





In 1959 the first fair came into existence when the Waterford Grange No. 231 was asked to come up with an idea for a community activity for the Beverly, Waterford area. A Community Fair was suggested, and the Grange provided \$100 toward expenses. The fair was held in an open field in Waterford at the end of Virginia and Washington Streets and afterward the \$100 was repaid to the Grange. Since there were no buildings, tents were rented for the livestock, fancy work and food stands. The Grange served food from a tent with a wide board stationed on saw horses and kept drinks in a big wash tub of ice. They cooked hot dogs in William and Gladys Meredith's kitchen and took them to the tent to sell. Bob Miller was chosen to be Parade Marshal because he had done the electrical work. He also provided rides by driving a garden tractor with a trailer. Horse and pony shows were featured. Bill Chipps was asked to bring Ayrshire cattle to show, Charles Campbell showed Brown Swiss and Neil Milner showed Holstein cattle. Other events were climbing a greased pole & catching a greased pig. Entertainment consisted of hay exhibits, an old fashioned fiddling contest, displays by 4-H, FFA, Girl & Boy Scouts, church groups, & school groups. The old country store had household appliances, motor oil, house paint, and many other items auctioned off to the highest bidder, many of which were donated by local merchants. It began with a parade. Prizes were given to the best performing band, outstanding float, best decorated bicycle and horse riding. Oran Adams sold tickets at the fairs. No bathroom facilities were available. Ronnie Eichmiller provided many hours of his time to the fair. In the beginning the electrical work was put up for each fair and when the fair was over it had to be taken down. Mr. Crooks, a barber in Waterford, helped as well. Dave Lowe was appointed official Fair Veterinarian and received \$10.

There were six directors as the Constitution states. In 1960, the fair was moved to the Drake and Leibrand properties. Ida Drake cooked the hot dogs this year in her kitchen. They basically had the same set up with tents. This year they added Kart Races under the supervision of the McConnelsville Kart Club. A dance floor was built. Church services were held. Barlow Twp. Vol. Fire Dept. won a prize for the newest fire equipment at the fair. They had purchased their truck in May of 1960. The Harrison Twp. Fire Dept. from Philo, Ohio had the oldest equipment and drive the farthest. This year the board decided to make some extra money and had a Donkey Basketball Game.

In 1961, the fair moved to the Wolf Creek Recreation Grounds, and is still held there today. The grounds are known as the Community Fair Grounds.

In 1964, the fair began on Thursday night the Starcher Building was completed and they were putting the siding on it by lights the night before the fair.

In 1971, a motorcycle rodeo was introduced. The PTA put up a building for food sales. This was the first year for the Hog Show and Sale. There was a swine sale of 5. Hogs had been shown before this date on the fair grounds, but did not sell.



Herman Huck

The 2023 Community Fair, Inc., Parade Marshal is Herman Huck. Herman is a native of the Beverly area, & he presently resides in his long-time Waterford home. Life & the U.S. Navy took Herman to the Pacific & back, but he has lived, raised a family, worshiped, worked, volunteered, & farmed locally in the Beverly-Waterford communities for over 70 years.

Herman was born in 1925 just north of Beverly, & he is an alumni of Waterford High School's class of 1943. After high school, Herman voluntarily enlisted in the United States Navy in December of 1943; he served the U.S. in the Pacific during World War II. He was in the Navy through May of 1946. After his military service, Herman worked in skilled labor positions, & he farmed, all throughout his civilian life. He was in the workforce for 70 years; Herman retired in 2017, after 18 years of employment at Air Heater Seal.

Herman was married to his late wife Alice in 1949. They had nine children: Calvin (& Carol) Huck, Patricia (& Pat) Tornes, Rosetta Huck, Sandy (& Donnie) Thieman, Veronica (& Bryan) Adams, Maureen (& Gary) Cunningham, Frank (& Leslee) Huck, Chris (& Christina) Huck, & Holly Webb. Herman and Alice have 19 grandchildren & 37 great-grandchildren, & several great-great-grandchildren. Herman has been a Catholic all his life. He & his family have been active & attending members of St. Bernard Parish for many, many years.

At 97 years old & counting, Herman has seen his share of history. He also shares history with the Waterford Fair Board. He was on the fair board as a member from 1979 through 1990, & he was president of the fair board in 1987 & 1988. During his fair board service, Herman was part of the work in 1985 & 1986 to build the high roof show ring & the hog building with a 100-head hog capacity. Herman enjoyed farming, & he has contributed to the growth of the Waterford Community Fair. Now it is the fair board's utmost pleasure to honor Mr. Herman Huck as the 2023 Community Fair, Inc., Parade Marshal.

Rev.2013 NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR ACCIDENTS

- 1. All tractors must be stock in appearance.
- 2. Top 5 tractors must weigh out.
- 3. Driver must remain seated and in control while pulling.
- 4. Pull must begin with tight chain, NO jerking the sled.
- 5. Drawbars are to be stationary in all directions.
- 6. Weights must be secure and allow clear hookup.
- 7. Tires cannot be altered by mechanical means.
- 8. Only diesel and gasoline fuels allowed, no alcohol.
- 9. Wheelie bars and kill switches are allowed in class.
- 10. Pullers must be 13 years of age or older
- 11. All pullers must sign liability waiver at registration.
- 12. Protest must come from puller in class in before pulling.
- 13. Pull committee decisions are final.
- 14. Disqualifications will result by:
 - a. Tractor touching or crossing the boundary.
 - b. Losing any part of equipment on track.
 - c. Failing to obey flagger or sled operator.
 - d. Not operating in a safe and sportsman-like manner.
- 15. Tug Pulling Only No more 2nd pulls after 1st round.




