

In 1959 the first fair came into existence when the Waterford Grange No. 231 was asked to come up with an idea for a community activity for the Beverly, Waterford area. A Community Fair was suggested, and the Grange provided \$100 toward expenses. The fair was held in an open field in Waterford at the end of Virginia and Washington Streets and afterward the \$100 was repaid to the Grange. Since there were no buildings, tents were rented for the livestock, fancy work and food stands. The Grange served food from a tent with a wide board stationed on saw horses and kept drinks in a big wash tub of ice. They cooked hot dogs in William and Gladys Meredith's kitchen and took them to the tent to sell. Bob Miller was chosen to be Parade Marshal because he had done the electrical work. He also provided rides by driving a garden tractor with a trailer. Horse and pony shows were featured. Bill Chipps was asked to bring Ayrshire cattle to show, Charles Campbell showed Brown Swiss and Neil Milner showed Holstein cattle. Other events were climbing a greased pole & catching a greased pig. Entertainment consisted of hay exhibits, an old fashioned fiddling contest, displays by 4-H, FFA, Girl & Boy Scouts, church groups, & school groups. The old country store had household appliances, motor oil, house paint, and many other items auctioned off to the highest bidder, many of which were donated by local merchants. It began with a parade. Prizes were given to the best performing band, outstanding float, best decorated bicycle and horse riding. Oran Adams sold tickets at the fairs. No bathroom facilities were available. Ronnie Eichmiller provided many hours of his time to the fair. In the beginning the electrical work was put up for each fair and when the fair was over it had to be taken down. Mr. Crooks, a barber in Waterford, helped as well. Dave Lowe was appointed official Fair Veterinarian and received \$10.

There were six directors as the Constitution states. In 1960, the fair was moved to the Drake and Leibrand properties. Ida Drake cooked the hot dogs this year in her kitchen. They basically had the same set up with tents. This year they added Kart Races under the supervision of the McConnelsville Kart Club. A dance floor was built. Church services were held. Barlow Twp. Vol. Fire Dept. won a prize for the newest fire equipment at the fair. They had purchased their truck in May of 1960. The Harrison Twp. Fire Dept. from Philo, Ohio had the oldest equipment and drive the farthest. This year the board decided to make some extra money and had a Donkey Basketball Game.

In 1961, the fair moved to the Wolf Creek Recreation Grounds, and is still held there today. The grounds are known as the Community Fair Grounds.

In 1964, the fair began on Thursday night the Starcher Building was completed and they were putting the siding on it by lights the night before the fair.

In 1971, a motorcycle rodeo was introduced. The PTA put up a building for food sales. This was the first year for the Hog Show and Sale. There was a swine sale of 5. Hogs had been shown before this date on the fair grounds, but did not sell.





Waterford Community Fair Parade Marshals



The 2024 Community Fair, Inc. Parade Marshals are Dave & Arlene Archer of Churchtown, Ohio. The Archer family is known for tractor pulling, but there's more to their story. Dave frequently tells people, "It is by the grace of God, the Cleveland Clinic, & my wife that I am here." Arlene adds, "I wouldn't be where I am today without him. I'm able to be a part of everything we do, the family & the business." With tractor pulling backgrounds & mutual admiration, they know what it takes to be a team; their full pull formula is they're in it together! Family values, work ethic, & God's grace are integral parts of their lives.

Dave & Arlene both attended St. Mary High School in Marietta, Ohio. Dave graduated in 1962, & Arlene in 1963. They started dating in 1965, & they married in 1967. In their early days, Dave was a pipefitter apprentice & worked construction. Arlene worked at Airolite & Union Carbide. She later raised thousands of tomatoes each year while raising the family. The couple founded Pioneer Pipe in 1981. Arlene became office manager there as of 1985.

As Dave & Arlene built a life together, they built up a family legacy that includes three children & their households. Their children are Jill (& Kevin) Witucky, Mike (& Stacy) Archer, & Kathy (& Justin) Schalitz. Their four grandchildren are Abby (& Mark) Winters, Austin Witucky, Hannah Archer, & Graham Archer. This family legacy is a hook that holds the tractor to the sled in Dave & Arlene's story.

The commercial legacy of the Archer family includes founding the Pioneer Group of businesses, including Viking Fabricators, Metaltech Steel, & Riverview Industrial Supply. It all grew from founding Pioneer Pipe, one of the largest construction, fabrication, & industrial maintenance companies in the Midwest region! The family legacy, commercial legacy, & tractor pulling legacy would all become intrinsically linked through a namesake Archer Family tractor known as "Pioneer".

The Archer Family tractor pulling legacy includes many National Tractor Pullers Association (NTPA) accolades, including Arlene's Grand National Crew Chief of the Year in 1999 & 2 Grand National NTPA championships. Dave was also inducted into the Mid-Ohio Valley Sports Hall of Fame in 2006 & the NTPA Grand National Hall of Fame in 2019. A pinnacle experience for Dave & Arlene was when daughter Kathy set the Farm Tractor Land Speed Record of 108.6 mph in 2018 in the Archer original Allis Chalmers D-19 "Alley Cat" stock pulling tractor that Dave drove in 1976 when he started tractor pulling.

The Archer Family had to troubleshoot their gravest challenge in 2016, when Dave had a double lung transplant to remedy Idiopathic Pulmonary Fibrosis (IPF). IPF is a lung tissue scarring condition with no certainty of the cause. Enter the Cleveland Clinic & the continuing grace of God...diagnosed with IPF in 2013, Dave became too ill to carry on with work & hobbies by 2015. In 2016, Dave received 2 new lungs. He recovered through grit & grace; that's when he focused on converting the original "Alley Cat" D-19 to a land speed tractor. Since the surgery, in just over 8 years, he's made 106 trips to Cleveland Clinic. Dave always tells people, "Everyday's a gift!" As a survivor of IPF, he shares this optimism & hope with IPF patients

by making himself available as needed to mentor others with IPF & facing transplant surgeries.

When you greet Dave, go for a fist bump instead of a handshake, & congratulate him on his Honorary Diploma from Washington State Community College awarded in 2022 when he delivered the Commencement Address at the graduation ceremony...& If you meet Arlene, know that you're meeting a woman who can parallel park a semi-trailer, build a Chevy engine, & pit crew a pulling tractor! Whether steering through life or entering a tractor pull, Dave & Arlene are in it to win it...it's full speed going for the full pull, doing the best you can with what you have, & remaining family-oriented. That is their legacy, & it is the fair board's utmost pleasure to honor Dave & Arlene Archer of Churchtown, Ohio, as the 2024 Community Fair, Inc. Parade Marshals, & to extend to them & their entire family heartfelt congratulations... from the home of the tractor pulls to tractor pullers at heart!
