Midland Northside Lions Club held our 29th annual WE SERVE Breakfast (formerly called Bunny Breakfast) on April 30 from 7 to 10 a.m. in the food court of Midland Park Mall. We served 287 people a hearty breakfast of sausage biscuit from Texas Roadhouse, scrambled eggs from Charley's Philly Steaks, homestyle potatoes from Mulberry Café, fruit from Chick-fil-A in the mall, and cookies from Fuddruckers. In addition, Pepsi donated the orange juice, Gandy's Dairies the milk, and Sierra Springs the coffee. We raised about \$13,300.

Once again, John Wojtkun, Jr. came from San Angelo as DJ/announcer. Lion Rob McGuire sang several songs and Phil Newell did some juggling. Mascots Andy Armadillo (accompanied by owner Aaron Battles from Texas Roadhouse), Juice from Midland Rockhounds and Lady Liberty from Liberty Tax Service helped to entertain the crowd. For the first time, we also included free vision screening, conducted by the Midland West Side Lions Club. There was a drawing later for 37 door prizes.

He spoke about the organization's work to aid homeless families that have at least one child younger than 17 years old. They are currently serving 13 families. The facilities rent for \$450 per month for a two-bedroom unit and \$550 for a three-bedroom unit. They are having a \$6.5 million capital campaign.

At the business meeting on April 28, the club agreed to donate \$200 to Family Promise. Most of the meeting was devoted to finalizing plans for our *WE SERVE Breakfast* fundraiser. Lion Tom Ochs gave a report on the proposed Zone effort to have a Pancake Breakfast on September 24.



Program Chairman Lion Mike Seerey brought Hannah Grainger and Adriana Aguilar as our speakers on May 12. Adriana is the Executive Director and Hannah is the Program Coordinator for Rays of Hope. They spoke about the organization's mission to guide children aged 4 to 18 through the various stages of grief caused by family separation, death and other factors. The club agreed to donate \$200. Lion Mark Singh reported that the Hogan Park development group has turned down our possible donation of a new lion drinking fountain.

At the business meeting on May 26, the club reviewed the WE SERVE Breakfast. Lion Tom Ochs presented a report on the zone Pancake Breakfast effort and said the next committee meeting will be on June 1. Lion Frank Stowers confirmed that our Installation Dinner will be at 7 p.m. on Thursday, June 23 at Gerardo's Casita.


