Thriving United has bought the former Midland Reporter-Telegram building and will use it as their administrative center. Their 30 employees currently serve about 1,700 clients.

The business meeting on March 28 focused on the upcoming WE SERVE Breakfast and voted to contribute \$200 to Thriving United. The existing slate of officers were re-elected to serve July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. Lions Frank and Don were named delegates to the District 2-A1 convention. Lion Mark gave an update on the youth exchange program, indicating that Chiara Cargnelutti from Italy will be the third student coming to Midland. Sally St. Jacques will host her while the Stowers will host Khulan Bayasgalan from Mongolia and the Singhs will host Anudi Ranadeerage from Sri Lanka.


