Azanet is a bilingual (English and Spanish) licensed psychologist in the state of Oregon. She was born in San Salvador, El Salvador and grew up in Miami, Florida. She started her career in mental health in 1999 at the **Orlowitz-Lee Children's Advocacy Center-Kristi House** in Miami, Fl. providing mental health services to child victims of sexual abuse and their families.
