VOTING RESOLUTION OF THE CUTCHOGUE FIRE DISTRICT

A regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners of the Cutchogue Fire District, in the Town of Southold, Suffolk County, New York was held at the Cutchogue Fire Department, New York on October 8, 2022 at 8:00 pm.

The following Resolution was offered by Commissioner Blados who moved its adoption: WHEREAS Section 175 of the Town Law provides a system for an annual Fire District election of officers; and

WHEREAS every elector of the Town who shall be a registered voter and who shall have resided in the district for the period of 30 days next preceding the election shall be qualified to vote for such officers; and

WHEREAS the district has not adopted additional personal registration pursuant to Section 175-a of the Town Law for persons not registered with the Board of Election; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Annual Election of the Cutchogue Fire District shall be held on December 13,
 2022 at Cutchogue fire House located at 260 New Suffolk Road Cutchogue, NY 11935, said date being the second Tuesday in December as prescribed by
 law, for the following purpose:
- a) To elect a Fire Commissioner for a full term of five (5) years commencing January 1, 2023 and ending December 31, 2027
- 2. Paper Ballots will be used and the polls shall be open from 3:00 pm until 9:00 pm.
- 3. Nominating petitions must be filed with the Fire District Secretary on or before November 23, 2022, said date being at least twenty (20) days prior to the date of the Annual Election. Each of said nominating petitions filed, shall be subscribed by not less than twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the district.
- 4. In lieu of a petition, the Board of Commissioners will accept a letter of intent In accordance with §176 of Town Law resolving that those persons wishing to be a candidate for Commissioner shall submit a letter of intent to the District Secretary, 260 New Suffolk Road, Cutchogue, NY 11935 on or before November 23, 2022, said date being at least twenty (20) days prior to the date of the Annual Election. This letter of intent shall indicate which office and the term for which

the individual wishes to run. The Board reserves the right to invalidate the letter of intent if the office and term are not indicated.
