



Roots of the

Pythagoras was an ancient Greek philosopher and mathematician who was born in Samos, Greece in 570 BC. His philosophy centered around the concept of metempsychosis which focused on the immortality of the soul and its transmigration at death into a new body or species. His mystical teachings were also supplemented with mathematical equations which primarily helped to corroborate that the stars and planets moved together in harmony. These teachings were incorporated in the movement known as Pythagoreanism which has been noted by Plato and other philosophers and historians as a new way of life.


The sources of the equations and philosophical teachings of associated to Pythagoras are vast as many scholars have attempted to provide evidence for his revelations. He was a traveler and a leader of an organization which was filled with devotees to his movement. His travels, however, provide clues to the true sources of his revelations including the theorem which remains known today as the Pythagorean Theorem.

In mathematics, the Pythagorean Theorem is a theory that identifies the fundamental relation among three sides of a right triangle. The area of the square whose side is the hypotenuse is equal to the sum of the areas of the squares on the other two sides. This theorem can be written as an equation: $a^2+b^2=c^2$,



where "c" is the length of the hypotenuse and "a" and "b" the lengths of the triangle's other two sides. If the variable "a" is substituted with the number 3 and the variable "b" is substituted with the number 4, the hypotenuse or product as represented by the variable "c" is 5. The result produces a perfect right triangle where angle ab $= 90^{\circ}$, angle ac= 60° and angle bc= 30° .² This case is unique to the 3-4-5 combination.


A common symbol associated with Pythagoreanism is the tetractys (below-left). This triangular symbol consists of ten points spread across four rows. Each of the three sides has four points. When inter-connected, a total of ten equilateral triangles are



produced with six facing upward, three downward and one encompassing the whole. Each angle in each triangle within the tetractys measures 60°. So, when combined with the other two angles in the triangle, a complete 180° triangle is obtained.

3-4-5 Triangle


This symbol was likely absorbed by Pythagoras while in Babylon. His travel to Babylon was actually done under duress after the Battle of Pelusium in 525 BC during the Persian Conquest of Egypt. He had been studying in Egypt at the time of the conquest for twelve years and became a captive. In Babylon, he was able to extend his studies



with the Magi which included exposure to the tetractys and numerology.³ When slicing a tetractys in half, the principles of the 3-4-5 triangle are attributed perfectly. With one angle remaining at 60° and the other cut in half to 30°, the third becomes a right angle or 90° angle. With the vertical line opposite the 30° angle measuring 3, the horizontal

line equates to 4 and the hypotenuse to 5 completing a perfect 3-4-5 triangle.

Although the source of the 3-4-5 triangle is attributed to Pythagoras, it is actually a concept that had long since been adopted in Egypt and Babylon where Pythagoras





studied. A papyrus from the

18th Dynasty of Egypt presented a problem in which the student had to determine the height of a pyramid (aboveright). The angle or slope (SEKED) and the base were known so, utilizing the Egyptian method, the problem was solved in a similar way as the Babylonian rule outlined.⁴ A translation from a tablet circa


1900BC (above) presented the following question:5

4 is the length and 5 the diagonal. What is the breadth?
The solution below is the theorem attributed to Pythagoras:

- 4 times 4 is 16.
- 5 times 5 is 25.
- You take 16 from 25 and there remains 9.

What times what shall I take in order to get 9?

• 3 times 3 is 9. 3 is the breadth.



So why is Pythagoras credited with this knowledge? It is most likely due to the spread of the doctrine of Pythagoreanism and the loss of knowledge during the Dark Ages. In 520 BC, Pythagoras returned to Samos and founded a school, "The Semicircle of Pythagoras", based on the learnings that he absorbed from Egypt and Babylon. He founded another school in Croton in 518 BC. Both promoted the following:

- reality is mathematical in nature,
- philosophy can be used for spiritual purification,
- the soul can rise to union with the divine,
- certain symbols have a mystical significance, and
- all brothers of the order should observe strict loyalty and secrecy.

Upon this doctrine, Pythagoreanism was forged and spread across the region. Other factions also grew along similar lines until the Dark Ages which ushered in a period of ignorance for nearly 600 years. The intellectual rebirth near 1200 AD expanded civilization and the closest intellectual sources were from the last known. So, the light that <u>re-entered</u> the world was credited to men like Pythagoras instead of their teachers.

In the writings of Albert Pike, particularly Morals and Dogma of the Ancient Accepted

Scottish Rite, Pythagorean concepts are directly referenced especially in the 2nd (Fellowcraft), 28th (Knight of the Sun) and 32nd (Sublime Prince of the Royal Secret) Degrees. He draws esoteric meanings to the Pythagorean tetractys like many in Western Civilization.⁷ Yet, as seekers of truth, Scottish Rite Masons are called to research and reveal new truths for the ancients like these:⁸⁻¹³

20,000 BC—The Ishango Bone

The bone contains a series of n o t c h e s which many



scientists believe were used for counting.

- 3,000 to 4,000 BC Sumerian accounting token to measure effort for work performed and the reciprocal wages to be paid.
- 2,600 BC to 2,700 BC

 Ancient Sumerian multiplication tablet for construction purposes.

All in all, there is a significant gap in the documented history of mathematics prior to Pythagoras. As further knowledge is gained, it is imperative to acknowledge those ancestors who actually made the initial discoveries. In doing so, the true trails of history can be preserved and the actual discovers can receive their just wages.
