2024 Zimbabwe Annual Conference Held

The Zimbabwe Region Annual Conference opened on the 19th of October, 2024 at House of Israel CME located in Kadoma, Mashanaland West of Zimbabwe. A small rural church with a big heart to host an annual conference, they are. It took a two-hour drive on highway to arrive at Kadoma from Harare. Delegates from across the region were present at the conference. Earlier, on the 18th of October, Bishop Adjei had an evening Communion Worship Service with the arriving delegates after his visits to the community, some members, schools and churches within the Kadoma district. The Conference opened on 19th of October with a short devotion led by Mission Supervisor Dr. Ezekiel Zifungo. Bishop in his opening statement to the delegates at the conference tried to tell the story of the CME Church, polity and structure. Mission Supervisor Zifungo gave his overview annual report after which the Missionary President also gave her report. Disciplinary questions were asked to prepare candidates for ordination. Four loyal pastors were ordained to the orders of Elder. Bishop Adjei promised to assist the Women's Missionary Council with a seed fund of \$500.00 for women empowerment programme as part of the church's social responsibility to CME's in Zimbabwe. Bishop presented the latest Book of Discipline and a Book of ritual to Dr. Zifungo. The Conference was

adjourned to Sunday, 20th of October for a thanksgiving worship service. To God alone be the glory.

Bishop Adjei and 1st Lady Mercy Arrives in DR Congo

1st Lady Mercy and Bishop arrived at Goma, DR Congo on the 14th of November 2024, for the 2024 Annual Conference of the regions. The Grace of God located them to be taken through protocol formalities before the immigration. Bishop had a brief meeting with his cabinet and the officers of the Annual Conference at the hotel, outlining conference schedules which will begin on the 15th November with Communion Worship Service. November 15th, 2024, Senior Bishop LL Reddick III, 1st Lady Wynde, General Officers Rev. Dr. Moore and Rev. Dr. Sragin landed for the first time in Goma, DR Congo as special guests of the DR Congo Regional Annual Conferences of the CME Church. They were welcomed at the airport by the Presiding Prelate, Bishop Adjei and 1st Lady Mercy together with Mission Supervisor Dr. Mugongo, Lay Council President Honorable Philemon, some members and Pastors of the Church. They were given protocol formalities through the immigration. A contingent of boys and girls scout of the Church mounted a guard of honor for the Senior Bishop together with the brass band at the airport. Indeed, it was such a good feeling to see our sisters and brothers of the church showing such great hospitality to their guests. Some local Radio and TV stations were at the airport to also capture the arrival of the Senior Bishop. Mr. Senior, General Officers and 1st lady, thank you for coming to the Motherland. Indeed, it was an honor to have you all at one of the regional conferences in the 11th episcopal district of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church.

2024 DR Congo Regional Annual Conferences Held in

The 68th Bishop and Presiding Prelate of the 11th Episcopal District, Bishop K. Lawson Adjei opened the 2024 DR Congo Regional Conferences at Bethlehem CME Church in Goma on November 16th. In attendance were the Senior Bishop and Presiding Prelate of the 8th Episcopal District Bishop LL Reddick III,1st Lady of the CME Church, Lady Wynde, 1st Lady Rev. Mercy Adjei of the 11th Episcopal District, General Officers Rev. Dr. Leon Moore and Rev. Dr. Ore Spragin, Guests from Rwanda Regional Conference: Mission Supervisor Dr. Mugongo, Lay Council President Honorable Philemon Bisengimana, Conference Officers, Pastors of our connection and delegates drawn from the various regions in DR Congo.

The day begun with a short devotion led by Mission Supervisor Mugongo after which the conference was constitutionally organized and opened.

Reports were received from Mission Supervisor Mugongo ,Women's Missionary Society President Lay Council President, Youths and Young Adults Council President, Health Department etc. Bishop responded to the reports by commending all the leaders for their good stewardship.

Senior Bishop LL Reddick assisted Bishop Adjei to ordain 39 pastors to the Orders of Deacon and 7 ordained to the Orders of Elder. The General Secretary of Missions and Evangelism, Rev. Dr. Leon Moore preached the ordination sermon. He urged the ordinands to study and preach the word of God without fear or favor. 1st Lady Mercy sang to the admiration of the audience.

Bishop Adjei in responding to the reports from conference officers, promised to top up the Women's Missionary Council empowerment project with \$500.00. Further pledged to support the hospital with \$1,000.00 for medications and the children's

Department. Appeal for 20 sowing machines were made for Bishop Snorton Vocational School. Bishop Adjei promised to provide 5 sowing machines, Dr. Leon Moore also promised to provide 10 sowing machines, Honorable Philemon also promised to provide 10 sowing machines.

Bishop Adjei also urge the young Pastors to study Theology at the University. He promised to give 6 scholarships to our pastors to study Theology at our maiden University in DR Congo. The conference adjourned to 17th of November, 2024. To God alone be the glory.

Senior Bishop LL Reddick III Preached at The Closing Worship And Thanksgiving Service of DR Congo Regional Conferences Held in Goma.

The 2024 DR Congo Regional Annual Conferences adjourned on November 17th with a thanksgiving service. Presiding over the conference was Bishop K. Lawson Adjei. Guests Bishop to the conference was Senior Bishop LL Reddick III and 1st Lady Wynde, General Officers Rev. Dr. Leon Moore and Rev. Dr. Ore Spragin. The conference brought together Pastors of our connection, Lay leaders, Women's Missionary So-

Dr. Ore Spragin took the congregation on the introductory aspect of the Bold Steps Initiative, helping the delegates to grab the whole visionary concept of the Bold Steps initiative. Senior Bishop Reddick preached the closing sermon on the theme: "Stand Up & Fulfil Your Calling In The Kingdom of God" His text was rooted from 1Samuel 1:1-18. 1st lady Mercy sang once again to the admiration of the audience. Presiding Elders and Pastors were stipends. All other financial commitments made by the Bishop was fulfilled.
