Annual Conferences

Bishop Adjei continued his second-round of 2023 annual conferences in the 11th Episcopal District and below is the summary report of the conferences held in below is the summary report of the conference held in Bujumbura, Burundi.

BURUNDI REGION ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT

Bishop K. Lawson Adjei, the Presiding Prelate of the 11th Episcopal District arrived in Bujumbra, Burundi on the 8th June, 2023. He was met on arrival by the Mission Supervisor, Faustin Sinzinkayo, Pastor Vincent and Pastor Augustin. The next day Bishop resolved to visit some churches to ascertain the nature of the churches and to know how to perform his episcopal responsibilities over those churches. Bishop visited Muyange and Rugeregere CME Churches. These churches were determined to get for themselves church building to facilitate and improve upon their place of worship. Indeed, these churches have purchased lands and blocks to start with construction. Bishop Adjei congratulated the membership for their efforts in building the church of God. He promised to assist them with the cost of building.

The Annual Conference opened on 10th June, 2023 at Gatunguru CME Church in Bujumbra. Delegates from far and near were fully present to participate and catch a glimpse of their new bishop. The host pastor was Pastor Vincent Sabagirigwa. The Missionary President of the Region preached the devotional sermon. Bishop's opening statement was about the history of the church, doctrines, polity and structure rooted from the Book of discipline of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church. Reports as usual were received from the Mission Supervisor, Presiding Elders, Conference Officers and other relevant stake holders of the Region. Two Pastors were recommended to be ordained to the orders of Elder.

Sunday the 11th day of June, 2023, worship service was held to conclude the proceedings of the conference. Bishop preached on the theme "Be Bold: Seek Ye First the Kingdom of God". Two pastors, Vincent Sabagirigwa and Augustin Ndereyimana were ordained to the Orders of Elder. Since church building and getting proper place of worship in order to meet the requirement of starting a church in Burundi looks very paramount and important to the membership, Bishop supported the Host Church with \$1000 to help finish up the ongoing projects in the church. The 2 churches visited were also given \$500.00 each to help in building their church buildings. Mission Supervisor, Elders and Pastors were all stipend by the Bishop in order to go back and continue working for the CME Church. Bishop read the appointment and gave certificates to that effect. The Presiding Prelate was presented with gifts from the region. The conference adjourned.

20th QUADRENNIAL ASSEM-BLY OF WOMEN'S MISSIONARY COUNCIL

Bishop K Lawson Adjei attended the 20th Quadrennial Assembly of the Women's Missionary Council of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church held in Jacksonville, Florida in the United States of America. Though she was the only delegate from the eleventh district, she made a lot of impact with her report and participation in all the deliberations of the conference. Bishop Adjei gave report of the 11th Episcopal district to the general assembly. Bishop requested the missionaries to support Schools, Orphanages, Women Empowerment, Vocational Schools and Church Planting in the region. He also preached the luncheon meditation hosted by the Fifth Episcopal District whose presiding prelate is Bishop Clarence K. Heath.






