### 2023 ANNUAL CONFERENCES IN RETROSPECT

In retrospect, Bishop has successfully held the Kenya Region Annual Conference, Rwanda Region Annual Conference, Burundi Region Annual Conference, Uganda Region Annual Conference, Tanzania Region Annual Conference and the next is Democratic Republic of Congo.

## DR CONGO REGION ANNUAL CONFERENCE REPORT.

Bishop K. Lawson Adjet determined to finish the 2023 annual conferences of the 11th Episcopal District, set the DR Congo Region Annual Conference from October 27th – 29th 2023. DR Congo has four annual conferences but the bishop had to combine the 4 conferences together because of the activities of rebels and the state of instability in the country. Therefore, all the conferences for DR Congo were held in Goma. These brought together delegates from all the conferences to Goma for the conference to be held.

#### Bishops Arrival In DR Congo.

The Presiding Prelate of the 11th Episcopal District, Bishop K. Lawson Adjei arrived in Goma with 1st Lady Mercy Adjei on October 25th, 2023 to hold the annual conference of the regions. He was met on arrival by the Missions Supervisor, Rev. Dr. Dieudonne Mugongo and Honorable Philemon, who is a member of Parliament. Bishop and his wife were taken through protocol immigration formalities. Soon after the Bishop's arrival while waiting at the executive lounge of the airport, there was a heavy downpour which according to Mission Supervisor Mugongo, it's a signal of blessings the bishop has brought to DR Congo. Their cultural belief is that whenever there is rainfall immediately or after an occasion, it signifies blessings from God

## BISHOP'S MISSIONARY VISITS IN GOMA

The Presiding Prelate of the 11th Episcopal District, Bishop K. Lawson Adjei on Thursday, October 27th, 2023 resolved to do missions by visiting the hospital of the CME Church in Goma, DR Congo.

It's a small hospital that serves the community where it is located and also serve thousands of refugees displaced by the ongoing activities of rebels in the Country. Indeed, I saw some admitted government soldiers who were wounded by rebels at the hospital for treatment. With shortage of drugs at the hospital, Bishop Adjei, together with Mission Supervisor Mugongo, Honorable Philemon who is the Lay Council President, Hospital Administrator and the Pharmacist went to the market with Bishop to purchase medical drugs worth \$1,000.00 and presented to the Hospital to augment treatment of patients who could not afford to pay neither buy drugs prescribed by the doctors. I am told these medicines will save thousands of lives. Thanks to the CME Church especially the 8th Episcopal District for her financial support to the work of missions in the 11th Episcopal district. Bishop's next stop was a school complex under construction with grant of \$250,000.00 from the government of DR Congo to the church. The land on which the school is being built is yet to be purchased by the church. However, the short-leased gives them the goahead to continue with the construction. The appeal in this regard is to support the purchasing of the land for our children to continue with their education.

#### Annual Conference Communion Service

Bishop K. Lawson Adjei will always want to prepare for his conference with a special service of prayers. This will serve as a special impetus for successful conference. Indeed, it has worked and therefore will continue unabated. Friday, October 28th, 2023, delegates who were arriving from far and near for the conference converged at Bethlehem CME Church in Goma for communion service. Hence an evening communion service held attracted members of the host church and the delegates. Mission Supervisor Dieudonne Mugongo preached the sermon

from John 6:52-60. Bishop Adjei led the prayer of consecration of the communion elements. The youths were in church to render songs with church choir. Prayers were said for the church, College of Bishops, the 11th district and the entire nation of DR Congo. Indeed, the church was now set for the opening of the conference the next day which is Saturday, October 29th.

#### Bishop Opens His 1st Sessional Annual Conference of DR Congo.

The 68th Bishop of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church, Bishop K. Lawson Adjei opened his 1st Sessional Annual conference of the DR Congo on October, 28th, 2023 at Bethlehem CME Church in Goma. It was 4 Annual Conferences combined together for security reasons. Delegates were drawn from far and near. Some of them when coming were hijacked by rebels after some negotiations, they were released. It took some of the delegates 2 days to arrive in Goma. The conference opened with

a devotion led by Rev. Bahati Jean. Bishop's opening statement was about the CME Polity on how annual conferences operate and how to become a preacher in the CME Church. Reports were received from the Mission Supervisor Dieudonne Mugongo, Women's Missionary Society, Youth and Young Adult Council, Lay Council, Christian Education, Director of Medical Services, Elders, Pastors etc. Significantly, 137 Churches were reported with total membership of 156,238, one medical

hospital and 171 schools. Special guest of honor to the conference was the Speaker of Parliament of North Kivu Provinces, Rt. Honorable Seninga Robert. He commended the church for playing advocacy roles, educating future leaders of the country, offering medical services to the citizens and above all giving the spiritual food to the citizens.

Prayers were said for him government. and the He highly commended the bishop for coming to lift up the image of CME Church in DR Congo. First Lady Mercy preached the ordination sermon. She encouraged the ordinands to put their houses in order. 29 pastors were ordained to the orders of Deacon and 11 ordained to the orders of Elder.

Bishop presented 4 sowing machines to Bishop Snorton Vocational School to augment women empowerment by learning skills to become self-sufficient and reliant. Furthermore, Bishop presented a motorcycle to one of the assistant Mission Supervisors in DR Congo who works at a very deprived, remote area with acute poverty and little means of transportation. Hence to keep him working effectively to grow our churches, Bishop Adjei had to perform this gesture. Indeed, the people were blessed with the presence of the bishop. I can say that the Lord has used me to fortify the gains made by my predecessors, lifted

The Presiding Prelate of the 11th Episcopal District, Bishop K. Lawson Adjei closes the DR Congo Regional Conferences with an explosive worship Service at Bethlehem CME Church in Goma on the October 29th 2023. Ironically, delegates were still arriving as rebels kept chasing them to collect their monies on their way to the conference.

A presiding Elder arrived today without any money on him. Songs were rendered from all the musical groups that were present. 1st Lady Mercy was presented with a piece of cloth from the Women's Missionary Council. Bishop received financial donation of \$500.00 from the Speaker of Parliament for his return ticket. Bishop gave the money to the Women's Missionary Council to support the micro finance project that was ongoing. The speaker of Parliament also blessed the church with 100 bags of cement for any church project. Passing of character was done after which certificates of appointment were presented.

Appointment for 2023-2024 was read by the Bishop. Mission Supervisor, four Assistant Mission Supervisors, 26 Presiding Elders, Conference Officers were all stipend by the Bishop to go back and work under the banner of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church. The conference adjourned till next year. Who else could have done this? Only God. To him alone be the glory.

#### 2023 Unity Summit & Connectional Board Meeting

The 2023 Unity Summit & Connectional Board Meeting was held from August 20th- 25th2023 in New Orleans, Louisiana, USA. The host was the 4th Episcopal District whose Presiding Prelate is Bishop Kenneth Wayne Carter. Members of the Board for the 11th Episcopal District both resident in USA and Africa were fully represented. Seasonal preachers and speakers were invited to the summit. Opening and presiding over the Connectional Board meeting was the Senior Bishop Lawrence L. Reddick III.

All active Bishops of the church were present. Service of the Holy Communion was held. Bishop Sylvester Williams, Presiding Prelate of the 3rd Episcopal District preached the sermon. Bishop K. Lawson Adjei read the Testament reading from Matthew 26:31-35; 69-75. The next Unity Summit of the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church will be held from September 1-6, 2024 in Dallas. The host Episcopal District is the 8th. Senior Bishop LL Reddick is the Presiding Prelate.


#### BISHOP ADJEI HONORED BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL OF CME CHURCH




