From Our Pastor's Desk:

Dear Ones.

We were truly blessed during the Advent season, and like many of you, I have been reflecting on hope, joy, peace, and love. As your Pastor, I often consider my privilege in receiving these gifts through my relationship with Jesus, alongside my responsibility to extend them—holding them for a moment, and then sharing them outwardly with the congregation and community.

As some of you may know, I am involved in hospital chaplaincy and participate in the Annual Conference on the Creation Care team. I also chair the Committee on the Role and Status of Women. Additionally, God calls me to spread uplifting messages on WYLF AM 850, which broadcasts each Sunday morning at 8:30 AM (available online too!). Through each interview, I strive to emphasize the importance of being "good neighbors." It is all about God and sharing the grace of Christ through our gifts and blessings so that others may receive the good work the Holy Spirit has for their lives too.

I continue to hold onto hope, joy, peace, and love, and knowing that you do too fills my heart with life! Your spiritual health and connection to Jesus light up the world like a candle in a dark room, and we are committed to carrying that light with us wherever we go.

During Advent, we sought tangible ways to carry these fruits of the spirit into our community and UMC connection. With great success, we reached out to many: Open Door Mission, the Maternal Hospital in Mutare, Zimbabwe, and the Red Bird Mission in Kentucky, where 40% of the population lives below the poverty line. We achieved much more too, including providing

food baskets for Christmas dinners and contributing to our local food shelf at the Blessing Room in East Bloomfield. Inside, you will find a missions report, but beyond what the Missions team offers, know that every visit you make—bringing a gift, baked goods, the bulletin from Sunday, or simply your smiling face—lights up those in need. You are the candle in the dark room because of the light Jesus has given you. I praise God for every moment you spend as that light, reflecting the beauty of our faith and the joy of the Lord our God. This connectional system we cherish in the UMC is knitted through the love and truth of Jesus Christ, prompting us to imitate His ways, His love, and His grace. Let's keep praying for the light to be revealed in all we do—speaking, sharing, protesting, affirming,

praying, and seeking. These are the actions

of the faithful people of Jesus Christ. This is

who we are, beloved, as Christians.

The Office for Aging & Dept. of Health have approved our kitchen for weekly lunches.! This new ministry will serve our neighbors by feeding them with food and fellowship.

I UMC is partnering with the Ontario County Office for the Aging to host the Senior Lunch Program. Beginning at the end of February we will have a delicious lunch available in our fellowship hall, weekly, on Tuesdays. Approval by the Administration Board & OCOA is finalized & approved. More details will be coming, but the cost is only \$3,50 per meal and in addition to delicious food plated and served, you will have the fellowship of friends and neighbors. There will be a sign up sheet for a weekly "host" from our congregation each Tuesday to welcome people to our lovely building and model the radical hospitality of Jesus. Amen!

Individual churches can participate in their own self-run missional activity or signup through CCYM to help out at one of the campsites. They will ask churches to complete a form of what they did so that CCYM can see how many churches participated. We might consider a work day at a local mission!

<u>Disaster Response Training March 29, 9</u> am – 5 pm, Rush UMC

Floods, hurricanes, tornadoes, snowstorms, and fires impact an entire community, causing physical, economic, and emotional damage. United Methodists UMCOR Early Response Teams (ERT) arrive soon after first responder professionals respond to the disaster. ERTs provide a caring Christian presence in the aftermath of a disaster. ERT help listen to the survivors. Further tasks might include assessing damage, tarping roofs, removing damaged household items, cleaning, and removing wet sheetrock. Teams stay for three days, replaced by another team as needed. Teams are selfsufficient and self-sustaining. Upper New York conference maintains several tool trailers. Individual team members pay for their own personal protective gear, food, & transportation. Team members should be in good physical and mental health. The training credentials you to enter disaster zones. An ERT badge is issued by UMCOR to applicants over the age of 18 following the successful completion of a background check and the course. Badges are valid for 3 years. Individuals need not be United Methodist to take the training.

Cost (\$35/45 person) includes a light lunch, snacks, and a digital or printed ERT manual. The course is open to ERT whose certification has expired as well as other volunteers interested in responding to natural disasters. Registration is open: https://bit.ly/2025ERTbasic

As Paul beautifully illustrated to the Corinthians. the church is the living embodiment of Christ's work on earth (1 Corinthians 12:12-27). We are called to be His hands, mouth, and feet—living out what it means to be truly "Christian," by following His example in all we do.
