From Our Pastor's Desk:

Dear Friends in Christ, Beloved, Happy New Year in the name of our Savior and Friend, the Lord, Jesus Christ!

Together, we are on a great adventure for the coming year, 2025.

What are your plans for the coming new year? Is there a new beginning, a new friendship, a new plan of action in your commitment to Christ? Will you decide to not only get closer to God through intentional prayer, but knowing you are gifted in God's grace and mercy, will you study the scriptures more often so that you can keep learning and let the Holy Spirit make some deep dives into your heart of hearts?

I have been in prayer with the Lord to ask what is it that we might journey with in our congregational life of faith in this new calendar year? How shall we find ways to get closer to God and engage in acts of kindness, compassion, and mercy? Bible Study? Check. Worship? Check. Mission purpose? Check. We are learning and eager to learn more about how to care for that which God cared enough to create.

The adventure will be faithful, intentional, and loving. We will find ways to express our thanks to God in our respect for the Earth and how this enables us to love God, love neighbor as self. I pray we will find ways to honor God in our respect for the planet and thus, respect one another. is am hearing God say, start with something we can all relate to: Food.

How does our food honor God, neighbor, and self? How does our food help us get closer to the Lord and what do our food choices mean regarding justice and health for the planet? Let's journey with these questions and hear what God is speaking to us! Thank you for joining hands on the journey!



Perhaps you've noticed the dirt pile on the north side near the kitchen entrance to the fellowship hall? We had some degradation in the fellowship hall furnace firebox last year and after speaking with several HVAC companies we opted to replace both furnaces with propane fired units based on efficiency and operating cost. We've purchased and installed a new 1000 gallon propane tank in preparation for replacing both oil furnaces in early 2025 (after we exhaust our existing oil supply). 
