This year's EDSO Summer Picnic is **BYOE** (Bring Your Own Everything). Given that we do not know where we will be in our COVID-19 Journey, the plan is tentatively to meet at Willamette Park in West Linn from 11:30 A.M.-2:00 P.M., Saturday, August 1st. Erik has procured the main shelter which can accommodate 50-100 people. You can click the link above to see the layout of the shelter and surrounding picnic tables. There is river access and a spectacular view of the Willamette coming up from the South through a glacial cut made during the Missoula Floods.

There is a water pad if it is very hot and you wish to cool off. While there is a play structure somewhat nearby it is less obtrusive than many of the other places in West Linn's Parks system. Parking should be plentiful. <u>Alcohol is permitted</u>, *but please be discreet*. The permit says nothing about it, nor is it mentioned specifically on the site; whereas Portland Public Parks are very specific in their prohibition, West Linn appears to be a bit more forgiving. Imagine yourself a teenager again, hiding it from mom and dad and I am sure everything will be fine.

Directions: Coming from the North down I-5, get on I-205 going East and it is about 5 miles down the road and known as the 10th St. Exit. The same exit for any of those traveling South down I-205. Go past the Chevron and up to the intersection, hang a right and go 2 blocks to 12th St. where you will hang a left and go straight down the hill to the park near the river.
