Our vision of justice, with an end to poverty and discrimination, is central to who we are.

For 50 years, we've taught a new understanding of God and created a welcoming space for all. Our current home is a beautiful 19th century red-brick building. We are blessed with considerable green space for hosting outdoor events. We share our social hall with several groups and run a food pantry that's open weekly.

Although we are based in Omaha, Nebraska, we draw people as far away as Grand Island to the west, Council Bluffs to the east, and Kansas City to the south.

Metropolitan Community Church-Omaha was a leader in the fight for marriage equality and continues to advocate for LGBTQ people. From the very early days, we've supported all those who live with HIV and AIDS. At this time in our history, we're known as a human rights church because we stand for justice on many fronts. We have built partnerships across the city, as we live out the gospel of God's inclusive love.
