We know that most people have extra sneakers in their closets they would like to donate rather than throw away. We can accept sneakers in <u>any</u> condition — used or new. By doing so, we raise money for WCB and help the environment. It's a win – win for everyone!

The WCB will be placing collection boxes throughout Brick — in the schools, fitness facilities, physical therapy facilities, senior communities, etc. and will send them to **Got Sneakers**, who will reimburse the WCB depending on quantity and condition.
