Brick 2022 Accomplishment Summary

We are very proud to have had such a productive year. Thanks to our industrious members we accomplished the following:

- Added 6 new members
- Spent nearly 1,000 hours on 13 Club activities
- Donated goods valued at approximately \$1,500 impacting 9 different target populations (hospital nurses, homebound senior citizens, troops, animal shelter, homeless, ill children, survivors of Domestic Violence, tots, and the entire community)
- Generated about \$2,000 via 5 different fundraising activities (2 craft tables, Silverball Arcade Museum tickets, Amazon Smile & Coastal Living)
- Donated over \$4,000 impacting 3 different target populations (High school students, homeless, veterans)
- Updated our Bylaws
- Increased publicity to include developing a Website, quarterly newsletters, various social media sites, local newspapers, and Brick TV.
- Created membership materials (PowerPoint Presentation, orientation packages, membership cards, application brochures, etc.)

The luncheon was held at the Scarborough Fair Restaurant located in Sea Girt. Social activities such as this allow members to get together, have a good meal with friends, and simply enjoy each others company with no other goal but to have fun. MARCH is Women's History Month

This years' theme is:

"Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories" - former Brick resident Myrtle Moore was one of them.


Ms. Myrtle Moore, while not born here in Brick, devoted her life to Ocean County history and educating children. During most of the 18th century male teachers outnumbered female teachers. This pattern reversed towards the end of the 18th century. By 1931 there were 234 teachers in Ocean County, of whom 84% or 197 were females. Ms. Moore was one of them.

While her teaching career began in New Egypt, she later moved to Brick and taught 4th grade students at the Herbertsville School. She was known for taking her students on field trips to broaden their experiences. Years later she was promoted to Teaching Principal, a position she proudly held until her retirement in 1961. To honor her years of service and positive impact on countless students, a plaque was hung at the school and it remains there today.

Ms. Moore was a member of several local historical societies, including Brick's. She was passionate about preserving local history. Upon her death the Brick Library inherited her research papers and books so they could be shared with others for years to come. Ms. Moore also provided the Ocean County Historical Society & Museum a significant financial bequest. In gratitude and to pay her tribute, the museum named an exhibit area after her. Please note that the Ocean County Historical Society & Museum is dedicated to "Telling the Stories of Ocean County".
