When record executive, Mortimer Palitz heard a solo demo of "Do You Want to Dance" Freeman had done, he signed him to the Jubilee label and had the original recording overdubbed in New York by session musicians in 1958. The *Cliff Richard and the Shadows* version of "Do You Wanna Dance" was released in the UK in 1962 as the B-side of "I'm Lookin' Out the Window." The *Beach Boys'* rendition of the song was released as a single in February 1965 and features Dennis Wilson on lead vocals.






## In the Midnight Hour by Wilson Pickett & Steve Cropper



Wilson Pickett recorded "In the Midnight Hour" in Memphis, Tennessee on May 12, 1965. Atlantic Records president Jerry Wexler brought Pickett in to sing at Stax Studio where Steve Cropper was a session guitarist. Cropper found some gospel songs that Wilson Pickett had sung on, including one with the lyric: "I'll see my Jesus in the midnight hour." Cropper got the idea of using
