





"Hi, my name is Opey!"



"It's a cloudy day. I hope the sun will come out soon."




"Today, my friend Molly Mechanic and I are going to see dinosaurs...ROARRR"




"Hi Opey and Tinker! Opey we'll be driving through the hills.


Are you feeling OK about the trip?"



"I think so Molly. I'm all charged and ready to go!"



"Look! My emergency brake isn't on. I can move again."




"Opey, your favourite things have helped you to feel better."




"Molly, humming and singing also helps me feel good."


