Ralph Heather is an award winning visual artist living in Paris, Ontario, focused on original printmaking using traditional and contemporary techniques such as hand-cut wood blocks and etchings. The prints are hand-drawn, hand-carved, hand-etched, and hand-printed in limited editions at his studio. He also works in other art media such watercolour painting and drawing in a variety of mediums.

In his work he observes and reflects on the local rural and urban surroundings of people and living landscapes. He searches for connections in our local communities that seeming go unnoticed and can so easily slip away. Then weaves visual cues and stories together using the best medium to express them.

Ralph has a varied background in art from a lifetime in and around the visual arts. He is a graduate of Graphic Design at Sheridan College (3 yr), and has studied part-time at OCADU, DVSA, Centre3, and Scottsdale School of Art. He is an accomplished Registered Graphic Designer (RGD) operating his design business Baseline Graphics Inc. for 25 years. At the Dundas Valley School of Art he leads workshops in printmaking. He continues to pursue knowledge and skills under the mentorship of master printmaker Robert Creighton, and Wesley Bates, master engraver. As a painter he is fortunate to have had instruction and guidance by nationally recognized artists; Annette Smith, William Biddle, Holly Snead, Gordon Perrier, and Chelo Sebastian. Ralph also participates locally advocating for arts and culture in his community.

## **Artist Statement**

Ralph Heather's recent bodies of work "Rural Detours" and "Sanctuary" are a series of original woodcut/linocut prints and etchings that pay tribute to the rich history of our local rural landscapes. Cutting through wood with chisels, inking, and transferring to paper, the woodcut/linocut resonates with a lively energy in darks and lights and realism.

He finds much of his inspiration not far from where he lives. It can be moments away or discovered while exploring the countryside. Searching for the missing connections to our local heritage and rural environment, finding himself surrounded by the historic places of trees, fields, homesteads, and working farmlands. Shared experiences, times and places are documented and are reflected in each work he makes. The interesting stories and situations are transformed into a woodcut print before they are forgotten by time and the unrelenting progress of today.

The art evokes a sense of place and encourages the telling of stories held within. The viewer often will first recognize the aesthetic beauty of the subject, landscape and a sense of place. Soon stories will emerge revealing details and messages in the remnants of a time forgotten, on land now being rediscovered and developed. This is the beauty of the still present ancient landscapes that are now overgrown, coexisting with generations' old homesteads and working farmland.
