Benefit Trust Report; Sam Hogan

The benefit trust financial report was shared with the members with no questions. Current balance of \$197,179.09

AFL-CIO Report:

The Strike happening at the UAW was discussed. The striking hospitality workers in Las Vegas was discussed.

Building report:

Windows replacement at the union office is awaiting the arrival of the windows, Once the windows come in the company is scheduling 3 months out. Should be installed in January, 2024.

Political Education:

With the House vacating the Speakers office, no bills can be brought forward for a vote. Everything comes to a stop until a new speaker is elected. With the government shutdown pending near the end of October the House needs to get a new Speaker soon. A government shutdown does NOT affect our active or retired letter carriers, the mail will continue and pay will NOT be affected.

Thomas Day and Robert Taub were both confirmed by the Senate for a new 6 year term as Commissioners of the Postal Regulatory Commission.

Vehicle & Safety:

NALC is in current talks with several Congressmen and Senator Gillibrand's office to write legislation on carrier safety and protection. Once a bill is written and submitted, we will ask for your help to make phone calls and get bipartisan support.

Unfinished Business: President Kenn y Montgomery:

Contract Update: The parties are still negotiating meeting several times a week. Most items being negotiated have been resolved with the exception of the financial aspect. The NALC is attempting to eliminate both of the pay tables and merge them into a new pay table. The NALC is looking for a substantial pay increase especially at the starting wage. The NALC is also attempting to eliminate the CCA classification for an all career workforce and shorten the time to top pay step. These are the items that are still outstanding and trying to work out the details. The NALC is still preparing to go to arbitration should an agreement not be reached. The National officers did not share specific details other than to say they are seeking a "SUBSTANTIAL" pay increase.

TIARERAP inspection schedule for the Fall includes Lyons Live week October 14 and Webster live week October 28 in our area. Special Inspections in Greece are scheduled for live week October 14.

Convention call will be coming out sometime this month. National Convention August 5-9 in Boston. If you are an elected delegate start thinking about if you want to go or not. Delegate Spending limit of \$12,000 approved by the membership.

NALC Charges against President Renfroe. A past business agent was appointed to investigate and report his findings to the executive council. Of the 8 original charges 2 were withdrawn by the charging party, 2 were found to be not substantial by the council and the remaining 4 charges were found to be substantial by the executive council. A 3-member panel will now by designated by the Executive VP to hold hearings to determine the seriousness and validity of the remaining 4 charges. The executive council will then decide based on the hearing, guilt or innocence and any punishment imposed. The accused and/or any member may appeal that decision to the National Convention whose decision will be final.
