HR 5995 has been submitted before the House. This bill, if passed would allow employees to buy back non-career time and get credit toward retirement. Currently there are 21 co-sponsors.

Steward Elections. January of every even year, deadline for nominations is January 4, 2024

According to the NALC constitution union dues is based on 2 hours pay at level 1 step D per month plus any local dues. With past pay raises dues is scheduled to increase by .09 cents per pay period to \$32.02 (currently \$31.93)

5-minute rule (end of the day).... bottom line...it doesn't exist. You are not limited to 5 minutes at the end of the day. Ask management to show you in writing where your afternoon office time is limited to 5 minutes. Management is looking at the route adjustment process where it gives you credit on line items for 5 minutes at the end of the day, this is no different from the 3 minutes you have in the morning to do vehicle check....it is a minimum and if it takes you longer then it takes longer. So really you have a **minimum** of 5 minutes.
