BIBLE RECORDS: We appreciate receiving Family Records from old Bibles in any area. Send xerox copy of original record, if possible, and a transcription of it. Include title page of Bible showing publication data, and a picture in the Bible, which would help identify it at a later date. Include name of person WHO POSSESSES BIBLE, and name and address of person sending us the record, as well as date!

BE SURE TO INCLUDE YOUR NAME AND ADDRESS on all charts and cards!

Some of our ambitious co-workers have put together 3 huge books of Family Reunion clippings from the Jacksonville papers, 1976-1982. Should some of our far-away members want a photocopy of any family that they know had a reunion

here, we would be happy to share.

Your Editor discovered a new method to surname-index husband/wife combinations from those fine lineage charts many of our members have been sending to us. See page 5 for instructions, with examples pp. 6-9. If this method were adopted by many societies, soon a computerized extensive list could be organized for quick scanning. If anyone has questions, comments, or suggestions for improvement, we would appreciate a letter on the subject.

We have added a new feature to our membership sheet; will you please <u>name the</u> heritage societies of which you are a member, giving National Number when possible, and <u>name of ancestor from whom you descend</u>. This may be a new productive way to match some family historians with a relative. We don't think this feature has yet been tried by any of the genealogical societies.

Note: When sending in your 1983 dues, will you please use the membership renewal sheet we are enclosing with our quarterly, listing surnames you are working on, regardless as to whether you have listed them before. This sheet will be filed until we get ready to type the Annual Directory next summer for 1983. Some persons said "Will send later", but with our extensive correspondence file it not easy to put such letters of information in the same spot.

Also, when you pay 1983 dues, please make a note of it in some prominent place that you sent them. Last year we had 21 people paying twice, and many more who forgot until the next summer when they suddenly realized they had not received our *Geneal-Journal* in a long time. . . . It costs us 71 cents to mail single copies to late renewals. . . . . We are trying to keep our dues as low as possible for your benefit.

You can help us in this economical venture by 1) prompt payment of dues, 2) recording the fact that you paid for 1983, by 3) sending us address changes immediately.

We still have back issues of the 1979, 1980 and 1981 quarterlies for sale @ \$10.00 per set of 4 per year. Perhaps some of our new members will want to take advantage of this further information on our West-central counties we try to produce records for.

Page 1: 100 Years Ago WHEN GRANT WENT MARCHING BY

Journal Courier, Jacksonville, Ill., July 2, 1961

FIRST MARCH WAS THROUGH JACKSONVILLE, By Cecil Tendick.

Of course everybody knows that George Washington slept in half of the beds of the Alleghany mountains.

And U. S. Grant and his 21st Illinois Volunteer Regiment were in at least five different towns in Sangamon, Morgan and Scott counties on July 4, 1861.

That's the way our ancestors recalled it and set it down. They didn't pay much attention to the slouchy man with a coarse beard that ranged down to his fourth shirt button when they first saw him. Some noticed that he was a natural in the saddle and that his brown eyes twinkled when he saw a small child, for Grant loved horses and children.

They had no idea at the time that the Civil War was going to turn into a bloody four-year war and that the unkempt character was to become Lt. Gen. U.S. Grant, commander-in-chief of the Union Armies.

... everybody loves prestige by association. So all the old timers remembered seeing Grant as he marched from Springfield to Naples a hundred years ago. They distinctly remember it because it was on the Fourth of July.

They also remembered that he was riding a claybank horse which he bought in Springfield, at Berlin, at Merritt, at Naples, and at Perry, Pike County, Judging from what we read Grant must have been well fixed in the claybank horse Inc.

And the oldsters recalled that Grant's oldest son, Freddie, 11 was with his father and he was riding a pony. Some said it was a roan pony, some said black, some sorrel, and some piebald.

At least Freddie was with the regiment and he was riding a pony.

While at Naples he joined the town kids and had a lot of fun swimming in the Illinois River. His best chum in Naples was Willie Smith who enlisted just as soon as he was 14 years old, and who was captured and practically rotted to death in Andersonville prison.

Picked by Yates

The 21st Illinois Regiment was made up of volunteers from Moultrie, Douglas and Coles counties. Their first officers, elected by popular vote were phonies; discipline became just a word, and in desperation Gov. [Richard] Yates of Jacksonville assigned Grant to take over. He took over. The lusty volunteers had to quit drinking and the emporiums on East Jefferson street, Springfield, felt a slack in trade. The men had to drill and salute and do "mess duty" and quite a few of them decided the war business wasn't in their line and went home.

But avid volunteers, including Chris Romang of Waverly, filled the ranks. On July 2, 1861, Grant was ordered to take his regiment to Naples, where a steamboat would be waiting to convey them to southern Missouri where they were to guard the railroad terminal at Ironton.

The Great Western railroad agent saw business coming his way, for the road ran from Springfield directly to Naples. He approached Grant and asked how many freight and passender cars he would require.

Grant replied, "None. The walk will do us good."

So, the 21st Illinois Infantry became the first and only regiment to leave Camp Yates at the western edge of Springfield afoot.

The regiment literally walked every place in the next four years, in Illinois, Missouri, Arkansas, back and forth across Kentucky and Tennessee, In Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, North and South Carolina and Virginia. They undoub-

tedly did more walking than any other regiment in the war, on either side.

Early in the afternoon of July 3, 1861, Grant and his boys headed west,

with most of their baggage hauled by privately-owned wagons. They camped that night about seven miles west of Springfield, between Spring Creek and Riddle Hill.

The next morning they headed west again, still on the Old State Road [which had been surveyed and laid out by Abraham Lincoln in his younger days], and around noon they came to the William N. Brown country mansion, where an oldfashioned Fourth of July celebration with the reading of the Declaration of Independence, some patriotic oratory and a basket dinner was in progress.

The regiment camped that night on the Corrington farm east of Jacksonville and about noon the next day they marched up East State street. Everybody in town was surprised to see them and some thought that the war was over and that the 14th Illinois Infantry, which had trained at the fairgrounds, was coming

Many Jacksonville women were busy sewing shirts for the soldiers--still using gray flannel -- that day and on West State street they came out waving their unfinished garments. One apologized to Grant that they didn't have any flag to wave and Grant said, "Those are the kind of flags we need."

Then the troops marched out to the fairgrounds, where there must have been some tag-end sort of celebration going on. The fairgrounds then was a beautiful elm and oak grove, and the boys lounged under the trees for a couple of hours. It was here that Grant had his first trouble with his subordinates, which was to plague him for the next four years.

Most of the lieutenants and captains "repaired" to the Dunlap House on West State street where they indulged in some pretty classy freehand guzzling. A couple of them didn't find the regiment until they got to Naples, and one lieutenant got so befuddled that he wound up in Berlin again, thinking he was going west when he was going east!

After the break at the fairgrounds the troops headed west and camped in Allinson's Grove, about seven miles west of Jacksonville. There Grant took his

pen in hand and wrote this order:

The Col. commanding regrets it becomes his duty to notice the fact that some of the officers of this command fell out of ranks yesterday, in passing through Jacksonville without authority to do so; and this whilst the rank and file were guarded most strictly. This being the first offence is overlooked, but in future no excuse will be received. The next day, July 6, the troops moved through Meritt and Exeter, over Apple Pie ridge, and got to Naples about 2 p.m. But they camped at Columbus,

just upstream, because it was a dry town. This is rather confusing, since the Collins family, ardent drys, really owned both Columbus and Naples. Naples was wet; Columbus, dry.

Of course anybody who has been in the army knows that the steamboat was standing at the landing ready to haul the regiment to southern Missouri. But they had SNAFU in those days, too; even better than the army can work up today.

There wasn't any boat. E. L. Greenleaf, the telegrapher at Naples, who later became a Jacksonville four-term mayor, wired St. Louis and a boat was dispatched to Naples. However, it got hung up on a sandbar downstream and stayed there for three days. When it finally got to Naples the orders had been changed, and the 21st was order to Quincy, afoot. But the orders were changed again, due to a show of rebel force near Palmyra, Mo., and a special train picked up the regiment at Perry Springs station, west of Meredosia.

By this time surely every man in the 21st Illinois Volunteer Regiment real-

ized he was in something new and different; he was in the army.

Page 1: GRANT'S MARKER AT NAPLES. Jacksonville Journal, Jacksonville, Ill., July 4, 1961.

By Cecil Tendick. [This story followed one written by C.T. on July 2, 1961, which was the 100th anniversary of U.S. Grant's march from Springfield to Naples. The trail was marked during Jacksonville's Centennial in 1925.]

Yesterday a couple of Civil War fans asked for specific directions on the route Col. U. S. Grant and the 21st Illinois Volunteer Infantry regiment took from Jacksonville to Naples. They said they wanted to follow the same road on the Fourth of July and take in the celebration put on by the boat club in Naples.

So, for all those interested, here is the route:
Start at the northeast corner of the fairgrounds, where there's a monument ereced by the Morgan County Historical Society during the centennial year of Jackson-ville, 1925, commemorating the fact that Grant and his men were there on July 5, 1861.

Head west on Liberty road. Go west until you hit the cemetery. Your odometer will read about 3.8 miles. Turn left.

Go south till you come to a T-road, odometer reading about 5.3 miles, turn right. Stay on it till you come to a stop sign, turn right and go west on the oiled road.

At about 6.7 miles you come to Allinson Creek, where the 21st Illinois Infantry stayed the night of July 5, 1861 and where Grant fumed because he was the only sober officer in camp. At that time the creek was a beautiful, spring-fed rivulet with enough volume to support a grist mill just upstream.

At about 10.6 you'll be in Merritt. Keep headed west. About a mile west you'll see Capt. Gillham's old brick home. The boys with Grant admired it too. Howard Hurrelbrink, one of the best farmers in the world lives there now.

At 13.5 you'll come to a stop sign on a Y and a black-top road. Veer to right and proceed on black-top.

At about 14.2 miles you can look to the right and see the gully where Brigham Young, later the great leader of the Mormon church who actually had more wives than he could keep track of, got religion. He had been attending the Mormon meetings in Exeter that were put on by Henry Rice of Exeter, who later became one of the ruling elders of the church. It is said that one one real hot July day, when there wasn't a breath of air to be had, Brigham was plowing corn in this gully with a balky mule. He decided preaching would be a better go than plowing corn. He quit plowing corn and joined the Mormon church.

[Your editor diverts from the story at this point to include the tale that there was a well in this area, and when Brigham looked down in it, he saw the letters P.C. He decided that meant that he was to go and "Preach Christ". Other wags, upon hearing the story said it must have meant "Plow Corn."]

At 15.2 you'll hit Main street, Exeter. At the left is Rudicil Arnold's brick hotel, "three stories with full basement." The hotel was there when Grant and his men went through and Rudy, who was handy with cuss words, fumed aplenty when Grant rode up and put his place off limits.

At the foot of Main street is Mauvaisterre creek, where Grant tipped his hat to a little girl as his horse was taking a drink.

Stay on the black-top, curve to west and then south. At about 16.8 you'll become atop Apple Pie ridge, a beautiful little moraine. If Wisconsin had it the tourist bureau would spend a million dollars a year advertising it.

Leave the blacktop road when you see Fred Korty's round barn at your left and take the gravel. Stay on top of Apple Pie ridge until you come to Route 100.

Page 2: GRANT'S MARKER AT NAPLES.

Turn left, stay on the slab, about a tenth of a mile, until you come to the gravel road heading west.

Go west, till you hit the Mauvaisterre levee, turn right and drive alongside the levee. You'll come to a T-road, turn left, and less than a quarter of a mile you turn right, headed north and towards Naples.

You'll veer a little to the left, then cross the Wabash railroad track and you're in Naples. The celebration will be at the old steamboat landing on the other side of the levee, to your left, but if you want to see the Grant monument put up by the Winchester Woman's club keep headed north and drive to the new half-million dollar elevator built by the Illinois Grain Company. As you approach the parking area you can look to your left and see the monument. If you wish to take a close look at it you can walk around the fence post next to the river and go over. The owner of the land, Merton Abbott of Jacksonville, won't mind.

Two partially finished mill stones from the old Collins grist mill at Naples made the monument. Hope you don't get lost, but if you do, you couldn't get lost in a better place.

Grant's march through Jacksonville was re-enacted June 11, 1977. The <u>Jacksonville Journal</u> and <u>Courier</u> for June 10, 1977 presents an article "Historical Notes Flesh Out March Route Area" which gives the route in greater detail, naming various homes and sites of interest to genealogical researchers whose ancestors may have been mentioned. Another article to note is the "Springfield-to-Naples With Sights Explained."

Grant's March to Naples which started from Springfield on July 3, 1861, was re-enacted as part of the Bicentennial by the Sangamon County Historical Society, Springfield Civil War Round Table, 114th Reactivated Volunteer Infantry, and the 7th Illinois Cavalry Reactivated. The tour was made in cooperation with the Scott County Illinois Bicentennial Committee, which arranged a Tour of Homes in the Exeter area.

Page 1: INSTRUCTIONS FOR A NEW HUSBAND/WIFE SURNAME-INDEXING SYSTEM FOR 4 & 5 GENERATION LINEAGE CHARTS. By Florence Hutchison.

Have you looked at a 7-generation lineage chart with all those names and vital data crowded on one sheet of paper, both sides, and wondered how one could logically figure out who was on it--and who was related to whom?

Do you realize that there are 128 individuals with 32 different surnames on such a chart were it completely filled out?

I have just developed a new husband/wife surname indexing system which can be used by societies who receive a lot of charts, and need to index them for quick reference. One can use pre-printed forms, or by typing the information on a card using the format seen on our cards on the following pages. This system can also be used by researchers who are working on a lot of family names.

For beginners, ancestral charts with both parental lineages on them for Person #1 (with the admonition to "start with yourself") are fine in order to teach them how to progress from the known to the unknown. But for data of so many individuals to later be crowded on one page of a 5-generation chart is too much! Let's simplify this genealogical device in two ways.

The logical answer for avid genealogists needing ample space for recording vital facts they come across, is to use a Paternal Lineage Chart on one sheet, and a separate sheet for the Maternal Lineage. (See examples on following pages which have been developed for the use of our Society members.) This method doubles the amount of available space for ancestors, and is far easier to scan for surnames that are involved in the study.

Some family historians have difficulty in determining the correct space to be used on the back of the sheet to record names for 6th and 7th generations. The formula is simple:

- •--Double the number of a person in any generation to find his or her father,
- •--Men's names are all even-numbered;
- •-- A wife is the next odd number to her husband's:

The father of son #20 is #40 on page 2; his mother being #41; Example: The father of wife #21 is #42 on page 2; her mother being #43, etc.

- e--Maiden names should be enclosed in parentheses:
- Example: Mary Jane (Doe), Mary J (Doe) Smith, or Mary Jane (Doe) SMITH.

  --Middle names should be given in full, when known; nicknames in quotes: Example: Mildred "Millie" Ann (Seymour), or "Millie" A (SEYMOUR).

The Husband/Wife Surname Indexing System for 4 & 5 generation Paternal and Maternal lineage charts are illustrated on the following 4 pages. [If any person is interested in the extended system for all surnames on a 7-generation chart, please send a long SASE and further instructions will be given.]

One can get 5 printed cards per page, 4 of them being used for the surname index with name of Person #1 on each, the fifth card being used for the name and address of Person #1, listing all surnames to be found in his/her chart.

Since the charts are divided as to paternal lineage, and maternal, then each #1 person has two reference cards. Perhaps a family historian will file only one of his/her lineages that applies to the society's area, by this method, and thus avoid a lot of names foreign to the given area from being in the cardfiling system. Try it--you might like it!

It was interesting to note in the Grace (Roberts) Davenport charts that both of her parents are descended from her grt-grt-grt-grand-parents, which makes Grace her own fourth cousin. Her parents are also her third cousins once removed! As of September 17 Grace is 94 years of age, and still going strong. We wish her many more happy years. She would like to find out more about her father's family after William Roberts. Can anyone help? He was in the War of 1812.

### ODDS AND ENDS -- AND OTHER THINGS:

One of our members posed a question about our Annual Directory of Members. She said: "I am having some second thoughts as I pour over the Geneal Journals, about writing to these people who are researching surnames. . . . presumably in the Westcentral IL area. What if this is not true of all names [listed]? Could you advise members either to limit their lists to people of that area, - or else make 2 lists? This would save much labor and postage as we try to be helpful to others."

Some members do indicate other states in which they are searching, but due to space problems in publishing our quarterly, we do include all surnames given us. regardless of place. There are two sides to this matter.

Suppose a person is researching a name in Kentucky? If we list it here, that may very well be the ancestral name one of our people may be looking for as they progress from our area to the eastern ancestral families, or westward during goldrush days, and later.

Genealogical research is not a cheap pastime. One has to expect some costs to accompany the pleasures and disappointments one experiences. Yes, it does cost 20 cents to send a letter, and 20 cents for the SASE enclosed. But over all, one may find some long-lost relatives in any place in the U.S. that they will be happy to correspond with, and perhaps visit some day. If we only listed surnames from our corner of Illinois, then many of our members may not have the pleasure of meeting people farther off who have early family history to share.

AND NOW, ABOUT THOSE SASE--stamped self-addressed envelopes used as enclosures:

- •--Please use LONG (business-type envelopes) instead of the small ones sized 3 5/8" x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ". This saves bulk when mailed back with several pages of what may be vital family history; or photocopies of books, etc.
- •--The usual "dime-store" variety of business envelope is #10 size 4 1/8"\* 9 1/2". It will fit, unfolded, into a "book-store" envelope #11 size 4 1/2"x10 3/8". (These may be purchased at about 4 cents each, and are most convenient.)
- -- Should you send a "dime-store" business envelope, here's how to fold it: a) open flap, b) fold twice into 3 equal parts. This is very neat.
- •--Because these folded envelopes now give the post-offices with sorting machines difficulties in going through, genealogical societies are now urging family historians to safeguard their expected letters of return by purchasing a quantity of the #11 envelopes for outer usage, using the #10's for SASE.

Another Descendant is John M. Henderson, of Independence MO. One of our new members works for the Mayflower Society--Mrs. Catherine F. MacDougal of Norton MASS.
