WOULD YOU PLEASE FILL OUT YOUR 1984 MEMBERSHIP SHEETS PROPERLY?

Membership sheets for 1984 renewals are included with both our September and December quarterlies. They serve as a reminder that we like to have your dues early for the task of processing them; secondly, so that we will not have to send reminders out in the early part of next year.

But please, make a note somewhere that you paid 1984 dues, to avoid paying them twice. We have had several members in 1983 who started missing their March and June quarterlies, then wrote to inquire. Some of them had failed to pay dues, or the postoffice did not deliver their quarterlies for some unknown reason. Some of these members had failed to send us their change of address soon enough. That costs a lot of extra postage.

Such disturbances create problems for the officers of our society who handle the various mailing processes. We willingly send duplicate quarterlies for proven paid memberships.

The most important things we request members do:

1. Write your name and address clearly. It may look good to you, but the typist sometimes cannot interpret the handwriting which may create an error in name or address.
2. Please, write in surnames being worked on! The editor does not see these yellow sheets until September for typing the annual directory. Some people say: "same as last year." Then the typist has to take time out to look up past records. One who has never tried to type a directory of members cannot comprehend the amount of time it takes to try to get an accurate accounting, even without the time-outs to find related data.

We volunteers are concerned about our members, and try to do our level best to help them with their family researchings. We try to publish as much data in each quarterly as possible, and give hints of better ways to do things. We are painfully aware of the fact that we can not get ALL of the letters of inquiry answered. But no one person knows when we will pick up a letter, sort of grab-bag style, and give them an answer they need; so taking a chance might be worth a long wait. There are just so many hours in a day that an individual can give to this service.

We are constantly acquiring more records to file, and finding people who are working on the same surnames, from the numerous indexes we are constantly compiling. We have some very dedicated genealogists in this area who are each helping people in their own way, but they are too few in number in relation to the many family historians who find they have ancestral roots in this part of west central Illinois.

There are many different areas of endeavor for a successful genealogical society to indulge in:

1. The monthly meetings, which must present programs of local interest so that members and visitors will keep coming. In this, we have been successful.
2. The publication of a quarterly which reaches out to the membership both local and nation-wide. (Over 500 members in about 40 states and Canada.)
3. The gathering of vital records and books from which to glean family data.
4. Various indexing methods to keep up with memberships, and other information.
5. Filing of correspondence, with appropriate indexing, in order to be able to recall family data presented to our society which might fit someone's needs.
6. A copying system for retrieval of information in answer to letters of inquiry.
7. Time allowed for courthouse research for vital records, deeds, and probates.
8. Publication of census and other public records for purchase by members.

We volunteers in this area are trying hard to fulfill all of these obligations. We deeply appreciate the support of our long-time members, because without them we would have no need to collect data. We welcome new members, because without them we would have no one to share our family history with. So, it is a fun-time sharing experience all around. Let's keep it up!

We salute and congratulate Grace Agnes (Roberts) Davenport on the occasion of her 95th birthday, September 17, 1983.



Grace Davenport is well known in Jacksonville circles, and many people went to the D.A.R. Duncan home to the reception given in her honor on Sunday, September 18th.

Her genealogy is given in the unpublished manuscript titled *The Descendants of John Granderson and Agnes Allen (Pulliam) Seymour*; also, *A Short History of James Pulliam*. Copies are at the Jacksonville Public Library and the Illinois State Historical Library in Springfield.

The beginning of this genealogy was compiled by Mrs. Emma Dora (Mansfield) Lowdermilk, a great-granddaughter of John G. And Agnes A. (Pulliam) Seymour. After the death of Mrs. Lowdermilk, Grace Davenport added to the records. Then with the help of various family heads, Esther (Seymour) Atwood collected and arranged the bulk of the data. In her opening statements she said: "Much credit is due Mrs. Guy Martin of Waverly, Illinois for long hours spent in copying records for me in Morgan County, and for her work in cataloguing many old country cemeteries where our kin are buried."

Grace Agnes Roberts, daughter of James Henry and Mildred (Seymour) Roberts, was born Sept. 17, 1888. She married Roy M. Davenport on Aug. 26, 1926. He deceased Jan. 5, 1959. In addition to being a D.A.R. member on Rev. soldier James Pulliam, she is a member of the Colonial Dames of the XVII Century, and numerous other heritage societies. Last year on her 94th birthday, she said she received exactly 94 cards!



Dear Geneal Members and Friends:

September 1983

America's first drive-in service station was opened by the Gulf Refining Co. 1 Dec 1913, at the intersection of Baum and St. Clair in Pittsburgh, Pa. They sold 30 gallons of gasoline the first day. Question: Now who was the first would-be genealogist who handed a blank sheet of paper to a researcher and said, "Fill her up!"

Societies still do (and probably always will) get inquiries saying "my Jones and Smith families were in your area in the 1830's. Will you please send me what you can find?" How can we ever teach the newer genealogists to be specific with names, middle initials, names of spouses, and any data available, but especially the WHERE'S? Many of the lineage charts sent to our society lack the latter info just because your editor did not put in that little important "w" on the 5th generation! So I, as a researcher might spend a lot of time looking in vain for a marriage, when it wasn't even in our area. I am giving this as an example - hoping to teach as many family historians as possible that all known data should be included in materials sent that may be filed for future reference in the home of a researcher, or a society.

Mary C. Manlove, of Jacksonville, has given us two pension certificates of Theodore H. Scott, who enlisted 14 Mar 1865 at Mt. Sterling IL, and was mustered out 14 Mar 1866. His residence was listed as Mound, IL. We also have his Pension Cert. #1,053,733. This was found in the possessions of Miss Leah Pratt Fletcher who died in 1936, and was living in Sierra Madre CALIF. Anybody related may have same.

In our June quarterly we reported the vandalism to Rogers Cemetery. There was a statement, with their picture, "For the past month Guy and Myra Martin have been putting their lives back together with wires and iron posts." In the meantime they have been putting the cemetery back together again with the purchase and setting of many new stones. Some of the graves have stones for the first time. This is a costly process. I am sure they would be very appreciative of your support in this venture with a generous donation to the Rogers Cemetery Association Myra formed 20 years ago.

Would you permit your editor to insert a personal note? (If not, skip this paragraph.) Our grand-daughter, Brenda Scarbrough of Rochester IL, will be competing in the national beauty contest for Miss Teen-Ager of the States at Miami, Florida, with the finals on Sunday October 30th. She was named Miss Teen-Ager of Illinois last summer in the state contest held in Springfield, Illinois. There are several similar contests, so it rather confuses the public. But these are more or less contests aimed at giving young models an opportunity to gain experience in entering contests. I have to stay home and help genealogists find their ancestors and collateral relatives.

We [Elder W. D. Best] submit this, our 5th annual report of the JACKSONVILLE DISTRICT, with great gratitude to God for innumerable blessings abundantly bestowed upon us, and upon all the ministers and churches during the year.

Forty-eight revivals were held, resulting in 1,020 reported conversions. The average time spent in each meeting was two weeks and a half, which is 165 weeks, or more than 3 years spent in continuous revival work.

[Note: another source of information created by these revivals are the local newspaper accounts found on microfilmed papers, using Conference dates as reference for locating them.]

Roodhouse, Centenary, Havana and Literberry has been submitted to more or less renovation.

The Illinois Female College has enjoyed another year of unusual prosperity. The attendance of pupils was large, the faculty strong, the enthusiasm of teachers and pupils inspiring, and the work done has been thorough and satisfactory. . . . One hundred and fifty pupils from our territory have been attending our church schools. . . .

The work among the young people in the Sunday Schools and Epworth Leagues has been progressing. There are now 40 chapters of the E.L. as against 29 reported last year. . . .

During the year death has claimed two of our elect sisters. Sister Phillips, the highly esteemed widow of Dr. F. W. Phillips, and Sister Akers, the venerable and saintly widow of Dr. Peter Akers. Triumphantly and in great peace they passed into their heavenly rest.

The following brethren will answer to the roll call of the superannuates, viz: D. H. Stubblefield, who, though he halts upon his staff, stil, like Jacob, is pressing on to the Promised Land. J. W. Helmick, who lives in Baldwin, Kansas, and of whom his pastor writes: "A good citizen, a Christian gentleman, a loyal Methodist, a faithful and true helper, worthy in every sense of the word, doing all he can for the Master, and succeeding in keeping off the claimant list." J. P. Dimmitt, who now resides in this city, from all human appearances, will meet with his brethren here in Conference and answer to the roll call for the last time. But with Charles Wesley he sings:

*"In age and feebleness extreme, Who shall a helpless worm redeem?  
Jesus, my only hope Thou art, Strength of my failing flesh and heart.  
O, could I catch one glimpse of Thee, And drop into eternity."*

G. R. S. McElfresh, being turned out to graze, he is often seen joyfully browsing in rich Presbyterian and Congregational meadows. While age somewhat enfeebles the body it seems only to brighten the mind and warm the heart.

W. J. Rutledge, still a perennial fountain of anecdote, reminiscence and poetry, is trying to refute the judgment of his brethren that he is old and superannuate, by so successfully caring for the mental, moral and spiritual welfare of several hundred of the State's most difficult wards that even the governor of the state has failed to find his equal as a successor.

Robert Clark remains the same sweet spirited Christian gentleman. Superannuation has not turned the sugar of his nature into vinegar. Conscious of failing powers, he is content to lie aside and join in the shout of the victory that younger and stronger leaders achieve.

Robert P. Droke has lost nothing, either in size or weight of either man or manhood because he is on the superannuate list. He delights in taking a rest, holding quarterly meetings, preaching and conducting revivals for the brethren.

A. Sloan submits with sweet Christian resignation to the inevitable, although to cease to live would have been far more desirable to him than to cease to labor. When ever opportunity affords his voice is still heard shouting on the battle from the walls of Zion.

The harmony and good will existing between pastors and people have been without a flaw, and the same may be said of the relation between the Presiding Elders, the pastors and the people. For the opportunity we have had to work for what we have enjoyed for victory or defeat, unto Him who has washed us in his precious blood and called us into the ministry we give all the glory. Amen. The WEST JACKSONVILLE DISTRICT [Horace Reed, P.E.] is the excelsior district of the Illinois Conference. Not in number of its population, for it contains less than any other district in the conference. Not in large cities, for all the other districts have larger. Not in wealthy churches, for all the others have wealthier. Not in the number of members, for 6 districts have more. Not in the salary paid to the Presiding Elder, for all the others pay more. It is, however, the excelsior district in the beauty and variety of its scenery, its high hills, rugged cliffs, bubbling springs and charming valleys.

The delightful views in Calhoun county in the spring time when the orchards and forests are in bloom, and the rarest hues of the woods after the first frosts in the autumn may be imagined, but cannot be described. The district is excelsior on account of the number of methods by which it is traveled by a Presiding Elder, from the most magnificent palace cars of the Wabash, Chicago & Alton, and C.B. & Q. to the roughest road carts and leaky skiffs; and on account of bad railroad connections the Presiding Elder has more time at cross roads for meditation, writing letters and making sermons than any other district can furnish.

It is the excelsior district because of the political stability of the people. Illinois was admitted into the Union in the year 1818. The very same way a majority of the people at the first election voted, they are still voting in every county embraced in the district, with rare exceptions.

It is the excelsior district in the vigorous opposition of those who sneer at experimental religion, and fight creeds, while they have one themselves to which they hold more tenaciously than any other sect, the leading article of which is:

*"We little care what men believe, Provided they our faith receive,  
And come to us--with us unite, And think our ways and plans are right,  
And swear allegiance to the water. As for the rest, 'tis little matter."*

It is the excelsior district in that the preachers in years past have done much more hard work for less pay than the preachers in any other district, and the last year has not been an exception.

Excelsior in that there are more Epworth Leagues in the district to the number of its members than in any other district, and under the leadership of the district president, R. L. STEED, it gives promise of a still higher state of efficiency.

It is the excelsior district in that it has, I think, the most remarkable primary Sunday school teacher in the Methodist church, if not in the world. Mrs. Clara M. CLEVELAND, of Griggsville. She is 76 years of age. She organized the primary class in that church May 4, 1856, and thus for nearly 50 years she has been a teacher. From first to last she has enrolled in her class 1,771 names.. The present number of the class is 68. Recently 22 were advanced to higher classes.

But with all the embarrassments in our work in the district the reports will show a healthy growth. One great embarrassment has occurred on account of the number of unordained pastors in the district. A young man may have excellent preaching ability and may be a superior pastor, but he sustains a great loss if he cannot baptize his own converts and marry members.

This Presiding Elder is under a deep conviction that the time has come when our discipline should be so amended that young men who are thought capable to have a part in our ministry and who prove themselves worthy by getting people converted, shall also be allowed to baptize their converts, and also to marry our young people instead of having them go to preachers of other churches, or to justices of the peace.

The aggressive spirit of the preachers of the district is seen in their efforts to push out into new territory. During the two years I have been in the district ten new societies have been added.



In the territory embraced by the Sny Island Circuit two years ago there were not more than twenty Christians. Under the earnest leadership of J. O. STONE we now have 200 full members. I dedicated one church last November, all paid for, and another will be ready for dedication in a few weeks, and paid for. A greater transformation among a people I have never seen.

At Bluffs, 18 miles west of Jacksonville, a city of 800 to 1,000 people, where our church never had a foot-hold, T. B. SMITH held a meeting and the result has been a good society of over 100 members, the building of a new church costing over \$3,000, which will soon be dedicated.

The entire society of the Methodist Protestant Church at Arenzville of their own free will and accord transferred their membership to our church. This gives us a good foot-hold in that town of 800 inhabitants. I think that that society will build a new church the coming year.

Two societies have been added to the Batchtown charge, making six this year. The two added to the Pleasant Hill work last year, and two to Bluff Springs make ten in all added in the past two years.

A new church is being built at Seehorn, on the Kinderhook Circuit, which will be ready for dedication in November.

A new church is being erected in Virginia, at a cost of about \$10,000, which is a great victory for Methodism in that city. Bro. REAT deserves great praise. Dr. PARKER has nearly paid off the debt on our church in Beardstown, and Bro. WATERBURY has removed all indebtedness from our church of all kinds in Winchester.

The revival work has been quite extensive. The pastors have reported to me over 1,500 conversions. I have emphasized the importance of the after-revival work--systematic Bible study, the habit of reading good books and our church papers, and working in the various departments of our League work. I am profoundly impressed that ten-fold more work is needed along these lines.

Special efforts will be made in the coming year to push the organization of reading unions. It has required unusually hard work to bring up the benevolences. While the yield of the fields and the orchards this year is great, yet it will be several weeks before the corn and apples will be converted into money.

Owing to the great drouth in most of the district the two previous years, and the great failure of wheat and apples, many of our people have been financially embarrassed.

I will not be accused of any partiality in making special mention of one of the preachers in the district. Wm. McK. McELFRESH is the senior preacher of the Conference in continuous effective service. He entered the Illinois Conference in 1851. For 44 years he has wrought his work so well that his brethren could say "well done." The good people at Barry were ready to ask his return the third year, but he feels that the time has come to ask for a change of relation. A more beautiful closing of a conference career has never occurred in the Illinois Conference.

I wish to record my gratitude for the most pleasant relations that have existed between the preachers and myself. Hearty cooperation has been given in carrying out the plans I have suggested. The pleasant hours I have spent in the homes of the preachers will ever be gratefully remembered.

I am profoundly thankful for the health I have enjoyed during the year, so that I have been able to do more work than in any year of my ministry. I have held 106 quarterly conferences; administered the sacrament of the Lord's supper 110 times; devoted 30 days in holding Biblical institutes in the district, with Dr. Williamson, which were held in 21 different charges; have lectured 42 times, and preached 368 times. Because so many Irish immigrants came to our Morgan County area from the beginnings of the county January 31, 1823, we are here publishing the marriage index of those men and women with the prefix Mc surnames. However, be advised that the first 180 marriages in Morgan were lost to posterity when the first frame courthouse, that stood on the northwest corner of the square, burned on December 6, 1827. All records were lost except the deed book which was in the home of the Recorder that particular night because he was working on it. Therefore, all other records in Morgan County begin as of December 7, 1827, instead of 1823.

Many of the Irishmen dropped the prefix Mc at a later time, so that family researchers should be aware of this fact of life and look for spellings of the name in other records without the prefix, which might occur at other times. As an example, McCane might be listed as Cane, or spelled Cain. McGee may be McKee, etc.

ODDS and ENDS, and OTHER THINGS!

Consider the plight of the descendant of a grandmother whose name is Kerenhappuck. They have been looking for the surname of Happuck all the way back to North Carolina and Virginia, without knowing that Kerenhappuck comes from the biblical daughter of Job, along with her two sisters Jemimah and Keziah. "And in all the land were no women found as fair as the daughters of Job, and their father gave them inheritance among their brethren." Job 42:14,15. (Was this a forerunner of the idea of equality of men and women?)

Where did the Lucy Ball (of Greene County IL) research papers disappear to after they were sent to Tennessee? This question has finally brought forth the answer, when Vera Haworth Eldridge of Liberty MO researched the problem as she traveled to Knoxville.

"We found them last week (June 1983) in the McClung Historical Collections. They have been removed from the East Tennessee Historical Center to a larger restored building. The librarians there are most helpful. We found Robertsonville where Lady Ann Howard Tunnell died at the home of her son, Rev. William Tunnell, which is now part of the Oak Ridge TVA project. They moved 5800 graves from this area when this government project went in. I am trying to find a listing of these graves, but have had no luck so far." Thank you, Vera. Now we know!

Lucy Ball, who used to work in the Greene County Clerk's office years ago, was the one who copied all the marriage records from 1823-1870 and placed them in the Illinois State Historical Library. I, your editor, saw them and photocopied them out @ 20 cents per page, over a period of time. [268 pages.] I "farmed them out" to several of our local members who made index cards, and then typed the first index made, giving surname of groom and of bride, and page to be found on Lucy's record. We still have these indexes for sale @ \$3.00 each. Volume 1 1823-1849, along with some early Madison County marriages -- and Volume 2 1850-1870. Your editor now has these cards filed according to a bride index, but it will probably be a long time before an index of that nature can be typed.

SOME HARD FACTS PERTAINING TO PUBLICATION OF HISTORICAL REPRINTS.

This item is in reference to the possibilities of our society publishing a reprint of the Portrait and Biographical Album of Morgan and Scott Counties, Ills., containing Full Page Portraits and Biographical Sketches of Prominent and Representative Citizens of the County.

Would you like to know how many people responded that they would be interested in purchasing one - IF we did a reprint? Less than 30 of the requested 200!

Let me quote possible figures. 400 books costing \$20 each for publishing, mailing, jackets and postage (with no allowance to volunteers for the service time in wrapping, addressing and providing car and gas to take them to the postoffice), equals an outlay of \$8,000. Very few societies have this amount on hand to pay the publisher outright.

Selling them @ about \$25.00, as we proposed, would give us \$2,000 profit in the long run. BUT--it would take the sale of 320 books just to get back the original cost.

If only 30 people out of 500 members decided they wanted a book now, then the society is stuck with 370 books to sell piece by piece, one or 2 at a time.

This type of dealing makes local volunteer genealogists think twice before committing themselves to all the hard work and long drawn out procedures involved with making reprinted county histories available to the public.

And so, we officers of this society are "thinking twice" about starting this project. At least we can do nothing about it now until after the 1st of next year because we have another quarterly to prepare, etc. In fact, we need a little time for our own family participation at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

If a lot more family historians agree to support the project by January 1st, then we may reconsider and take the steps necessary to do a reprint of that valuable family history book next spring.

Genealogists who do not give personal dedicated service to local societies, should show their support for such dedication of a few people by purchasing such reprints and donating them to a library so that other family historians coming along later may enjoy the benefits when a particular reprint is no longer available to the public.

A lot of people say "I want to wait and see what it looks like first". But that is then too late to get a copy, for not-for-profit organizations cannot afford to stockpile books for future unknown needs.

For those of you with Stice-Wilson family history lore saying you descended from James Wilson, Signer of the Declaration of Independence from the Province of Pennsylvania, forget it. You descended from another James Wilson who was in the Revolutionary War. We have a lot of Stice Family history on hand for anyone who is interested.

Do you know the name of Paul Revere's horse? Was it 1) Tony, 2) Silver, 3) Brown Beauty, 4) Man O'War? The Chicago Daily News reporter (9/30/1975) found a genealogy of Deacon John Larkin, of Charlestown, Mass. It seems that Paul Revere borrowed the horse, for his most famous ride in American history, from Samuel Larkin who was John Larkin's father. "Larkin, Samuel; born Oct. 22, 1701; died Oct. 8, 1784, aged 83: he was a chair maker, then a fisherman, and had horses and stable. He was the owner of Brown Beauty, the mare of Paul Revere's ride. . . ."

As Longfellow might have said, "hardly a man (or bee) is now alive who remembers that!" But I wouldn't be surprised if we don't have some one of our members some day who might "tie into that one."
