Attached is a copy of the reading of the FLINN CEMETERY which is located in the northeast corner of Morgan County, just south of Cass County and west of Sangamon County. It is approximately 1 mile east of Prentice, Illinois and can only be reached through a field or pasture. It is in the northeast quarter of Section 7 Township 16 North Range 8 West of the 3rd Principal Meridian. I chose this cemetery to clear, reset, read and publish the stones because people are buried here or have relatives living today in the three counties mentioned which are the three counties in which I have lived.

This cemetery contains the graves of at least 72 named deceased which are carved on 66 headstones plus 4 more for whom we found only footstones.

Approximately 200 hours were spent in preparing and carrying out this task which is what I am using as my service project to earn the rank of Eagle Scout in the Boy Scout program. I hope you will like what I have done and write my Scoutmaster Troop 312, Mr. Larry Swartz, 36 Friars Lane, Springfield, IL 62704, to let him know.

W.L.C. infant son of W.C. & M.J. Owen, died July 28, 1865, aged 8m-15d

Infant daughter of J.W. & C.A. Owen, died June 11, 1882 (no age on stone)

Willie Clarke, born February 18, 1874, died August 11, 1874

(the carved spelling of the last name reads Clarlie - both boys on one stone - broken off base)

Eddie D.W. son of D.W. & O.H. Clarke, died July 20, 1872, aged 2y-8m-9d
(carving different than above stone - spelling of name is Clarke)

Franklin M. Flinn, July 1, 1841, August 22, 1901 (on north side of large stone)
Z.W. Flinn, born in Surry Co., N.C., died December 1, 1868, aged 73y & 16d
(on west side of large stone)

Elizabeth Flinn, January 26, 1803, August 4, 1889, wife of Z.W. Flinn (on south side of large stone) (all three listed on this one large stone)
(Troop 312 replaced the top piece of this stone after repairing it and drilling a hole in it to anchor it to its base)

Eddy son of Isaiah & M.E. Strawn, died April 30, 1862, age 7m-22d

Maryetta wife of Is Strawn, died September 22, 1862, aged 17y-10m-6d

Edmund M. Flinn, died June 9, 1878, aged 27y-11m (no days on this large stone that is between the stones of two wives of I. Strawn)

Elizabeth M. wife of I. Strawn, died January 2, 1861, aged 29y-14d

Nancy H. wife of Joseph Hays, died September 28, 1841, aged 15y-10m-12d

Joseph L. son of Z.W. & E. Flinn, died November 8, 1839, aged 1y-2m & 2d

Rebecca A. daughter of Z.W. & E. Flinn, died November 2, 1833, aged 11y-12d
(earliest death recorded on stone in this cemetery - stone is broken)

Clinton son of D. & L. Flinn, died June 22, 1864, aged 3y-4m-18d

ROW 4 - running from South to North

Ralph W. son of J. & V. Hudspeth, died November 25, 1880, aged 11y-6m-17d

Sarah wife of Ralph Hudspeth, died August 15, 1891, aged 81y-10m-15d

James Hudspeth, died September 11, 1849, aged 11 months (no days on stone)

Ralph Hudspeth, died October 23, 1851, aged 82 years (no month or day on stone)

George Hudspeth, died October 28, 1861, aged 29y-4m-11d

Martha wife of W.G. Hudspeth, died Sept. 21, 1878, aged 24y-7m-23d

Lillie May daughter of W.G. & M. Hudspeth, died Nov. 16, 1878, aged 4m-26d
(both on one stone - broken off original base)

Short stone in concrete base - is probably a headstone but is not legible!

William E. son of W.T. & S.A. Adkins, died February 16, 1872, aged 2m-22d
(uncovered this stone and stood it up on a large concrete base that is
just north of Joshua & Elizabeth Adkins' stone)

Little Maud daughter of B. & E. Berry, died April 14, 1870, aged 6m-2d
(probed and located this stone near this concrete base that we also
set it on with William Adkins' stone)

N.A. - footstone (we did not locate a headstone to go with it - it is also
on concrete stone with the two listed above)

ROW 7 - running from North to South

Cerseley wife of Thomas E. Woosley, died Mar. 26, 1847, aged 40y-11m-4d

Eli W. son of G.M. & M.A. O'Banion, died December 1, 1857, aged 5 years
(no month or day on stone - the apostrophe is carved on this stone
in the surname)

George M. Obanion, died Sep. 15, 1853, aged 26 years (no month or day on stone)

Infant son of G.M. & A. Obanion, died Dec. 4, 1850, aged 14 days

G. Obanion, died Jan. 13, 1841 (stone broken in half here) aged 33 years
(no month or day on stone)

ROW 8 - running from South to North

Hannah wife of Vinson Standerford, died June 12, 1854, aged 52y-3m-28d
(this headstone is broken in four pieces and is piled on a group of
fieldstones that is near the southeast corner of the cemetery)

Mother - Julia A. Guinn, 1820-1880 (south side of stone)

Father - Stephen P. Guinn, 1814-1876 (north side of stone)
(this newer stone is the farthest north of any stones in cemetery)

ROW 9 - running from North to South (in southeast corner of cemetery)

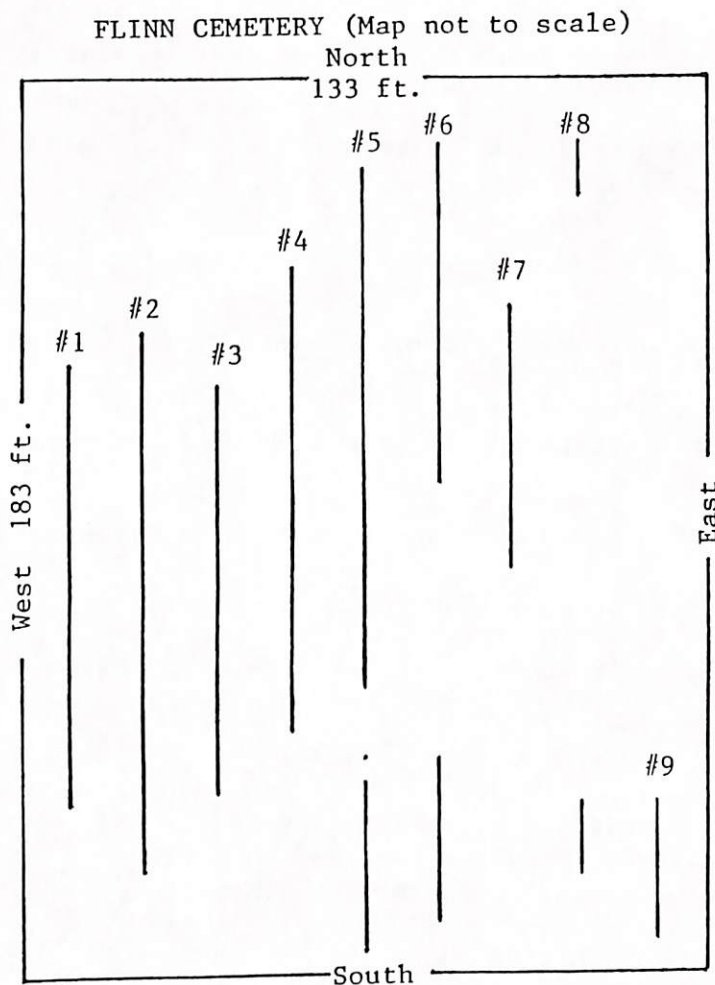
Sarah wife of S. Wilson, died August 22, 1856, in the 40 yr. of her age
Sarah E. daughter of S. & S. Wilson, died ? ?, 1856 (bottom of stone
broken off and not located - this mother and daughter are on this
one tall stone)

tree because where the footstone is located, it appears his headstone
should be exactly where the tree is located)

Sarah C. daughter of N. & M.E. Keiser, died May 17, 1858, aged 23 days

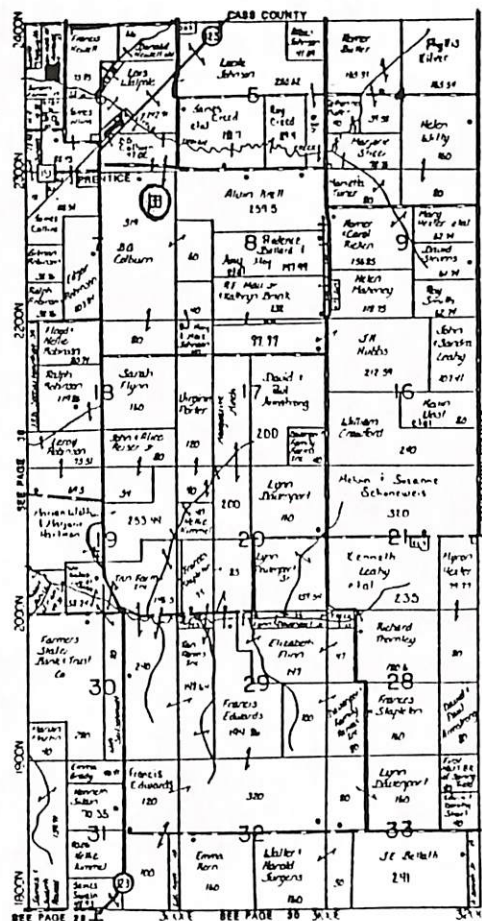
Malinda J. daughter of N. & M.E. Keiser, born March 12, 1862, died

WILLIAM J. CRAIG, farmer and stock dealer, section 13, was born in MORGAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS, January 26, 1835. His parents, MOSES H. and SARAH (HUMBLE) CRAIG, were both Kentuckians by birth. William J., spent his youth on his father's farm, and was educated in the common schools. He was married in his native county, April 6, 1854, to MISS SARAH A. POINTER, a daughter of WILLIAM and ELIZABETH POINTER, of Morgan County. After he farmed two years, and then moved to Hancock County, where he resided three years, going thence to McDonough County; here he tilled the soil and handled stock some seventeen years. In 1879 he sold out his property in Illinois and came to Missouri in the spring of that year, purchasing his present farm in Cass County (Missouri). He has 330 acres of land in a good state of cultivation, a large residence, a good barn, and a young orchard. The farm is fenced principally with hedge. Mr. and Mrs. Craig have five children: TABITHA, (now MRS. AARON THOMAS), SARAH LOUISA, (now MRS. NATHAN PRESTON), GEORGE N., WILLIAM ROBERT and FLORA PEARL.

THEY CAME TO OUR TOWN

A Story of Orphan Train Children

A little over a hundred years ago, four children came from New York to find a home in Scott County, Illinois. It is quite a remarkable story.

It began in New York City in 1888. At that time the city was teeming with immigrants, many of whom were struggling to get started in America. There were many children running the streets and causing much concern to the authorities. These children were orphans, half-orphans (one parent only) or children whose parents could not, or would not, care for them.

Several organizations: the Children's Aid Society, the New York Foundling Hospital, and the New York Juvenile Asylum were formed to help these children.

The thinking was that these children could be taken from the city and placed in an environment where they would have a chance to live and make something of themselves. As a result, they were sent into rural areas where families would open their homes and hearts to these children. The family taking a child agreed to raise that child as a member of the family, sending him to school and church until the age of 21 - a girl until she was 18.

Placing agents visited farming areas where people might be interested in taking a child. Ads were also placed in local newspapers promoting the taking of children. Notices would then appear in the papers announcing the time of arrival of the Orphan Train. Anyone desiring a child, placed an application with the local screening committee.

The children were sent out by train in companies under the supervision of a placing agent. When the train arrived, the families gathered at the advertised location. The placing agent would explain the work of the institution the children were from and then introduce each child and give some of his background. The families were then allowed to talk to the child they were interested in and make their choice. The children who were taken went for a trial period. If, at the end of the time, both the family and child were satisfied, the child would remain with the family. The New York Juvenile Asylum and the New York Foundling Hospital required that an indenture be signed.

If, at the end of the trial period, the family or the child felt that things would not work, the child would be moved to another family. If a child was not chosen at a given train stop, then he was taken on to another town.

The children coming from New York to Scott County were three children by the name of Schmidt and one by the name of Coughlin.

The Schmidt children, Charles Augustus, Henry Herman and Annie, were the three oldest of five children born to Henry Herman Schmidt, Sr. and his wife.

The parents were born in Germany and married there. The children were all born in New York City after the parents came to America about 1873. The father died and the mother could not care for them.

They were picked up by the police as vagrants. If the parent did not take better care of them, they were placed in an orphanage and then sent West. This is what happened to the three oldest Schmidt children (the mother kept the two younger children).

The train arrived at Winchester, Scott County, Illinois, where the Coughlin child and the Schmidt children were chosen by families. (How many other children were in this company I do not know).

Henry was taken by Elder John H. Taylor, a minister in the Primitive Baptist Church. Elder Taylor wanted to know about Henry's family name, Schmidt. It was explained that Schmidt was German for Smith. Mr. Taylor said, "Smith is good enough for me". To this day Henry's daughter goes by the name Smith. (Interestingly enough, when Henry married he used Schmidt).

Annie Schmidt was taken by Allan Taylor, the son of Elder Taylor. After a time, Annie felt she had to work too hard at the Taylors' so, after seeing an ad for dairy maids in Minnesota, she asked to be allowed to go there to work. The Taylors agreed, but it was not long before Annie asked to return. She had found out what hard work really was on a dairy farm. The

Taylor's allowed her to return and there was no more talk of "too much hard work". Annie Schmidt/Smith married and had two children. She and her husband lived in the Jerseyville area. She lived to be in her 90s.

Charles Augustus was taken by the Ed Norman family who lived at Oxville not far from Winchester. He was concerned about his mother, so he saved his money to return to New York. One day when he was sent to town in the horse and buggy with some milk, eggs, and butter, he sold the produce, and sent the money and the horse and buggy back to the Normans with a neighbor. He purchased a ticket with his savings and returned to New York. Years later he migrated to Texas where he became a successful business man.

Henry stayed with Elder Taylor until he had finished his indenture. He married and he and his wife had one child, a daughter. Henry clerked in grocery stores and was a janitor at the local grade school when he died in a car accident.

Each year the placing agent wrote to the guardian and to the child asking for a report on his progress in school and his home situation. Some of these letters were published in the yearly report put out by the Juvenile Asylum. The following three were Henry's, printed in the reports for 1893, 1896 and 1899.

"From Herman Schmidt, aged Thirteen, Came to Illinois in 1889.

'I was taken to the Asylum when I was six years old, and after staying there two years I came to Illinois. My guardian is a Baptist preacher and a farmer, and I like to live on a farm, and I thank you for getting me such a nice home. I have everything I want, and I go to church lots, and I have lots of fun, and I learn a great deal at school. I did not go to the World's Fair because it cost too much money. I have a pig that weighs two hundred pounds, and a nice calf, and I have a good many papers and books to read. My guardian owns 140 acres, and we have eight horses, seventeen cows, and sixty hogs. I will close by thanking the Asylum folks for helping me when I was too young to take care of myself.'

'Mr. J.H. Taylor, guardian, writes: 'We like Herman very much. He is obedient and willing to do his work, and is doing well with his books, and will make a good scholar, and we intend to send him to school as much as we can. His health is good, and he has grown rapidly since he came here. I think the Asylum is doing a great deal for the poor children.'

"From Herman Schmidt, aged Sixteen, Who Came to Illinois in 1889.

'The Annual Report which I have received, and read, brings to mind the Asylum life of my early childhood. Your letter is the best one I ever received. I shall try to profit by it, and I propose to stay with my guardians until my term of apprenticeship expires. They are kind and do as much as any boy could ask of them. I have a cow, and a two-year old steer, and I have just sold five hogs, which brought me thirty dollars, and I have fifty dollars besides that I have saved, and I shall keep my money until I can use it for something profitable, and I would advise all the boys to do likewise. The West is the place for the Asylum children, and I would advise them to come out here instead of going back to the city to become worthless outcasts. When they get good homes they ought not to ask for anything more. I go to school and church and Sunday-school, and I send my best regards to all the Asylum Directors and teachers.'
- P.O. Winchester, Ill." (1896)

'I have taken more interest this year than ever before in the annual report. As I look back to the condition I was in at the asylum, and compare it with my present condition, I can realize what the asylum has done for me in placing me where I have a chance to make a man of myself. I am still attending school and expect to finish my education this winter. I took the central examination for a teacher's certificate last spring and shall take the final next spring. My rank in the class is highest, and my last month's average is 95 and three-tenths. I have been in my home ten years and am perfectly satisfied and contented and always have been. I am in good health, and I would like to have you come and see my home and how I am getting along. I attend church nearly every Sunday, and though I am not a member I enjoy the services and believe it is profitable for me to hear the gospel preached.'

'Mr. J.H. Taylor, guardian, writes: 'Herman is a good boy, attentive to his work, and takes great interest in school and is well advanced in his studies. He has grown to be quite large and always has good health, and is as dear to us as our own children. He has always been truthful, and I believe he will make an honest man. He likes to work on the farm and will make a good farmer. I am striving to make a good and useful man of him, and I shall be very much disappointed if he does not turn out well.'
- Winchester, Ill." (1899)

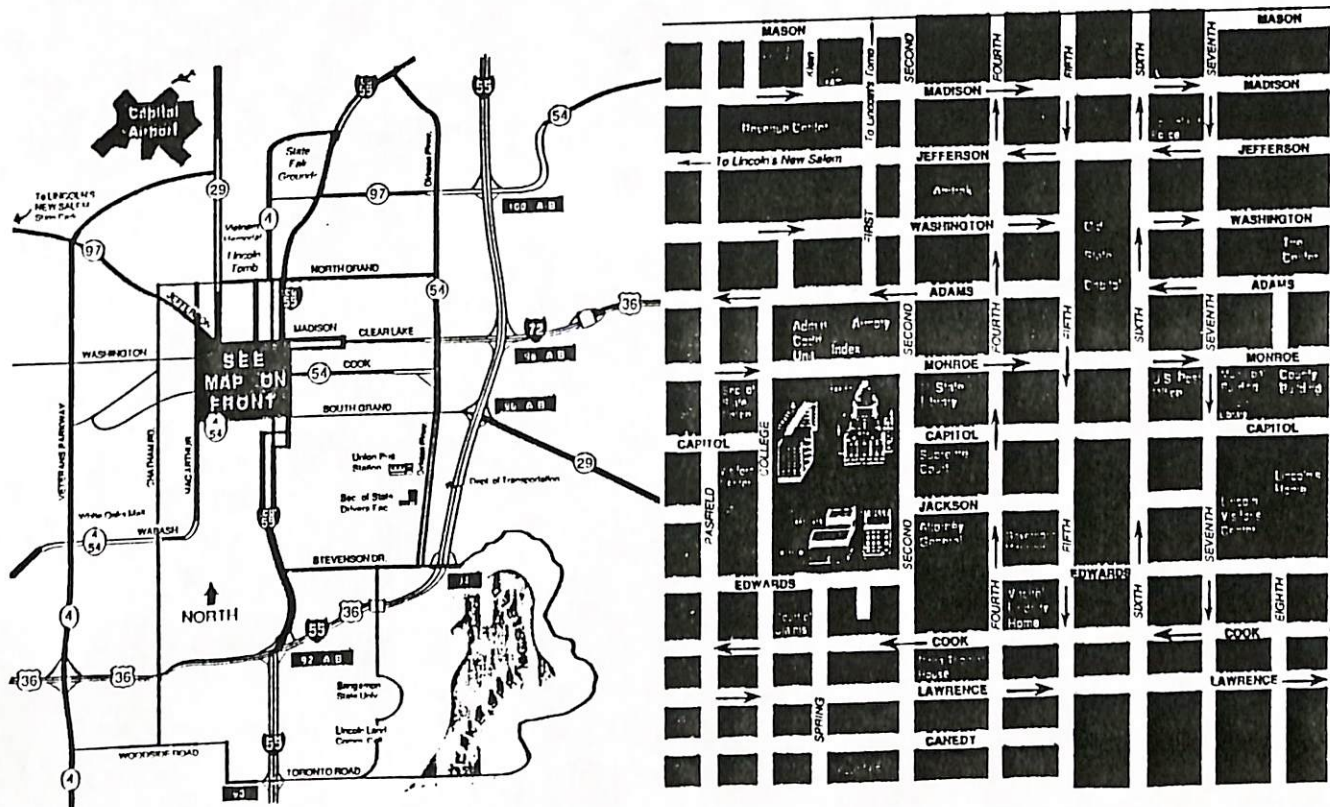

This particular story had a happy ending. Henry's mother finally moved out to Cole Camp, Missouri, where she had a sister. In time she remarried and Annie, Henry, Helen (Henry's daughter), visited there. Charles Augustus came to Missouri to visit and the family was to have happy times together.

Helen L. Smith, Henry's daughter, has pictures of the family and is happy to tell the story of her father's family.

The fourth child to come to Winchester was a little boy just five years old named Frank Coughlin, but that's another story.
