GREETINGS, my friends, wherever you are! from your Editor.

"'Tis the season", again, "to be jolly", or harried, as the case may be -- depending upon whether December is a month of pleasure, or a lot of effort to catch up on all you didn't get done the other 11 months.

It also depends on whether you like what you are doing -- no matter how busy, -- or you are doing something out of duty or traditional responsibility against your Will.

I hope that you, as genealogists, have learned the art of being very busy -- with pleasure. This is the present state of affairs with your Editor, as she struggles to put together the 4th Quarterly of 1975.

My sincere hope is that there will be some family history questions answered for some of you out there. I am truly sorry for all the letters from you that did NOT get answered, but am thankful for all those who did get a little boost up the family tree. Several wrote back to say how happy they were. These letters make it all seem worth while.

Your letters are all on file, and get an occasional "looking over". Our index files are increasing daily, and our chances of finding "missing perons" are getting better all of the time. Maybe some day YOU will be on CANDID LETTER!

By the way, Editor's "typewriter struck a wrong number" on the gray double-issue of June-August, with the map of Cass County on the cover. Please change the year to 1975 (instead of 1974) change the Volume to III (instead of II).

Please note that 1975 is the first year that we have printed 4 quarterlies; however, our JUNE-AUGUST issue counted for two of them.

In reality, all members new in 1975, by the end of this year, will actually have received 5 issues, since we sent them the August 1974 *Geneal Journal* also, as a special service to them, along with our 1972 Surname Index.

I would like to suggest that you "pull all issues of our Journal together", and review their contents. You may have missed something in an earlier quarterly that means more to you now.

Please remember that these booklets are "precious writing" -- no more than 200 copies scattered around the United States -- that they contain many records heretofore unpublished - nor available elsewhere -- that there are many people who might benefit from reading their contents if you made them available in other places than in a private home, buried under stacks of papers.

After re-reading them, xeroxing out what is important to you, perhaps you might like to donate them to some genealogical reference room, or a nearby library so that others may share them.

Or, you might start a "Round Robin" packet and exchange quarterlies with some other relative or friend. For inexpensive Fourth Class Postage you can send up to 1 pound for the same rate of postage -- did you know that? One of the legal requirements for "BOOK RATE" -- a book must be a minimum of 24 pages, with 3 staples, if so put together. All of our mailings meet this requirement.

Did you know that you could buy a dandý little scale at the Postoffice for weighing letters? It can be carried in your purse or pocket. It cost \$2.00 -- the last we knew!

For all of this dedication to keeping the name files straight, and addressing all of the hundreds of letters and large envelopes, and many other deeds of necessity, pertaining to an organization such as our Society, we owe a deep debt of gratitude to our Financial Secretary, Miss Lucille V. Crawford.

We also owe many thanks to numerous people for their indexing and other contributions, but we hesitate to name them, because we surely would leave out some very dedicated person's name. Your President wishes to publicly thank these members for their efforts on behalf of this very successful Society.

Your President-Editor has acquired a few new responsibilities with the Illinois State Genealogical Society, having been elected one of the nine Directors at the Fall Conference in Springfield.

I.S.G.S. President, Harold Felty, has also appointed her as Chairman of the 3-lady committee for New Society Guidance. We are sorry to lose our very capable former chairman, Barbara Dalby, who is moving to Florida. Another person is not yet named in the Northern Region.

A list of known societies, with their addresses, are at the back of this quarterly, after our 1975 List of Members of the Jacksonville Area Genealogical and Historical Society. We are giving this for the benefit of any of our readers who wish to write to a Society in the county of their ancestral relationships.

Your President was the happy recipient of one of the five plaques presented as a Local Service Award, to nominees whose names were submitted by their local societies, by the Honors and Awards Committee of the Illinois State Genealogical Society at the Fall Conference, in Springfield.. There were 18 nominees, and those not receiving a plaque, were given a certificate of recognition for the many splendid services each person performed for the local society of which they were a dedicated member.

Our Society has had two other recipients -- Mr. John King of Carrollton, in 1972, a certificate of recognition for the many Greene County cemetery records he turned in to us.

In 1973, our very avid family history researcher in Waverly received one of the 5 plaques of the Illinois State Genealogical Society. She is Mrs. Guy Martin (Myra).

In my remaining space I would like to include the cost of Wills here so that you can avoid unnecessary correspondence with our Circuit Court Clerk, Joe Casey. He has agreed to a set fee of \$2.00 for Wills, by mail, for which he will xerox however many pages there were. (The price has been 50 cents per page.) This office will return your check if the will is not on file. If you want a copy of the Petition for Letters of Administration, which I have found to be in most files, it would cost \$1.00 extra. It gives the date of death of the decedent, names of surviving heirs, and name of administrator or executor. These people are very busy with current court affairs, so please do not make any unusual demands that they help you with your family history. Don't miss reading the next page!

THE RISING LEGAL COSTS OF GENEALOGY IN ILLINOIS

A piece of legislation introduced by 5 legislators from Chicago, enacted into Law as of October 1, 1975, affects the whole state of Illinois down to the county clerks. Like music from a horn, this bill "went round and round and came out here", with a terrific impact on family history seekers.

At least in West Central Illinois, the price of birth, death AND marriage certificates has risen to \$3.00 each because of House Bill 681. The bill itself only raised the price of birth certificates, but the County Clerks, seeing this as a way to raise more revenue for their office, used it as a blanket to cover ALL vital records.

Your President was invited to be a guest of our County Clerk at the meeting of Clerks from West Central Illinois last month. She had an opportunity to speak, and probably helped the situation out with various understandings related to genealogical research. There are several problems we need to look at, jointly, and to work out solutions for. The big unsolvable one is lack of space for a valid researcher to sit or stand when looking at records. No courthouse is currently large enough, because of the pile-up of record books.

A second problem arises because vital records are supposed to be secret from 1916 forward. Most county indexes have included these with the older ones. As a result of our meeting, many of the clerks are taking steps to separate the indexes so that the ones from 1915 backward can be public, legally.

A third problem involves the researcher. Many County Clerks get very irked over those out-of-town researchers who come and stay for long periods of time, and "get in the way" of normal business procedures. May I suggest that genealogists heed this, and come and go, rather than spending a whole day in one office, if this seems to be situation. Many places this is no problem. It all depends upon the local set-up and personalities involved.

Another problem is the price impact H.B. 681 provides -- the researcher must pay \$3.00 for a certified birth certificate, and be legally entitled to one. If the name is not located upon search, the Clerk keeps the \$3.00 as a search fee, and the researcher gets a statement that the birth is not on file here.

The biggest problem is the terrible letter-writing by family history seekers! They write a long-winded spiel about how their grandpa came to the county in such and such a year, and a few other irrelevant statements before they finally mention the name of the person whom they are seeking. Believe me, busy clerks want to pitch the letter in the wastebasket. If they don't, it takes them a long time to find courage to pick up the letter again!

I suggested they use a high-liter pen and mark a pink line through the name, and the vital piece of information the writer wants, then they won't have to wade through all of that ink to find the name again when they look at an index. The biggest help would be if people who write would simply say: I need the birth certificate of _____, and give other supporting evidence known, and sign their name and give clear addresses. An SASE would help a busy Clerk.

One of the clerks solves the problem quickly by determining how many persons the letter-writer is seeking, and send them prepared forms for each one. She returns the letter to avoid filing problems. The form states the cost. If the person is still interested and fills out the form properly with remittance, then it is simple for the county clerk to search the records and provide the certified copies of the record. You can avoid one step now - send \$3.00 for each name you want, and be concise in your letter.

OF BOOKS AND THINGS -- NOT CABBAGES AND KINGS!

Our 1872 Atlas and 1894 Plat Map reprints we are selling as our second Bicentennial Project, are being delivered by Unigraphic, hopefully in time for Christmas. After about 150 had been delivered, they ran out of bindings, and had to order a new supply. This delayed delivery of some of the books. By the time you get this Quarterly, no doubt all purchasers will be happily reading their newest acquisition. We are very sorry for the delay, but the circumstances were beyond our control. The "book is beautiful". It was worth waiting for!

May I call your attention to THE TWO INDEXES! People easily find the one in the back of the book for the 1894 Plat Map. The index for the 1872 ATLAS is in the MIDDLE OF THE BOOK!

Just to show how valuable is the work of the genealogical volunteers, we estimated that if all of the wonderful people who helped with the indexing charged the going rate of \$3.00 per hour that typists get in this area, those complicated indexes would have cost \$1,000.00, and would have been prohibitive in cost to our Society.

Be thankful that we have so many dedicated genealogists in the State of Illinois who are constantly indexing, probing for lost records, and bring many records into printed form for the first time in history.

As you know, our first Bicentennial Project was the reprinting of the 1878 Morgan County History published by Donnelley, Loyd & Co. WE ARE SOLD OUT!

If you are one of those who missed out on the opportunity to have one of these fully indexed books at home for ready reference, please send us your name and address - NO MONEY - and we will put your name on the waiting list.

When we have 100 NEW SUBSCRIPTIONS, we can get Unigraphic to do a second print.

We need VOLUNTEERS FOR READING THE 1850 & 1860 MORGAN COUNTY CENSUS FILMS.

Jacksonville Precinct and Waverly 1850, are being read.

There are several other precincts someone could start on. Write us if you can.

The 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 Morgan County Census microfilms are at the Jacksonville Public Library. Also on one of the films, is an early POLL BOOK with names of individuals living in Morgan County.

George Caldwell and Mary Lou Whitlaw have finished the 1850 & 1880 Scott County Census records, and have donated their master copy to our Society. They are currently working on the 1869 Scott Co. Census. We do not have sufficient funds to publish these yet, but -- maybe next Spring?

Robert Dalton has "typed up", in excellent fashion, about 100 pages of Greene County Cemeteries, which could be used as masters for automatic offset printing. He has bound two books of his Morgan County Cemetery readings, and has placed them in the Jacksonville Public Library.

Mrs. Hutchison is making Surname Indexes for the several Scott County cemeteries turned in to the Society by Mr. & Mrs. Chester Funk. She and Lucille Crawford are compiling a list of names of persons who have biographies in the *Historical Encyclopedia of Illinois* by Bateman and Selby, and Short's *History of Morgan County*, ca 1905. Mrs. Hutchison has an index of biographies and portraits in Gridley's *Sketches of Cass County*, a copy of which is in our Jacksonville Public Library.

If any of our members are doing ANY INDEXING, please notify us, so that we won't duplicate what someone else has already done. We have just learned that Elizabeth Hardy is doing an every-name index for Chapman's *Portrait and Biographies of Morgan and Scott Counties*, 1889.

Aren't there a lot of interesting things going on in our genealogical world! Alas! now I lack space!

MOSS (WALNUT GROVE) CEMETERY¹

located about 3 miles west, and 4 miles north
Jacksonville, Morgan Co., Ill.

Code Number: MORG-S34-T16N-R11W-3PM-MORG-MOSS-ILL

This country cemetery² was named for a grove of walnut trees that formerly stood nearby. It is located southeast of Concord, and is on the north edge of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter Section 35, Township 16 North, Range 11 West, 3rd Prime Meridian. The farm formerly was owned by John A. Moss.

Although the cemetery can be seen northward from the road, it can be reached only by crossing private property. An unusual fact about this small cemetery, is that it has a source of revenue to help pay for maintenance. Lora Isabel Smith donated American Telephone and Telegraph stock for this purpose. The cemetery is fenced and maintained, with most markers being erect. Original records of this cemetery were burned about 1941 or 1942 when the home in which they were housed was destroyed by fire.

In September 1879 (Lodelia Sutton had graduated from Carrollton High School) when my mother was hired to teach school that fall. I don't believe the district school in that township was known only by a number. The Old Stone Jug School house had even then been there a long time. At the time it was built it had no windows. It was made of native rocks and the top was built rounded with a large sky light overhead. I have heard long ago that a heavy wooden door on top had at one time been used to let down over this sky light when not in use. But when I knew the old Stone Jug building it had a roof and windows. The window sills were wide and a nice place for a small girl to sit and look out at the horses and cows in the Bechdoldt barn yard.

In April of 1882 my mother and father were married and soon after the new school house was built. I believe it was called Pioneer School. My father started a store in the old Stone Jug when it was no longer needed as a school. The Farrow family lived at foot of Cole Hill and the George Bechdoldt family lived in the house Schwallensteckers now live. The rest of Eldred was one big cornfield.

My father was doing well in his store and when the railroad came thru he had the Post Office and of course it had to have a name. I don't know how the town was named, but it had to have a name no other town in Illinois had. At that time Kampsville was called Farrowtown, so that name was out, and there was a Bushnell, Ill. So the ones who came to vote on a name for the postoffice decided on the name Eldred.

After the R.R. came thru my father built a large grain elevator and the farmers shipped their corn, wheat and stock by rail instead of taking it to Columbiana to ship by boat. Then the town began to grow fast. In those first years of the daily trains Eldred began to be quite a busy and prosperous town. I have always been sorry my father could not have lived long enough to have seen even the first 10 years of the growth of what was once just one Stone Jug School house, one house and acres and acres of corn fields. But he did live to see the long talked of railroad come thru and the new school house built.

But he also had many heartaches. Rode home from Columbiana at dusk and found his home burnt to the ground and his wife and new baby at home across the road and other four children being cared for by neighbors. He died at age of 35 years.

And now we come to one of the nicest little towns in a beautiful location. nestled at the foot of hills where springtime brings folowering dogwood, redbud, and wild plum trees, while closer to the highway the wild flowers blossom. As one drives down the road to the Illinois River, the Calhoun hills lift their heads to the sky. Nowhere else can the sunsets be more beautiful as we look toward the west from the little town of Eldred. Nowhere else are the highways so lovely to us who live in Eldred as the one where we can "Lift up Our Eyes to the Hills of Home" and always behold beauty.

Altho Eldred is far from being a cornfield now, we can still vision how it once looked as we drive down the highway and see the acres of thrifty corn growing so lush and tall along the way to the river. And as we drive back we can see Eldred nestled at the foot of the hills and still we can look back and remember the Old Stone Jug as the first store and the old school house (then new) which was where I remember the first Christmas tree and the first big doll.

Papa stood me on a chair and I sang a song. A lot of you know more about Eldred that I do in this day and age, for I have been away a long time, until we moved back here nineteen years ago.

But I still think of it and remember how it looked so long ago when I was a child. Thank you for listening to my long ago memoirs.

There are Companies also listed D through K in this 1862 publication, but we do not have room to print the rest of them at this time. They will be continued in our next issue of the *JACKSONVILLE (IL) GENEAL JOURNAL*.

The following list of names is taken from an old Day Book that Arthur Crumrin, of Virginia, Illinois, found in an antique store in Springfield one time. He loaned the book to the Jacksonville Area Genealogical and Historical Society for awhile so that a list of names could be gleaned from its well-worn pages. Mrs. Virginia (Heaton) Gordon, great-great-grand-daughter of William E. Gordon, has made this index which is here printed. She believes that this Day Book came from William Gordon's store that he kept in the village of Lynnville.

The only identification in the book, was the word "Lynnville", which was on a torn page. Mr. Crumrin assumed it to be in Morgan County. Mrs. Gordon recognized the neighborhood names as being in the vicinity of Lynnville.

The major value of this book as a genealogical assist, is that it indicates that the following list of people lived in, or came to this part of Illinois at some point between 1833 to 1838, when the book was probably superseded by another like it. The dates given indicates the year or years that they purchased something and had it charged against their account. There were numbers that indicated that there was another account book, but unfortunately that book is lost to our use. Its whereabouts are unknown.

Of course it was quite interesting to note the various kinds of purchases by the various persons. The following prices are some as given in the Day Book:

Sugar, 12½ ¢ a lb.; Coffee, 20¢ a lb.; Rice, 8¢ a lb.; Tea, \$4.75 a lb.; 10 lbs. salt for 25¢; Eggs were 6¼¢ a dozen.

Irish Linen, 75¢ a yd.; Print, 22¢ a yd.

A thimble cost 6¼¢; a silk handkerchief, \$1.00; a pr. of shoes for \$1.25.

To shed a little light on the Lynnville community, the following history is taken from the 1872 Atlas Map of Morgan County, 1872, page 56, Township 14, Range 11, 3rd Prime Meridian.

This township "was first settled by Doctor Caldwell in the spring of 1820, where he made an improvement about one mile south of what is now known as *Allison's Mound*; and the first court held in Morgan county was held at the house of Dr. Caldwell.

Other early settlers were A.M.Liebe, William Gordon, William Coultar, after which settlers flocked in quite rapidly. First marriage was that of Charles Harrell to Miss L. Caldwell, and Elizabeth York was the first child born. The first death was the wife of Charles Harrell. The first church was built in the village of Linville, in 1839; anterior to that time, preaching was held at private houses and school houses. Peter Cartwright was the first regular preacher. First school house was built in 1830. William Brisbane taught the first school at his own home. In 1830 Adam Allison built the first mill for grinding grain (tread mill). First saw mill was built in 1859 by William Anderson and Henry Shirtcliff. Edward Shirtcliff sold the first goods in the town of Linville, which is now a promising little village."

On page 74, in the biography of John Carter, born in West Virginia, 20 September 1822, we find that in 1851 he formed a co-partnership with John Gordon, son of William E. Gordon, in a mercantile business at Lynnville, which exists at the present time (1872).

DO YOURSELF A FAVOR NEXT TIME YOU ARE MOVING BOOKS

Have you ever gone to a library or courthouse doing research, and came home with a sore throat, "sinus difficulties", and an aching back? Do yourself a favor and learn how to handle books and natural dust accumulations; and while you are about it, learn proper body mechanics - or, how to stand properly - when moving large heavy books from shelf to table, and vice versa. (A good researcher always puts things away, doesn't he, or she?) You can prevent a lot of pain by practicing good body mechanics pertaining to weight distribution.

Let us say you are in a courthouse looking at those heavy deed indexes that are under the counter, or on a nearby shelf. What is your usual procedure for putting them in position to read? Think about your procedures of moving them.

1. Find the book you want to look at. Don't just grab it up at this point.
2. Find the nearest spot available to which you are going to take it.
3. Clear surface ready to put book in place.
4. Unload yourself of purse, other books, etc., -- certainly do not keep your heavy purse straps over your shoulder, or arm, ladies.
5. Stand with your feet spread apart. (In the first place, wear low-heeled "Old Mother Comfort" shoes when doing research and standing on your feet.) Never lift ANYTHING with your feet close together. Always notice this stance before you put the weight of the book on your arms.
6. Grasp the book firmly at both ends, after rolling it part way out. You can get better balance by grasping things at center of gravity.
7. Tighten your lower back muscles, hoist the book off the shelf, and with a mighty swing, get it to the table top. But -- do not slam it down hard on the table! That action scatters dust all over the room!

If you want a good sore throat when you get home, just be careless with books and spread dust right into your line of breathing. Ever see dust particles in the air when sunbeams shine in a room? Shake something linty in that beam and see what happens. And don't forget - the air around your nose is just as linty!

Never flip pages of old dusty books before your face. Turn the pages gently, and AWAY FROM YOU, or you will cause more dust and lint fibres to flow into your breath stream, and settle right down into your throat and sinuses.

That's it -- your own carelessness -- and dust, not "cold germs."

And don't forget to practice THE LIFTING STANCE -- your feet apart, so that the weight will not overbalance you, and twist your spinal column in the wrong direction. YOU take charge of your spine - don't let it control you.

Remember to do this EVERY TIME you move that heavy book -- taking it down off the shelf, or putting it back! Happier researching!
