Bell demonstration set for Tuesday

Sunday, August 16, 1987

The Morgan County Courthouse bell will be demonstrated Tuesday, Aug. 18, beginning at 9 a.m. and continuing throughout the day.

The bell is only the beginning of restoration of the courthouse tower, according to the Jacksonville Emblem Club, which is handling the project. The next item to be restored will be the clock atop the courthouse, which will be coordinated with the bell to ring on the hour.

Jacksonville has had no town clock since 1883, according to the club, when fire destroyed the Presbyterian Church, where the Journal Courier is now located, which had a bell tower and clock.

The cost of finding and buying a clock to be used is expected to be well over \$5,000. The club also plans to restore the walls, install adequate lighting and furnish the small rooms in the decor of the period.

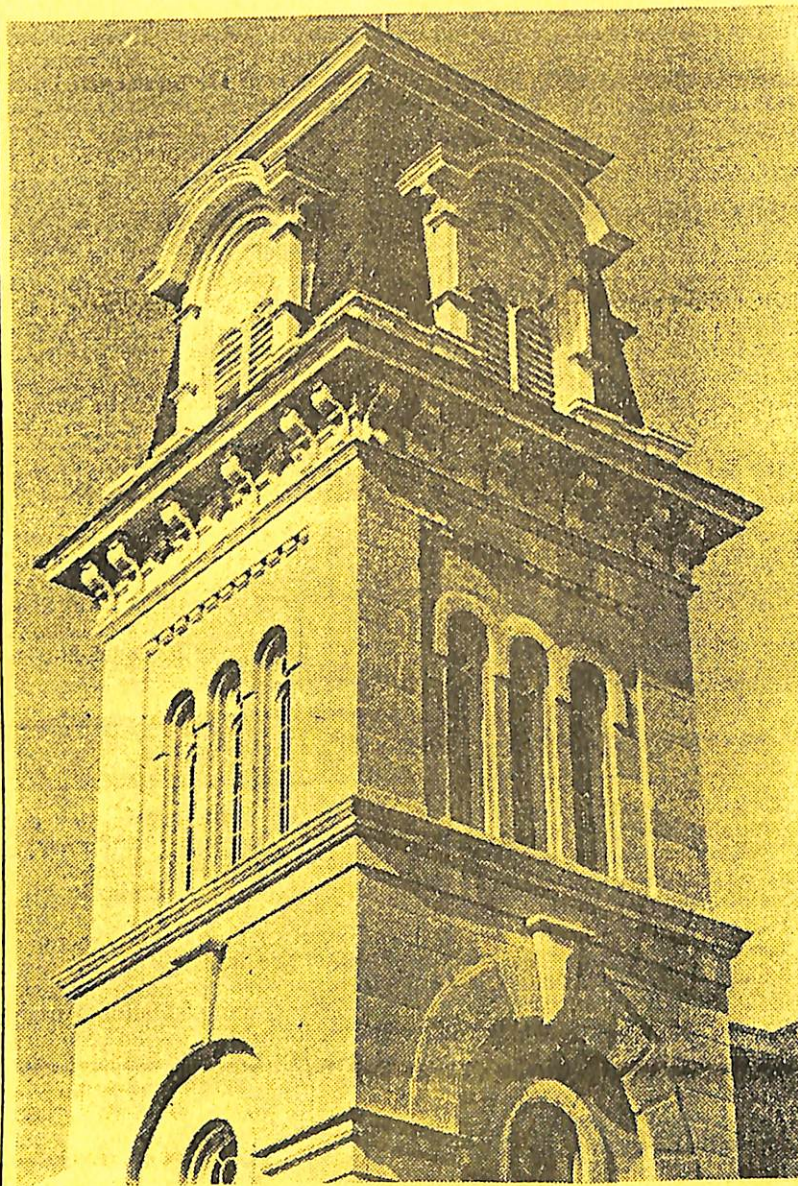
The Emblem Club hopes to make the site into a historic spot, and is seeking continuing community support for the project.

Each member receives a card; however, each family receives only one copy of our quarterly the Jacksonville IL Geneal Journal published for March, June, September and December.

Memberships received late in the year will be sent all four quarterlies for that particular year. Dues will again be payable on or before January 1 following. Back issues of our quarterlies from 1979 to present are available for \$10.00 per year, which includes mailing charges.

Students in grade or high schools may wish to receive family history assistance from our experienced genealogical researchers. They will receive a card and the quarterlies at the reduced rate of \$3.00 per year.

Each member should file his or her Lineage Charts with our Society. Sometimes we are able to put individuals together who are working on the same family lines from our extensive Surname Index.

MEETINGS: Any interested person, member or not, is welcome to attend our meetings on the 4th Thursday nights. Doors open at 6:30 for registration and visiting. Meetings start at 7:30 p.m. We are currently meeting at the Northminster Presbyterian Church at the corner of Fayette and Court Streets.

LETTERS OF INQUIRY: Names sought and name and address of person making inquiry is included in our Society's news articles. This has proved to be a popular feature, and is read widely since our notices appear in several area newspapers.

YOUR OFFICERS AND BOARD MEMBERS APPRECIATE YOUR SUPPORT as indicated by your friendly letters and donations to our Library Fund which is growing rapidly. And so are the expenses of maintaining it at the corner of Fayette and Morgan. Mary Frances Alkire is the Librarian.

Membership dues and donations are our only way to pay for the ever-increasing costs of publishing and mailing our popular quarterly. It contains hundreds of names for several counties in West Central Illinois over the years. Most of these records were never before available for public use.

IF YOU ARE AN OUT-OF-STATE RESEARCHER, please be informed that under a 1973 Illinois State Law pertaining to the Vital Records of Birth, Marriage and Death, the Illinois County Clerks will require you to have a membership card from some Genealogical Society in Illinois before you will be permitted to search these vital record indexes. This does not apply to Deeds, nor Probate Records in the offices of the Circuit Court Clerks.

PLEASE USE LONG (business-sized) ENVELOPES when requesting genealogical materials in order to avoid so much folding of important family records being sent to you.

Dear General Members and Friends:

[From your Editor, September 4, 1987]

As I review the contents of this quarterly, and appreciate the indexing assistance of several of our members, we send it out with our best wishes, and have high hopes that there will be some helpful information "for somebody out there".

It is not easy to select a few items from many possible research inclusions for a booklet of this size that will be read and/or enjoyed by numerous readers with many different stations in life, research abilities and desires for ancestral information. All we can do is present that which will fit the white space of 20 sheets of paper, and wish that it could be much more. But the problems of cost and time taken to put together 750 quarterlies and prepare them for mailing to about 650 members in 40 states and Canada is too expensive, and is causing our financial reserves to dwindle more rapidly than is desirable.

Somehow, or another, many of our quarterlies mailed at Bulk Rate are not delivered to some of our members. We request address changes and guarantee return postage. Then by the time we search out the reason for non-delivery, and re-mail the quarterlies when possible, our expense per quarterly has risen to about \$2.25 extra each. Many times the postoffice must lose sight of our quarterlies and they are swallowed up in their vast pile-up of undelivered third class mail without ever knowing that we guarantee return postage.

A letter with first-class postage was mailed to me with one wrong number of the house, which would put it across the street. As well known as I am to the postmen it was returned marked "Unknown"!

All of you know your own address, and sometimes hurriedly jot it down without realizing that a reader can have a problem of interpreting your hasty handwriting, and may make an error in re-copying it to a piece of mail being returned to you. Please -- always write your name and address within your letter, as well as on the outside envelope, very clearly, and not hastily. Therefore, if an envelope becomes separated from the letter - as it sometimes does in our busy lives - we then know where to send our missives of concern and research.

The yearly dues to join our society have been low throughout the past fifteen organizational years. The costs of publishing has increased as time has passed, and with our library facilities expanding rapidly and needing more room for books, our needs for financial support is becoming quite evident. So, our Board of Directors voted to make a moderate increase of two dollars per year for regular and charter memberships in 1988. Please refer to the society information on the inside of the front cover, and on the enclosed pink membership sheet for 1988. (Our previous sheets have been yellow in color, usually.)

We owe much to our industrious librarian, Mary Frances Alkire, for arranging and re-arranging our collections as time passes, and many more books are added. When anyone from out of town visits our facility they usually say "My, you have so much more here than we do in our library!" This is very pleasing news to hear. And we appreciate any donations that they can leave our library.

We owe much to Eileen Gochanour who has published so very many genealogical and historical booklets for all the surrounding counties. She has donated copies of all her publications to our library, and to me for my use in trying to answer the large quantities of inquiries that comes to the society's Postoffice Box 21.

Since Eileen is currently busy typing some of her great projects we are not including a listing of her publications with this quarterly. Any new members who want a copy of her publications can write to us for one included in our earlier quarterlies.

That brings up another matter of concern. I may not always get your letters answered "in due time". Therefore, I would appreciate your sending me a personal reminder letter. My address, and those of our officers, are always on the inside back cover of our quarterlies in case you ever need one.

Space does not allow me to compliment other officers who are doing a great service and excellent job concerning their respective volunteer undertakings. F.H.

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Page 1: HISTORY AND "RECORD OF CHURCH MEMBERS IN THE M[ETHODIST] E[PISCOPAL] C[HURCH]
Jacksonville Station: Ill[inois] Con[ference].

The earliest known record book to exist was carefully photocopied and transcribed, with permission of the Church officials, by Mrs. Florence Hutchison, July 1987, so that this valuable early record of local residents could be thusly preserved in more than one place and published, at least in part, for genealogical purposes.

Following is the early church history as given in the "History of Morgan County, Illinois: Its Past and Present . . ." page 373, titled by its present name. Published by Donnelley, Loyd & Co., 1878.

The Centenary Methodist Church is now the oldest congregation in the county. It was organized in 1822, by a few persons who held their meetings for worship in the large log cabin of "Father" Jourdan. It stood just back of the old Berean College building, and was erected here before Morgan County was created. Its members were scattered about over the country, many of them coming several miles to attend divine service. When the city was platted, in 1825, they were holding meetings in this cabin, and continued to occupy it until the completion of the log school house in which Judge Thomas taught the first school in Jacksonville. They worshiped in this log structure when not occupied by other denominations, until about 1830, when they erected a brick church, which stood on East Morgan Street, near East Street. This was the first brick church in the county. They worshiped in this building until 1838, or 1839, when they sold it to be used as a chair factory, and erected a more commodious church on the south side of East State Street, where the marble front now stands. This church was dedicated by Peter Akers, D.D., who preached the dedication sermon from the words, "This is the house of God, this is the gate of heaven." This house they occupied until the centennial year of Methodism in America, 1866, when they dedicated their present house of worship, at a cost of \$35,000.

The congregation, small at first, grew in numbers during all these years, and it was known as the Methodist Church of Jacksonville. When the Grace Church was organized, being on the West side of the city, it was called the West Charge, and the church of which we are writing was called the East Charge. By this name it was known until the erection of the present church, when it was, in commemoration of the year of its erection, called the "Centenary Methodist Church."

The first regular minister here was the Rev. Mr. Starr. Among his successors have been Revs. J. S. Barger, John T. Mitchell, Wm. M. Grubbs, Thomas Chandler, Chauncy Hobart, Wm. J. Rutledge, James Corrington, and others. The present pastor is Rev. English. This church is now one of the largest and most influential in the county.

* * * * *

The church is now called Centenary United Methodist Church, the oldest congregation in Illinois, founded in October 17, 1821. An ornate wooden pulpit, the gift of the Reverend Peter Cartwright, is a particular treasure of the Church in their secondary chancel.

Among the more famous of the regular worshippers in this congregation were Richard Yates, Civil War Governor of Illinois, and his son Richard Yates, Jr. who also served as governor of the state January 14, 1901-January 9, 1905.

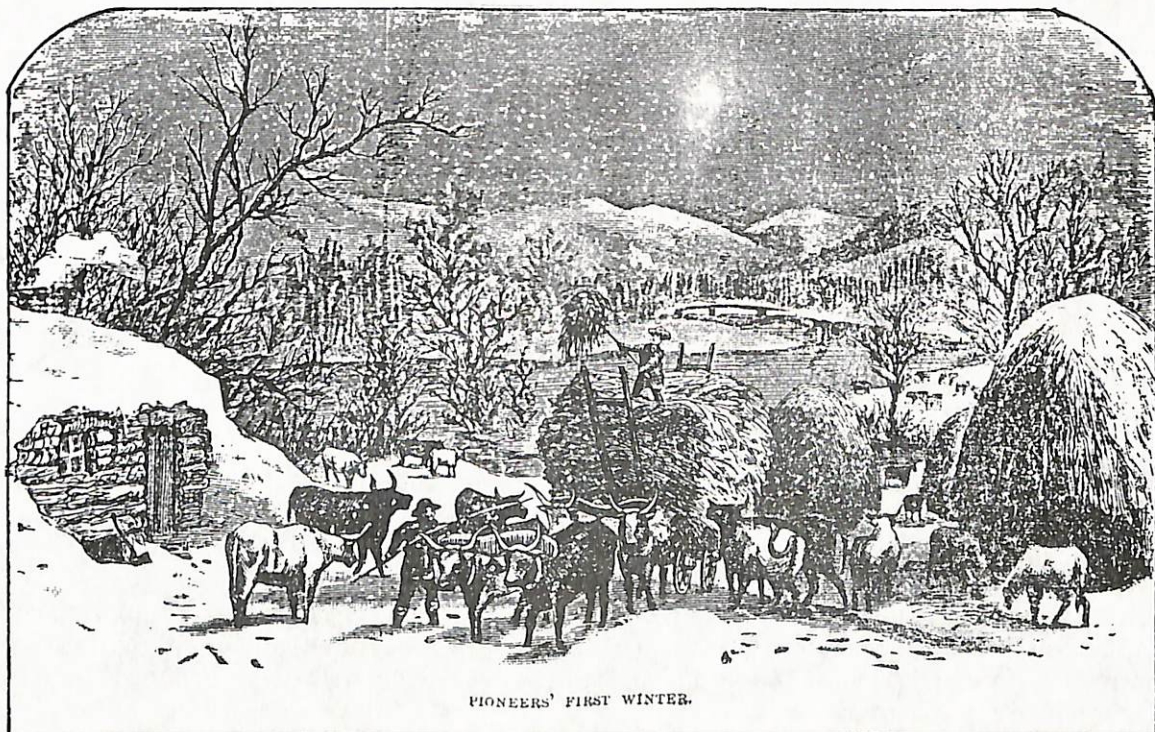

Richard Yates, Sr. was Governor of Illinois from January 14, 1861 to the inauguration of Richard J. Oglesby January 16, 1865. He died suddenly on November 27, 1873, aged 55 years, just a short time after he had received his new copy of the 1872 "Atlas Map of Morgan County, Illinois."

Our Society was donated this Atlas by the Wabash College Library in Crawfordsville, Indiana. Because our own Genealogical Library is needing funds for maintenance, we are proposing its sale -- if the price is right! Further details given on another page of this quarterly.

Under the provisions of an Act of the Illinois General Assembly entitled *An Act to tax gifts, legacies and inheritances in certain cases, and to provide for the collection of the same* approved June 15, 1895, was in force for all estates of deceased persons in the State of Illinois as of July 1, 1895.

Following is a letter found in the front of Inheritance Tax Record Book 1, hereinafter referred to as ITR#1, which gave the Classes and rates of taxes deductible from the estate according to its evaluation.

SUCCESSION ON INHERITANCE TAX.

Class 1--Tax \$1.00 on \$100.00. Taxable only on excess of \$20,000.00

Class 2--Tax \$2.00 on \$100.00. Taxable only on excess of 2,000.00

Class 3--on each and every \$100.00 of the clear market value of all property and at the same rate for any less amount:

On all estates of Ten thousand and less, \$3.00

On all estates of over \$1,000.00 and not exceeding \$20,000.00, \$4.00

Over \$20,000 and not exceeding \$50,000, \$5.00

On all over \$50,000, \$6.00

An estate which may be valued at less than \$500.00, should not be subject to any duty or tax.

* * * * *

Fortunately most of the pages from the Inheritance Tax Record Book 1 (ITR#1) had death dates included. Index cards were made by Eileen Pence from "hard-to-read" writing and figures. Florence Hutchison further researched the case files in the Probate Court archives for the rest of the dates and other data. A separate index will be made giving Case File numbers, Decedent and Administrator(s) or Executor(s), so that genealogical researchers may have access to further information than that which will be given in this Inheritance Tax record.

Cemetery 'adoption' program will also create records

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio — The Wood County Genealogical Society is going into the adoption business — for cemeteries, that is.

The society is seeking people for its "adopt-a-cemetery" effort, which aims to improve the appearance of the county's 77 graveyards and preserve vital historical records.

Society member Lolita Guthrie said some of the cemeteries date to the founding of Wood County in 1820, and contain the only record of the lives of some early residents.

The society is encouraging people who live near the cemeteries and those with family members buried in them to look after some of the graveyards, especially smaller ones that have been targets of vandals.

"We don't want to just save stones," said Guthrie. The historical information on the stones is also a major concern. "That was a human who did have a life and is part of someone's family history," she said.

Society members are currently recording information from the stones in each cemetery to save for family historians.

The genealogical society is directing people to township trustees and others in charge of the cemeteries. Guthrie likened it to a neighborhood block watch program, and said the society will have a booth at the county fair in August to highlight the cemeteries and recruit guardians.

The adopt-a-cemetery drive was prompted by recent vandalism at Oak Grove Cemetery, near the campus of Bowling Green State University.

Vandals knocked over 42 stones there.

This "Adopt-a-cemetery" news item came from *Genealogy Gleanings* in *Antique Week*, Mon. July 20 1987 page 17B.

The idea is very good, but hard to put in practice for current reasons of disputed land ownership, lack of fencing and who is responsible for its upkeep to avoid animal grazing. Then there may be inaccessability by usable road that would-be adopters face with modern-day farming practices and high land prices.

If there are descendants left they are usually reticent to spend their funds or time.

Many individuals are too old to do the actual work of restoring and maintaining an abandoned cemetery. They think that if they donate \$5.00 that their contribution will go a long way in helping with maintenance! They do not realize hired help is usually necessary, and that charges are much higher now than they used to be in W.P.A. days. It takes a lot of personal caring, fortitude and constant work for individuals willing to restore a cemetery. Would you be willing to undertake such a worthy project financially or work-eagerness? If so, this Genealogical Society will be happy to send you some literature on how to start.

Book shows how Jacksonville's past is reflected in its buildings

JACKSONVILLE — Jacksonville's rich and diverse history is reflected in the city's architecture, according to the recently published "The Legacy of Historic Jacksonville."

The book's introduction boasts that "the west section of Jacksonville contains virtually every style of architecture from the late 1820s to the present time."

Jo Anne Beard, a retired teacher, wrote and compiled the annotated catalog of 53 selected structures, working under the auspices of the Jacksonville Historic Preservation Commission. Three federal grants provided funding. The 156-page text includes numerous photographs, sketches, and period plat maps.

Initially, the commission's goal was to gather data from the city's east side to determine if there was justification to create a historic district in the area. In the process, the text also became a source book for the creation of walking tours by the Jacksonville Visitors and Convention Bureau.

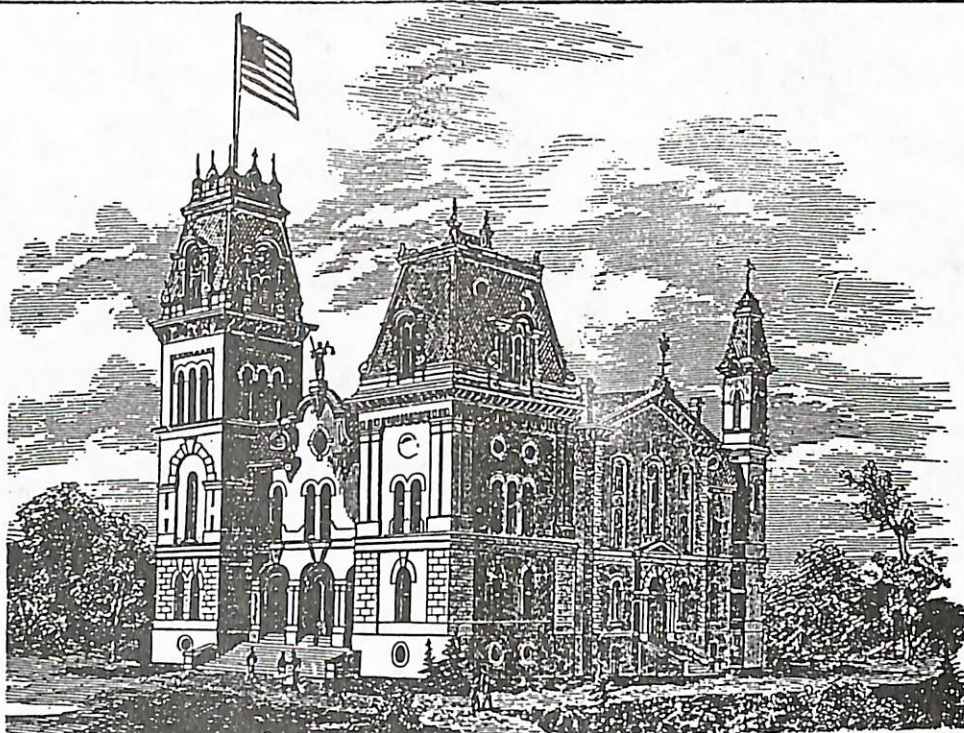
The book describes 24 structures to the east and 24 to the west of the Central Park Plaza. Five centrally located structures include the Civil War Monument, the old post office building, the public library, Labor Temple and the Morgan County Courthouse. The courthouse and Labor Temple were recently listed on the National Historic Register.

Delightful anecdotes are sprinkled throughout the text, illustrating the contrasting personalities of those who lived in early Jacksonville and contributed to the architectural landscape.

There is an account of Augustus Ayers' capricious decision to buy the plans for a house he saw from a train window in upstate New York. It is the two-story brick Italianate, built in 1857, at 876 W. State St., distinctive for its glass cupola and columned front porch.

And there is Alexander Platt, a building contractor and community activist in the late 19th century, who worked for the development of the east side "that it not be slighted as the new and expensive homes were being built on the west side."

Platt constructed many of the early buildings at the schools for the deaf and the blind. His own 14-room mansion at 907 Rountt St. (1872) is described architecturally as an "eclectic hybrid."



The Morgan County Courthouse in Jacksonville was completed in 1869. It combines two architectural styles — Italianate and French Second Empire.

Touring Jacksonville's historic areas on foot

JACKSONVILLE — A guide for walking tours of historic Jacksonville has been distributed by the Jacksonville Area Visitors and Convention Bureau.

The brochure includes a map showing three different tours ranging from 30 to 90 minutes. Brief descriptions of selected homes and institutional buildings are included.

All tours are circular. In the Central Plaza area, a brief tour includes the Morgan County Courthouse, public library, David Strawn Art Gallery and Farmers State Bank, a building that has housed

banking businesses since 1835 and was recently added to the National Historic Register.

Longer tours are suggested for the east and west sides of the city. The tour of the west side, on West State and West College streets, includes Governor Duncan's Mansion (1835), Illinois School for the Deaf (1839), and Illinois College. Founded in 1829, IC is called the oldest degree-granting college west of the Allegheny Mountains. The tour includes one of only nine known octagonal houses in Illinois.

A tour of the city's east side runs the length of East State Street,

which has historic buildings on both sides. On the west end is the American Gothic brick building of the Centenary United Methodist Church (1866). On the east end is an Italianate structure that was the home of Civil War hero Benjamin Grierson. Between are the Illinois School for the Visually Impaired (1848), MacMurray College (1846) and a dozen other historic buildings.

The Jacksonville Area Visitors and Convention Bureau is located in the Chamber of Commerce building, 155 W. Morton Ave.

"The Legacy of Historic Jacksonville", a 156-page soft-cover book features the Original Plat Map of Jacksonville on the back. Members who have our society's March 1983 quarterly have that plat on the cover, and a listing of all persons who purchased each of the 180 lots of the Original Town of Jacksonville, by your editor.

Meredosia festival to feature an array of activities

MEREDOSIA — The Meredosia Labor Day Burgoon Festival, scheduled Sept. 6-7, will focus its theme on the citizens of Meredosia — "where they lived, where they worked, where they played." A variety of activities are planned for the festival, including a Civil War battle re-enactment.

A Sunday morning breakfast at 7:00 at the grade school cafeteria, featuring biscuits and gravy, will start the festivities. A special community church service will be held at 10:30 a.m. at St. John's Lutheran Church, using a Civil War liturgy. Food service will begin at 11 a.m. in the pavilion, with fish, sandwiches, drinks and other foods being offered.

An historic display at the Mason Building will open at noon, focusing on people of Meredosia. An historical walking tour map will be available at the Mason Building for a cost of \$2. Featured on the Sunday walking tour will be the Schmitt Bros. Blacksmith Shop. Displays and tours end at 6 p.m.

Activities running both days will include kids games from noon to 2 p.m. in Boyd Park, bingo at 2 p.m., a craft and quilt show from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. at the grade school, a Civil War camp opening at 9 a.m., a flea market in Boyd Park, an antique steam engine display, and demonstrations by the Heart of Illinois Ultra-lights Club.

A Civil War pre-battle meeting at 12:30 p.m. and a battle re-enactment at 2 p.m. behind the high school will also be featured both days.

On Sunday, the Prop Kickers will fly their model

aircraft in the field east of the football field at 3 p.m. A display of their craft and a video will be in Boyd Park from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

An old-fashioned cake walk will be held in the park at 4 p.m. Sunday.

Sunday evening's entertainment will feature the Golden Road Variety Show at the Skinner Bandstand from 6-9 p.m.

Burgoon will be one of the main attractions at Monday's activities, with kettle service starting at 7 a.m. and bowl service beginning at 11 a.m. Monday's historic walk will feature the Historic Homes Tour from 1-5 p.m. Homes open on the tour will be the Skinner House, the Bushnell House, the Naylor House and the Hedenberg House. Admission will be \$1 at each house. The historic display at the Mason Building will open at noon, with tour maps available.

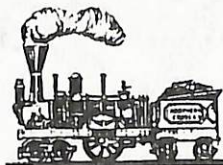
The first annual car show will start with registration at 9 a.m. and judging at 1:30 p.m. at the high school parking lot. A fine illustrated article introduced as "The Evolution of the Flag of the United States as a New National Government Developed in the North American Hemisphere 1776-1960" can be found in the June 1987 issue of *Jacksonville IL Genealogical and Historical Society*, P.O. Box 21, Jacksonville, IL 62651. Prepared by Florence Hutchison, a vexillological lecturer, the article was pre-

pared especially for the benefit of genealogical researchers so that they may better understand the progressions of their ancestors' migrations to new lands secured by treaty, and opened up to new settlers as they spread from east to west. Hutchison emphasizes that our national flag should always be referred to as "the flag of the United States," or the United Statesian flag — not "The American Flag," as no flag in this hemisphere is

entitled to that designation. ("There are about 38 national flags of equal importance in North and South America, including flags of several European nations flying over their territories and departments in our hemisphere.") Ten maps and flags of the United States are used in the article to show boundary changes at various periods in history. ✕

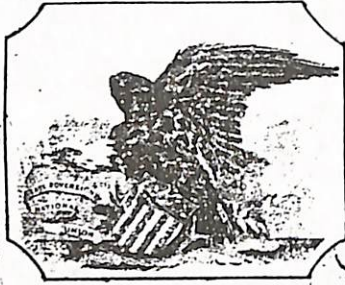

A casual inspector of a signature on a document, such as the one above, would consider this to be the correct one by Governor Richard Yates, Sr. as of the Civil War in 1863.

There are several on file at the Illinois State Archives. I was permitted to copy one to use in this quarterly.

Therefore, I made a quick judgment that he did not sign the 1872 Atlas Map of Morgan County, Illinois, but most likely another family member did.

Lowell Volkel, archivist, came up with a document to prove that the above signature - and others like it - were done by the Governor's secretary, S. Hirschbach, as noted on the letter dated March 14, 1863, to the left.

This gives us a good lesson on proving a signature. Who did it?

Pasted on back pages are two 1893 Illinois maps, in color, showing all counties and indicating Congressional voting Districts of that date.

Bids will close as of October 15th, 1987, and buyer selected. In case of duplicate bids, prospective buyers will be notified for additional information.

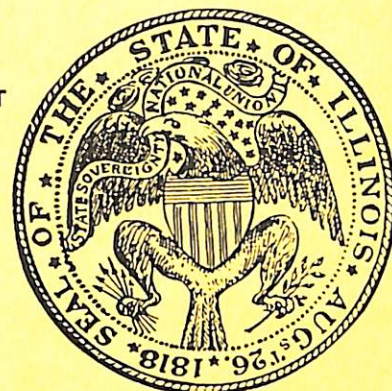
