- Have you ever heard of "grave-witching", similar to "water-witching"? One person, using two copper rods can find unmarked graves, it has been reported. The easiest and surest way is to use one of those metal finders. They go "zerp" when a metal part of a casket is located. And don't forget to take your binoculars along when reading tombstones. Stand away, at different angles, and you can read the words better than when close to the stone.

- Veterans records by mail, from Military Service Records (NNCC), National Archives, Washington DC 20408 now cost \$5.00, prepaid. Ask for NATF Form 26 first. When form is filled out send \$5.00 each if you want 1) Pension files; 2) Bounty Land records; 3) Military Service records. Asking for all 3 at one time is a good idea, however costly it is.

Another quarterly is on its way -- may its contents enlighten someone's day! Certainly many of our members' letters coming back, with nice comments and welcome donations to our typewriter fund, have brightened many a day for us, and inspired us to work harder to accomplish research and indexing of as many records as possible during our active years. It gives us a marvelous feeling to have touched, in some way, the lives of so many people! We hit the 500 membership mark as of the end of December 1981. Of course we have corresponded with many others who were not members, but inquiring about early families whose footsteps may have crossed our lands on their journeys further West.

We are particularly grateful for all of those *brave* dedicated people who go out and read the stones of our numerous cemeteries in our part of West Central Illinois, and who then types them, makes index cards for our files, and generously presents a copy to our Society. We are also making great progress in getting persons to form a Cemetery Association to reclaim, protect, preserve and care for old abandoned cemeteries.

The article "How To Start A Campaign To Protect Old Cemeteries", by Florence Hutchison in the NEWSLETTER of the Federation of Genealogical Societies offering to send data, is beginning to attract letters of inquiry from other states. Our legal Cemetery Petition to the Secretary of State is geared to Illinois State Law.

Should someone consider forming an association in another state, and wants to know what the cemetery laws require, and they can't find out, or do not understand what the lawbooks say, would you please photostat a copy and send to us for evaluation? Your Court Clerk or County Clerk would have a copy of the latest edition in his office. (Libraries do not usually have the latest editions). By looking in the index, one can find that Chapter which pertains to Cemetery Law. (Chapter 21 in Vol. III pertains to Illinois cemeteries.) But in view of the fact that it covers active cemeteries, and those rules which apply to Township form and government, and then laws that apply to the County Commissioner form of government, one has a problem of separating out the parts that apply otherwise.

"The little country post office at Bluffdale ten miles northwest of Carrollton was established by John Russell November 2<sup>d</sup> 1829. It was the third postoffice in Greene County. The first was Carrollton with John Skidmore, postmaster. The second was White Hall with Beverly Holliday postmaster; then came Bluffdale with John Russell for postmaster.

"The records of the postoffice department show that John Russell, succeeded Nov. 30, 1841 by his son, W.A.J. Russell, was again appointed Aug. 11, 1852 and served nearly eleven more years, then Spencer G. Russell, another son, was appointed February 3<sup>d</sup> 1863 and held the post office for more than 41 years until it was displaced by a rural route in July 1904. Thus for seventy-five years the postoffice was held by the same family.

"The writer of this article was born in the postoffice and lived there for 41 years. My first recollections were seeing Reasor R. Nichols bringing the mail on a horse from Carrollton. The mail was a weekly mail comming first on Monday and was afterward changed to Saturday." [No more pages in our collection.]

And now, in 1982, descendants of John and Laura Ann Spencer Russell still live in the same old stone house that was built in 1828 calling it Hobson's Bluffdale Farms. Linda, Bill and their 3 sons operate a farm-style Motel during the summer where city folks can get a taste of real farm life and Greene County hospitality and recreation.

The farm descended to them through Howard and Mary Keller Hobson. Mary was the great-grand-daughter of John Russell. She had carefully garnered all of the family possessions, old letters and memorabilia of the numerous years. It is in tribute to one of my dearest friends and closest historically-inclined associates that Ye Olde Ed is including some memoirs of these early Greene County citizens in this March 1982 quarterly. It is with sadness and a great sense of loss that I give the following obituary in the *Jacksonville Courier*, 1 Mar 1982:

Mary Hobson, 77, of Greenfield, died Sunday morning at College Station, Texas. She was born in White Hall, daughter of Philip and Nora Russell Keller. She married Howard Peter Hobson June 5, 1929, in White Hall, and he preceded her in death July 10, 1962. Survivors include William Hobson of Eldred; Phillip Hobson of College Station, Gene Hobson of Bryan, Texas, 11 grandchildren and one great-grandchild. . . . Interment will be in the Russell family cemetery north of Eldred.

It was always my intention to publish the Russell cemetery reading and send a copy to Mary. Now I do so in her memory, not only because of her, but because some of our quarterly's readers may have some of their long-lost relatives in this old Greene County cemetery.

Now I sadly can say "My bluebird is gone." Therein lies the tale of my acquaintance with Mary. I had lived for 10 years in Greenfield, in the meantime taking creative writing courses and doing historical and flag research of various kinds. In February 1965 on my trip to Oklahoma I learned about the "Betsy Ross Memorial Association 46-star Flag" that was reportedly lost when the USS Oklahoma was sunk at Pearl Harbor December 7, 1941. Manon Turner Atkins at the Oklahoma State Historical Library said "I do not believe that flag was on the USS Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor, I believe it is still at Independence Hall in Philadelphia where it was supposed to have been kept." I am a very curious person, especially where flags are concerned! Two weeks later I found it--right where it should have been!

Many times in the past when I was talking with people about historical matters, they said "Mary Hobson who lives east of Greenfield has a lot of history."



After the above incident someone said "Mary Hobson has an old flag." This got my attention fast, so I called her and she invited me out. This old flag turned out to be a 33-star homemade flag which draped the casket of her great-uncle Capt. W. A. J. Russell when it was brought home to be buried in the Russell Cemetery, facts which I was able to help her piece out. He was among the first casualties in the "Charge up Missionary Ridge" on November 23/24, in the Battle "above the clouds" at Lookout Mountain. (May I digress from my former line of thinking to include this interesting bit of history.) Capt. W.A.J. was a favorite officer, and the night before his men had presented him with a beautiful new sword. Being called out early next morning to charge, the men rushed to the top of the mountain through the clouds. Suddenly they were in bright sunshine, and when W.A.J. raised his sword for his men to charge the Confederates waiting for them, his flashing sword made him an easy target for the fatal bullet. It was the usual custom to fire-blacken swords in order that they would not flash, but W.A.J. had not had time to do this.

And then Mary began to show me the old family letters and other mementos that were in her possession. We had an immediate Mutual Admiration Society going! So, after searching for history in so many other places, I called Mary "my bluebird", after the story written by Maurice Maeterlinck titled "The Bluebird" in which a young girl went searching all over for a bluebird, never finding it. Upon returning home she found it in her own backyard! Mary then became a companion on many of my trips in giving lectures on flag history to organizations and schools in the area. We dressed her up in some of my aunt's antique clothing, as Betsy Ross, and she showed the audience how Betsy had cut out the famous five-pointed star, for George Washington and Company, "with one snip of her shears". We always proudly displayed her Civil War flag.

On one of my trips to the East Mary went with me and I took her to the old places in Vermont from which her ancestors had come. At one point we sat on a bridge looking upstream at the place where her great-great grandfather had once had a mill run by water power. We found some living relatives she was able to later correspond with, and went to the gravestones of her ancestors. She took one picture of me lying "belly-down" in front of a tombstone trying to read the last words. (I told you I was a curious person!)

Should any one want to look at some of the old precious letters she had from 1818 in Vermont on the trip across to Illinois, etc. they can look at the Russell or Spencer collection in the Manuscript Division of the Illinois State Historical Society.

Mrs. Walter Sanders, of Litchfield, did a thesis on the Life and Letters of John Russell who was a famous early Illinois writer and educator. She worked with Mrs. Hobson on this important historic documentary. Copies are on file, as far as I can remember, at the College in Charleston, and SIU branch at Edwardsville.

I have in my possession photostat copies of many of these letters, with the idea of writing a book on the life of John Russell, but that is one of the bypassed good ideas I have had to abandon with Time and other responsibilities.

Mary's sister, Annie Keller, was the famous teacher who saved the lives of her students in the Centerville School destruction during a tornado, but who lost her own. A monument on the White Hall Square stands today as mute testimony to this sacrifice. It was interesting to me when Mary related how Lorado Taft requested her to come to Chicago and sit as a model for his statue. From all of this first-hand information I wrote an essay for the annual creative writing contest sponsored by the Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs in 1977 on the achievements of an Illinois woman, which placed third in the competition.

"No soldier on the battlefield ever met a great crisis more nobly, more bravely than she. No patriot, celebrated in history and song, is more deserving than she of all the praise that her act has brought to her name, . . . and honor to the teaching profession." Thus was a country school teacher memorialized by State Superintendent of Public Instruction, Francis Blair, in 1927.

Annie Louise Keller, age 25, had spent seven years teaching three country schools in Greene County, modestly, efficiently, quite unnoticed, except for her many friends who knew and loved her for the sweet, jolly, fun-loving person that she was, until she met instantaneous death. The parents of twenty-one children and the entire nation paid homage to that bravery and wisdom which saved the lives of her pupils on that eventful noon-hour, Tuesday, April 19, 1927.

Her last words were "Get down on the floor under your seats!", and then a few seconds later "OH!" Fifteen terrorized grade school children, ranging in ages six to thirteen, obeyed their teacher although their greatest inclination was to run outdoors, except that "Miss Annie" barred the way. She had dragged some down to the floor on her way to guard the door, when a first-grade boy came running to her for comfort and protection. He threw his arms around her neck, and she had straightened up, holding a frightened boy close to her. At that instant the white-painted heavy oak door, complete with framework and lintel beam, directly in the path of the violent tornado, caved inward collapsing the building. Fortunately the high-pressured wind carried away a large part of the roof. Debris from the south front of the brick school piled inside, pinning down the youngsters, and the east and north walls were scattered across the yard and fields. Only the southwest corner, where the lunch boxes lay scattered, and a smaller portion of the northwest corner stood jaggedly reminding the eventual on-lookers that here once stood Centerville School.

The teacher's lunch-box lay crushed, as yet the food uneaten, an indication that she had spent her noon hour in concerned control of her charges during the wild winds, sucking and gusting around the corners, and the dashing rains and hail that preceded the disaster.

Miss Annie had let five pupils out a little early to go home for dinner, due to the warning signs of an approaching rainstorm. Ed Hobson borrowed a horse, raced home, and tied him to a stob on the corner of the farm scales building, and dashed into the house as the rain and hail started. While the family was eating dinner, they noted a loud roar. They were suddenly in the midst of a twister that ripped the south part of their house away. Ed and Howard Hobson, his older brother, rushed to the north window and noted that the scale house was gone, the unhurt horse still tied to his post of duty. But gone was the familiar Centerville schoolhouse, a prominent landmark, a quarter of a mile away.

Howard, fiance of Annie, hurried to the school. Other neighbors came from opposite directions. All had ignored the damage to their own homes to assay the loss of life at the school. Do you wonder at the adoration of Annie Keller when fifteen pupils were extricated from the rubble alive and relatively unhurt? For Annie the loving and giving of herself was over. When the door was lifted from their beloved teacher, they found she had died instantly having been struck on the head. Her left wrist and right arm was broken in her fall trying to protect the little boy, whose arms still hugging his teacher's neck, was found alive and unhurt.

Of all the structures in the path of the tornado which had swept across

Central Illinois leaving twenty-three human victims and hundreds of devastated homes in its wake, none suffered demolition more complete than the school which, since 1848, fostered the education of generations of children. Pridefully it had been pointed out by residents as the best-equipped country school in this part of Illinois.

Annie Keller had little time to think. The tornado had come from the southwest with the speed and roar of a fast train. Virginia Powell, nearest to her when the building fell, had followed her teacher to the south end, and had thrown herself on the floor with her little brother Howard at the teacher's command. "All I heard her say," Virginia recalled, "was for us to lie on the floor. When the door struck her I heard her cry 'Oh!' I was caught under a pile of bricks and couldn't get to her. I called to her, but she didn't answer."

Fellow students and teachers of the Illinois State Normal University recorded their tribute of honor to Annie Keller May 4, 1927:

Seldom is the human heart touched so deeply by the deeds of courage and loyalty, thoughtfulness for others, and forgetfulness of self as our hearts have been touched by the last act of Annie Keller. At a sacrifice of her own life, she bravely guarded and saved the lives of her sixteen pupils, . . .

We gratefully acknowledge our debt to Annie Keller. Her deed has reconsecrated the name TEACHER; it has raised high that name so that parents and all citizens will be elevated to higher levels of appreciation for the work of teachers, and of loyalty to the cause of education; it has moved us to recreate our ideals of personal fitness, duty, and loyalty in carrying forward the work in which her life will always be a beautiful and inspiring example.

We shall, therefore, cherish and perpetuate the memory of this devoted teacher and former fellow student here at the Illinois State Normal University, and shall consider it a privilege to join in the movement to create a fitting and enduring memorial of the heroic deed that has given her spirit an abiding place in the lives of others.

A beautiful monument seven foot high was erected in honor of Miss Keller in White Hall, from funds sent to the Memorial Committee. The \$5,000 sent from school children, organizations, and interested persons from all parts of the nation was used to buy the marble, and build a base.

Lorado Taft, noted Illinois Sculptor, donated his time and talents to the project. Annie's sister Mary, later Mrs. Howard Hobson of Greenfield, sat two times in his Chicago studio as his model for the carving of the figure. Taft was one of several distinguished speakers at the dedication of the monument August 25, 1929, on the second anniversary of the storm. Tendered an ovation when introduced, Mr. Taft said he always had a strange ambition to do something great and good for some town. He said that "everywhere, all about us, great and good things are being done which are unsung. I saw here," he said, "in the heroism of Miss Annie Keller, an opportunity to do something in honor of a more or less obscure young woman who gave her life without one thought of herself. The value of preserving that ideal appealed to me. The vision I had is set up in stone here. . . . I rejoice in my profession that makes possible this memorial to her if it becomes an inspiration to others, and perpetuates her sweet memory."

Twenty Centerville children formed a human chain around the covered monument on dedication day Sunday afternoon, August 25, 1929. At the signal for unveiling, the flag was drawn aside by representatives of the Army and Navy. All who could



see, were thrilled by the sweet character and magnificent purpose in the features of Annie Louise Keller memorialized in pink Tennessee marble. Out of solid marble is carved the bust, a woman of beautiful features, with face somewhat upturned to the southwest as though listening intently to the winds. Her left arm is clasped around the shoulder of a little girl who nestles closely to the bosom of the woman. The woman's right arm is clasped around the back and shoulders of an older boy. In his right hand is a strap holding his school books. The boy appears to realize danger, but feels safe in the clasp of his teacher's arms.

Editor V. Y. Dallman of the *Illinois State Register*, who had so ably aroused public sentiment for providing funds for the memorial, said in part:

All of us have caught the spirit of this hour. These children point the way. This marble breathes a sermon. Let us catch this spirit that moved the magic chisel in the master hand of Lorado Taft, and go forth re-dedicating our lives to the ideals this monument represents. May we always hear Annie Keller's voice calling to us in the winds. . . .

Out of the sky a tornado came;  
Death rode that dreadful storm;  
Out of the storm came a sacred name  
History to adorn.  
With it a challenge comes, sublime,  
Serve little children -- all.  
It echoes on the Wings of Time,  
Sweet Annie Keller's call:  
"Serve little children -- all!"

And thus it was, that a moment in history's Time changed the lives of many people, in one way or another. The monument still stands in White Hall's park. I wonder how many people now understand its inspiration and meaning?

Your Editor has a charming story written by Anne J. (Spencer) Barton, daughter of Mary (Smith) and Stephen Spencer who once owned the land now Diamond Grove Cemetery. She is closely related to Annie Keller and Mary Keller Hobson.

My friends want me to write my story. My parents were born in Vermont in a place called Vergennes. My father [Stephen] and mother [Mary Smith] were married July 10th, 1818. They came to this country in 1820. They then had two children, Marshal Smith and Mary Jane. Jane was a little baby when they left Vermont.

They came in an early day and moved here in wagons. My grandfather [Gideon Spencer] and grandmother [Elizabeth Winchell], and, also, my Aunt and Uncle. They stopped in Missouri [at Bon Homme in the American Bottoms] and staid a while, then they came to Illinois to a place called Bluff Dale.

Then pa moved to Morgan County to a place called Diamond Grove. There I was born August 12th, 1827, in a little log cabin. In the place of my home now stands a fine brick house.

There my dear father got shot in the arm, it was an axident. The gun slipped out of his hand and the bullet went into his arm. The Doctor that waited on him would come and stay all night with him. I was but a little baby then, ma said I would sleep all day and cry all night. The doctor said if I was his child he would knock me in the head! . . . [This story is 14 pages long, transcribed from some hard to read writing in an old tablet.]



# WHAT'S NEW WITH OUR MORGAN COUNTY CEMETARIANS!

Spurred on with the urgency to read every obtainable stone in our area, we are constantly collecting transcriptions of many cemeteries by interested "cem-etarians", as we call them. Mr. and Mrs. Merrill Stewart, with their daughter Shirley Aleguas as typist, are constantly handing in sheaves of papers of tomb-stone readings. Our recent acquisitions are Campbell Cemetery, Hodgerson, Little Hope and Union in Sangamon County. For Macoupin County, there is Hogan, Landreth, Nifong, Pulliam and Vancil.

They have discovered some new burial sites of few stones. There was one stone on the Larry Connolly (formerly Joe Stillwell) farm, section 32 Twsp 13 N. Range 7 West. This land was owned by Milton Turner in 1872, according to our Atlas Map. Perhaps someone may be related and would send us more information. None of us have ever heard the name before.

VULBORDON, Minnie born 20 Oct 1799, died 7 May 1871 aged 71 yr 6 mo 17 da.

Then they found a few stones Section 36, Twsp. 13 N. Range 9 W, Morgan Co. They called it the Woolsey Cemetery.

This valuable aid to finding ancestors who participated in early wars and militia engagements prior to 1835 is divided into the following categories:

1. Statement showing the names, rank, etc. of Invalid Pensioners residing in the State of Kentucky by County, pages 2-15.
2. Statement of the Names, etc. of the Heirs of non-commissioned Officers, Privates, etc., who died in the United States' service; who obtained five years' half-pay in lieu of bounty land, under the second section of the act of April 16, 1816, and who resided in the State of Kentucky, pages 16,17.
3. Statement showing the names, rank, etc. of persons residing in given counties, in the State of Kentucky, who have been inscribed on the pension list under the act passed the 18th of March, 1818, pages 18-66.

[Note: The 4th item is not included in this index. It is composed of pages 67-152, with those pensions for veterans in the various Kentucky counties commencing March 4, 1831.]

\* \* \* \* \*

Genealogists, with ancestors in West Central Illinois, will undoubtedly be interested in this index of the Kentucky Pension Roll up to 1831 for several reasons:

- No doubt many of these veterans either migrated further on West, or had families that came to our part of Illinois;
- With the aid of a Kentucky County map of 1835, one can determine which county to write to for further information. In 1835 there were 34 counties as compared to 120 currently.
- This index, giving the county of Kentucky residence in the 1830's, provides an area for research in census records, marriages, estate administrations and land ownership.
- Many of the men were deceased, which gives death date and county.
- Prior service in other areas provides a state to look for further information as to residence, service records, etc.
- Noticing different spellings of names gives one an insight as to locating ancestors. Some names may be by sound, dropping the southern "r", some surprising originals, and no doubt some mistakes. Ex.: Sayers and Salyas may be Salyers; Dossey may be Dorsey; Caughey (Coffey?)
- Other data given in the book, not quoted in this index, is the pensioners age when placed on the roll, annual allowance, sums received, date placed on roll, date pension commenced, and remarks of various kinds.
- If a genealogist does not have access to this book from some library, our Society will send a photostat copy of any certain pages desired. Please send long SASE with request. A donation of a small sum for time and effort to copy is always appreciated by volunteers who thus offer services of this kind.

X--Family historians doing research for Kentucky ancestors would do well to purchase An Historical Atlas of Kentucky and Her Counties, written and compiled by Wendell H. Rone, Sr.; Mayfield Printing Co., Sutton Lane South, Mayfield Ky 42066. Edition referenced is 1965. It gives the history of formation from Virginia, with many maps showing development of the "Commonwealth of Kentucky" along with much interesting historical data concerning early settlement.

NOTES TO NEWER GENEALOGISTS: By Florence Hutchison, "Ye Olde Ed."

Sometimes experienced researchers, in trying to standardize documentation of original records by use of abbreviations, or to conserve space when typing such records, may fail to note that there are many genealogists new to this fantastic hobby who may not understand the word intended.

Secondly, new workers may have a tendency to revise the wording of old original records they are copying, since they have knowledge of current spellings.

Cautions and suggestions:

- Find lists of standard abbreviations and keep at hand for reference.
- Purchase a paperback issue of Kate L. Turabian's *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses, and Dissertations*; The University of Chicago Press. [Get latest revised edition, the 4th being published in 1973.] Kate has modernized documentation procedures a great deal, which is quite sensible, with excellent index.
- Underline in red, or use a "Hi-Liter" pen across important words, to emphasize them for scanning needed information. [Your editor believes in marking personal copies for this reason.]
- When copying original records such as censuses, old tax books, land patentee records, etc., and especially Bible readings, do copy what is on the handwritten page, and not the modern spelling as you believe it to be. The word may be inaccurate, but do not change it. [Your editor personally hates to see the word (sic) splashed all over the copy of an original document.]
- Put a footnote at the bottom of the first page explaining that the wording, spelling and punctuation are as in the original document.
- Another way to indicate possible misspelling of a name is to underline a couple of letters; Haden, if it should be Hadden; Kally for Kelly. Use    underlining for letters missing, or not readable.
- If one wants to add modern spelling, use brackets, i.e. Guvaia[Goveia]. Brackets are for personal thoughts.
- If there are two ways a word is spelled, use a slash between; Melton/Milton.
- For aliases one can use as in Koyle[see Kyle]; This involves a separate card on each name, and a longer index. [Your editor does not always do this, in order to conserve space, and thus add more names to the indexing.]
- Parentheses are used by original writers to insert an explanatory note in the body of the material, rather than being encumbered with footnotes. However, it is now standard practice for genealogists to put parentheses around maiden names to identify them from middle or marriage surnames, even when it is not on the original record being copied. [There are always exceptions to rules!]
- Speedwriting techniques, as opposed to shorthand, helps to reduce long words to smaller space adaptations. Shorthand can only be read by the original writer. Speedwriting shortens words (1) by leaving out vowels and double consonants; i.e., *Kntcky Pnsn Rl*. (2) by stream-lining the handwritten alphabet; i.e., *b = G, h = h*. This method can be read by anyone aware of speedwriting techniques. In the *Kntcky Pnsn Rl* your editor accomodated the County names to 7 spaces, by omitting some of the vowels, as in *Cmpbell*. Speedwriting would reduce it to *Cmpbl*. (3) Another way to reduce a word is to use the first letters, accomodating it to available space, as in *li* for *line*; *Re* or *Reg* for *Regiment*. [Usually abbreviated as *Regt*.]
- When making additions to lineage charts, do it in colored ink or pencil. Do not erase original notes; if incorrect, according to your way of thinking, draw a pencil mark across it. You may need this reference later. And *please* put name and address of compiler on each sheet. If you make corrections on some one else's sheet, state at bottom "revised by       " and give your name and date.

Your editor is aware that she violates many standard practices taught by English and typing teachers. May she be forgiven because she is trying to disseminate as much vital information as possible in the few allotted sheets of paper which comprises our quarterly--a necessary procedure to reduce publishing costs.
