

PRESSIE'S WANDERINGS

I recently had the pleasure of visiting in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Philip Maire, in Jacksonville, Florida. We talked a blue genealogical streak that pleasant evening. Then I wandered around eastern Tennessee in order to go to some of the courthouses in Bradley, Monroe and Loudon counties. Let me warn you — never try to enter one on Wednesdays! They close at noon! The early Bradley (Cleveland, county seat) records are in another county from which they were formed.

The county seat of Monroe is at Madisonville. I found that Reba Bayless Boyer, of Athens, Tennessee, has published all their early court and marriage records in 2 volumes. I do not know the price of her excellent reference books.

The Loudon courthouse was closed by the time I reached there. Then I decided to take what looked like a good highway (72) to reach Kingston in Roane County, on highway 40 back to Nashville. Man! if you want to see what our forefathers had to cross in the way of mountains - don't miss this road. If you DO take it, be sure YOU don't miss THE road. There are twists and turns, and hairpin curves galore. When I glanced quickly down a ravine at the head of one of the hairpins I almost lost my 20-cent candy bar I'd just eaten! If I HAD missed that one, they would never have found my bits and pieces. But it was fun - try it, you might like it!

Roane County has a beautiful new courthouse, at Kingston, and was open for business all day. The old one is now a Museum, open only on Saturdays, however.

Jean Maire donated our Society some family histories, among them a book entitled "The Ancestry of Jacob Pence and Louellen Hatfield Pence:, Vol. I, by Harry R. Wallace, Wash. DC, 1964. It contains names PENCE, HATFIELD, LITERAL, HART and TERRY, families of Grayson & Hardin Counties, Ky., with a map of these two. The Hatfield's came from Western Pa. There is an interesting map of Washington Co. Pa. While no west central Illinois connections are shown, to my knowledge, we feel that this might be a valuable reference book of probable ancestors since those same names appear in our area.

We are xeroxing Jean Maire's last copy of "The Long Years, a Paternal [Spaulding] Genealogy" she compiled and published in 1967. While the index has many other in-law surnames, the basic allied names to her father, Paul Spaulding, who married Zelma Hackley, Greene County (II), are COFFIN, COOK, HOLTZCLAW, KNIGHT, LOVELACE, MIDDLETON, SILL, STANFIELD, STOUT, & VERNON.

Among other things she gave us is some 1969 letters from Mm. D. Yancey of Grandview, MO., pertaining to Witt families of McMinn & Monroe Counties, Tenn. Included, is "The Name & Family of Witt", 12 typewritten sheets compiled by The Media Research Bureau of Wash. DC. One set of letters (5 pages) pertains to Musgra(o)ve research. Two pages refer to Enslow (Enloe) family history. One page lists the members of "The Lee's of Va.," copied from the book of that name by Burton J. Hendrick (Little, Brown & Co., 1935). Two pages are English [family] Bible Readings copied from Vol. 4 Kentucky Bible Records (1966), Ky. Society D.A.R. There is a portion of this page listing Swift & Jett names, and 5 Blackburns from family Bibles.

May I remind our readers that the D.A.R. record books have many such Bible readings on file at our own Illinois State Historical Library in Springfield.

Many of these were collected by our own resident, Sara John English. While there last week, also, I found many marriage records from many states on file under the index card "Marriage Records:. I did not have time to examine any of them, escept that I am xeroxing out the ones for Morgan County and Greene County for our own reference, and hope to provide an index for them - some day.

As you probably have found out the hard way, one individual can only xerox out 30 pages per one day from this Library, which makes it very inconvenient where one needs larger quantities from several books. So be prepared - take some friends with you who can order 30 pages under their name, for you!

While I am on the subject of libraries, may I suggest you take some of your address labels to stick on the book request slips you turn in to the librarian, which will save your writing time. Also, if you want to keep a copy of the slip, and don't want to make two, take along some small sheets of pencil carbon cut 3 x 5 to put between two of the requisition slips. You can use this "second" to file under title or author, and have a future reference as to where you found such-and-such a book. You could then make a few notes on your copy as to what you found of interest in this particular book.

Another donation from Edna Renner of Beardstown will be started in this Journal - Wills and Estates data taken from Probate Record Book A and B. We will finish B and her abstracts for Book C in our next March Journal.

We have not included any estate administrations for Morgan County, because we have not had the time it took to go to the Courthouse and copy down the information. We have been too busy xeroxing out the Burial cards from our City Hall in order to index our two largest cemeteries - Jacksonville East and Diamond Grove. While we have about 15,000 cards made, there is at least that many more to go yet!

Note: We are now sold out of the Jean Maire Greene County books @\$3.50, except for reference copies. So do not order one.

Several of our members have sent their 1977 dues already ... Thank you very much, folks. We hope that the rest of you will tear off the bottom of our dues sheet at the back of this Journal, and send them in right away. YOU are what gives us encouragement, and makes us feel proud of this great organization that has been built up in five short years!

J., died July 24, 1850 aged 48 years LITTON, James, died Sept. 22, 1854 aged 75 years 9 months 22 days (There is an inscription of the other side of this toppled obelisk, but the stone is too heavy to be rolled over. Perhaps it has the following reading, made in 1929 by Mrs. Sara John English, but without the location.) LITTON, Mary, died Sept. 11, 1854 aged 75 years 4 months 17 days LITTON, Johnney, son of G. and ? Litton, died April 26, 1873 aged 4 years 3 months 23 days (Buried on same lot with James Litton.) LOAR, Rev. C. (or G.), born in Baltimore, Md., Nov. 25, 1766 died Jan. 12 LOAR, Polly, wife of C. (or G.) Loar, born in LOAR, Alex (?) LOOMIS, Amy Alice, 1856-1867 (Buried on seme lot with Sarah E. Loomis.) LOOMIS, Sarah E., wife of J. Loomis, died Sept. 3, 1860 LONERGAN, T. (No dates, only a cross.) LUDLUM, Andrew Todd, son of Cornelius and Levinia Maria Ludlum, died ? 5, 1846 aged ? months 29 days LUDLUM, Cornelius, son of Cornelius and Levinia Maria Ludlum, died July 29, 18?? aged 8 months 10 days McCAFFERTY, Martha A., wife of D. M. McCafferty, died Oct. 24, 1865 aged McCORMICK, Amanda R., wife of Valentine S. McCormick, died Sept. 4, 1884 aged 58 years 4 months McCORMICK, Luramah, our mother and wife of Valentine S. McCormick, died Dec. 7, 1864 aged 53 years McCORMICK, Valentine S., died Sept. 21, 1873 aged 60 years 8 months 14 days McCORMICK, Maggie, daughter of ? and A. McCormick, died June 6, 187? McCOY, Rev. Asa Shinn, 1824-1903 (Rev. McCoy was pastor of Centenary Methodist Church in 1873 and 1874. The congregation of the church honored this man on May 25, 1975 by placing a bronze plaque on his grave. Rev. McCoy died in Pueblo, Colorado on March 24, 1903.) McCOY, Lydia C., 1834-1913 (The lighted cross on the east tower of Centenary United Methodist church is endowed in perpetuity as a memorial to Lydia Chamberlain Mc-Coy, wife of Rev. Asa Shinn McCoy. The memorial was presented by her children in 1932. A bronze tablet on the front of the church building gives this information.) (The following McCoy family names are chiseled into a stone shaft that stands just south of the monument of Rev. and Mrs. Asa Shinn McCoy. The large, badly weathered shaft was toppled in the storm of June 14, 1957. On June 8, 1975 eight members and friends of the Robert Dalton family restored the shaft to its base.) McCOY, Ada Woodson, July 13, 1828-Feb. 6, 1858 McCOY, John Woodson, Sept. 15, 1854-July 14, 1855 McCOY, Ada Jane, Jan. 27, 1856-Dec. 14, 1858 McCOY, Charles Asa, Jan. 28, 1858-Feb. 19, 1858 McCRACKEN, Mary B., wife of J. McCracken, died Aug. 23, 1855 aged 63 years 11 months 10 days (Stone broken across the date.) McDONALD, Emma J. (No dates on this stone which is directly south of the military section. It is very difficult to read this stone.) McKAY, Fielding, born March 24, 1810 near Milford, Shenandoah Co., Va., died June 29, 1879 (This marker is lot 304 Row A, the easternmost row of graves. The short spire keeps falling off its base.)

JACKSONVILLE EAST CEMETERY (Page 22) McLEAN, Alice, died April 17, 1859 aged 35 years, wife of John McLean McNALL, Ella L., wife of George McNall, born June 27, 1870 died Oct. 3, 1890 (Ella's burial is on the family lot of the Sanfords. Her tombstone is identical to that of R. L. Sanford.) McNAMARA, Mary, daughter of M. and J. McNamara, died May 18, 186? aged 1 year 1 month 6 days McWILLIAMS, William, native of Scotland, died Nov. 26, 1850 aged 50 years (A newspaper reporter wrote about this tombstone, probably about 1900. It was not recorded by English in 1929 or Dalton in 1976.) MABERY, Mary Elizabeth, (family name uncertain) died Aug. 28, 1833 aged 1 year MAHLER, Antony, died July 28, 1861 (or 1864, probably 1864) aged 29 years 10 months 9 days (The compiler recovered this tombstone from a pile of fill

dirt between the cemetery and Mauvaisterre Creek. It belongs on Lot 341 of Row A in the extreme east end of the cemetery. However, at the present time, October 7, 1976, it is leaning against a Bailey tombstone on Lot 280 Row B.) MAHONEY, Margaret Ryan, wife of Michael Mahoney, died June 19, 1874 aged 21 y MALONE, Bridget, who died Jan. 23, 1865 aged fortieth year of her age.

MANN, Daniel, died May 5, 1835 aged 34 years (Mrs. English recorded this as Daniel, and a newspaper reporter recorded it as David Mann.)

MANSFIELD, Clara E. Guy, 1868-1932

(A photograph of a painting of John Mathers, and the following story, ap-

peared in the Jacksonville Journal of Feb. 15, 1974.)

An original painting of Jacksonville's first mayor, John Mathers, was presented informally to the city recently by MacMurray College, which has had the painting for many years.

Mathers was an early member of the MacMurray Board of Trustees, serving as secretary, treasurer and fund raiser. He was among the trustees who

brought the college through the hard times of the Civil War.

Dr. Walter Hendrickson, professor emeritus of history at MacMurray College, presented the painting on behalf of the college to Mrs. Rose Cosgriff, city tressurer, who accepted on behalf of the city. Howard Sidman, professor and chairman of art at MacMurray, restored the painting, and Roger Pautz of the Art Center framed it.

John Mathers was elected twice, first in 1867 when the city went from the village board to the mayor-council form of government. He was reelected in 1869. The Irish-born Mathers was a Mar Democrat who advocated abolition and supported President Lincoln's policies when the Civil War

broke out.

The Mathers family came to America about 1823, when John was nine; they

lived first in Lexington, My. The family moved to Illinois in 1826 and settled in Jacksonville in 1832. It is said Mather's attended Illinois Col-

lege but no official record has been found.

"As mayor his term was singularly free from controversy, as far as I can determine from a reading of the newspapers of the time," Dr. Hendrickson said. "But we do know that he and the council had to face the problems of city government, including care of the streets and sewers and the franchising of public utilities, especially the street railway, which was chertered in 1367."

Mathers was baptized by John Wesley, was an ordent Methodist and for a time was a licensed preacher. He served in several circuits until 1848 when his health failed and he gave up what some have called "the strenuous life." He entered real estate and insurance in Jacksonville, where he was successful and became reasonably well-to-do. He died in 1880.

The painting of Mathers is by G. M. Stone, about whom nothing is known. He may have been an itinerant painter. "The painting is a good likeness, as

compared with photographs of the man," Dr. Hendrickson said.

MENGLE, J. H., Co. H, 32 Ill. Inf. (John Mengle, wagoner, enlisted Oct. 8, 1861. He re-enlisted, as a veteran, on Jan. 2, 1864 and was mustered out on Nov. 20, 1865. He is buried on Lot 520 Row K.)

MENGEL, Peter, Jan. 4, 1805-Jan. 25, 1865 (Mrs. English, in her 1929 listing, has his birth year as 1804 and has his name incorrectly listed as Mongel.) MENGEL, Sarah Stephens, Aug. 17, 1817-Nov. 28. 1891 (Sarah and Peter are buried on Lot 520 Row K.)

MICHAELS, Theodore, 1850-1936 (A small metal marker.) MIDDLETON, Emeline, wife of G. F. Middleton, 1822-1906

In 1829 he was elected a trustee of Illinois College. Information about Wm. C. Posey is in the history of Illinois College written by Dr. Rammelkamp. When an unnamed newspaper reporter made a walking tour of East Cemetery about 1900, he had this to write about the Poseys: "Here is a name greatly honored, or rather two names. First was laid here the body of the sainted William C. Posey, one of the most Godly men that ever lived in Morgan County. It is related of him that he was once a candidate for sheriff and visited a rather tough part of the county and remarked: 'My name is William C. Posey and I am a candidate for sheriff, but I would rather have the grace of God in my heart than all your votes. He died July 12, 1849, and his wife, Sarah, died April 20, 1860. He was a devoted member of the Presbyterian church,

He wrote: Here is a name with a peculiarly fragrant memory, that of Judge William Thomas. Elderly citizens can easily picture in their minds the old gentleman seated at his table, quill pen in hand, making the peculiar marks, at first so illegible but later on more easily read as one becomes accustomed to them. His spitoon was always nearby for the judge was an inveterate tobacco chewer, but one who knew his noble qualities forgot any little irregularities which he might have had. He used to enjoy telling how he "stole" through the legislature the bill for the charter of Illinois College. That was the time when the state's lawmakers didn't think much of the cause of education and failed to look kindly on any enterprise which sought the spread of knowledge. The judge was in the legislature at this time the bill was pending and had to use some wise, shrewd tactics to accomplish the desired object. The judge's remains are accompanied by those of other members of the family.

Villiam Thomas was the first man to conduct a regular school in Jacksonville. The site of the structure is commemorated by a gray granite

marker in the 200 block of East College Avenue.

Some school lists came to our attention which we xeroxed. Pacific Union, found in Township 10 North, Range 13 West, was popularly called "Whistle Jacket. Does anybody know why? We have made a composite list of pupils, and arranged them alphabetically. As you will probably see, some of them are the same person, with a different spelling as set down by the teacher. We decided it might be of assistance to family history seekers if they were aware of spelling variance. The school was on John Snyder land. [See 1873 Greene County Atlas, Tlon, Rl2W, 3 PM.]

The tombstone readings for the Bennington, Vermont cemetery were published in "Early Settlers of New York State" by Janet Wethy FOLEY, in Volumes IV, V, & VI, July 1937 to June 1940, by segments. A copy of her three volumes is in the Illinois State Historical Library. [Indexed under FOLEY.]

There are many valuable marriage, death, church records and Bible readings in these little quarterlies bound with 3 volumes together. The records of the old "First Congregational Church", at Bennington, beginning in 1762, were published in "Early Settlers" from April 1936, to, and including November 1936, as well as several other churches.

Because there were so many descendants of people in Bennington who came to West Central Illinois, particularly Greene and Morgan, I am publishing only the names found in the readings. If any of our members need further information they can either write to us, or try to find a set of these books in their nearby library. I found my first copy of this valuable book in the new Selby Library in Sarasota, Florida; otherwise I would not have known this book existed. They had only 1 volume, whereas our library in Springfield is lucky to have 3 volumes.

Janet Foley states in the beginning paragraph "For a long time no one knew where Vermont ended and New York began, therefore records of pioneers on the borer are of interest in New York State." Likewise, because their descendants came to Illinois, these records, in my opinion, are of interest here. There are 75 Revolutionary War soldiers in this one cemetery, although all were not so identified. We will mark those with an asterisk (*). It is too time-consuming to alphabetize these names, so you will have to scan the entire list. Rather than repeat the surnames, we will list the man "& wi" (wife).

I am sorry not to include a query section in our Quarterly, but they take so much time to prepare, I'd rather leave it out than disappoint people who write expecting me to include them. Also, I have to carefully count pages and paper weight in order to keep postage costs down, since we have to mail them third class. Our postmaster will not accept Quarterlies at book or library rate any more. There are so many records to publish - cemeteries - courts - churches, etc. These should have priority. Family searches are temporary in nature, public records are long-term information that needs to be preserved for future ages. Tombstones are constantly deteriorating - courthouse records increasingly hard to get, and could, overnight, be lost forever. We had best capture them whilst we may.

For example, Mr. and Mrs. John Reynolds of Bloomington, who by the way are helping us with Greene County cemetery indexing, decided to go to a certain County in Kentucky to search family records - Russel, I believe. The Courthouse had been destroyed by fire two days before! What a great disappointment!

My friends, I <u>urge you</u> to copy your family records and get them in readable shape as soon as possible! As with the disappearance of a courthouse overnight, with its tremendous collections of past history, you too, might suddenly be thrust on the other side of Life. What would you leave behind, for all of your efforts? A lot of unintelligible scribbling? or an orderly family history booklet that others could pick up, add to, and work on with pleasure?

As my poem went in the last Quarterly - "if you can't be a tree on the TOP of the hill, be a bush on the SIDE of the hill". If you can't afford to publish a big book, take a hint from June and make some smaller "family booklets". Divide your maternal and paternal lineages so as to avoid confusion of names, and putting families together who are not related, except for the #l person (usually yourself), [unless you have some first-cousin-marriages among your grandparents!].

If you are waiting for people to answer your pleas for information, and they haven't answered - publish without them, for the first time, and promise to make a supplement later. Family history is too controversial in private and public records to reach perfection, normally. If you wait to "sift out all the facts", there won't be any facts down on paper for others to sift. 'Nuff said sifters?
