

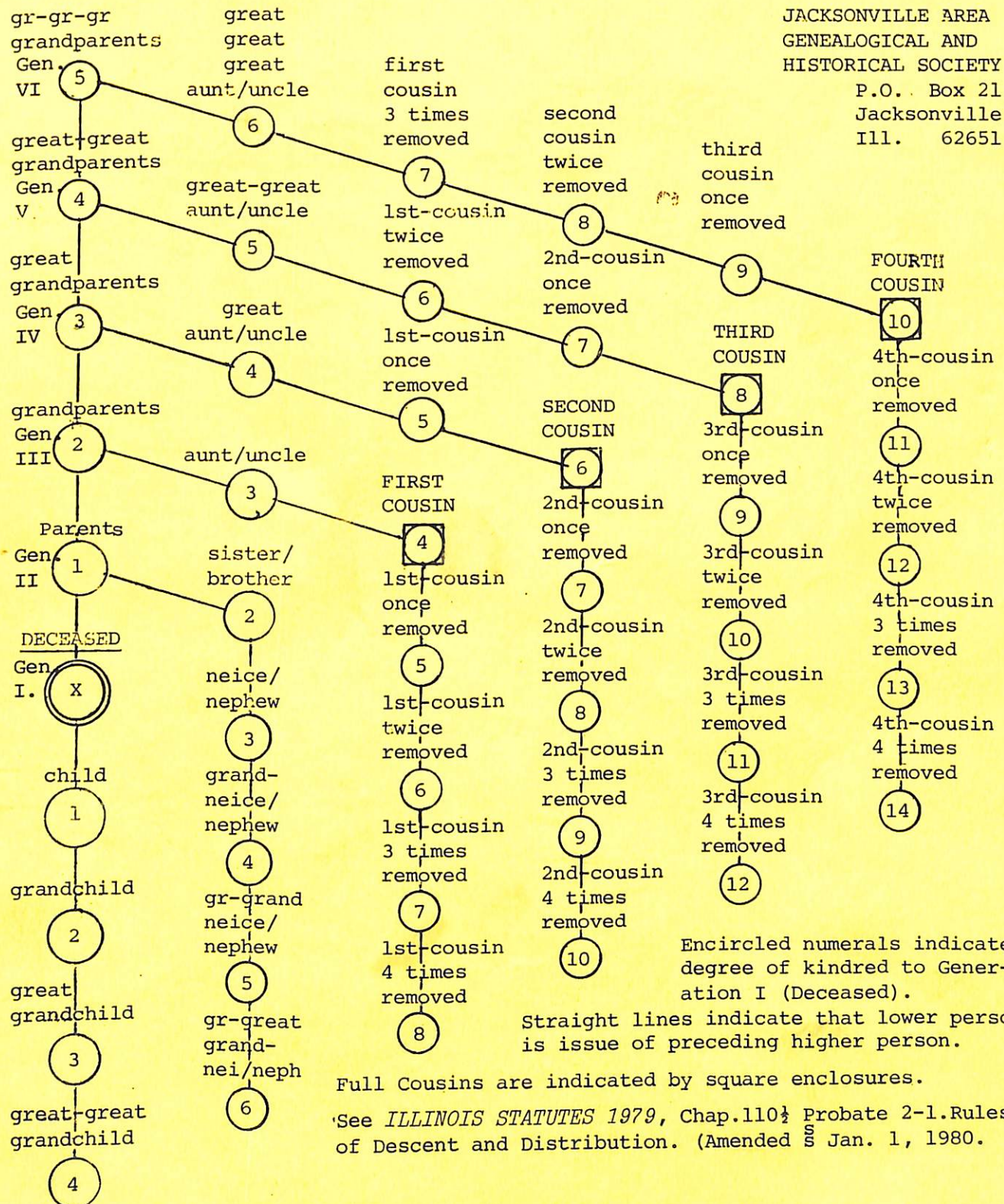

Dear Friends and Generous Geneal People:

Thank you, thank you, thank you wonderful people who responded so quickly to our typewriter needs. We are 3/4ths of the way to the top in paying for this badly-needed item, so we are quite willing to accept any other donations our members or friends would share with us. We are making great progress in getting some of our back-log indexing done, but we can think of a great many more which are just waiting for typing time. Your donations and kindly comments were very heart-warming, and points up the great need for making West Central Illinois records available for public use.

The Jacksonville area is more critical for the hundreds of people who spread out over the U.S., than any other town in the vicinity. The earliest wagon road called The Vandalia Trail, led directly here, and went on west because of the ease of traversing at the heads of streams, instead of trying to cross the larger bodies of water as the Mississippi at St. Louis. From here they could cross the comparatively shallow Illinois and upper Mississippi before it conjoined with both the Illinois and Missouri Rivers.

The earliest people came up the Illinois in keel boats and landed either at Newport in Greene County, or Naples and Meredosia in this area. They all came to Jacksonville first, and many noting the already established schools and churches, stayed for awhile, though others in their group sought to go further on into Missouri, and other states of interest. As most of you know, by this time, Old Morgan included the present-day Scott and Cass; hence the earliest records until 1837, 1839 and 1845 are in our courthouse. Your editor is currently trying to revise or edit the 1830 and 1840 census records for these counties. Awaiting a turn to be typed is the 1845 Morgan County State Census. The other persons who so laboriously transcribed the records were unsure of a lot of names. With my experience in reading through the Old English and Spencerian handwriting, I can now go back to the microfilm and come out with probably a more correct spelling of many names. For that reason, some of the current indexes will be changed.

Which brings up a point some of you researchers may help with who have access to College and Historical Archives. I would like to have a photostat of the Spencerian handwriting books from which the teachers of the 1850's taught penmanship. There surely must be one saved somewhere! To find and re-print such a book would be of inestimable value to current readers of those early records. As a youngster, your editor was taught the Palmer method. We had nice penmanship books from which to copy. Perhaps one of the reasons I can read pretty bad penmanship is because my teacher always let me grade the handwriting of the other pupils each day. We had a chart from bad to better as a guide. I would compare the pupils page with that and arrive at the grade he or she received. She and I lived down the same road, so you see for a year I was "kept after school" naughty, or not! Well, I am sure that if you saw my handwriting now you would not believe it when I told you I was once the champion penmanship gal in Logan County, Oklahoma. There were 150 rural school students who passed the stiff 8th-grade examinations in 14 subjects that year. I had to march second in line, because another girl had received one-tenth of one point higher grade than I did! My mother crocheted me a beautiful white dress which I still have. Somehow it doesn't fit too well anymore. Does anybody else have that problem?

There are so many things I wanted to put in this quarterly, but had to leave out for lack of space. I also had to switch to other things because one piece of research needed too much more work on it. We are late to press because of many different unrelated problems in various directions. We hope you understand that it was not caused by laziness on anyone's part! We love our readers too much for that. Oh! you are such nice people, it is a joy to serve your needs!

It was my pleasure to be honored at the Mayor's reception recently, and to receive a beautiful placque from Mrs. Pauline Newport, City Clerk: "to Florence M Hutchison in appreciation for invaluable research and records presented to the Jacksonville City cemeteries", signed by Milt Hocking, Mayor.

Thanks to the efforts of Mrs. Leonard Wood (Hazel) and Mrs. William Sample (Margaret) we have found the record book of the Union Baptist Church of Pisgah and were permitted to make a copy of this valuable church record. From it we learned that Zachariah Waters deeded the land in 1847.

A subsequent search of the land records in the County Clerk's office by your Editor produced the following deed:

Know all men by these presents that I Zachariah Waters of the County of Morgan and State of Illinois in consideration of my fellowship and attachment to the members of the Society of Seperate Baptists in said county who are known as "Union Church", and also of my desire and duty to preserve and perpetuate for burial uses the ground wherein the remains of my father and other of my kindred lie entered [interred] do by these presents give grant alein remise[?] and confirm unto Lot Luttrell, Nathaniel Cox and Henry Davenport trustees of the said church and their successors forever the following described land situate in said county being a part of the East half of the South East quarter of Section Eight in Township fourteen north Range nine West of third principal Meridian and bounded as folows to wit:

Commencing at a stone situate at a point distant about fifty-six rods South of the North line and about three rods West from the East line of the said half quarter section, thence running West sixteen rods, thence South twenty rods, thence East sixteen rods and thence twenty rods to the place of beginning, containing two acres more or less and including the Church building and burial ground now used and appropriated by the Society aforesaid To have and to hold the before granted premises to them the said trustees and their successors to and for the uses of a House of public worship for the denomination of Christians known as Seperate Baptists and of such of them as are in fellowship and communion with the Union Church, and also for the uses of a burial ground under the direction of the said Church and for no other uses and purposes whatever, And I Elizabeth Waters wife of the said Zachariah do hereby relinquish and release my right of dower to the said granted premises to the said trustees and their successors fully and effectually to all intents and purposes, forever, In witness whereof the said Zachariah and Elizabeth have hereunto set their hands and seals this twenty fourth day of July Anno domini 1847.

[signed] Zachariah Waters
Elizabeth Waters

The above document was notarized by Manning Mayfield, J.P. "this twentieth day of August AD 1847." The deed was Recorded Oct 2nd 1847.

The history of the church was given in several places, but the best source was from a newspaper item dated "Tuesday Morning, October 28, 1930". [Probably from the Jacksonville paper.]

LARGE NUMBER AT CENTENNIAL EVENT OF PISGAH CHURCH

Union Baptist Church Holds Observance of 100th Anniversary

The one hundredth anniversary of the Union Baptist church of Pisgah was observed at the church with a large attendance of members and visitors. The church was organized October 23, 1830.

The pastor, Rev. L. E. Riley opened the day's program with a few appropriate remarks on the centennial observance and his association with the church. He then introduced the speaker for the occasion, Dr. D. O. Hopkins, district superintendent, who gave an able address on the theme, "Timelessness". A beautiful selection was sung by the Beardstown quartett, Mrs. and Mrs. S. D. Fuqua, Mrs. T. D. Wright and Mr. W. O. Owens.

At the noon hour the ladies of the church were hostesses in serving a bounteous basket dinner in the basement of the church. About 100 guests enjoyed this feature and renewed old associations.

The afternoon session was called to order by the pastor, who appointed George Beekman to act as chairman of the "Hour of Reminiscences".

Mrs. A. A. Curry gave the following church history:

"The Union Baptist church was organized in October 1830. Can you imagine the first meeting on this spot one hundred years ago, the pioneers of this part of Morgan County, Ill., who organized--and were the charter members of this church--their old time dresses, and speech and character molded by the hardships, privations and necessities of those days? This is a copy of their first meeting."

"We the Baptist members of Jesus Christ having embodied ourselves called on John Antle and Solomon Despain, and were constituted on the 23rd day of October, 1830--a Separate Baptist Church, on scriptures of the Old and New Testament, believing them to be the infallible word of God, and a sufficient rule for both faith and practice."

"The church was not given a name till April, 1831, when it was called 'Union Baptist church'.

"A business meeting was always held on the first Saturday of each month, first at 11 a.m., and later at 2 p.m. These meetings were always well attended, and after prayer, inquired for fellowship and found all in peace. But if a member had walked disorderly or was absent from these monthly meetings, a committee was appointed to visit him and labor with him. After taking gospel steps if said member did not make acknowledgement, he was excluded from the church. If he was repentant there was rejoicing and he was restored to full fellowship.

"As new settlers were coming into the community, there were many new additions to the church, usually heads of families. On January, 1844 the church voted to have yearly protracted meetings, to commence Friday, before the third Saturday in July, and to have the church ordinance of communion and foot washing, quarterly.

"On April, 1847 the right of land on which the meeting house and grave yard was donated by Elder Zachariah Waters. When trustees were appointed, Nathaniel Cox, Henry Davenport and Lot Luttrell were appointed--and the deed was made over August, 1847.

"On June 1832, the church sent her first Associational Letter, when William Winfry was appointed to bear a letter to the South Kentucky association. Brothers Martin Smith and Zachariah Waters were appointed to write this letter.

"On October, 1846 a letter was sent to the Illinois Association at Spring Run. In January, 1835, on petition of Walnut Creek, the church set apart Brother Thomas Murphy as an arm of the church to receive members with Brothers Joseph Waters, Meacom Smith, Z. Waters, and the Preaching Brethern, thus the first child was born, and the Baptist church of Walnut Creek was organized. On June 1837, in like manner the second child, the church at Shoal Creek was organized.

"On May, 1848, the church granted the brethren and sisters living on Bear Creek, Macoupin county, the privilege of being constituted into a church, as soon as convenient, seeing that the distance is thirty miles from the Mother church, seeing that their numbers are sufficient for that purpose, thus the third child was born.

On October 1854, the church agreed to extend an arm of this church to Youngblood prairie for the purpose of receiving members. In December, 27

members were dismissed to constitute this church, thus four organizations have gone out from the Mother church, Union.

"There were eleven charter members, seven of them as follows: Nathaniel Cox, Lot Luttrell, Frances Petre, Joseph Waters, Zachariah Waters, Martha Smith and Mrs. Samuel Wood. The only charter member that remained with the church all her life, was Mrs. Wood, who reared a family of 8 sons and 1 daughter.

"Zachariah Waters was the first pastor. He did not enter the ministry for some years after the founding of the church. Brother Waters was pastor for 18 years, William B. Hart 7 years, and F. M. Wadley, M. C. Davenport and finally Brother Hart was recalled and served most of the time till the church was wrecked by the cyclone of May 9, 1880. He was badly injured in this storm, while spending the night at the home of J. B. Beekman.

"Other pastors were G. W. S. Bell, E. S. Graham, Thomas Marsh, H. P. Curry, Laban Estes, W. F. Thompson, T. B. Frary, S. M. McKinney, Henry Dixon, William Gaither, J. W. Judd, F. M. Crabtree, H. P. Jones, W. R. Johnson and Lester Riley the present pastor.

"The early church was called Separate Baptist. Some believed in the doctrine of predestination and were opposed to Sunday schools and missions, until 1854, when Clary's Grove church and Blunt's Grove church, Mason county, and this church called a meeting here and organized the "Illinois Central Association". All was not harmony at Union for several years and some of the members withdrew and united with the Predestinarian church..

"In 1869 the first offering was made to "Home Missions". [\$20.00, another record indicates.] This building is the third house of worship, but is on the original location. The first meeting house was a log cabin dwelling, which was afterward covered with weatherboards, oak slabs probably.

"Many brothers and sisters have been members of this congregation and have passed on to the Great Beyond--and when we think of that numerous throng we seem but a handful left to carry on and are led to ask ourselves the question, are we not far short of the example set forth by our zealous forefathers? What will the next century bring forth? May God's Blessing be on one and all."

Several beautiful musical numbers were given at the hundredth anniversary by the Beardstown quartette and by Mrs. J. H. Shutt and Mrs. Barrow of Waverly. The home church quartette, Otto Wood, Leonard Wood, Garfield Rogers and Carl Longenbaugh gave a well rendered selection. The older persons were called upon and gave a few words in memory of those who had been active in the church in the past. Brother Hart, Samuel Wood, Rev. William Davenport, David Moore, Ivan Wood, Mattie Smith, A. A. Curry and others. A favorite hymn of Brother Curry was sung in his memory, as he was present at the meetings which had made plans for this centennial meeting. Regret was offered on account of the absence of Brother Herschel Boyer.

Miss Merry Grace Williams gave two readings. Mrs. Mary Ausmus sang a favorite hymn of the Grandfather Wool, "I Need Thee Every Hour". The meeting closed with prayer by Dr. Hopkins and by the audience singing "God Be With You Till We Meet Again."

[The history was evidently written by Mrs. Minnie Wood Curry Harcourt from old records she had access to at the time. At the publication of this quarterly (December 1981) we do not have time to publish the list of former members of this church, as the record is rather "helter-skelter" with many lines being drawn over the names for some reason. Instead, we will present an index of the burials in Union Cemetery.]

The following Index of Burials in the Cemetery of the Union Baptist Church is a partial one accomplished by Robert W. Dalton in 1971 on a very cold day. It includes all the old stones, but not the newer ones.

"Located within sight of Pisgah, Union Cemetery can be seen from Illinois Highway 104. A church was formerly adjacent to this cemetery. Here is located the grave of Samuel Wood, former county judge and member of the state legislature. The cemetery, well maintained, is still used for current burials."

The land was set aside for a cemetery by John Cook Caldwell, and was named for his wife's parents, Rev. and Mrs. William Rogers.

Among the honored dead sleeping at Rogers Cemetery are 3 pioneer ministers: Rev. Rogers, Rev. Newton Cloud, and Rev. Austin Sims. It has been rumored lately that the present landowner of the northeast quarter of Section 13, Township 16 North, Range 12 West of the Third Principal Meridian has removed the remaining stones and is going to farm this cemetery site, which is against the law of the State of Illinois, and concern of many citizens whose relatives have been so disregarded as worthy of retaining the land they paid for so many years ago in order to have a decent and remembered burial site.

Our cemetery advisory board recommends that action be taken to recover at least a part of the land - to be fenced - and kept as a memorial to the dead by the placement of a stone so stating, and evergreen trees planted to mark the site for the future. Native grasses and flowers should be allowed to grow in the area to be a natural habitat for wild animals. As many stones as possible should be recovered and buried on the site, if unfit for standing. While this would not mark the exact place of burial, at least the site of these burials would thus be preserved for future generations, which is one of the prime considerations of the family historians of today who are acting as a bridge between our past ancestors and their descendants.

The tombstone readings for this overgrown cemetery were made in 1966, 1967 and 1968 by Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Lovekamp, Mr. and Mrs. Lee Fox, and Keith and Carroll Lovekamp. Livestock had been allowed to roam in the cemetery.

Several stones had been stacked in a fencerow, while others were partially buried and had to be dug up in order to read the inscriptions. [Note: After digging stones up to read, it is a recommended practice to re-bury them on site, so that someone in the future may have the same privilege of reading it.]

According to a Cass County history book, John Savage built the house which stands on the same farm where Morrison Cemetery is located. It is about two and one-fourth miles northwest of Concord.

Five children survive their mother--Emma Filey, of Bath; Nancy Jane, wife of Philo Davis; William H.; Thomas J. and John. She joined the Methodist Church in her youth and always lived a Christian life. Funeral services were held Thursday, Oct. 4, at Morrison cemetery, near Concord.

This cemetery in Sec. 6, Township 16 North, Range 7 West of the Third Principal Meridian, Sangamon County, in Cartwright Township, stands on a hill at the south edge of Pleasant Plains on the east side of the road. The 1874 *Illustrated Atlas Map of Sangamon County* published by Brink, McCormick & Co., Illinois, indicates a deeded cemetery on land by Jacob Epler.

Because there are numerous burials of interest to our Society members, we here present an index of the deceased from an earlier reading to be found in the Dr. Barringer Cemetery Records on file at the Illinois State Historical Library, and the Lincoln Library in Springfield.

In 1976 the 119-year-old Peter Cartwright Memorial United Methodist Church was formally recognized as one of only 17 National Methodist Historic Shrines in the United States, the only one in Illinois, and one of 2 in the Old Northwest Territory. Anyone who has ancestors and collateral relatives buried in this community should be very proud that they lived and contributed so much to society in such an historic area.

Roland Shephard settled in Cartwright Township in 1818 on Section 3-16-7. D. Scott, Robert Wilburn, S. Pierce and Edward Perkins followed in the fall of 1819. Samuel L. Irwin, B. Purvines and _____ Crow, and others, settled in the spring of 1820. In the same year the first sermon was preached at the residence of Absalom Baker, by the Rev. James Simms, a Methodist minister.

Cartwright, according to historic records and the circuit rider's biography, contributed \$300 to construction of the church in 1857 and personally helped in the building project. It was Cartwright's firm conviction "that he was God's instrument in bringing religion to the frontier, regardless of the obstacles in the way."

From the *Madison County Genealogical Society NEWSLETTER* of September 1981, P.O. Box 631, Edwardsville IL 62025, we note the following address which may be of interest to some of OUR members. For a FREE map of Germany, write to: German National Tourist Office, 104 South Michigan Ave., Chicago IL 60603.

We would like to give a re-cap of Robert Buecher's lecture to the Madison County Society also. Mr. Buecher stated, "the 3 most important facts to know about a German ancestor are: o--Place where they came from; o--Religion of ancestor; o--Approximate birth date. Be sure to check that the name wasn't changed into English when arriving in the United States.

If you write to Germany: o--Keep letters simple; o--Send a self-addressed envelope with an International Reply Coupon (purchasable at the postoffice); o--Do not send U.S. stamps as they are of no use to Germans; o--Never send checks.

Here's an interesting item from *The Oklahoma Mason*, November 1981, about how "checking accounts" started: *When a man made a deposit in an English bank three centuries ago it was recorded by notching a stick. The thick was then split, the bank keeping one half and the depositor the other. Before the money could be withdrawn the two pieces had to be matched. The depositor's half was call "bank stock" and the part kept by the bank was the "check".*

That is similar to "indenture papers" in which the contract was written on a long sheet, twice, and then torn in the middle. The two parts then had to match in order to be legally claimed.

In Colonial times, land transfers took place on the actual property with the buyer, seller, and a few witnesses present. Conditions of the transaction were declared, and the seller symbolized the transfer by presenting the buyer with a twig and a handful of earth. If there was a home, the buyer was given the door knocker.

Processioning of land, in early Virginia Parish records, meant that Parish officials, witnesses and adjacent landowners would proceed to walk around a piece of property in order to prove ownership between adjacent lands.

RULES OF DESCENT AND DISTRIBUTION OF AN ESTATE according to the *ILLINOIS STATUTES*.

See Chapter 110¹/₂ PROBATE, paragraph 2-1. Rules of descent and distribution "computing by the rules of the civil law."

[The statements below have been simplified for clarity, and are not exact words of the law book quoted from. Ed.]

The intestate real and personal estate of a decedent (and the *real* estate of a non-resident decedent), after all just claims against the estate are fully paid, descends and shall be distributed as follows:

- (a) $\frac{1}{2}$ to surviving spouse; $\frac{1}{2}$ to decedent's descendants, per stirpes.
- (b) No surviving spouse, entire estate to descendants, per stirpes [equal shares].
- (c) No surviving descendants, entire estate to surviving spouse.
- (d) No surviving spouse or descendants, entire estate to parents, brothers, and sisters of the decedent in equal parts;
 - 1) if one parent dead, a double portion to surviving parent;
 - 2) if a brother or sister is deceased, his or her portion goes to descendants, per stirpes.

Note: "in no case is there any distinction between the kindred of the whole and the half blood."

(e&f) [And so on-----through succeeding generations to great-grandparents.]

- (g) If there is no surviving spouse,
 - descendant, (or descendants

the entire estate goes in equal parts to the nearest kindred of the decedent in equal degree "computing by the rules of the civil law."

- (h) If there is no surviving spouse and no known kindred of the decedent, the real estate escheats to the county in which it is located. If all else fails to qualify, the property shall escheat to this State, and be delivered to the Director of Financial Institutions of the State pursuant to the *Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act*. [See Chapter 141 paragraph 101 *et seq.*]

And there in the last paragraph lies a warning to genealogists who may miss out on receiving rightful heirships of real or personal property by not keeping up with their ancestors and collateral relatives. This is good enough reason for compiling a skeleton family history, showing not only the vital records, as birth, marriage and death, but residences of their relatives, particularly state and county.

This was my personal experience. I went to see a cousin, whom I had not seen since I was a young girl, who lived in St. Louis Bay, Louisiana. In reality, I was her last full cousin. I tried to contact her two years later, and found out that she had died shortly after I visited with her. By that time her estate had been through probate court, and settled. A friend of hers inherited the estate through a Will which had been made before I visited Ethel. I learned from another person that Ethel wanted to change her Will, but the friend kept her from it.

Had I kept in contact with Ethel, and had been apprised of her death, then I could have filed suit against the Will and perhaps salvaged, at least, some of the family keepsakes, many of which were thrown into the ashcan by this "friend." I should have left my name and address with someone for notification of death.[Ed.]

Dear "Eager-beaver genealogists": Some of you pay your dues without signing our membership sheet which we enclose with the September and December issues of the quarterly, for various reasons.
