

THE DEVELOPMENT OF COUNTIES IN WEST CENTRAL ILLINOIS 1821-1845
Florence Hutchison

"Old" Greene County -- established January 20, Laws 1821. An area separated from Madison County was called "Greene County with attached territory." It contained the future counties of Greene Jersey, Macoupin, Morgan and Scott. (Cass was included in Sangamon.

Greene County lost Morgan and Scott January 31, 1823, and the southeast quarter of Macoupin to Madison January 13, 1825. Greene lost the rest of Macoupin January 17, 1829, and Jersey February 23, 1839.

This development of counties is important to the genealogist who is looking for ancestors prior to the time a county became a legal unit of government, and started storing records. The records will be found in the parent county. The map on the front of the August 1974 issue of The Jacksonville Geneal Journal is a fine illustration of the early parent counties.

"Old" Morgan County -- established January 31 Laws 1823. An area separated from Greene County contained Morgan and Scott. An area separated from Sangamon County contained Cass county. Morgan County lost Cass March 3, 1837, and Scott February 16, 1839. The boundaries between Morgan and Sangamon were redefined February 12, 1835, and between Morgan and Cass in 1837 and 1845.

"Old" Pike County -- established January 31 Laws 1821. An area separated from Madison, Bond and Clark was called "Pike County with attached territory". It contained all future counties between the Illinois and Kankakee Rivers to Indiana and Wisconsin on eastern and northern borders, and the Mississippi River on the west, including the lower tip later known as Calhoun County. The site where now stands the City of Chicago was then in Pike County.

The boundaries of Pike County were redefined January 31 Laws 1823, restricting it to the territory between the Illinois and Mississippi rivers south of a line drawn west from the present site of Beardstown, containing the future counties of Pike and Calhoun, a part of Schuyler, and the greatest part of Brown and Adams.

"Old" Sangamon County -- established January 20 Laws 1821. An area separated from Madison and Bond contained the future counties of Cass, Mason, Menard, Logan, Tazewell, Sangamon, and parts of Morgan, Christian, Macon, McLean, Woodford, Marshall and Putnam.

Adams County -- established January 13 Laws 1825.
It was formerly a part of Pike of 1821 and 1823.

Brown County -- established February 1 Laws 1839.
It was formerly a part of Pike of 1821 and 1823, and a part of Schuyler by January 31 Laws 1825, until it was separated in 1839.

Calhoun County -- established January 10 Laws 1825.
It was formerly a part of Pike of 1821 and 1823.

Cass County -- established March 3 Laws 1837. It was formerly a part of Sangamon of 1821, and was made a part of Morgan in 1823. In 1837 the south line was half a section (3 miles) further north. In 1845 a part of Morgan was added to the south line of Cass (3 miles), which is a factor influencing the county of origin for many public records such as deeds, death and birth records in the following sections and ranges of Township 17 North, 3rd principal meridian.

Greene County -- established January 20 Laws 1821.
Area was redefined under Laws of January 17, 1829 removing Macoupin County, and February 28, 1839 removing Jersey County. These changes especially between Jersey and Greene, would influence the origin of public records prior to 1839.

Jersey County -- established February 28 Laws 1839.
It was always a part of Greene through the changes of Laws of 1821, 1823, 1825, 1829 until 1839.

Macoupin County -- established January 17 Laws 1829.
It was formerly from a portion of Madison County which had been attached to Greene January 20, 1821. A portion in the southeast quarter of the county was added to Madison January 13, 1825. It was joined together, and became a county in 1829.

Menard County -- established February 15 Laws 1839.
It was a part of Sangamon through many changes from 1821 to 1839.

Morgan County -- established January 31 Laws 1823.
It was formerly in Greene territory January 20, 1821, and had its boundaries redefined in 1823 when Cass was added to Morgan and Scott, from Sangamon.

In 1837 the north line joining Cass was established half a section (3 miles) further north, which involved Township 17 North, 3rd P.M., in Ranges 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13.

In 1845 this boundary was redefined, and this area added to Cass. There was also boundaries redefined between Morgan and Sangamon in 1835.

Pike County -- established January 13 Laws 1825.
It formerly covered a large portion of Illinois (including Chicago). Boundaries were redefined in 1821 and 1823. (See Old Pike).

Sangamon County -- established January 30 Laws 1821.
It included many counties. (See Old Sangamon). Boundaries were redefined in 1825, and 1835. The county assumed its present proportions February 15 1839 when Menard, Macon and Christian counties were established from Old Sangamon.

Schuylerville County -- established January 13 Laws 1825.
It included Brown at this time. Both were formerly in Pike. (See Old Pike). The two counties were separated February 1 Laws 1839.

Scott County -- established February 16 Laws 1839.
Scott was formerly included with Cass and Morgan. The 3-county area is still referred to historically as "Old Morgan".

It is hoped that this analysis of the West Central Illinois counties will be a help to genealogists in knowing where to look for early records of their ancestors. This was gleaned from "Counties of Illinois, Their Origin and Evolution" compiled and published by Paul Powell, Secretary of State, March 1967.

The following names, birthdates and parents' names were never recorded on the current indexes in the County Clerk's Office of Morgan County because they were delayed birth certificates filed from 1940 to 1943. The persons who were born between 1858 and 1878 (Jan. 1), were filed in a book which was discovered when Mrs. Florence Hutchison, President of the Jacksonville Area Genealogical Society, and chairman of the Archives Committee of the Morgan County Bicentennial Commission, was taking an inventory of the County Archives. The Historical Records Survey of the WPA for 1939 was used as the basis for relocating the older records. This special book of birth certificates was prepared after that first survey, no doubt as a result of the thorough job the WPA workers did prior to 1940.

The list of 346 birth certificates is hereby published for genealogical purpose. A member of the Society will research the record for one dollar per name. A copy of the certificates may be secured by sending two dollars to the County Clerk's Office, Jacksonville ILL 62650.

These delayed birth certificates are on file, unindexed until this copy was made, in the Morgan County Court Clerk's office labeled "1858-78", and are filed chronologically. For copies, request the birth certificate and any accompanying affidavits. Give name, birthdate, and parents. Send two dollars for each copy.

MORGAN COUNTY POOR FARM INHABITANTS 1848-1853

A genealogical treasure was unearthed during the search of the County Court House archives by Mrs. Florence Hutchison, Chairman of the Archives Division of the Morgan County Bicentennial Commission. In trying to locate the books listed on the Morgan County Historical Records Survey #69 accomplished by the Works Progress Administration in 1936-39, the Morgan County Poor Farm Records were discovered wrapped in a brown paper package after the closing December 20, 1951 in the attic of the courthouse.

About 500 cards have already been made on persons who were inmates, patients, or passersby, at some time or another, from 1933 on. The earliest record book has been gleaned for names, and the list for "Paupers Received" from 1848-1853 is here given. In December 1853 the Superintendent died, and from then on for the next 10 years the books are very poorly kept, and badly written.

This 1848-53 record is so important, however, because quite evidently many of the immigrants arriving in Morgan County were penniless and ill. They applied to the County Commissioners, were assigned to the Morgan County Home for relief, were housed, fed, and treated medically, then discharged as places were found for them.

Their country of origin is often listed. These are people who would probably not have adequate income to buy farms, and thus be listed on the annals of county history. Just because they were poor does not make them outcasts. Undoubtedly many people were born to these temporarily unfortunate pioneers who made their way up in the world and became landowners.

Many of these persons were old and sick and had no relatives to claim them for burial, so they were ordered buried in the Morgan County Farm cemeteries always near the main house. There were 3 successive poor farms in various areas around Jacksonville, and this history will be pieced together and recited at a later date.

Because of finding these record books from 1848-1951, we will be able, by diligent effort, to reconstruct many burials in these otherwise forgotten cemeteries. While tombstones with vital information are practically non-existent in these cases, we can eventually glean much of this information from the record books left behind by the various Superintendents, and the early Court Records. In the beginning, the three County Commissioners were the County Judges.

Evidently the Superintendent died at this point, and from here on for 10 years the records are too poorly kept to read and interpret. The rest of the records from 1863 to 1933 have not yet been examined. We have about 500 cards on persons who were inhabitants from 1933 to the closing of the Morgan County Poor Farm on December 20, 1951.

There are two cemeteries on this third farm, and we now have the names of many persons who were buried there. Of course all persons deceased after 1878 are on the death index files in the Morgan County Clerk's Office, regardless as to whether they died on the Poor Farm, at the State Hospital, or in an elegant mansion. The Morgan County burials will be compiled and published at a later date.

HAZEL GREEN CEMETERY

Nov. 1, 1970

Although situated only four miles north of the Illinois Braille and Sight Saving School in Jacksonville, HAZEL GREEN CEMETERY is one of the more difficult cemeteries to reach in Morgan County. Known as the Savage Station neighborhood, only traces remain of a lane which apparently was the route to this cemetery in the northeast quarter of Section 4, Township 15 North, Range 10 West, 3rd Principal Meridian. Thickly covered with brush, fallen trees and myrtle, there are probably other fallen tombstones that cannot be seen at this reading.

Can anybody else tell us something of the history of this forsaken cemetery, or give us additional information of burials? Please send them to the Jacksonville Area Genealogical Society.

The above cemetery reading is a sample of the method to be used by the Jacksonville Genealogical Society in publishing readings. There has been much debate amongst genealogists as to the best method. Many persons favor giving the reading as it comes from the cemetery, as a guide to location of stones in relationship to each other, and disclosure as to the exact reading, along with some epitaphs.

Such readings are difficult to scan for surnames, require many more words per printed page, and cause typing problems. After considerable thought and research, we believe that saving space, recording vital data in alphabetical, easily read columns is far more practical. We also leave space for additional information to be written in by genealogists whose family members are interred there.

If our volunteers can willingly provide this much information for the benefit of the general public, and exactly pinpoint the location of old cemeteries generally unknown, surely persons who are interested in having exact readings can pay a reasonable fee for the reading from the Society, or locate the stone in the cemetery themselves, and copy it down as they wish, or take snapshots or rubbings.

CROW CEMETERY, also called ELMORE CEMETERY

 March 21, 1970

Covered with a dense growth of brush and fallen trees, this cemetery is not recognizable as a burial ground from the road that lies about 150 yards south, straddling the Cass-Morgan county line.

Crow Cemetery is in the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter of Section 31 in Township 17North, Range 8 West, Cass County. It is about two miles from Prentice, and about one mile west of Cooper Cemetery.

COOPER CEMETERY, read March 21, 1970

Although this cemetery is actually some 150 yards north of the Morgan and Cass county line, the compilers are including it here since those persons buried here were well known in Prentice, on the Morgan County side of the line.

The tiny burial site, its surrounding three-feet-high stone wall in need of repair, is in a field in the southeast quarter of Section 31 in Township 17 North, Range 8 West, Cass County. It is about 1½ miles north of Prentice. Persons still alive remember that, as children, they were chased away from the cemetery by a woman standing on the porch of a nearby house (no longer there), and shouting for them to leave, while she waved a broom to add emphasis to her words.

WOODLAWN CEMETERY ALSO CALLED HUFFAKER CEMETERY
June 9, 1974

No known burials remain in this former cemetery, which was used as a burial ground for the family of Michael Huffaker. He received the land patent for this land from the government of the United States on March 6, 1824. When the land was sold out of the family many years later, the new owner insisted the burials be removed.

Those bodies interred in Woodlawn Cemetery were then removed to Jacksonville's Diamond Grove Cemetery.

A description of Woodlawn Cemetery survives in a Huffaker family history. The cemetery was across the road and south of the house of Michael Huffaker, which he had built himself, even making his own bricks. The house is still occupied in 1974. The cemetery was so situated that he could sit on his front porch and see the hallowed ground, which was enclosed by a white fence. An arched gateway, covered with roses, served as the entrance. A large weeping willow tree seemed to protect the several graves with their white tombstones. The cemetery was on high ground just north of North Fork Mauvaisterre Creek, and on the east side of a road. It was about .8 of a mile northeast of Arnold. Legal description of the cemetery site was in the southwest quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 19 in Township 15 North, Range 9 West, 3rd Principal Meridian.

A discrepancy in the above reading, however, appears from the Morgan County Circuit Court records, case #1790. The Petition for Letters Testamentary notes that Frances J. Huffaker deceased "on or about the 30th day of March 1883". Survivors included her husband Michael Huffaker, her children Frank W. Huffaker, Mary Shuff and Fannie Grassly, and Jennie Huffaker & _____ Huffaker, her grandchildren. Michael was appointed Executor by her Will, but since he died several days later, 9 April 1883, Case #1791, both estates were administered by Wm. P. Callon.

No doubt the child listed as being in Woodlawn cemetery was the child of Fannie Grassly

This points up the advantage of researching any estate administrations in a given county, not only for similar surnames, but possible related ones. Fortunately in Morgan County, so far every case examined has the Petition for Letters of Administration tucked in the file. This lists the date of death and surviving heirs. They begin in December 1827, immediately after the fire which destroyed the records in the log courthouse which had accumulated since the County was established Jan. 31 Laws 1823, containing Cass, Morgan and Scott counties, then undivided, now called "Old Morgan".

Our Society President, Mrs. Florence Hutchison, is currently making a card index on all estate administrations from 1827 to about 1900, and the first three pages of this eventual alphabetical index is included in this issue of the Journal.
