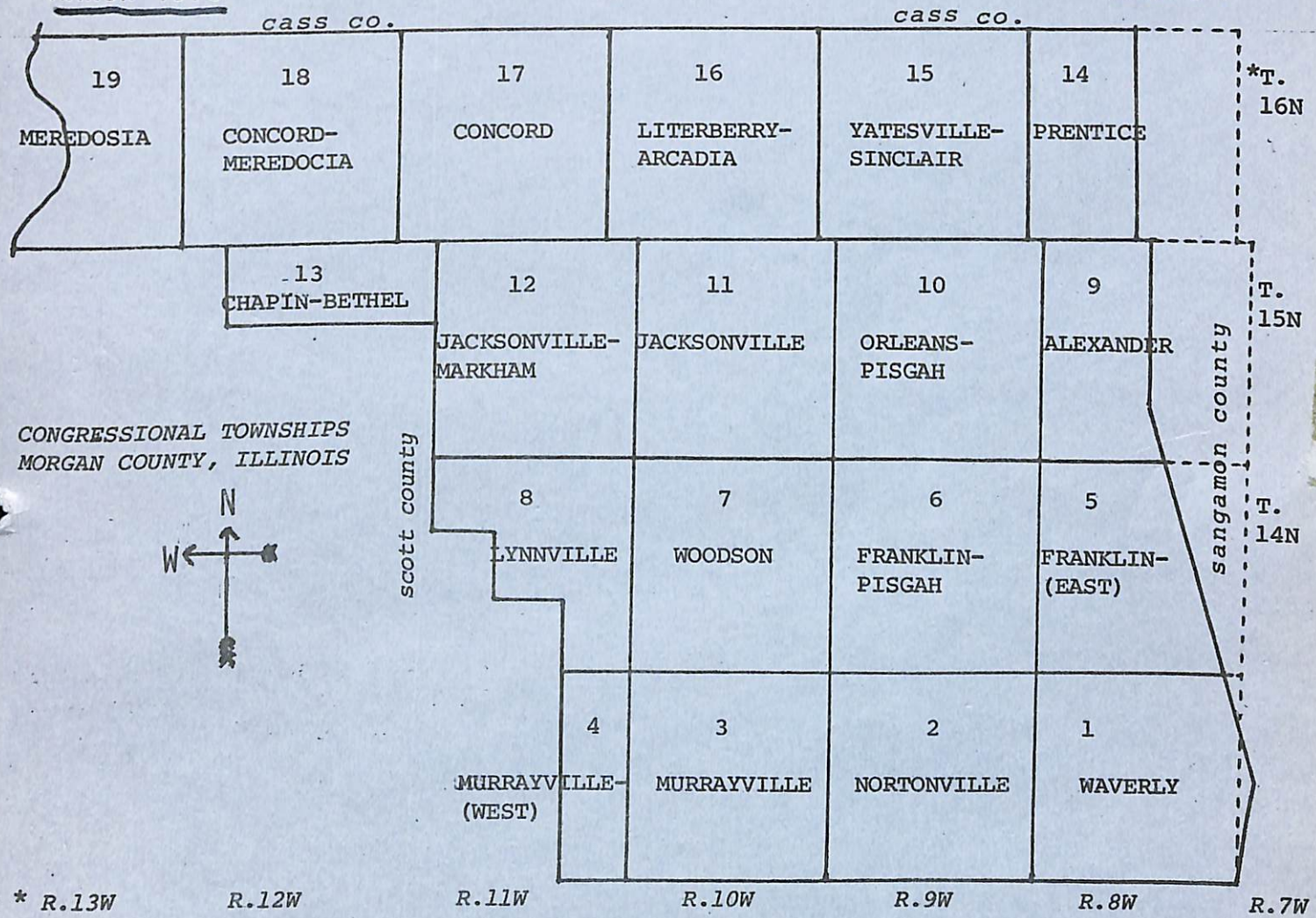

A note I had to leave out of my introduction to Cemeteries in Morgan County: Should a cemetery deed recorded in the Courthouse be honored as an eternal franchise on a given piece of land they are buried in? It appears to me that if a farmer or real estate dealer is able to take over land, dig a hole and bury the tombstones, and build on the land, then it is just as right for a stranger to come on ANY person's deeded property and take it over any time he chooses to do so. Deeds recorded for cemeteries should be just as inviolable as any other property. We need a good landmark suit on this in the State of Illinois in order to discourage the takeover of deeded cemeteries for farming or home development, without proper and legal removal of the bodies to an established cemetery. These old cemeteries, where possible, should be preserved as historic sites or parks, if nothing else. This is not the case in many circumstances. That is why it is imperative that our family historian make, collect, and put on public record all cemetery readings we can - and as soon as possible!

If you want to make Time pass quickly, just be Editor of a genealogical quarterly and watch it fly between your masterpiece productions!

If you want to know who your NEW officers are, just look at your old books; except Virginia Gordon, on the nominating committee, was too timid to place her own name on the ballot. So, I and my whole cabinet landslided(?) into office again. We welcome my old traveling companion Clara Wiese. She and I shared the rough dormitory life for a week at George Washington University last June in Washington D.C. while attending the World's Federation of Vexillologists. We met Europe's finest and most avid flag historians.

In case we have a new reader -- vexil refers to flag. *Vexillum* means "square flag". I am more of a Vexillumologist -- a square flag-historian!

I hope you-all find something of interest in this *Geneal Journal*. It wound up entirely different than first planned, which was to be an index of Morgan County marriages up to 1860 like the Greene ones (with the blue covers.) And then I made an exciting discovery of a Guardians Book for the 1850 period and started making index cards on the minors, their ages and birthdates for about 137 decedents. But before that was finished, I discovered a big chronological index of naturalizations, xeroxed the entire book, and my faithful helpers started making index cards by the hundreds. That is such a huge task, it has to wait for more research and TIME. At this point do not expect much help except for a name and date in County Courthouse records for these. The indexers in 1941, when Morgan County stopped taking applications forgot to leave the key to the books. For example, MS p.60, or MA p. 90 does not mean a thing to present Court Clerks. I am about to make the breakthrough as to what books are referred to.

About that time Howard Davenport brought me that beautiful old Patterson Bible cal825 with info that did wind up in this Journal. I wanted to put the beautiful engraving of the Tower of Babel on my cover, but opted for the map which is proper for the Cemetery listings in this book over which many of our members have slaved for 5 years.

In the meantime I have given talks on my favorite subject 'How to Start Your Family History NOW' to the Kiwanis Club in Winchester (Scott County), the Macoupin County Historical Society, and the Waverly Community. You will see the happy results of the latter on another page. Nothing gives me greater pleasure than to start a new genealogical society. I'd organize one in every community, if possible!

Jane Coble has been "working her head off" on school records ever since last summer when she received donation of treasurer's books and other data from 3 old rural school districts. Her discussion at our February meeting (the first one since October) created a lot of interest for our members to donate records and related pictures to us, or loan them for reproduction.

She and I were permitted to search the attic room of the Regional Superintendent's office and found many old school records of great interest to us as genealogists. Mr Paul Keller has been most cooperative in making records available to us. I xeroxed the 8th grade exam students for the 1880's, but it will be quite some time before we accomplish an index.

One precious book I found loaded with dust was the register of elected County Officers beginning in 1823 to about 1850. Virginia has made cards on all of these but we have not had time to process them. I have had quite a busy time keeping Margaret Farmer and Bernice Massey supplied with the lot cards out of the City Clerk's office on the burials in the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Jacksonville East Cemetery. We are about 2/3 finished. Now, if somebody could just donate us enough money to buy a house where we could start a Genealogical, Vexillological and Sphragisticological Library so that I could put in it all of the collections in my house, I wouldn't have to stumble over all these boxes that are rapidly closing in on me! There are times when I wish I weren't such an ambitious historical soul - but on the other hand, life wouldn't be so exciting. One never know what interesting person or discovery he/she will meet next! (Or should that be she/he? That rhymes better with Tee-Hee.)

I was so intrigued by Elsie Armstrong's diary in verse when Dr. Jarret of Illinois College called me to ask my advice about it. I had an interesting session with him and then met the charming person rather new to Production Press, Mrs. Law. We would love to find Elsie's original manuscript written with a broad quill pen. Does any Strawn relative have it in their possession? We want to photograph a few samples.

Our faithful Lucille, fortunately for me a retired library^{an} from MacMurray College, has quite a time keeping our financial, publications and membership department going. We have a lot of fun talking to each other on the phone concerning the business end of our Society, our hassles with IRS and corporation reports, etc. Whenever I need a reminder to keep an appointment I inform her, she writes it down and calls me about every 15 minutes trying to get me there on time! We enjoy the exciting letters we receive from people truly from "around the world". (Of course the problem is -- getting them answered. We are sorry about all of those lying in wait - but once inawhile we find the right ancestor and make some people very happy.) It is relaxing to work with someone like Lucille who has a great sense of humor. One day she said: "You and I can have more fun out of a misplaced comma than most people get out of going to a circus!"

About the new Waverly Society - if you want to be a Charter Member you have to get your money in quick. They already have over 60 members. We set the dues the first night after presenting the Resolution. I was prepared with receipt books, and the Secretary took in about \$40.00 the first night. See how easy it is to start a Society? People are eager to join such a group. I am sure you will not want to tear this book, in order to use the App. blank. Just put the info on a 3x5 card instead. I purpose-ly made them in this manner so that we could print single sheets to use elsewhere, and save making 2 masters.

Pertaining to our Cemetery listings: For those of you who purchased our 1872-1894 Atlas and Plat Map book, you can easily locate a cemetery by referring to the correct map (page numbers on page 20, I think) from our list. Perhaps one of your families lived on nearby farms and may thus have been buried at this location.

Mr. and Mrs. Chester Funk have turned in to us many readings for Scott County, and she prepared an alphabetical surname index by which we can easily find some burials. Doris Wankel has just made such an index for all of the Greene County Cemeteries that Bob Dalton typed for us from readings turned in by several avid "cemetarians". Because of all of our indexing work, that is why our correspondence is piling up. But someday we will be able to find ancestors more easily, so bear with us Timewise.

From my naturalization research I learned a lot - that we need genealogists to take time out from seeking ancestors to finding methods as to how we can retrieve some valuable materials from our Courthouses whose records are so vague. Please read Neagle's book on the subject. It will give you insight as to the various laws which affect the situation. While oaths are on file from 1865 on, all they reveal is the man's name and date, names of his two witnesses and the Judge's name. A man may have filed his first Intention in New York, Louisiana, or Philadelphia, or elsewhere, and that record would not show here. After filing his second Petition here, he may have taken his oath with friends or relatives in another county.

For Illinois ancestors, do not expect to get Homestead Patent numbers and find a Petition on file in Washington DC, as stated in Neagles book. Lincoln's 1862 Homestead Act came too late for aliens to find land here, according to Dr. Wayne Temple and Lowell Volkel of our State Archives. Kansas, Nebraska and other western states have that possibility. Prior to 1906, when the law changed, it is rare to find this important Petition in our local courthouses. About the best we can do is name of man, and 1 or 2 dates when he filed or took oath, except in rare instances. We are working on this angle. Be patient a while longer.

Impossible dream? EVERY family historian in the U.S. and elsewhere to send LONG stamped addressed envelopes! to enclose our gleanings. Gleaningly Yours, Mrs. Florence Hutchison, Editor, etc.

[This tract, on file in the vault at the Illinois College Library, was prepared in preparation for selling burial lots in the College Hill Cemetery to provide funds for operating the College. It is a marvelous description from the cupola of our second courthouse on the Public Square of Jacksonville. The first one, a log structure burned, with all records except the Deed Book, about December 6, 1827. From this description you can gain a concept of the City as it looked to your forefathers.]

JACKSONVILLE is one of the largest towns in the State of Illinois; its centre is upon a small mound or circular swell of land, elevated about 10 feet above the general level of the surrounding prairie; it was laid out in 1825; its streets are at right angles with each other; each side of the original plat is 1866 feet and there is a public square of 500 feet in the centre.

ADDITIONS have been made to it on all its sides, so that it is now more than a mile square and contains 1800 inhabitants, exclusive of the families and students upon the College Farm, which is not included in its limits. It is in the centre of Morgan county, and the Court House is on its public square.

From its cupola on this Court House [which evidently had windows on all 4 sides] at one mile due East, on the road to Springfield, commences the timber land on the Western bluff of the Mauvisterre Creek. This bluff is about 50 feet above the square and is called the Mauvisterre Grove; commencing at a point about 3 miles S.E., and occasionally increasing its elevation as it goes, it accompanies the Creek in its beautiful sweep by the East and North, till its view, at about 6 miles distant, in the N.W., is intercepted by an Island-Grove which descends and juts into the Prairie north of Governor Duncan's seat and about two miles from the eye.

West from the cupola is College Grove, commencing immediately back of the buildings, one mile from the Court House, 60 feet above the public square, and overlooking all before it and on either hand. This Grove, though not connected, yet appears from the Court House to be joined, with the Governor's, and to descend with it gradually to the level prairie on the North; to the South it descends about half way down the gentle slope and nearly to the railroad recently surveyed, where it opens to the eye, between itself and Diamond Grove, a view of Lynnville, situated at 7 miles distance, on another swell twentyfeet above the road at Jacksonville.

Diamond Grove commences one mile south from the College at an elevation of about 30 feet above the square; on this line it gently rises to the South and descends again into open prairie, projecting its point South Easterly almost to the St. Louis road, which runs South from Jacksonville. Between this point and the S.W. point of the grove first mentioned, is no hill or grove to meet the eye; some few spots of trees appear in the distance, like single ships in the offing; but all else is an "open prairie of the West." The following is copied from a description of the place in 1832.

"The surface of the ground in that vicinity is thrown into heavy swells, resembling mountain waves after having lost some portion of their elevation. In the eastern edge of a grove which crowns one of these eminences, the College buildings are situated, and overlook Jacksonville, which lies down a regularly inclined plain at the distance of one mile. To a spectator on College Hill, the village appears to occupy the centre of a circle, whose circumference, bounded by woodlands, sweeps around till it is lost on either hand by the grove in rear of the College buildings' while almost the whole surface of the prairie, which composes the area of this circle, lies directly under the eye. This, sprinkled over with cottages, farms, herds of cattle, and travellers seen in the distance, moving in every direction to and from the village, presents a scene of beauty seldom sur-

passed. The transition of that region from an entirely uncultivated state to its present condition, has been marvellously rapid. The fires that have swept in lonely grandeur over those prairies from time immemorial, have but just begun to find their progress impeded by cultivated fields and roads and the various works of art. In those very fields which now compose the College Farm, the deer has but just ceased to feed and to bound or recline in security, and the yells of the prairie wolf even now occasionally break upon the ears of the student, as he slumbers within classic walls."

Four regular Churches or religious Societies are incorporated here, each of them having a meeting-house and a stated pastor. A Female Academy has a large and commodious building for its use, and is well supported. Two of these houses, the Episcopal and Presbyterian, and the Academy, are situated on one of the ADDITIONS to Jacksonville, towards the College Plat; and indeed all the lands West of Jacksonville, up to the College tract, except a lot which belongs to minor heirs, is already laid out into building lots, and many of them are already occupied as such.

* Morgan county is one of the best farming counties in the State; it contained more inhabitants in 1830 than any other -- and doubtless does still. Very few sections of its lands are in the hands of speculating corporations or individuals; it is principally occupied by practical farmers. Jacksonville being the County seat, and having all its public business, as well as all its county offices and officers there, to say nothing of the College and its family of more than two hundred, constantly residing at its door, and giving it their influence and custom -- cannot but continue to be, as it has been, a growing and thriving place. It has already a country about it to sustain it; and indeed, however rapidly it has risen, it is not in advance of the actual growth which must support it. By inspection of a map, it will be seen that it is not only the centre of its county but very nearly of the State; and as an evidence of its central relationship to other important portions, it is the central point of six railroads, actually incorporated, and of another actually commenced at Naples, though not incorporated.

Three of these [railroads] are from Beardstown, Meredocia, and Augusta, on the Illinois river; the first being on the route to Galena, and each of the others to Quincy, on the Mississippi, and Jefferson City in Missouri; the others are from Springfield, Waverly, and Carrolton; the first on the great route through Indiana and Ohio, east, as well as to Peoria and Chicago, or Michigan, north; and the last on the route to Alton and St. Louis, in the south. The road from Augusta is actually commenced, and will be completed with all possible dispatch; it will be the first within several hundred miles of Jacksonville, and cannot but give increase of business and add greatly to the value of property in that place; it commences about 10 miles below Naples, and about 26 from Jacksonville, passing through Winchester and Lynnville, two thriving villages, in its way, and also through the College Farm.

[The rest of the promotional literature deals with the desirability of lots for sale for homesites around Illinois College. It provides a beautiful plat map, but research indicates that this land was later replatted so that this map does not give an accurate description of the lots as they are today, hence would not be necessary to reproduce herewith.]

Also, with these finds, which Mr. Pratt permitted us to xerox out of the Library, was the original plat map for College Hill Cemetery which no longer exists. After Diamond Grove was opened in 1868, many of the bodies were re-interred in the latter, and from our indexing we will eventually be able to provide quite a complete listing of persons who were moved. Details for this will be provided in one of our future *Geneal Journnals*.

As these cemetery indexes were being typed from the cards made so faithfully and abundantly by a few of our friends and society members, it appeared that there were many little points that needed checking either on the burial grounds, on the death certificates at the Courthouse, or on the lot cards or chronological records at the City Clerk's office; however, the project has taken far too much energy and time as it is, and so we have to leave the final determinations as to the proper spellings, locations and dates to the individual researcher.

If any person discovers errors, we like to have a letter quoting the source, and making the correction, but we do not guarantee that we will publish it later. That is always a hope, but because there are so very many original materials heretofore unavailable to the public that we try to put in our limited space of the Journals, it is not possible to pick up these minor points. However, we keep a file of letters, and somebody some day may benefit from reading your communications, and be able to benefit from your care and kindness. We earnestly wish we had a library and librarian in which we could file all of this materials and make it readily available to the public, but having no such facilities at our disposal currently, we will have to bide our time and make the best use of these collections as we can under the circumstances.

We are currently making cards on the East Half of Jacksonville East Cemetery. Then when we xerox out the cards on the Eastview Addition, from the City Clerk's Office, we will have a card on everybody buried in these 4 City cemeteries up to about December 1976. Eventually we can look at the chronological record book and add those more recent burials. This is tremendous progress, but we have a long way to go yet before we get the cards processed and burial directories typed for public presentation.

Our next goal will be to make a record of the burials in the Diamond Grove Memorial Mausoleum which is a privately owned institution, and whose records are not available at the City Clerk's office.

For a list of burials in the State Hospital Section of Diamond Grove, see the June 1978 issue of the State Genealogical Quarterly. We did not get them in to the new Editor, Dr. Weatherbee, until too late for the current March issue. A list is on file, however, at the Illinois State Historical Library.



The foregoing cemetery list, compiled from many sources of research and readings is the result of 5 years labor since we started the process of collecting them. In the meantime, several individuals have faithfully searched for and spent much time in the many cemeteries recording, transcribing, correcting, rechecking, and disbursing money on doctors trying to heal their poison ivy discomforts. They would finally turn in copies to your Society President who has also spent many hours and days coordinating the effort and preparing and indexing copies for public use in many ways. She calls herself CIA -- Central Intelligence Agency for Collecting Intelligent Advisories from members and friends. She has devised standard methods of discovering old cemeteries, and has spent much time in courthouse research for deeds and old plat maps. She listed the cemeteries as unknowns and disbursed the list to our immediate members and many of them went out to the suspected locations and found the traces. Naming the sites has been a problem. Some deeds gave the old name, but no one knew it any more. So several names have been compiled for the same site, with one being selected for the major one to which all others are referred. Sometimes we took the name of the farmer owning the land in the 1872, 1894 or 1914 plat maps when the mark  was first shown. Oft-times alternate names were discovered in death certificates when a husband and wife were buried side by side, but listed as two different cemeteries.

Out of this has developed a unique method for pinpointing and indexing cemeteries according to the Congressional Township of six miles square (or fractional parts thereof), and not according to civil township names, precincts, nor road district numbers. This congressional township method was adopted by our earliest plat map makers in Illinois, and one we should follow now in view of the constant changes in political townships within the county boundaries. Use as your references, for locating old cemeteries, the 1872-74, 1893-95, 1913-15 series of Atlases and Plat Map books which many of our Societies are having reprinted in recent years.

Start your cemetery list from these books by using a pink or green Hi-Liter pen to mark the spot for easy reference. If you do not want to mark the book, xerox out copies. Most of them can be covered in two long pages. Mark church sites with one color, schools another and cemeteries another color. This makes the page "come alive" with sites of genealogical interest.

Also acquire a copy of the Illinois Veterans' Commission Honor Roll of County, Illinois published ca 1956. We xeroxed our copies. This gives a splendid list of names for cemeteries as they were known at that time. We had to hand-number the pages in the book for reference. If you find errors in this book and can make corrections, the Illinois Veterans Commission, War Veterans Graves Registration Division on West Jefferson Street, Springfield ILL 62705 will be very appreciative of receiving them and correcting their file cards.

If all counties, which have accumulated readings, would adopt this method of identification and place copies in one location, we could computerize all cemetery records in Illinois for easy retrieval. The Code would include County, section, township, range, principal meridian, number of pages in manuscript, and cemetery name. A reminder: always include the meridian number (here 3PM or 3M) with readings, as that identifies Illinois in case a cemetery reading is extracted and read elsewhere in the world. For example, Allinson and Bull-Austif cemeteries in our county, whose ranges are North of the Base Line, and West of the Third Principal Meridian, would read:

MORG-IL31-T15N-R11W-3M-03-ALLINSON [cemetery named could be coded ALLIN]
MORG-IL27-T13N-R09W-3M-07-BULL-AUSTIFF [" " " " " BU-AU]
[Co. Sec Town.Range *pp cemetery] *pp = number pages in manuscript + index.

A fast Surname Index is being prepared as the front page of each cemetery, so that when one picks up the copy he scans the alphabetical list first. Even when readings are alphabetized some names, out of place, or added at the back, might be otherwise missed. If the transcriber does not have all soldiers listed, then we add those from the IVC Honor Roll mentioned above. IVC=Illinois Veterans Commission. If you are interested in securing a copy of Surname Index for Morgan County, or Scott, or Greene, please send a card indicating your interest, no money now, so that we would have an idea as to how many to publish. They would probably be about \$2.00 per county. The surname index for Cass County Cemeteries of Arthur Crumrine's 1970 edition was in our *Geneal Journal* (gray cover) unfortunately listed for June and August 1974, Volume II, when it should have read 1975, Vol. III. Copies of this are available at \$2.00.

Among our most avid recorders of cemeteries have been Robert Dalton, our Local Service Award recipient 2 years ago, Myra Martin and John King, recipients of the award in previous years. There are several others whose labors have produced numerous cemetery records for our use, but we hesitate to name them for fear of omitting some one at this particular time when we are beginning to make headway on pulling such records together, indexing them, and getting them processed for retrieval.

Bob, a newspaperman since he was 9 years old, is night foreman for our Journal-Courier. He has a unique way of putting readings together with other related data. Here are some notes on the subject from him:

The task of compiling the burials in the cemeteries was begun in 1967 as a public service project. At first only tombstone readings were recorded, but this soon evolved into searching out the unmarked graves as well, and probing with a metal rod for buried stones. I retrieved many stones that had washed down the hills, and laid them with stones of related names.

Additional information is sometimes included, such as obituaries, items of interest about the deceased, military service, etc. Some of the cemeteries I searched no longer exist, but are now trailer courts, housing developments, pastures and plowed fields, regrettably.

Sources of information I used to obtain the burial listings have included tombstone readings, cemetery records, coroner reports, death certificates, court records, land deeds, family records, interviews with relatives, *landowners, sportsmen and mushroom hunters, lists of readings from others, and newspaper microfilms. Retired cemetery sextons are a valuable source of information as to the set-up of larger cemeteries, and they may have old records in their possession. In using microfilms of old newspapers a researcher should pay special attention to the "country correspondence" columns from outlying areas of interest. Usually printed once a week, the country correspondents often mentioned births and deaths occurring in the neighborhood, and sometimes named the place of burial.

*Bob always secures permission from the landowners before going on the property. He is the kind of gentle, sincere person who always obtains it, too. His introduction to every cemetery which gives directions, or descriptive evidence of the burying ground, as it used to be called, along with that all-important Section, Township, Range and PM, makes the area "come alive", or gives the indication that no trace now exists.

We number our Congressional township maps beginning with Map #1 in the lower right-hand corner of the counties progressing east to west across the townships, then proceeding north with each range as it appears.

We name them by a town or two in the six square miles (or fractional parts thereof. If a square has no town, we use the town East or West of it, or a combination of towns on either side; i.e., Concord-Meredosia for that six miles square between them.

"SKETCHES OF MY LIFE"

by Elsie Strawn Armstrong, edited by Frances Strawn Giberson of Colorado Springs, Colorado, has been recently printed by Production Press, Inc., of Jacksonville, Illinois. This is a charming diary type of genealogical heritage written in verse.

A book I bought for my son Perry, when a school boy and as I found it this morning, lying on my table, I thought I would try to scribble down a brief recital of the labors of my childhood, for the amusement of my grandchildren and great-grandchildren. In the year of Eighteen Hundred and Fifty Six, I was severely afflicted with inflammatory rheumatism, more especially in my right hand and right eye. My hand soon recovered, but my eye is still very sore, so I cannot see to work, but with a large goose quill, that makes a large black mark, I can see to write a part of my time and it is amusement for me.

Mar. 28, 1860.

Thus, begins the unique diary and personal history of Elsie Strawn Armstrong. Elsie Strawn was born November 4, 1795, in Bucks County, Pennsylvania, the daughter of Isaiah Strawn and Rachel Reed. She was one of 12 children; ten boys and two girls. The family lived in Pennsylvania, later coming to Ohio, and then into Illinois. She was warned, "not to go to Illinois, for people soon die there!"

Her grandfather, Jacob Strawn, born in 1719, was the son of Mary Buckman and Lancelot Strawn. The Buckman family came to America with William Penn, on his second crossing of the Atlantic. They were all Quakers.

Elsie and her husband, Joseph L. Armstrong, were married 19 May 1808, and had 9 children. He died 25 October 1856 in Chatham, Ohio. Elsie was the sister of Jacob Strawn, of Morgan County. He was known as the "Cattle King" throughout Illinois. She died 31 May, 1871 in Morris, Illinois.

From reading the death certificate of Hettie Israel Patterson (Book 28 p. 168) we began to solve the mystery as to where the family lived. Her parents were Frank H. Patterson, born in Kentucky, and Catherine Guest (Gest), also born in Kentucky. Hettie was born in Concord, Illinois, 24 April 1858. She died 4 November 1937, aged 79 years, 6 months 10 days. She was single, and a teacher at the School for the Deaf for fifty years. She is buried in Diamond Grove, Lot 79, Section A. Also on the lot are Mr. and Mrs. F. M. Patterson, Robert, W. H. Patterson, and Julia E. Heyers. Next to it, Lot 80, lies Mary J. Strawn listed on death record above.

FORMULA FOR A MORE-SATISFYING LIFE

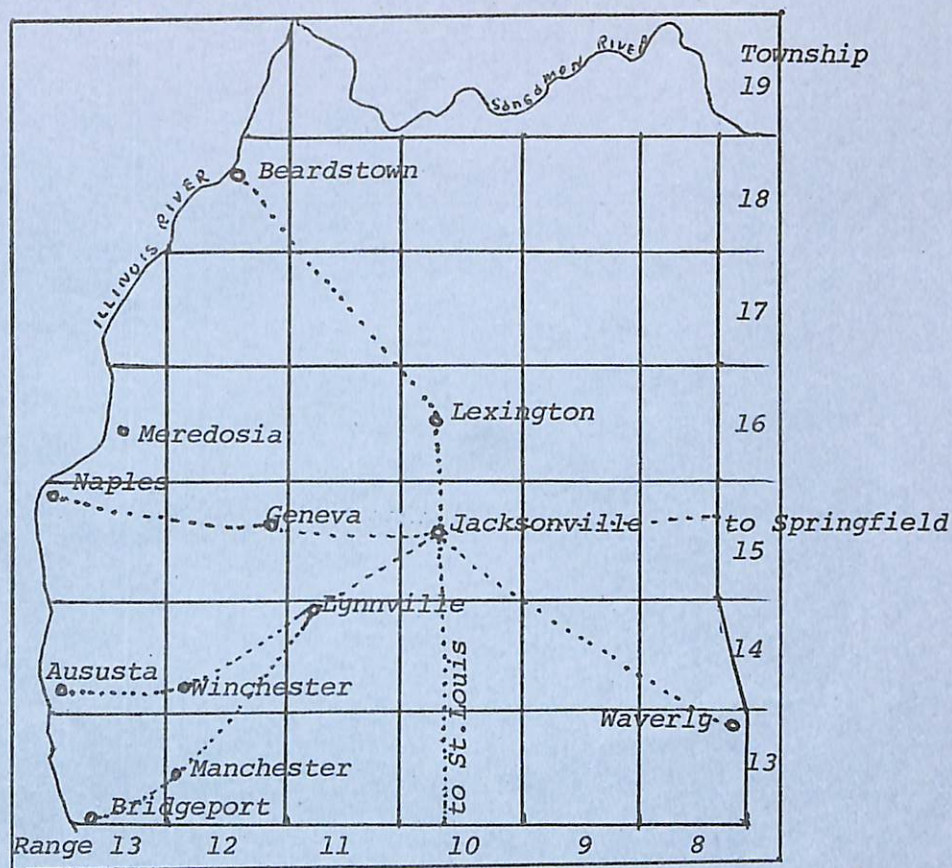
