




One of my first "loves", with all my multitudinous duties to home, family, genealogical and vexillological responsibilities and lectures, is creating another *GENEAL JOURNAL* that may be of valuable assistance, or reading pastime and pleasure for our hundreds of members and friends in the numerous states that the society's quarterly is sent to. Lucille has just told me that she has addressed 640 to send out within the next few days!

At this holiday season, we take this opportunity to thank all those persons who have sent us complimentary notes and lovely Christmas cards. It is impossible, time-wise, for me to make personal response to each welcome letter, especially since this particular quarterly is being prepared pre-Christmas in order to avoid the ten-day closing of one of the printing offices during the last week of the year.

But we always have to be patient and do the best we can, as collating 14,000 sheets of paper and putting together 700 copies is no small job. There is usually only two of us to accomplish the mailing process. After Lucille and I have finished the "seemingly impossible", we hug each other and joyfully say, "We dood it again!"

So many new researchers, as well as our members, write and ask if there is any person available to do more research for them. We are happy to say that three ambitious ladies are now available. Their names and addresses are given on page 32, along with some address corrections and acknowledgment that your editor, being human, makes some typing errors and unintentional omissions.

With so many new members in our enclosed Directory, there is no room left to put in a great many other things I deemed important. But we are grateful that they decided to include their name in our 1986 listing, because we see the possibilities that kindred souls are going to find each other, and be able to share family information to the satisfaction of both.

Unfortunately, we occasionally receive reports such as this: "I sent that person a lot of family history, but have never heard from them since. They never even acknowledged that they received my package." Won't all of you please remember to respond to such correspondence, even if you receive materials that do not tie in to your family! Our dear friend and excellent researcher, Myra Martin, has sent out so much good history to inquirers, never to hear from them again. Postage and some payment for copies, which are not cheap, should be returned to these genealogical history "senders", even if they do not send a statement of costs.

We are very proud of the new societies in west central Illinois. The Meredosia Area H.&G. Society announce that they had 155 charter members at their December meeting. They have presented Yours Truly with a Life membership for help with their organization as the 100th society in the State of Illinois. The Griggsville G&H Society is the 103rd one.

The organizers of the Hemminghaus-Pond Cemetery Association is very much interested in acquiring family history sheets from relatives anywhere. A new association is being planned for the Greenwood cemetery in January. Anyone interested in that cemetery can write to Mr. Charles Ater, 329 Caldwell, Jacksonville IL 62650.

Perhaps these announcements will encourage others to form an association to protect the abandoned cemeteries in their area. Your Editor knows all the "ins and outs" involved with the procedures in these cases, from experience with others on the Morgan County Cemetery Advisory Board. We hope that our widespread members will consider making donations to assist these local workers in repairing and restoring these plots which were dedicated as "God's Acres" in the long, long past. Beatrice Branch wrote these appropriate lines, as published in "Sunshine Magazine".

Much valuable ancestral data is contained in a large book containing the minutes, necrological lists and membership data 1869-1899. A photocopy has been made of the many pages, and is being put on a computer listing for future use by Florence Hutchison and Warren Haley. To introduce the membership list, the following information is taken from the History of Morgan County, 1878 by Donnelley, Loyd & Company, pages 319,320.

"The following history of the Association, with its list of members, was prepared by the Secretary, Mr. Timothy Chamberlain. The society is one of the best organized in the Western States. Mr. Chamberlain has taken great pains in keeping the records of its meetings, and the list of its members, in an exceedingly neat and systematic manner in a book prepared by him expressly for this purpose:

"At a Fourth of July celebration at Arcadia in 1869, there were found to be a large number of the early settlers of the county, and the conversation naturally turning to things and events of the past, and a desire having been expressed by many of the aged persons present to meet their friends of early days, it was decided among them that a call should be issued in the papers, and all invited to be present at a picnic."

The following notice appeared in the Jacksonville Journal of September 2, 1869:

"OLD SETTLERS' MEETING.--A meeting of the old settlers of Morgan County will be held at Arcadia, Thursday, September 9th, in D. G. Henderson's grove, at which time Judge William Thomas, J. T. Jones and M. P. Ayres, will speak.

Other speakers are expected, and without doubt the picnic, for such it is to be, will be an occasion of great interest. It is desired that all those residing in the territory, which in 1830 was embraced in Morgan County, should be present and participate in the exercises. Old settlers are particularly invited."

The first regular meeting of the old settlers of Morgan, Cass and Scott, was held in the grove near Arcadia, on Thursday, September 9th, 1869. Pioneers from all parts of these counties were on hand at an early hour. The exercises were opened with prayer by Rev. Joel Goodrick. Hon. Joseph Morton, Capt. Yaples, Judge Whitlake, Bradley Thompson, M. P. Ayres, and others, made remarks appropriate to the occasion. A letter was read from Judge William Thomas, apologizing for and explaining his absence. Mr. Charles Cox was First Marshal of the day, and Mr. John M. Wilson assistant. Dr. John Craig was Secretary.

Not less than 500 persons were present. An ode was sung, composed by Major George M. McConnel, of Jacksonville. The following resolution, offered by Mr. M. P. Ayres, was unanimously adopted:

"Resolved, That we cherish tenderly the recollection of the names of our honored dead, the early pioneers of our county, and we realize that though dead, yet through their works they still speak, and we trust we may imitate their virtues, and show by our works our appreciation of the toils and trials endured in our behalf."

It was intended that a regular association should be organized at this time, so that hereafter annual meetings might be held, and every valuable act concerning the history of the counties be preserved. However, the time was so fully occupied with other matters, that such an organization could not be effected, and a meeting was called for August 25, 1870, which met again in Henderson's grove, near Arcadia, and after listening to speeches from Hon. Newton Cloud, Rev. N. P. Heath, Major G. M. McConnel, Senator Richard Yates, and others a society was organized, and a constitution was presented and adopted. All could then become members who were in this region previous to the deep snow of 1830 and 1831.

Ode sung at the "Old Settlers Meeting",
Arcadia, September 9, 1869, composed by
Mr. George M. McConnel, of Jacksonville.
Air: *Auld Lang Syne*.

"Should auld acquaintance be forgot",
In busy - fast today?
And they and theirs remembered not,
As time slips swift away?
Not so; we catch the faint perfume
That drifts along the air,
And pluck the fragrant flowers that bloom,
In memory's garden fair.

We've not forgot those early days,
In still and solemn woods,
Or 'neath the sun's untempered blaze,
O'er prairie solitudes,
Where wanton summer breezes sighed,
O'er seas of summer bloom;
Or icy tempests wandered wide
In winter's clouds and gloom.

Full many a mound with turf o'er grown,
Along the path we've trod,
Mark where the heroes we have known,
Low lie beneath the sod.
No need to call the honored roll,
To vindicate their claims,
Since stream and prairie, grove and knoll,
Commemorate their names.

Fast flows the tide we drift upon,
Swift slip the years away,
And surely, sadly one by one,
Each meets his latest day;
Come then while once again we've met,
And clasp your hand with mine,
"We'll take a cup of kindness yet,
For Auld Lang Syne."

This song was once again sung at a
meeting of the Morgan County Historical
Society held in Jacksonville, at the Dunlap
Hotel, November 11, 1943.

And then, to honor the history of our
long past this song was copied and sung
at the meeting of the Jacksonville Area
Genealogical and Historical Society at
the Morgan County Courthouse, December
4, 1986, led by Florence Hutchison,
president.

Maybe somebody 50 years from now will
notice this action and talk about us as
"old settlers in Morgan County": We will
be the "antiques" in the next century!
Will our descendants be seeking our history?

* At a meeting on August 25,
* 1870, the old settlers residing
* in Morgan, Cass and Scott, com-
* posed of territory originally in-
* cluded as the County of Morgan by
* law January 31, 1823, again as-
* sembled in Henderson's Grove, near
* Arcadia, in order to secure annual
* meetings with each other, to per-
* petuate the acquaintance and
* friendship which existed among
* them during the first years of
* their residence, and to adopt a
* constitution.

* Many were later invited to send
* their names to the secretary, but
* many early settlers neglected this
* privilege for one reason, or ano-
* ther. As a result lists, recorded
* in secretary Timothy Chamberlain's
* book, do not include all persons
* in Morgan territory which was part
* of Greene County January 20, 1821
* until 1823.

* Cass became a county March 3,
* 1837, and Scott county was estab-
* lished February 16, 1839. The
* "three-mile strip of northern Mor-
* gan county was added to the lower
* part of Cass February 16, 1845.

* Genealogical researchers need
* to remember these dates of county
* establishment, in order to know
* where marriage, probate and land
* records are to be found.



The Illinois State Archives has a complete card listing of the soldiers listed in the Honor Roll books of each county. Researchers can give them the name of a veteran listed in our Jersey County index, along with page number, and they can probably find other data on the man, and send some information to the inquirer.

A second meeting was held Dec. 9 at the home of Lucille Lovekamp of Jacksonville. The Hemminghaus Cemetery Association was organized with the following officers

elected: president, Lucille Lovekamp; vice president, Helen Driver; secretary, Velma King; and treasurer, Beulah Ginder. Also present were Mrs. Hutchison (registered agent), Melvin Braker, Maurice Driver, Jim King, Rena and Carl Stegemann and Mildred Strawn.


One of our members, Mrs. William A. (Margaret) Sample, over quite a period of time, has been reading tombstone inscriptions at the Franklin City cemetery. In order to acquire additional data from other interested family historians, we are publishing this partial index of known burials.

Many stones have fallen over, are too weatherworn, or missing, for proper transcribing. No one, to my knowledge, has a complete reading of the cemetery, which is in three distinct parts. We are listing the names found in each part, so that visitors to the cemetery could more easily locate a given family plot.

We are including a plat of the three areas for reference.

We would appreciate it very much if any of our readers would send us information on any of the burials, known or unknown, at Franklin. Please send these to our society for recording and sharing with anyone else interested.

For instance, some of our members may have Bible readings for some of their ancestors or collateral relatives buried at Franklin. If they sent a copy to us, then we would have a more complete family history on the deceased whose remains lie in that big cemetery. It is our ultimate goal - for 1987 - to get as complete a record for that cemetery as is possible. Won't you help us?



Part #1---A closed Iron Gate to Railroad tracks, and into town at second entrance.
Part #2---A closed Iron Gate to ditch, to Route 104.
Part #3---Rest of old part from center of part to end.

The cemetery is very well kept. Some stones are pitted, and others are not readable. There have been broken and damaged stones, and heavy ones toppled off their bases, and are lying flat on the ground.

NOTICE OF A SMALL PUBLICATION FOR SALE PERTAINING TO MACOUPIN COUNTY:

Your Editor typed the PATRON'S DIRECTORY from the 1875 ATLAS OF MACOUPIN COUNTY, ILLINOIS published by Warner & Beers, Chicago, Illinois.

However, since there are 20 pages of the directory, it will not be possible to publish this listing in one of our quarterlies. Our society will send a copy of this valuable reference for a donation of \$3.00, which includes postage.

To my knowledge, this rare book has never been reprinted, so that a listing of these particular patrons are not otherwise available for genealogical researchers. See sample page of information available as shown below.

This huge atlas, which is about 16 x 20 inches, also has maps of all counties in Illinois as of 1875, with a special listing of all towns and county seats.

The map on the cover of this December 1986 quarterly is a reduced version showing Jersey County, principally, since we published the veterans list of that county. The map can be used to help locate the townships in the cemetery list.

One of the fine features of these maps is that they show all of the section numbers in each of the six square miles of townships, and names of towns which are no longer in use. Many were changed as time went by to avoid duplication of names throughout Illinois. Only one town could have a given name. Of course precincts and townships as named then, and used by our ancestors, are not the same now, except in some cases. Here is a sample of information in the Patron's Directory:

The following is a letter dated November 8, 1986 from Christopher W. Davenport of New Canaan, Connecticut, to Florence Hutchison:

Dear Mrs. Hutchison: I thought you would like to know that Mrs. Hubert and I met for the first time on Saturday, November 1st. If you hadn't told me, I never would have known that I had a long-lost cousin living so nearby. [about 25 miles]

Quite simply, our meeting was one of the most fascinating experiences I have ever had. It was moving to meet a distant relation, especially since I come from so small a family. Mrs. Hubert is a charming and knowledgeable person. Her attic must be a veritable storehouse of all sorts of interesting treasures, for we were able to pass two hours very quickly just talking about the Davenports, and all the items she brought with her which are connected with the family. I learned much about my family that I did not already know, such as the fact that we are also descended from the Simms family of Maryland. Mrs. Hubert has her own copying machine, and she made me copies of several important documents which I plan to share with the rest of the family.

As if that were not enough, Mrs. Hubert had several letters which my grandparents had written to members of her family. She even had a snapshot of me and my brother taken when I was three years old. I was able to produce a copy of the same snapshot from my own picture album. It is amazing to think that I have driven by Mrs. Hubert's house in Greenwich several times in the past twenty years that I have lived in New Canaan without ever imagining that that house contained a snapshot of me!

Best of all, Mrs. Hubert brought me a wonderful present. It is a songbook that belonged to my grandfather which he must have lent to her mother[*] at some point. It is a children's songbook and it has my grandfather's name written in it, along with the date January 15, 1872. That means he was ten years old when he got it. The book is in remarkably good shape, and I have enjoyed looking at it and sharing it with some of my colleagues at school. Children are certainly brought up differently now! Many of the songs are very didactic, such as "The Truthful Boy", and "Things That I Must Not Do." There are also ones about seasons and holidays and animals. I can't wait to show it to the rest of my family at Thanksgiving. Along with the book of children's Bible stories which my grandfather got at Centenary Methodist Church in 1866, it begins to give me some idea, however hazy, of how he was brought up.

Thank you again for putting us in touch. I had no idea that all this would happen when I began to look for the grandfather [Bazill Davenport] I never knew last spring in Jacksonville. All the best, Christopher W. Davenport.

Mrs. Richard S.R. Hubert, of Greenwich Connecticut, on November 13, 1986, also wrote:

Dear Mrs. Hutchison: You have had a letter from Christopher Davenport of New Canaan. We had a great time together, and I think he was very pleased with all the unexpected information I gave him.

In his letter he made one mistake - the book was not lent to my mother [*], but to my grandmother, Elizabeth Davenport Black. My mother was not even born in 1872 - she came along in 1875, "Lizzie" having been married to my grandfather, G[reen] V[ardiman] Black in 1865. I gave him the song book with a *supposed* letter from Lizzie - a copy of which I enclose for your amusement. . . .

Sincerely, Elizabeth B. Hubert.

Following is "a note supposedly written by 'Lizzie' Elizabeth A. Davenport Black to her young nephew, Ira William Davenport" on November 13, 1986, which gives a humorous touch to this happy genealogical success story.

Dear Will: I am returning your song book to you, and I apologize for being so slow, but it has only been one hundred and fourteen years! I hope you are happy in your new location, and maybe I will see you there.

Affectionately, Lizzie. P.S. I am sending this songbook by Christopher.

This listing of the Illinois Central State Hospital patients in Jacksonville, is the first and only one available anywhere. While census data gives place of birth, it does not tell us what Illinois county they came from. Nor does it relate date of death, nor where they returned to, if released. But family researchers may find a relative in this extensive list. The microfilm was very difficult to read, so one has to use a lot of imagination to recognize a family name.



In honor of Veterans' Day, Cub Scout Pack 114 at the Illinois School for the Deaf held their annual Veterans' Day program. Cub Scouts Curt and Craig Kuhn served as hosts.

Veterans Edward Scott and Lonnie Sumpter were in attendance. Phillip Seabolt, Tyrone Harris and Andy Gabel were the color guard. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, led by Chris Kuhn, Mrs. Jeffrey Benson was introduced. Mrs. Benson is the chairman for The Flag of the United States of America for the Illinois State Daughters of the American Revolution. She announced that Pack 114 has been awarded a certificate through the Rev.

This cemetery started burials in the latter part of 1867. Lots 380 to 456 in Section D, on the extreme south edge of Diamond Grove were set aside as Potter's Field, with single grave lots being from 457 to 479. Lots 380 and 381 were used as the road entrance on the south side of the cemetery.

State Hospital Patients were buried in lots 382 to . In 1883 the State of Illinois purchased lots in Section H of Diamond Grove and used this as their burial grounds until 1954.

Dr. Andrew McFarland, having resigned his position in the State Hospital in June 1870, he soon after established the Oaklawn Retreat on the east edge of Jacksonville, a private institution for the treatment of insane patients, which he conducted with a great degree of success during the remainder of his life. His daughter and son-in-law were in the business with him. Dr. McFarland committed suicide 22 November 1891. For those patients not sent to their county of residence as requested by relatives, he buried them in Potter's Field in Section D. We have no source for these records except as they might be listed on the Diamond Grove cemetery's chronological listings of burials in Potter's Field in Section D.

The following listing of State Hospital Patients in Section D are made chronologically as to date of burial [not death]. Since these burials occurred prior to death certificates being filed in 1878, there is no further information available except name, from what county and burial date. We have no record as to which lot they are on in Section D, except that there were 5 burials across the lot.

This chronological list of Hospital Patients came from records in the City Clerk's office, written in the back of a book. Since there is no further information available anywhere for these people, and no tombstone markings of any kind, except bare ground, there is no need for any person finding a relative here making further inquiry in Morgan County. Their only other source of information might be in the Circuit Court Clerk's office of the home county of the patient for probate.

Again, let us remind you that this list does not include many patients whose relatives or friends took the bodies to home cemeteries in other counties. These are burials only, in our Diamond Grove cemetery in Jacksonville. This note was found in the Cemetery record: "The graves in this record are numbered from the south commencing at the southwest corner of Section D. There are several graves that the names are not known, and no record kept of them. The record is correct, however, after May 1st 1871. J. M. Stout, Sexton."

We are making this list chronological as the deceased were placed in graves, or removed so that we may have a general idea as to their approximate location in section D of the cemetery.

In 1878 the State of Illinois passed a law that death records were to be filed with the County Clerks, under the jurisdiction of the State Public Health Department. They wrote the data in big books on a couple of lines across 2 pages, giving name, death date, age, where born, marital status, and name of cemetery --only. Unfortunately, we have no record as to which county these patients came from.

We had to spend many hours checking the names as written by the Sexton in the City Clerk's records against the death record book in the County Clerk's office because there was a great discrepancy in the spelling of names. The version given here coincides with that on the death index. These burials still do not have stones. MS=marital status; Ma=married; Si=Single; Wi=widow/widower.

NOTE: These are DEATH DATES, not burial dates.



Not a one of these burials is listed on our Diamond Grove computerized lists, because these State Hospital patients were never recorded on Lot Cards, so we did not find them for a long time. Then lists began to appear in the record books of the City Clerk's office, here and there. Mrs. Hutchison, by diligent effort has now found all of the listings from 1870 to the present time. But it will be a long time of more researching of death records, to stabilize many of the misspelled names, before these deceased can be added to the Diamond Grove alphabetical list.

On the death indexes in the County Clerk's office, there are many more State Hospital people on record who died at the Hospital, but whose bodies were sent to their home county, or residence. We have hopes that some day we may find time enough to record those also. Unfortunately, in this 4-page directory of burial records there has been no evidence as to what county the person came from to the State Hospital, in the first place. We are hoping and praying that some day the way may be opened to us as researchers, so that we can add this very important feature to our card indexes. Will family historians please let us know if they find any of these decedents as a part of their family. Any other information on any one of them would be appreciated. There is no way of pinpointing any of these gravesites, except as to area. But at least we have a lot of names that we know are buried in Section D along the south side of Diamond Grove, where there are no stones. The City cemetery workers, not knowing of the burials in the vacant space built a road over most of them.
