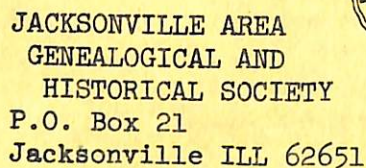

WE WANTED YOU TO KNOW

We wanted you to know how Illinois developed by the split-up of territory through the authorization of new counties, so we have included the 1825 map on our cover. Our September issue was 1823, and December, 1814. Compare the 3 maps for various counties and note Illinois' growth. These are also a guide as to which county seat you will find public records for your ancestry, in early days. Study the maps.

The Overview map on page 1, depicting Entrance and Driveways in Jacksonville East, indicates that we have listed burials from Row A through EF. Sorry, the map was printed before the book was composed, and we only had room to include Rows A through DE, omitting E and EF. These will be given in Book II - some day.

We wanted you to know what "the home folks" are doing, especially when they fail to answer many letters of inquiry on time. In order to serve you better in the future, we feel that extensive indexing of public records takes priority. "The harvest is full, and the reapers are few", so we must patiently apply our talents day to day as our strength allows. We grudgingly have to take time out for eating and sleeping occasionally! We are sorry to delay your personal family history, but we hope you understand, and will forgive us our unintended trespasses in this respect.

While you received 40 pages of Jvl East tombstone readings, so diligently gathered over the years by Bob Dalton and his sister Dorothy Long, there is a distinct difference in the kind of information, and only a few burials will be duplicated. Bob had no way, at the time, of identifying locations of the gravesites, until your Editor worked out the cross lettering and numbering system similar to township-range identifications. He only copied the older tombstones - with death dates. Most of the stones were prior to 1868 when the City Record begins with its burial dates.

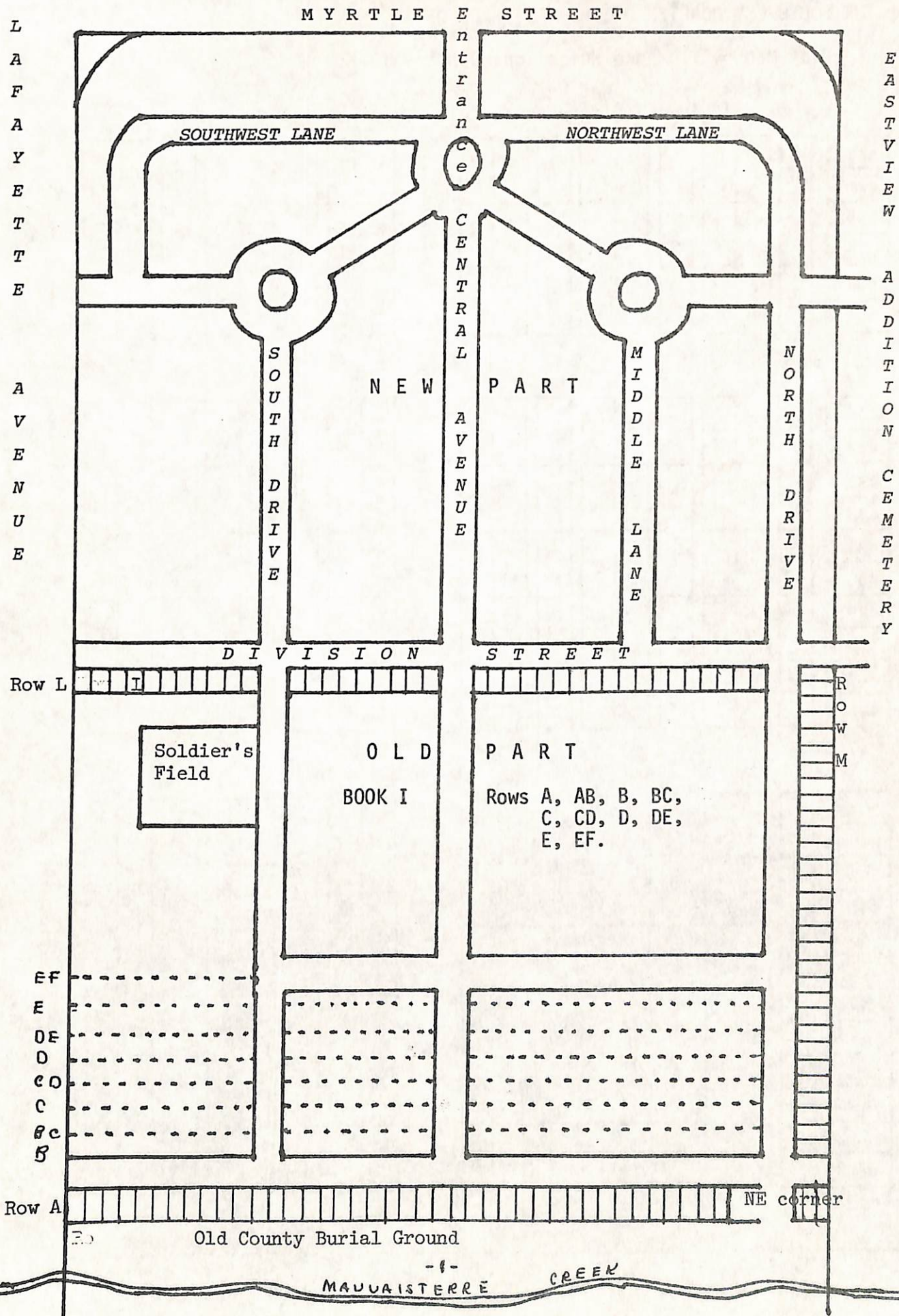
Book I identifies decedents as to lot number, not specific gravesite (i.e., 1st South, 3rd from North, etc.) The maps created by your Editor will, for the first time in history, enable anyone the opportunity to drive out to the cemetery and locate any given lot number. If there is a tombstone, you have located your relative. If not, you will know the approximate spot of burial and could erect a suitable monument at your convenience, if so desired. You must get information and permission from the City Clerk's Office for this procedure. We have the xerox copies of their lot burial cards, and could answer some of your preliminary questions, perhaps.

If you want more information on your ancestor than the burial date we have recorded, you can apply for the Death Certificate from the County Clerk in the usual manner required by State Law. All Vital Statistics are under the supervision of the State Department of Health, and the County Clerks are their local agents who are required to follow prescribed procedures and collect fees as set up by that Department.

All burials we show in Book I are "of record"; however, sometimes we do not always find some deaths on the County Index (starting 1878 in Ill.) This may arise because of differences in name spellings, or name accidentally left off index. Should you fail to get a death certificate from the County Clerk who states "it is not on file", write a letter to us explaining the situation, and we will investigate the matter. Remember: parents' names were not on death certificates until at least 1910. Spouse was not listed until 1920 by State Law. (See article p. 36.)

We wanted you to know that we are desperately trying our best to find your ancestors and collateral relatives. "We want you to be happy, or we're not in business". It sure looks like we're very much in business with 244 members from 30 states and Canada in 1976. The purpose of this cemetery Quarterly - if I didn't send you "samples" of what we are doing, you would not know what was available! We're very busy -- and happy -- are you? We have to leave it up to you to pull all of that family history together after we fill in your gaps. We would appreciate copies of your charts, etc. "Yours [and mine] are the Hands of God. Use them well as you travel Life's way." By the way, what did YOU do with His Hands today, genealogically?

The Old County Burial Ground was in this area between the Jacksonville Cemetery and Mauvaisterre Creek which is a few yards east of here.

The preceding four sectional plat maps of Jacksonville East Cemetery, Old Part (East Half) have overlapping areas in order for them to be more clearly understood.

The Southwest Quarter and Southeast Quarter overlaps Rows EF, F, FG, and G;
The Northwest " " Northeast " " Rows EF, F, FG, and G.

The overlap area in the other direction are the Lines (12), (13), and (14) North of Central Avenue.

We thought it best to include as much map as possible on each sectional plat so that as one drove around the cemetery he would have better reference points by which to locate the lot he was seeking.

HOW TO COORDINATE PLAT MAPS, SURNAME INDEX AND DIRECTORY OF BURIALS

1. Look at the surname index for each row and find Name, Row, Line# and Lot#.
2. Look at the Directory for the Row and Line# to see who is buried (of record) on the lot.
3. See owner of lot on regular double rows (half-lots are single rows)
4. Find name of person buried on lot
5. Age at death (if it was shown on City records, it is on this list)
6. Date of burial (not death date)

This is all of the information to be found in City records. There is no need for you to make further inquiry here. (For additional data see suggestions for other sources on another page in this book.)

The first plat map of record, that we have found, was filed in the County Clerk's office in 1867. Newer plats are to be found in the City Clerk's office. The 1867 map is the one from which the original lot owners was determined, as well as from the Lot burial cards on file.

Do not assume that "no record of burials" indicates a vacant lot. The lot was probably filled before the City Records of 1868 were started in Book I. If there were previous Sexton's records, they are to be presumed lost.

"OWNER OF LOT" is name of purchaser on regular family plots in rows A, B, C, etc.
"HALF-LOTS" are a single row of lots laid out in the wagon service lanes of the original cemetery started in 1833. They were sold as singles or doubles.
"REGULAR LOTS" are a double row of lots, indicated as being on the east side (e), or west side (w).

HOW TO USE MAPS WITH INDEXES AND DIRECTORIES

(Each row has index preceding directory of burials for that row)

1. Determine Row, Line# and Lot # from
 - a. Surname indexes for each regular row or half-lot row
 - b. Directory of burials, lot owners and lots
 - c. Location of Lots (a chart listing lots from 1 to 561, and half-lots from 2½ to 561½, to be found as last pages in this book)
2. Make use of first map showing layout of both the new and old parts of Jacksonville East Cemetery. Enter from Myrtle Street at west side of cemetery.
3. Example: Soldier's Field. Take South Drive until you see cannon on your right. Index and Directory for this area will be in Book II.
Example: Elizabeth French in B-6w. Proceed east, stopping in front of Row A. French tombstones will be to your right.

RCW A - DIRECTORY OF BURIALS, LOT NUMBERS AND OWNERS, Jacksonville East Cem. (OP)
The East Half of cemetery is known as the OLD PART, or OLD PLAT (OP)

ROWS are alignment of lots and alleys South to North (S-N)

LINES " " of lots East to West (E-W)

Regular rows (S-N). indicated by alphabet, are 2 lots side by side, designated as east side (e), or west side (w). These comprise the oldest part of the cemetery started in 1833.

HALF LOTS, indicated by $\frac{1}{2}$ after number, are a single row of lots (S-N) interspersed between regular rows in the former wagon lanes of the old cemetery. Burials in $\frac{1}{2}$ lots begin about 1920, until recently.

NO RECORDS indicates burials prior to 1863, not on current record books.

Do not assume that "no records" indicates a vacant lot. There may be tombstones, or grass where temporary markers once were.

DATE given is burial date, not death, normally 1 to 3 days after decease.

This can be used to search for obituaries, and death certificates.

* = Serviceman; + = Minister; sb = stillborn; inf = infant;

chi = child 6 mos to 14 years (ys)

OWNERS (own) = person or persons with deeds to lot, or fractional parts.

While these were all of the burials of record in Row A, after making index cards on all of the deceased listed as Public Burying Ground, and County Ground, we were able to identify additional burials in this row, known as Northeast Corner. Then we found numerous ones for "County Ground" as being identified as buried East of Row A, so these burials are included in this row listing. There will be other public burying ground listings for other areas as well. Prior to this indexing, no person currently dealing with the cemetery could even guess where any specific burial was on PBG.

ROW A -- BURIALS IN "POOR GROUND IN NORTHEAST CORNER OF CEMETERY"

As to why people who may have once been highly respected in their community come to the financial status of being too poor to purchase a burial lot is a matter of speculation, but a hard fact of life. That the least of these may be identified as a relative by some genealogist vainly trying to find a loved one, we present these names garnered from the lot burial cards in the City Clerk's office labeled "Public Burial Ground", "Poor Ground", or "Potter's Field" by various officials. There was enough description as to the grave site that we were able to pinpoint the area. These are in the Northeast corner of the cemetery at the end of Row A where there was some unplatted land and three unsold lots - 499, 500 and 501. To show that these people are identifiable, we thank Robert Dalton for a little time and effort to look up some of their obituaries in the newspapers, as given:

CALDWELL, G. 17y 29 Jan 1905.

"J'v1 Daily Journal" Tues., Jan. 31, 1905 -- George Caldwell died at his home on Reid street Sunday morning at 8:45 o'clock, of pulmonary tuberculosis, at the age of 17 years.

DAVIS, Myrtle B. inf 30 Oct 1904

"J'v1 Daily Journal" We., Nov. 2, 1904 -- The funeral of Myrtle B. Davis, the infant daughter of Mrs. Mary Davis, who died Sunday morning, was held at the family home on Broadway alley Monday afternoon in charge of Rev. J. E. Rogers.

FRANK, Mrs. Antonia 76y 7 Feb 1905.

"J'v1 Daily Journal" Tues., Feb. 7, 1905 -- Mrs. Joseph Frank, one of the original Portuguese emigrants from Madeira to this country, died at her home 1½ miles northeast of the city Monday morning at 10 1'clock, at the age of 80 years. She leaves one son, John Frank. ...

BRANUM, Wyatt 9ys 2 Feb 1906 "Accidentally killed by Wabash train."

JOHNSON, Harvey 34ys 30 June 1905.

"Jv1 Journal" Thurs., June 29, 1905 -- Harvey Johnson died at the residence of his mother, Mrs. Louisa Johnson, 502 S. Fayette St., Tuesday night at 11:30 o'clock, at the age of 45 years. He is survived by his mother and two sisters, Mrs. Birdie Joel, of Paris, Mo., and Mrs. Lizzie Miles of this city.

UNKNOWN NEGRO abt 35ys 7 Aug 1905. "Killed by officer while lingering"

"Jv1 Journal" Sat., Aug. 5, 1905 -- He was killed by Capt John Kennedy of the police force, while in the act of burglarizing the jewelry store of Charles Price on East State Street. It was believed that the dead man was George Swaby, formerly of Louisiana, Missouri. The Swaby family moved to Shelbyville a number of years ago. He suffered from tuberculosis.

POLLOCK, Wilbur "amputated arm of". B'd 4 Jan. 1908. "R.R. accident".

Did you know that the law requires the burial of body parts to be accompanied by a burial permit as for full bodies? The law read - in early days, "no dead human body or part thereof shall be received by any person in charge of any premises in which human bodies are disposed of, unless such body or part thereof is accompanied by a burial permit issued by a local registrar.

SIMS, SINNIE 19ys 12 Mar 1905. "J'v1 Journal" Sun., Mar. 12, 1905. The

remains of Sinnie Sims, who died recently in St. Louis, arrived in this city Saturday morning and were taken to the home of his mother, Mrs. Fiske, on Cox street. The funeral will be held from the residence this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock.

There are no stones to mark any of these graves. Until Mr. Lambert assumed care of the cemetery, Row A and the "Poor Ground" was a total mass of weeds, brush, briars and poison ivy. He gradually cleaned it until the area back to a row of trees near the Mauvaisterre Creek is now grassy sod.

To print these names is our way of honoring these "unknown" dead, at least one of them being a soldier who probably never had a flag on his grave on Memorial Day - a feat we hope to accomplish in 1977.

Insofar as marking any particular grave, the following lines, taken from a Scottish grave yard, are peculiarly applicable:

"In this church yard lies Eppie Coutts, Either here or hereabouts; But whaur it is none can tell, Till Eppie rise and tell hersel."

AGE is that given on death permits filed in City Clerk's office.

Burial date and age can be used by genealogists to find obituaries and birth certificates during that period of time.

ROW BC HALF-LOTS -- DIRECTORY OF BURIALS AND LOT NUMBERS, Jacksonville East Cem. (OP)

HALF LOTS, or HALF ROWS, are a single row of lots laid out in the service lanes of the OLD PART (OP) of the cemetery, and take their numbering system from the double lots on either side, by adding $\frac{1}{2}$ to the number of a lot on either east or west side.

The numbering system now appears quite haphazard as demands for new lands became pressing with the passing of 140 years since this became a "Public Burying Ground".

The starting lot in Row B is 367 and 368, instead of the original 1 and 2. Row BC took its first number from Row C-366 -- to become 366 $\frac{1}{2}$. They called the next lot 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ (from Row B), thus skipping, from side to side, are the half rows numbered!

As new officials took over, they used a slightly different system, and thus muddled the lot numbers. But it still quite orderly when you study it.

That is why I devised the system of using the alphabet to label the rows from South to North, and numbers for the East-West line-up of lots, thereby creating a cross-reference that would pinpoint any lot in the cemetery.

There are no "original owners", all lots in row BC being sold as singles. They are listed chronologically per lot, which is probably the way they lie underground. The first burial was in June 1933, and the last November 1959.

Do not assume such lots to be vacant lots. There may be tombstones, or only grass where impermanent monuments once were. That is why the original owners are listed - no doubt their families lie beneath the sod.

DATE given is Burial Date, not death, normally 1 to 3 days after decease. Age and burial date will assist family historians to know a period of time for which they can search birth and death records.

ROW DE HALF LOT -- DIRECTORY OF BURIALS AND LOT NUMBERS, Jacksonville East Cem. (OP)

HALF LOTS, or HALF ROWS, are a single row of lots laid out in the service landes of the old part of the cemetery (East half). They acquire their numbering system from the double lots on each side, by adding ' to the number of a lot on either the east, or west side.

All lots in this row appear to have been sold as singles, so no "original owners" are given. The first burials were in 1925.

UNFINISHED STILL

A baby's boot, and a skein of wool,
Faded and soiled and soft;
"Odd things," you say, and I doubt you're right,
Round a seaman's neck this stormy night,

Most like 'tis folly; but mate, look here:

A woman stood on yon far-off strand,
With a wedding ring on the small soft hand

The voyage was over; I came ashore;
What, think you, found I there?
A grave the daisies had sprinkled white,
A cottage empty and dark as night,
And this beside the chair:

The little boot, 'twas unfinished still;
The tangled skein lay near;
But the knitter had gone away to rest,
With the babe asleep on her quiet breast,
Down in yon churchyard drear.

[This poignant poem, from Cassell's Magazine" was reprinted in the "Jacksonville Journal" January 1874.]

As with the little boot, our burial directory and indexes are unfinished still. This much will serve as BOOK I, and the rest will probably be in Book II and Book III, since we cannot staple so many pages together at one time. We do not plan to continue them in our next *Geneal Journal*. Any person who would like to have copies when they are completed should send us a card or letter expressing their interest, so that we will have an idea as to how many to print. The cost will probably be \$2.00 per book in order to take care of higher rates of postage and printing supplies. It will probably be next summer before we accomplish the indexing of the West Half of Jacksonville East Cemetery, and the Eastview Addition, because we still have the hundreds of names for Diamond Grove to edit and publish in some form. We have not yet started xeroxing out the Burial Cards for Jv1 East West ^{1/2} NP. We have the Diamond Grove cards already made - it is a question of time for assembling the cards in proper order, then indexing alphabetically. We already have Sections A, B, and C finished.

Because we would have to xerox from my master sheets, we would need \$2.00 per section for these Diamond Grove readings. This is a temporary offer in order to benefit any of our members who feel that they would like to see these readings. This project has been very complicated and time-consuming, and with no guide-lines to follow, we have to work out the problems one by one as we proceed. We are anxious, however, to make these burial records available to the public as soon as possible. We will place copies, as soon as available, in the Jacksonville Public Library for the use of those who are doing research here.

ARE YOU LOOKING FOR PARENTS' NAMES ON DEATH CERTIFICATES?

Important to the family historian are the names of parents, along with the vital statistics to be gleaned from marriage, birth and death records. If you are looking for names in Illinois prior to about 1910, you will not find them. The laws of 1901 and 1903 will be quoted briefly below: (from back of a death cert.)

RESOLVED, That under the authority conferred upon the State Board of Health in the act requiring reports of deaths and the recording of the same, approved May 6th, 1903, it is hereby directed that Certificates of Deaths made in accordance with the provisions of this Act by physicians, midwives or coroners, shall contain the following facts concerning the deceased, in the order stated:

- a. Name of county in which death occurred.
- b. Full name of deceased, the sex, the color, the age (years, months & days)
- c. Place of birth (state or country)
- d. Number of years deceased lived in the State of Illinois
- e. Occupation, conjugal condition (single, married, widower, widow)
- f. Date of death (hour, day, month and year)
- g. Place of death (township, village or city, number of street and ward)
- h. Place of burial, date of burial, name and address of undertaker
- i. Immediate cause of death with duration thereof (years, months, days, hours)
- j. The contributory cause or complication with duration thereof (years and months)

Deaths from the following causes are to be referred to the Coroner for Certificate:

(Coroner's reports are probably filed in the Court records division. As to their availability to researchers, I do not know.)

About 1910 (law date not on the 1915 certificate I am quoting) the names of parents were included by law. It was about 1920 before name of spouse was added. Data is summarized as follows

1. Full name of decedent
2. Male or female; color or race; marital status
3. Name of city and town, and state or foreign country where decedent was born
4. Age in years, months and days
5. Date of death, including the year, month, day and hour
6. Profession, trade or exact kind of work. If out of work, former occupation
(I will not quote this lengthy citation pertaining to occupations)
7. Township, Village or City, street and number where decedent died; institution
8. Lenth of residence in state, and U.S., if foreign born
9. Full name of father, place of birth (usually state, only)
10. Maiden name of mother, " " "
11. Name and address of informant as to decedents above family history
12. Place and date of burial
13. Name and address of Undertaker
14. Signature and address of Doctor

Death certificates are filed with the County Clerk in the county of their death. Special permits have to be obtained to attend the body if shipped out of the county. If person died of certain contagious diseases, he can not be sent out of county. This may explain why certain members of a family are not in the former county of residence, and why many are buried in the County Burial Ground of local cemeteries.
