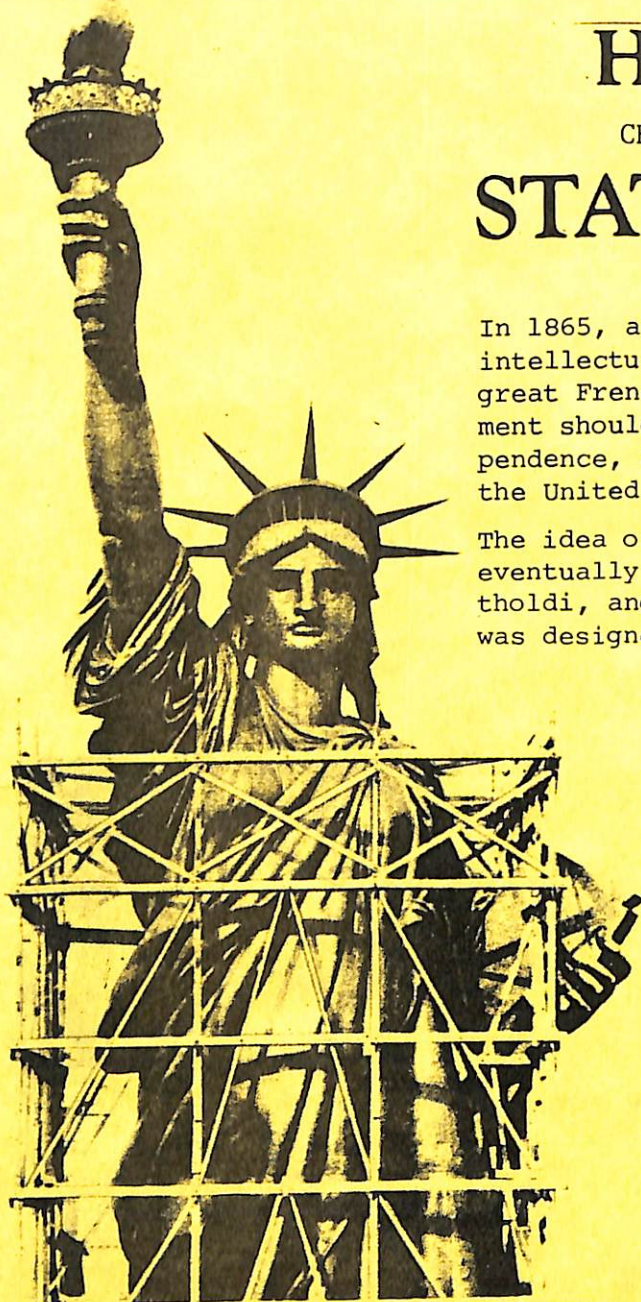

## Help "Save the Lady"

### CELEBRATING THE 100th ANNIVERSARY OF THE STATUE OF LIBERTY



In 1865, after our Civil War was past, a group of intellectuals in France met and Edouard DeLaboulaye, a great French historian, suggested that a Liberty monument should be built as a memorial to democracy, independence, and the promise of liberty and freedom that the United States of America represented to the world.

The idea of a Statue of Liberty was conceived and was eventually created by the French sculptor, August Bartholdi, and was built around an iron framework which was designed by Gustave Eiffel, famous designer of the Eiffel Tower.

The Statue of Liberty, 151 feet tall, is covered with 200,000 pounds of hand hammered copper sheathing. The Statue cost \$400,000.00 to build, and was paid for by contributions from the French people.

The completed Statue was presented to the United States Ambassador on July 4, 1884. The famous lady was dismantled and shipped to New York in 1885. School children, as well as other U.S. citizens, contributed the needed money to build the pedestal and install the Statue on Bedloe's (now Ellis) Island. Liberty Lady was unveiled in a grand ceremony in New York Harbor October 28, 1886.

Ellis Island opened its doors to immigrants in 1892. By the time it closed in 1954, more than 17 million newcomers -- your ancestors -- and mine -- had arrived at this historical island, viewing our beautiful STATUE OF LIBERTY as a new way of life. Now, let's give *HER* a new way of life!

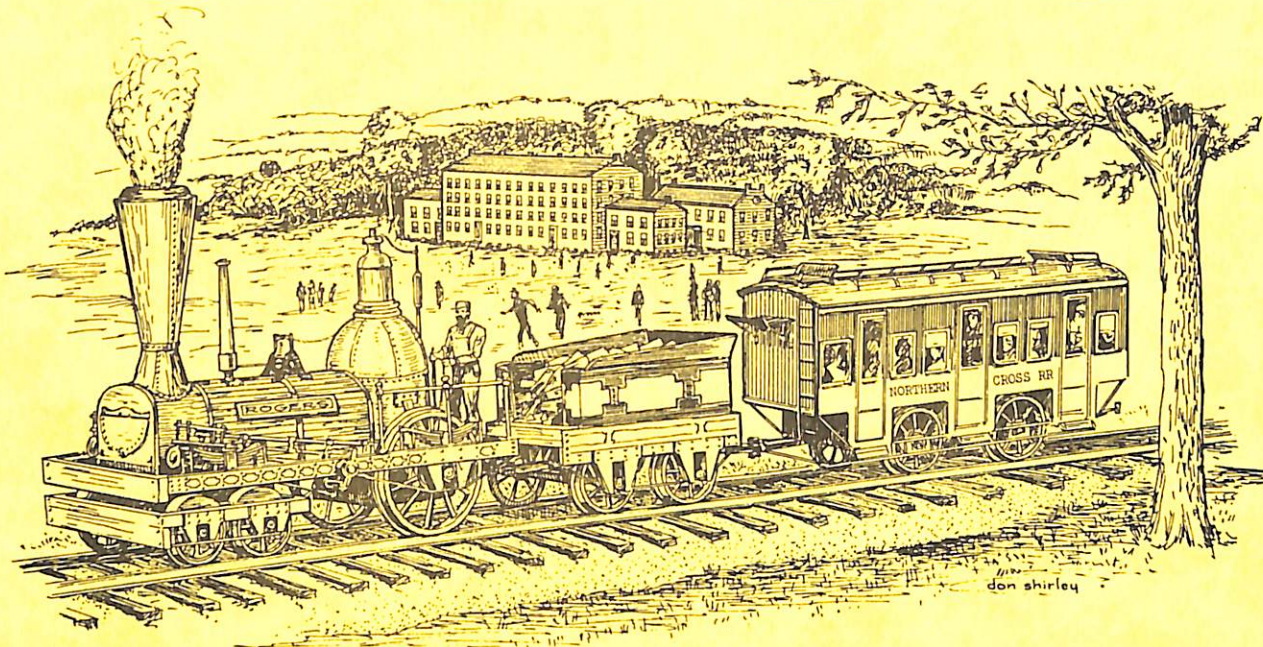

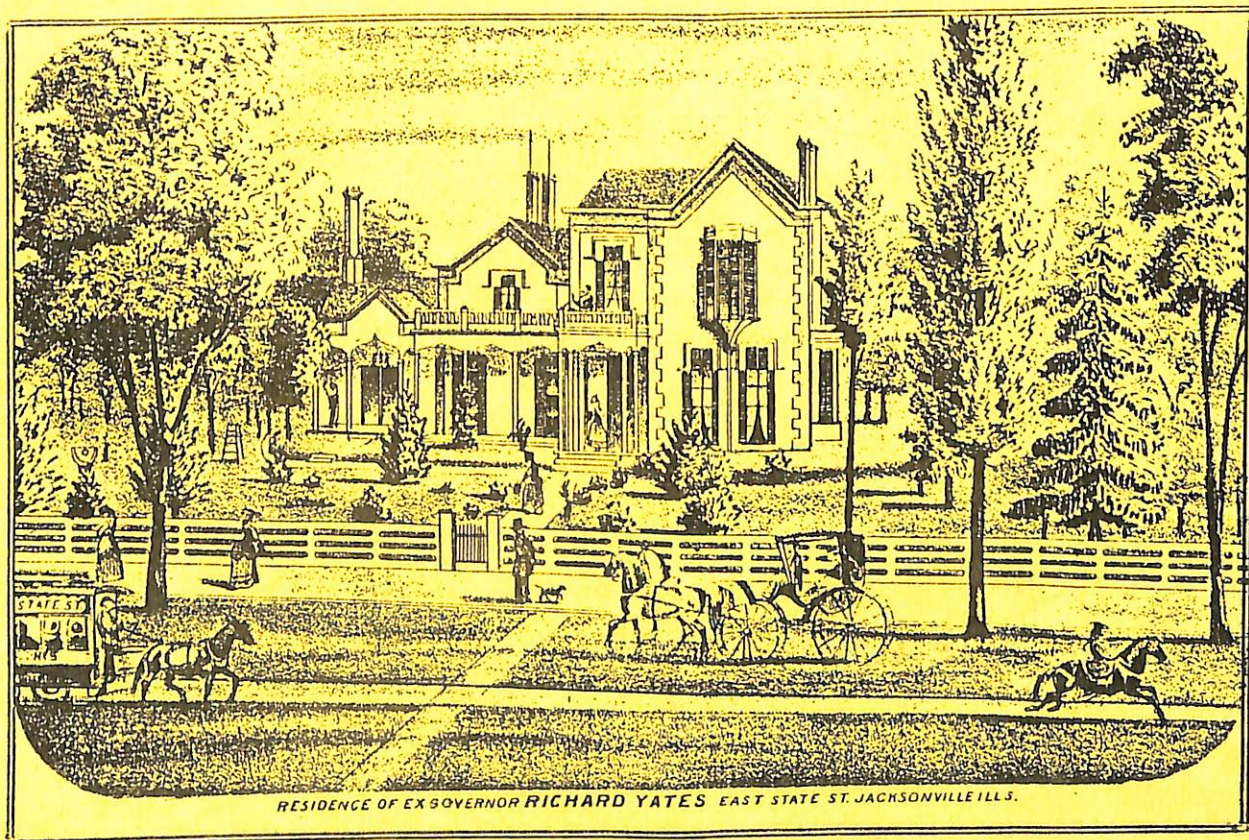

# NORTHERN CROSS RAILROAD passes Illinois College - 1839



The NORTHERN CROSS RAILROAD first came to Jacksonville in the fall of 1839. It was the first railroad train in the State. At that time the campus of Illinois College extended north to West State Street, thus the railroad ran past the campus. The engine was 16½ feet long, weighed 10 tons, and cost \$6,500. The overall length of engine and tender was 25 feet. In 1847 the tracks were placed four blocks north in the location of the present tracks in the north part of Jacksonville.



The first street cars in Jacksonville were horse-powered railways operating on South Main, East and West State. See one coming into view at left in above picture of the Yates home. This is an 1872 Atlas pen-sketch of one.

Dear Geneal Members and Friends:

Our busy world never ceases to be historically exciting, and genealogically pleasurable, as you will find from some of our articles in this quarterly. My newest project has been trying to see how much money I could collect from people, as Family Life chairman, of the Jacksonville Woman's Club, in order to help restore "Our Lady" in New York. So far, in just 6 weeks, I have sent in over \$350.00 to help restore the Statue of Liberty. That might buy enough gilding to cover one of her fingernails!

She is such a mammoth lady being about 25 times as tall as I am. How I wish I had the power to inspire as many millions of people as she has in her nearly 100 years existence--of course, I'm not quite that old yet, either.

Will the fascinating aspects of family history research ever end? A telephone call led me to help a lady at the County Clerk's office to find her ancestors, just a little while ago. A man doing other work kept "cocking in his ear" in our direction as I explained procedures on looking up marriage records, etc. Then another couple came in. Before I left, to finish this letter, I had "twisted their arms" [as I am frequently accused of doing] and had 3 more avid members for the society clan. I came home and there was a \$100.00 Life Membership. It looks like I am going to have to stay in the publishing business a long time in order to outlive "the Lifers!" The evident answer to the above question of the day is, "I guess not."

We have been saddened by the loss of one of our members, Guy W. Martin. He and Myra have worked so hard down through the years to protect and beautify many cemeteries. Many memorials have been sent to Myra which she has placed in their Public Library because as she said, "Guy loved to read." Perhaps many of our members who have received so much help with their family history in the Waverly area would like to send donations to his memory. I am reporting this here because many of our members "out there" would not have knowledge about this.

How Eileen Gochanour and her fellow transcribers and publishers are working to get many records in booklets so that the remote information can be found by our family historians. We will have a flyer in this quarterly showing that they have published the 1870 Federal Census of Sangamon County, including the Mortality Schedule. If you hurry and order before April 15, 1985 the book will be \$25.00 plus 6% sales tax by Illinois residents. After that date the price will be \$30.00. After finding a will in the estate administration dated 22 January 1857, he was able to correct the error that the man had died in 1837. Also, the name had come out as William Carter on a tombstone reading. He and his wife drove to Beardstown to Oak Grove Cemetery and found that it read William Carver, December 16, 1777; died, April 23, 1857. Should anyone need this information for themselves, Ed Coltrin lived (1975) at 2923 North Golf Drive, Peoria IL 61604.

#### GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY PROGRAM TO BE ON JACKSONVILLE RAILWAY

The 13th annual business session of the Jacksonville Genealogical and Historical Society will be held on Thursday, Jan. 24, at the Illinois Power auditorium on West Lafayette. Doors will be open at 6:30 p.m. for registration, browsing through displayed records and visiting.

The program will concern "Reminiscences of the Jacksonville Railway System and Its Relationship to Union Depot." The men reportedly responsible for chartering the horse railway in 1867 include Cyrus Epler, Felix G. Farrell, T.S. Morrison, Murray McConnel, James H. Lurton, James Dunlap, Moore C. Goltra and John T. Springer.

Later, extended services were operated by William S. Hook and his sister, Frances Hook, with electric motors being installed about 1892. The society would appreciate hearing from persons who have had ex-

periences in riding these lines or from descendants who have family history anecdotes or photographs relating to the development of this early transportation system in Jacksonville.

The city plat map of 1894 shows this line running from Union Depot to the Square with one line going south on Main and the other west on State. The society wonders if there are other existing maps showing this transportation system.

At the November meeting of the society there was discussion of the requirements for membership in various heritage societies with members giving their experiences.

President Florence Hutchinson appointed a nominating committee composed of Barbara Henderson, chairman, Virginia Gordon and Jack Thomas. They will present a slate of officers at the January business meeting.

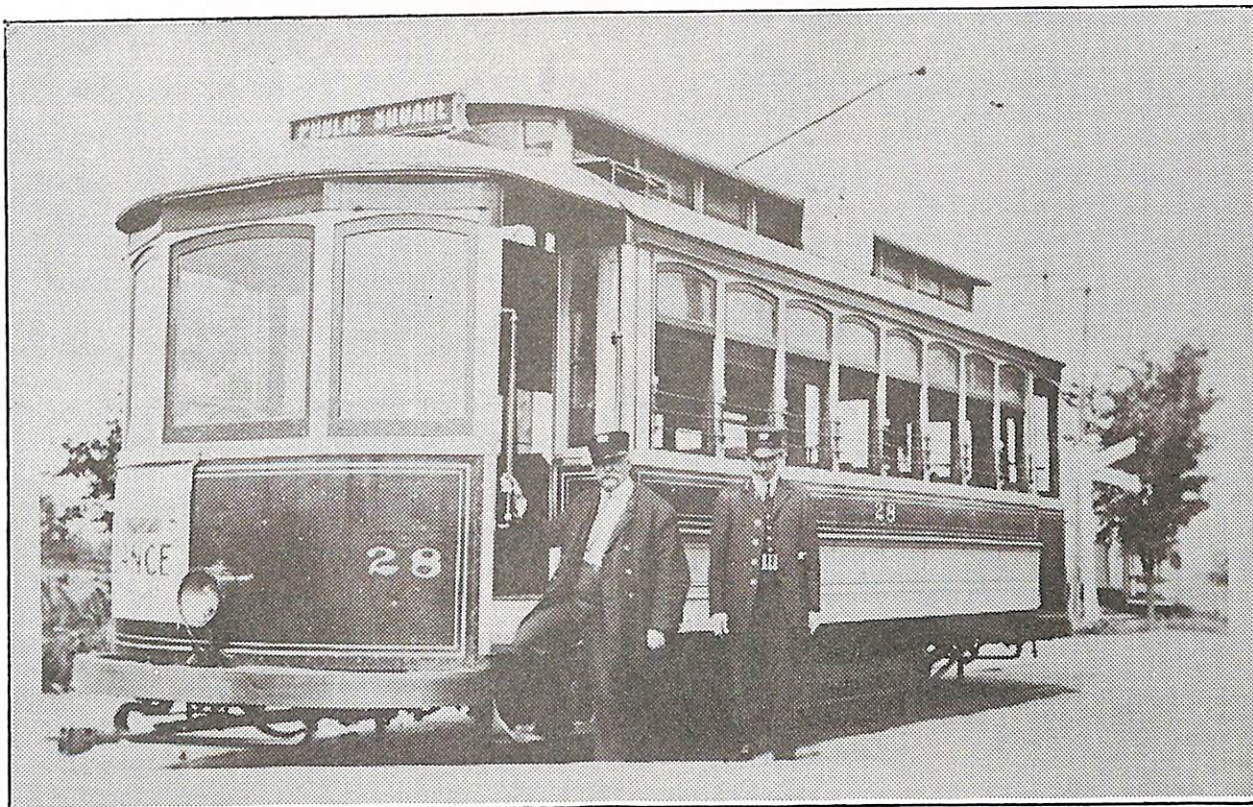

#### JACKSONVILLE CITY RAILWAY INFORMATION BEING SOUGHT.

It started operating sometime after Nov. 1870 as a horse-drawn trolley car line that was able to take in \$15 per day in five cent fares.

When warm weather approached, open "Summer Cars" were chartered by groups of young people who rode the length of East and West State Street and the length of South Main Street from the square to Dewey Park. The cars were gaily decorated, usually with red, white and blue bunting, and the ride ended with dancing and refreshments at the hostess' home.

It ceased operations on March 27, 1927, its demise brought on by the increasing use of private cars and inexpensive taxi service.

Now the Jacksonville Area Genealogical and Historical Society has

launched an effort to gather more information on the Jacksonville Street Railway Company and the people connected with it.

The primary quest of Mrs. Florence Hutchison, the president and founder of the society, is to locate the records of the company, which may have ended up being stored with the records of the M. P. Ayers and Company banking firm, the predecessor to the Farmers State Bank. Anyone with information on the whereabouts of the records is asked to contact the society at P.O. Box 21, Jacksonville, ILL., 62651.

The company began as the Jacksonville City Horse Railway, an enterprise involving men such as Cyrus Eppler, Felix G. Farrell, T. S. Morrison, Murray McConnel, James H. Lurton, James Dunlap, Moore C. Goltra and John



T. Springer. A. A. Dewey was listed as the president of the City Railroad Company, as it was referred to in a Sept. 16, 1870 article in the Jacksonville Daily Journal.

The line originally ran on South Main Street from the square to Vandalia Street, and a short time later was extended down East State Street. A third extension followed on West State Street to the western city limits, which were at what is now Grand St. in 1872, but the line apparently ended at the Illinois School for the Deaf earlier.

About 1890 William Spencer Hook, Sr. and his sister, Francis (Fanny) Hook purchased the property and electrified the trolley line at that time. In the 1968 book "Morgan County, The Twentieth Century," it's stated Fanny showed her business acumen by buying the cars from The Pullman Manufacturing Company and the electric motors and controls from another company. She then had the town's pioneer electrician, Gus Sieber, put them together at a substantial saving over the price Pullman got for his ready-to-run-cars.

The Hook family was a fascinating Jacksonville family. William Spencer Sr.'s father was Cornelius Hook, a prominent merchant here. Hook's sister-in-law, Mrs. Matilda Vanderhoff Hook (wife of Washington Hook) operated the Jacksonville Free Reading Library, which was located where the Farmers Bank building is now. It is said the records of the Jacksonville Street City Railway Company were located in the library, but there is currently no knowledge of what happened to them. Hook was a partner with Marshall P. Ayers in the Ayers Bank.

In 1894, the Jacksonville Street City Railway ran from Main Street to Dewey Park at the corner of Waverly Street and Vandalia Avenue. [Waverly now is West Vandalia.] Then north to the south side of the square where it turned east and northeast to State Street and ran to the site of

the present railroad depot. The line also turned west and north to West State Street to Webster, where it turned south to College Avenue and curved south to what was then Asylum Street, but is now called Woodland Street, and then west on Mound Road to Westgate.

Some people say it went only as far as the Norbury Sanitorium, which was located at the present site of the First Baptist Church, across from the Mound Cone Shop.

By 1913, the lines had been extended on North Main Street to Walnut and then to just east of Hackett street, where it stopped just short of the C. B. & Q Railroad.

It was also extended:

East on East State Street to half a block east of Johnson St. to Vine Street.

East on Vandalia Road to the Chicago & Alton Railroad tracks, just east of Hardin Avenue, where it stopped and let people off close to Nichols Park.

From Webster Avenue to Grand Avenue on the north side of the Illinois School for the Deaf, where people got off and walked to the fairgrounds across the street.

Most of the information on the routes of the trolley car line was ferreted out by Mrs. Hutchison from county plat maps of various years.

As far as is known, all tracks were single track except for two known by-passes, one of which was in front of 1042 West State Street, a house owned by William S. Hook. The house is shingle style and a copy of a New England dwelling, probably at Falmouth, Mass. The original structure there was designed so the ocean could be seen from all 26 rooms. The designer is unknown but the house closely resembles sketches made by the prominent Boston architect, Arthur Little.

There is a legend that the trolley cars circled the house but this was not true. In the book "Morgan County The Twentieth Century," mention is made of a passing switch in front of



the house, from which Fanny Hook could pretty well tell what was going on all over the system. It was said that if a car was a minute late, she was on the telephone finding out why, and what was being done to correct the problem<sup>1</sup>.

The trolley line was owned by the Hooks until 1905 when the Illinois Power and Traction Company bought the system.

Relatively few details are known about the Jacksonville Street City Railway.

There is no record of the number of employees or the number of the pieces of equipment, although electric cars numbered 28 through 30 are known to have existed. It is also not known if any of the car bodies still exist, perhaps having been purchased for use as a small farm structure.

Some fragmentary records exist of the location of the company's office during the period from 1899 to 1907. In the earlier year, the office was at 225½ West State Street; in 1902 at 526 East State Street, and in 1907 at 224 South Main Street. [This information came from City Directories for these years.]

<sup>1</sup> A letter from a Hook descendant said that Fannie (who always spelled her name with an "i", as Francis) never lived in the 1042 West State Street house.

An interesting piece of research would be to see who did live in that big house from about 1877 on to 1910.

Many of the Hook families are buried in Diamond Grove. However, Fanny Hook lived in Pennsylvania in later years, and that is where William Spencer Hook died. Both were returned to Jacksonville for burial.

"A GLANCE INTO THE PAST" has been a feature of our Jacksonville *Journal Courier* for many years. Following are a few excerpts preserved and given to us by Bob Dalton concerning the City Railway system. These are from the 100 Years Ago portion:

Sept. 11, 1971 (1871)--Two new street cars have been received by the City Railway, and will be placed upon the line at once.

July 21, 1971 (1871) --SOMEBODY HURT. Pat Somebody struck somebody else over the head with a shovel, late on Saturday afternoon, while they were at work helping to lay the new city railway in east State street near the square. The man was not badly hurt.

August 25, 1971 (1871)--Street cars run regularly to the junction now, and crowded more every trip. New cars in a few days.

January 5, 1972 (1872)--Due to the ice coat, the City Railway company found it necessary to double team the cars yesterday, and, therefore, had two horses instead of one.

Bob reported that years ago, James Thaddeus "Thad" Grady told me that when he lived on South Main street near the town brook, it was possible to hear the street car and its horse approaching because the horse hoofs made noise as they hit the wooden planks that were laid between the rails.

Jan. 14, 1972 (1872)--The cash receipts of the City Railway for the month of December were four hundred dollars. Number of tickets sold--Adults, 6136; children 290.

Feb. 28, 1972 (1872)--The fare on the city railway has been reduced from seven cents to five cents for adults and from four cents to two cents for children. At such a price there are certainly more who would choose to ride than walk.

Oct. 18, 1972 (1872)--Ignoring a recently enacted city ordinance prohibiting the running of the City Horse Railway Co. tracks through Central Park, Col. Dunlap, the contractor, yesterday laid several sections before being stopped by an injunction secured by Mayor George McConnel. Circuit Judge Brown is holding court in Calhoun county, and upon his return to the city the entire matter will be ventilated and resolved.



We railway researchers have had some interesting talks with various persons who used to ride the street railways from here to yon. Since no history has ever been written on this topic -- except bits and pieces garnered from here and there, we would welcome pictures, stories that are written on paper, and any other valuable data concerning this period in Jacksonville history.

While we appreciate having telephone calls, yet we have no way of recording the interesting tales told to us.

We made minor corrections in the fine article by Frank Ladd, as we copied it for this quarterly. We were given permission by the editor of the *Journal Courier* to re-copy the news items and the courtesy of using pictures published in their newspaper. We deeply appreciate these kindnesses. In this way we can effectively pass on to our interested members "out there" in 40 other states materials that may be of ancestral value in their family research.

One of the outcomes of our question "Where are the original records of the railway and railroad pathways that traversed in and out of Jacksonville?" Mr. McAlpin, a director of the Illinois Railway Museum at Union, in McHenry county, said that they acquired many of the records of the Illinois Terminal System when it went out of business. There is a great possibility that many of the records we sought may be in their library collection. We will report more on this phase of the project at a later date.

When I said to Mr. McAlpin, "We of course want to find the history of the railway system, but then we are interested in trying to find the people who were involved with it."

He replied, "How would the payroll records help with that history?" He is going to investigate the possibilities of locating these records in their library. Isn't that great?

#### SOME INTERESTING SIDELIGHTS AND GLANCES INTO THE PAST:

Feb. 4, 1976, *The Bluff Times*, Scott County IL, reported items of 100 years ago, the in Peoria "the horses of the Adams St. horse railway have to be attached to the corner of the cars, so that the horses can travel outside the rails. The bottom has fallen out between the rails because there is so much mud nowadays that people in the interior find it almost impossible to get to town."

\* \* \* \* \*

March 11, 1985 our Jacksonville paper reported "75 years ago, the Jacksonville Railway company had a force of men at work yesterday tearing up the track between the car barns and the junction. New rails will replace the old ones, which are in very bad condition."

And so, we find that the railway systems had their continual maintenance problems.

\* \* \* \* \*

Your editor kept coming across the word "Omnibus" in the early city directories. We asked the question of Harold Gibson, and found the answer:

"The omnibus was a public vehicle designed to carry a comparatively large number of passengers. It looked almost like a street railway coach except it did not travel on rails. Each hotel in Jacksonville had an omnibus that met all incoming trains. The drivers and porters tried to talk the travelers into going to their hotel." There is a drawing of one on page 96 in our 1872 Atlas of Morgan County, IL. It is shown going to the beautiful Mansion Hotel.

\* \* \* \* \*

Harold Gibson, Normal IL, formerly of Jacksonville, came to Illinois College in 1926. He rode the Litchfield, Carrollton and Western Railroad from Litchfield, and boarded one of the street railways for the mile and a half to the college. He said, "the L.C. & W. Railroad was popularly called the 'Look, Cuss and Wait' Rail Road."

Some lady was on the street car, and as they rode along she pointed out all of the historic sites along the way. He has a very good article on this ride which we have been given permission to publish in the near future.

Page 1: SMITHSON CEMETERY, Scott County, Illinois. Read 24 April 1982 by only Reuben Bates. He said that there were some errors and omissions in the older readings he had seen, so this is an updated one. Your editor had sent him the Petition for Letters of Administration of his uncle, Garrett O'Banion. The W. Kilver farm is about Section 10 Township 14 North, Range 13 West 3rd Principal Meridian. Reuben describes the location as follows:

"The Smithson Cemetery is by the Wayne Kilver farm. Follow highway 36 west of Riggston to Gillham cemetery. Then one miles further west to Exeter road, turn left about 2 miles, then turn right. Turn left on first road, go about one-fourth miles and turn right into farm lane. Cemetery is in a field enclosed by a stone wall, and has no trees or brush. The first burials were made in 1837."

ALLISON?ALLINSON CEMETERY, Morgan County, Illinois. [The names are used interchangeably in many records, Allison being most common.]

Allison Cemetery is located on what was known as Allinson's Mound [1872 Atlas] west of Jacksonville, formerly Olmstead's Mound. A Mr. Olmstead erected a log cabin on the mound in 1820, and this is where the first election of Morgan County officers was held, and the first Circuit Court convened in April of 1823.

The legal description of the property is East Half Section 31, Township 15 North, Range 11 West 3rd Principal Meridian. The original list of tombstones was done by Walter R. Sanders, of Litchfield April 1974. This given below is combined with a new family listing by Mrs. Eldridge Roberts, formerly Mary Frances Hills, whose relatives are in this cemetery. She grew up in the same house your editor now lives in.

She sent a story written by her grandmother about her early school-days in Greene County IL. Nellie (Cox) Griffith was born 16 Dec 1895 in Hillview, to Jacob Daniel and Lora Jane (Chapman) Cox. On December 24 1915 she married Landa Griffith in Hillview. 69 years later, they are both well and living in Table Grove Fulton, County IL.

SCHOOLDAYS, by Nellie Griffith, 21 Jan 1983.

In 1901 I was six years old and in my first year in school. Our school was one large room with two rows of seats and desks on each side with a large heating stove in the center of the room. The blackboard was built all around one wall with a space for the long white sticks of chalk and erasers for cleaning the black board, and a space built ten inches higher than the floor level where the teacher's desk sat. On the desk was a clock and the little bell with a handle that the teacher rang to let us know when it was time for school to take up. Our classes were from the first through the ninth grade, and we had about 30 pupils in our school.

Games we played were "Anty Over the Schoolhouse", "Dare Base", and "Drop the Handkerchief". I can still hear the jingle of our little school bell telling us it was time for school to take up. We all would rush in and take our seats and then the teacher would have roll call. Each one answered by saying, "Present", and then we would sing one song. We took turns in picking the song we wanted to sing. The teacher built the fires in the winter term. After school the boys would get in coal and kindling.

I grew up on a 17,000 acre ranch known as Fairbanks Ranch. Our closest town was Eldred, Illinois, where we did our grocery shopping and picked up our mail once a week.

# NOONAN CEMETERY, also called WOOD CEMETERY.

We have two readings for this remote old cemetery. One was from Walter R. Sanders of Litchfield, and the other by Dr. C. E. Black, President Charles Rammelkamp, and L. A. Vaught, January 30, 1928. Their description is as follows:

"This is a copy of grave stones from an old cemetery about six miles northwest of Jacksonville, Illinois, overlooking the Mauvaisterre Creek. Land now owned by Mrs. John Noonan, and is the NW¼ of the SW¼ Section 10, Township 15 North, Range 11 West of the Third Principal Meridian. The cemetery is old, located on a hill in timber, only one stone was standing. The rest had to be dug out of the ground. There may still be other stones covered with earth."

The 1872 plat map shows this as Charles Eads farm. In 1894 it was the Thomas Noonan farm. This cemetery has been referred also as the Wood cemetery since Ellen Wood is the earliest known burial there, in 1847.

## WHAT WAS LIFE BACK IN OUR ANCESTRAL PIONEER DAYS?

What prompted so many people in England to come to our particular state of Illinois? The answer to this can be found in many books that were written for emigrants who were seeking passage to the "new world", by land speculators and holders of much land who wanted workers for their farms, and buyers for their holdings. One such book which would be interesting to read, if one can find a copy, is "Eight Months in Illinois, with Information to Emigrants", by William Oliver, MDCCCXLIII (1843). It was "Inscribed to the Labouring Men of Roxburgshire, With Sincere Wishes for Their Welfare." It started out with this lovely poem by a Thomas Campbell:

*The pride to rear an independent shed,  
Ang give the lips we love unborrowed bread;  
To see a world from shadowy forests won,  
In youthful beauty wedded to the sun;  
To skirt our homes with harvests widely sown,  
And call the blooming landscape all our own,  
Our children's heritage in prospect long.  
These are the hopes, high-minded hopes, and strong,  
That beckon England's wanderers o'er the brine. --*

How many interesting little notes your editor would like to include in a quarterly. Here are brief bits and pieces that may help someone.

WHEN WE PRINT ADDRESS CHANGES, please, be sure to change the addresses in your 1984 Directory of Members, so that you won't write to a wrong address and be disappointed to have your letter returned. Make corrections in red, preferably, and the change stands out.

Do not use pens with light blue ink on ANY family history work, letters, nor corrections. Light blue will not photocopy. Experiment with different pens.

\* \* \* \* \*

Friends of the Society--please--do not cut in two, or thirds, our Membership sheet which you return with dues, as some people do. We have to file these in a 3-ring notebook, and when they are severed, this creates time-consuming problems.

Also, do not write your requests for information on the back of membership sheets, as this record and queries go to two different places. When the secretary is handling over 600 of these sheets of paper during a year's time, you have no idea as to the problems these two little items cause, along with all the constant changes of addresses that keep coming in. Our genealogists are quite a moving population, in more ways than one.

\* \* \* \* \*

And secondly, always promptly write any changes of address you get in your 1984 Directory of Members. That might save YOU a lot of postage for mailing, retrieving, and mailing back to some kindred soul. [See this is repeat."We can't win 'em all!"

And thirdly, send us your changes of address as soon as possible. When we mail quarterlies at bulk rate, the postage is low. But when they are returned to us because the member no longer lives at the address listed, and has left no forwarding address, then we have to now pay \$2.00 for the quarterly to be returned to us.

And fourthly, please send LONG, or business-sized envelopes that are stamped and self-addressed [SASE]. Do you really want genealogical papers returned to you that are all folded up in six parts, instead of three?

And fifthly, if you send a donation for some material, and you have not received it in a reasonable length of time, we do appreciate hearing from you about it. But please do tell us what your request was. Try as we might, it is impossible to keep all the hundreds of letters we get properly filed. We try to answer the ones with personal and society donations as soon as possible, and first. But sometimes we do not get the proper notation on the outside of the envelope to indicate the request.

And sixthly, while we are about it--please include surnames being researched on each year's membership sheet returned to us. Some people write "see last year's list". Then, in September, after last year's listing is safely tucked away, we have to try to locate the information. Sometimes we get an old listing, then the person writes back to say, "But I am not searching such and such a name now, and have no information to give the people who write to me." Because--names do change.

Page 1: THEY DROPPED MY DOLLY IN THE DIRT. And that's the end of that!

December 11, 1984, marked the end of the Morgan County jail that had stood so imposingly, and not unsightly, at the corner of South Main and College street about 125 years. It was probably the oldest jail in Illinois still being used. Within the past few years, when procedures were started to construct a new one, it was the dream of your president to acquire the abandoned jail for a Morgan County genealogical and historical museum. It could have been a secure place to store the old county records, and current historical findings. There were residence rooms whereby a caretaker could have lived, a kitchen area where community rooms could have been established for meetings of various kinds. Each of the jail cells could have been made into individual library facilities. One of our members, a retired architect, said he and his wife would lay out all the plans for us.

Unfortunately, different County Commissioners came on the scene, many problems arose for them in the processes of building the newer controversial jail, and money for county usage has been greatly lessened.

At the national level funding for historic preservation was cut off, and hopes for finding money for repairing and restoration work vanished. While there were quite a few people who eagerly said, "Yes, I will volunteer to help you get it established", your president is quite aware of the fact that volunteers seem to vanish into thin air when it comes time to get a desired work done.

And so, "my dream dolly" was dropped into the dirt, never more to rise so majestically again. All winter the site has been an unsightly mud hole with some ugly buildings of all shapes and sizes facing South Main and College. The place now reminds one of a person with 4 front teeth missing. We wonder how our city fathers can find enough space to park just a few more cars, and yet find a beautiful way to block off the view of the buildings just beyond. 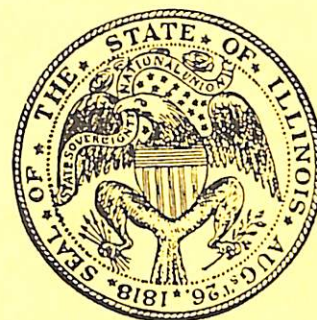


Seal of the Illinois Territory, sketched by the late Mr. Brand Whitlock and reproduced in the Journal of the Illinois Historical Society.
