

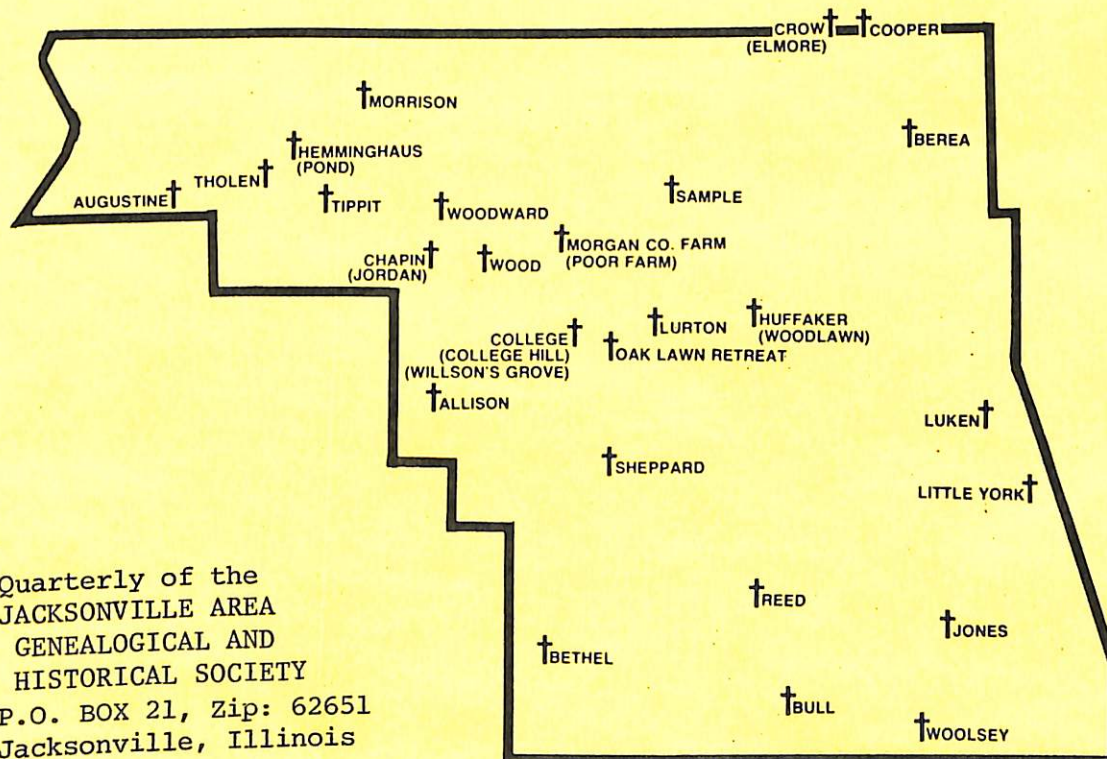

Each Member shall receive a membership card which should be carried when doing Courthouse research in Illinois. Members paying dues late in the year will receive all publications for that year. A family will receive only one publication per mailing due to increased postage rates.

Junior Members, whose parents are not members, will receive all publications of regular membership. This is our effort to encourage students to start family history collections early in life while their relatives yet live to give them benefit of their historical knowledge. Please send us your Lineage Chart.

Each Member may file his or her own Surname Index Cards with our Society. These assist us to locate other genealogists working the same family, and to get them together for mutual benefit.

MEETINGS: Any person, member or not, is welcome to attend any meeting.

REGULAR MEETINGS: 4th Thursday night, 7:30 p.m. Illinois Power Auditorium on West Lafayette Avenue. We do not meet in July. Our November meeting is usually the Thursday following Thanksgiving. Our annual election of officers is at the January meeting.

Your Officers and Board Members appreciate your support as indicated by your nice letters, and membership applications. This is our only way to pay for the ever-increasing costs of publishing our Quarterly, the *Jacksonville Il Geneal Journal*, which contains hundreds of names from Courthouse records, cemeteries, churches, census indexes, and other materials from several counties in our area including Cass, Greene, Morgan, Scott, etc. Most of these records have never been published before, nor available for public use otherwise.

LETTERS OF INQUIRY are read in open meetings. We publish names sought in this area in our news notices, with name and address of seeker. This has proved to be a popular feature, and is "read far and wide", because our notices reach about 10 area newspapers.

Many of our records have been placed on file with the Jacksonville Public Library, the Illinois State Historical Library, The State Archives, and the Lincoln Library in Springfield. Morgan, Greene and Cass Cemetery records are on file at the Jacksonville Public Library. Also, some for Scott County.

We urge you to copy your family records, get them in readable shape as soon as possible, and file with a library and/or genealogical society. Were you to suddenly be thrust on the Other Side of Life, what would you leave behind for all of your efforts? A lot of unintelligible scribbling? or an orderly family history booklet that others could pick up, add to, and work on with pleasure instead of puzzlement.

Divide your maternal and paternal lineages so as to avoid confusion of names, and putting families together who are not related, except for the #1 Person. These can be more efficiently filed in Society records.

If you wish to receive your current Membership Card would you be kind enough to enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope [SASE]? And, please, make them LONG ones when requesting genealogical materials so that they won't have to be folded so much.

Dear Hearts and Geneal People: Another June has come - and is going - fast! Isn't it strange how old words come back to haunt us? You probably recall the naive Chicken Little who went about crying: "Henny-Penny, the sky is falling!" Now, this month, or in July, Chicken Little will be updating her language to say: "Unlucky Duckies, the Sky-Lab is falling", and she won't be kidding this time.

We have 2 features in this June's Quarterly, and we hope that many of our family historians will be able to find some of their people, or help us in finding them. Listing the contents of Volume II of Bob Dalton's excellent work will give a wealth of names to choose from. And in addition to his efforts, and those of his sister Dorothy, his wife and parents, we owe gratitude to Edna Secrest for sending us the 3500 cards from which we typed the index.

Our collection of Greene County Cemeteries is increasing constantly through the efforts of Mabel Sheffer and other friends too numerous to mention. So now, it is time we made a permanent list of all cemeteries in that county, and Scott.

Our collection of Scott County Cemeteries is considerable through the efforts of Mr. and Mrs. Chester Funk. I visited in the Courthouse in Winchester last week, and was able to secure several other readings through the courtesy of our County Clerk, Mrs. Ballard. I will exchange items with her so that we will increase the information at both ends. The County Board is developing a museum in the old jail with CETA workers.

I visited with the County Clerk and Circuit Court Clerk in Virginia, seat of Cass, the week before and received excellent cooperation in locating genealogical materials. It is very refreshing to have such nice folks in public office.

I have been telling genealogists that I would like to have readings of their family members in various cemeteries, lately, and today I received a nice letter from H. Clark Dean of Glencoe ILL giving his grandparents data in Exeter and Gillham cemeteries. He followed my instructions as to putting his name on each page (used letterhead stationery), name of cemetery and available data on them.

Should you desire to send us this information, please use standard size paper (8½x11) so that we can punch 3 holes (leave adequate space on left-hand side) and place in the notebooks with the proper cemetery. (Only 1 cemetery per page, please.)

Fred Korty of Evanston ILL has sent us a correction on the Naples Cemetery to state that the surname was CRAFTON, not GRAFTON. He had previously sent us a xerox of the obituaries of Wilhelmina Fredrika Appel Busch, and Mr. Fred Appel. As time and circumstances permit, I plan to xerox such holdings and, keeping the original in the original correspondence file, place another in the cemetery file and family history file.

Our correspondents sometimes express amazement at how well I remember the names of those relatives they are working on, and can send them useful items of interest. Do not credit to my memory, but the excellent system Lucille V. Crawford has helped to set up. Every once in awhile she updates the sheets of paper that in the first column has the surnames, alphabetically listed, that people are looking for, and across the page we put the surnames of the ones who wrote to us about it. Sometimes we get an accumulation of 2 to 4 names and can put these people together.

While I am far behind with answering letters, and getting all correspondence from one person "captured" in a 9x12 brown envelope, I do have a sizeable file nearly 4 feet long. The surname is in the left-hand corner, so that I can easily pick out a person's name as needed. If--and when--we get a public place to put these materials to use, we will have accumulated a wealth of genealogical material to draw upon.

PRESENTATION OF VOLUME II OF THE DALTON-LONG CEMETERY BOOKS
TO THE JACKSONVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY
March 18, 1976



Miss Frances Woodrum (right) of the Jacksonville Public Library is shown receiving a bound copy of "A Guide to Cemeteries of Morgan County, Illinois, Volume Two" from the compilers, Robert W. Dalton, and his sister, Mrs. Donald (Dorothy) Long. The two volumes owned by the library contain the results of about eight years of research into old cemeteries, land records, newspapers, microfilms, death certificates and family records. In a few instances the cemetery readings were made by others and donated to the compilers for this project. Containing information on about 60 Morgan County cemeteries, the two volumes deal mainly with the abandoned, isolated or destroyed cemeteries of Morgan County and contain much genealogical information. Of special interest is a listing of 197 persons, from infants to elderly, who are buried in the Poor Farm cemetery and where the numbered grave markers do not contain the names of the deceased. The volumes may not be removed from the library and are not commercially available.

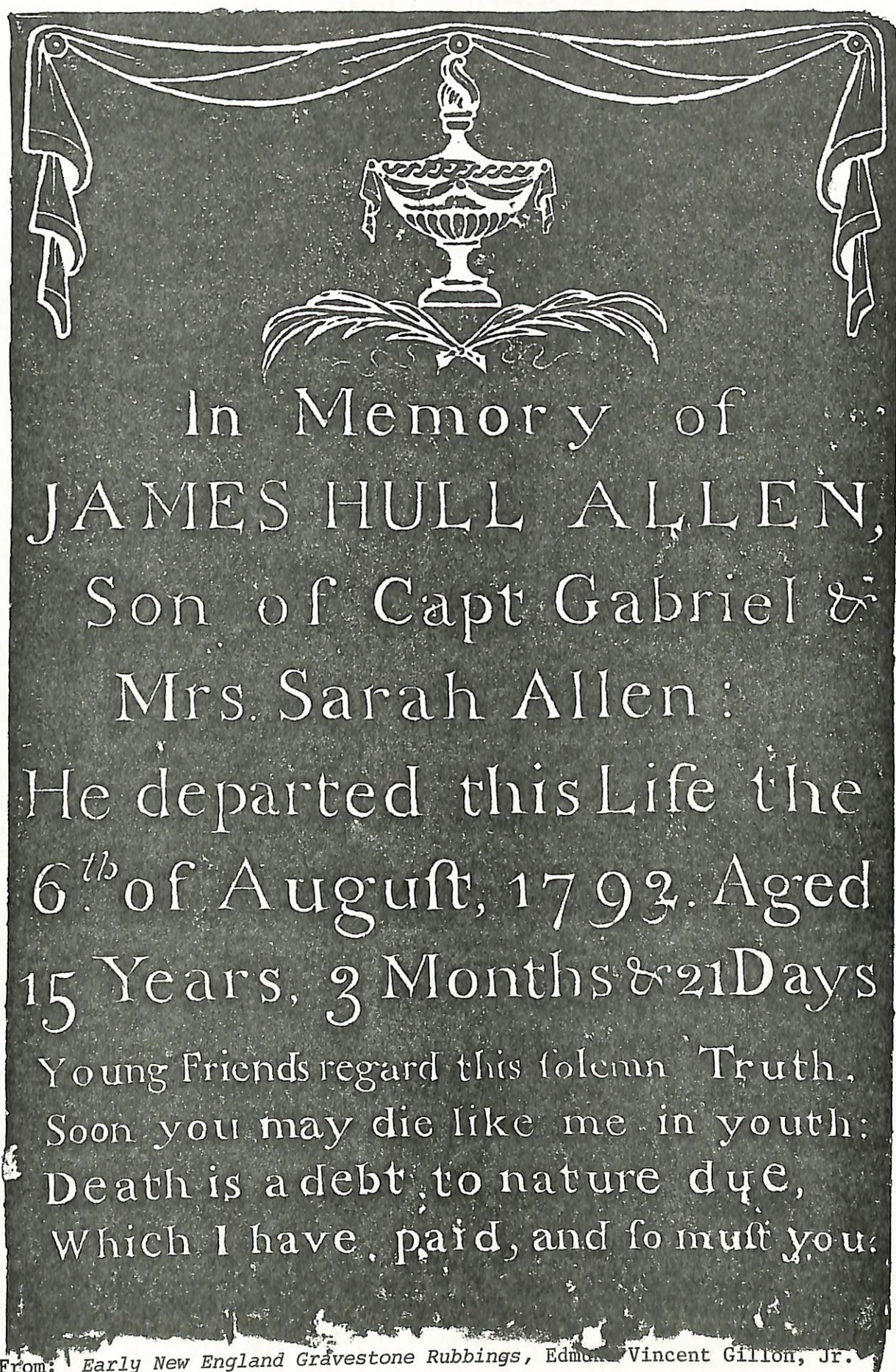

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A REVIEW OF FACTS PERTAINING TO ILLINOIS VITAL RECORDS: MARRIAGE, BIRTH & DEATH.

1. Marriage records (and divorce):

- a. Marriage certificates were required to be filed with County Clerks. from beginning of County records. Marriage had to be conducted in county in which application was made.
- b. Return of marriage certificate by minister, or other legal officiate, was required, recorded, indexed and filed.
 - 1) Sometimes record says: l.g. This means license was granted, but no marriage certificate was returned for filing.
 - 2) This may not indicate that marriage did not occur. Perhaps bad weather, death, or removal of officiate to another place may have been a reason why certificate did not make it back to the county office; or, it may have been misfiled, or lost. One must search indexes for all possible ways of spelling a given surname.
 - 3) Some marriages took place by publishing "banns" for 3 weeks in the local church, and the minister noted this in his personal book, and/or church record.
- c. By State Law in the latter part of 1877 names of parents, and other data, was recorded in the County Marriage Record, and placed on the back of each certificate filed.
- d. Since 1 January 1962 a copy of each marriage and certificate of divorce has been required to be filed with the State Registrar of Vital Records. They maintain a statewide index, alphabetically, by name of husband, and by maiden name of wife.
 - 1) For a \$3.00 fee, the State Registrar will search indexes and verify whether a particular marriage has been recorded, in which county, and when and where a divorce has been granted. [See address below.]
 - 2) Copies of marriage records, however, are available only from County Clerk.
 - 3) Copies of divorce decrees are available only from the Circuit Court Clerk.

2. Birth and Death Certificates:

- a. Filing certificates with County Clerks started in 1878 for births and deaths. Again, not all certificates made it to the county office for one reason or another. Variable spelling of surnames makes such search quite difficult.
- b. Certified copies of birth and death records may be issued to those persons qualified to receive them upon payment of \$3.00 fee required by State Law. Some counties charge a higher fee.
- c. Make application to County Clerk's office where event occurred, giving as much data, and variable name spellings, as possible.
- d. Use application forms, or make your letter brief, and in outline form.
- e. Do not request County Clerks to search indexes for surnames. Ask them to refer you to a local person who may do this type of genealogical research.
- f. Death certificates are filed in county where death occurred.
- g. Birth or death certificates are available from the State Registrar of Vital Records for those filed after 1 January 1916. A statewide index is maintained. The search fee is \$3.00 each.

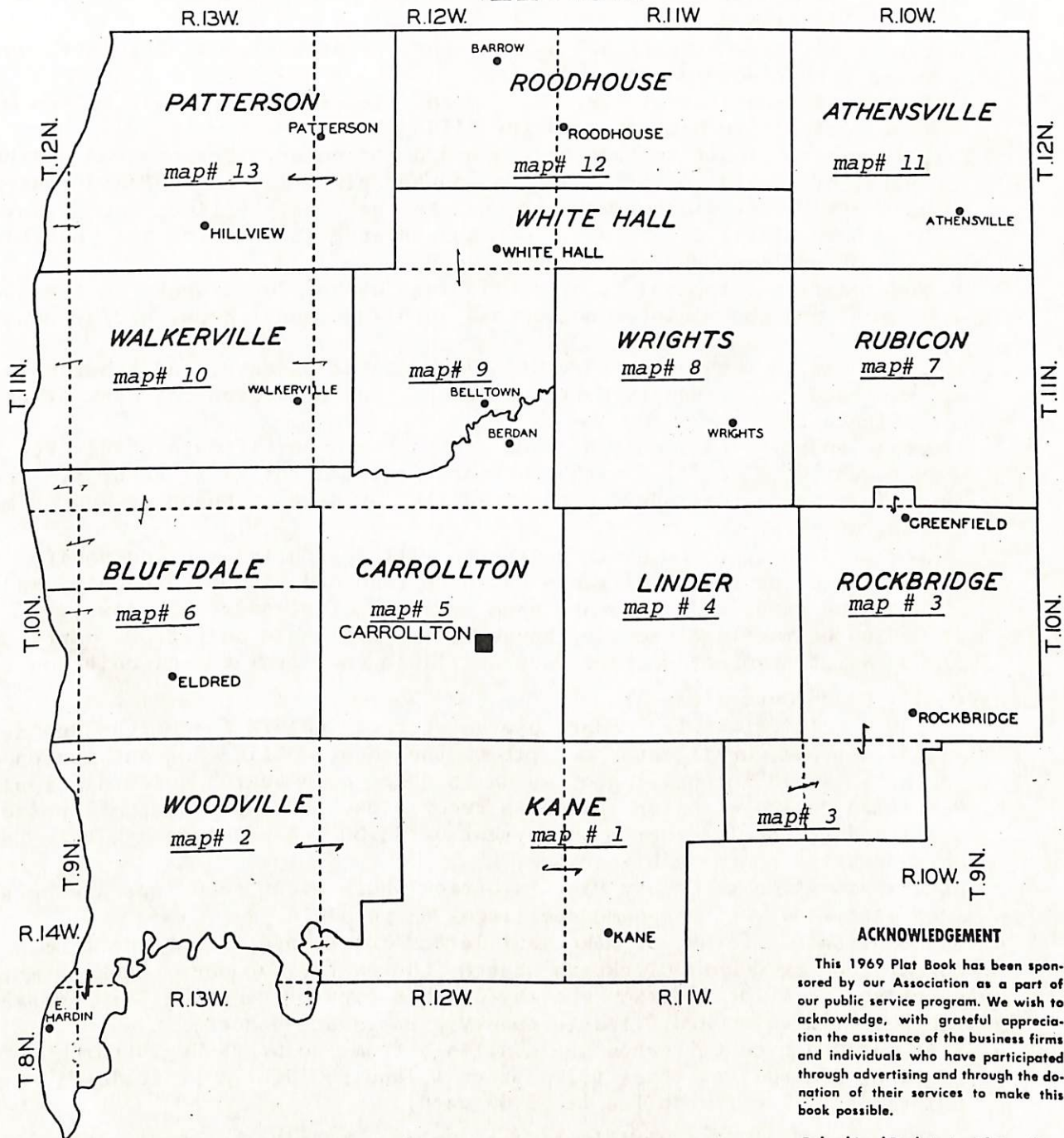

Also apply to them for birth and death certificates filed after 1 January 1916.

Application can also be made to county clerks for births, deaths and marriages. Application for divorce information must be made to Circuit Court Clerks.

Applications for revelation of adoptions is extremely difficult and would probably require a Court Order from a Judge.

Dear Friends and Family Historians of Greene County:

I have been trying to pinpoint and name the cemeteries of Greene County, Illinois, for the past 4 years, and wish to make a final list. I need the help of interested citizens, family historians, county officials and land owners.

Included with this letter is a list of cemeteries compiled from the Plat Books and Atlases of Greene County for 1873, 1893, 1915 and 1969. They are divided by Townships, listed as "map# 1, map# 2", etc. A township map is also included as a reference to approximate cemetery locations in the County.

If there is a cemetery on land you own, would you be so kind as to send the readings on visible stones, if it is a small family plot, especially. Could you tell us who might have readings, who is the secretary or president of any cemetery associations, with addresses. Do you know where any old record books are located?

If you are a family historian, and have any records of burials in a given cemetery, would you be so kind as to send us a list with available vital data? Be sure to indicate name and location of cemetery, and name and address of person submitting data.

Write on one side of sheet, please, preferably standard size (8½ x 11). This way we can punch 3 holes and insert in our Cemetery Notebooks, along with whatever readings we may have. Be sure to give:

1. Name and location of cemetery (and township, if known)
2. Name and address of person submitting reading
3. Vital data, both from stones, or family history:
 - a. birth, and where (if possible)
 - b. death, " "
 - c. marriage data (from family records)
 - d. relationships to other burials, or living persons.
4. Especially make notations if bodies have been moved from a country cemetery to a larger one.
5. If a cemetery was known to have been in a specific spot, but no surface evidence is currently available, please give us this very important information. Time, animals and floods have destructed many family cemeteries. Probing with a steel rod may reveal some buried stones. Using a metal finder may detect the metal handles of caskets. Using binoculars, and standing at a distance from surface stones, may make reading faded letters easier.

Because of the deterioration of tombstones, vandalism, and careless handling of these deeded cemeteries by modern machinery, it is quite necessary for us to locate and record the names of our deceased in order to preserve a vital part of our heritage for future generations. Your cooperation and concern will be greatly appreciated.

These cemeteries are on approximately 90% deeded land discovered by searching the plat maps of 1873, 1893, 1915 and 1969. There are a small percentage which have been called to our attention as being on certain lands.

We have tried to give names to those possible, and suggested names for others, derived from naming the first family to have a cemetery mark on their land. Normally, they buried their loved ones there, and opened it up for their neighbors to share.

We have undoubtedly made errors, or have differences from local or popular opinion. We would appreciate many persons carefully considering these matters, making any corrections or suggestions, and mailing them to us.

Traces of some of these cemeteries may be difficult to find. However, evergreen trees, or wild rose bushes in a vicinity are good evidence. Many cemeteries have been destroyed when roads were relocated or widened. Different plat maps locate the cemetery at differing spots on the section of land. We do not know all facts from these "paper surveys". We need help from the landowners and relatives of people buried in the area.

The land descriptions, as to the fractional part of a quarter in a section of land may be incorrect, because we have determined these by looking at the maps, and making a judgment as to the cemetery's approximate location. Please feel free to make corrections here also, as we want accurate descriptions. We may have some of the owners' names incorrect. We used a 1969 Greene County Plat Map. We would like to have the current names of owners.

For those active cemeteries under a trusteeship or incorporation, we would appreciate having the names of the secretary, treasurer, or president, with addresses. When we finally publish a correct list, perhaps we will have readers who would like to make donations for their cemetery's upkeep.

We would like to receive these letters of correction or comment with the next few weeks. Won't you take time, now, to write us?

NOTES OF INTEREST FROM MEMBERS:

Because there are several persons trying to put the numerous Thompsons into proper family perspective, we are including some notes from Mrs. Maxine Gieringer of Cincinnati, Ohio 45208 From her letter: (2365 Madison, #304)

1872 Atlas, p. 78. Adam Butcher's wife is referred to as Mary Ann Sharp. The name is Tharp. (My g-grandparents.) They were married in Pike Co., Ohio where Thomas Tharp's will names his daughter Mary Butcher.

1872 Atlas, p. 25. The index lists Nancy S. Thompson on pp. 78 & 122. There were two Nancy Thompsons.

(a) Per the Atlas, Nancy S. married Samuel French.

(b) The Nancy on p. 122 is a sister of my g-g-grandmother Mary Ann Thompson who m. Jacob Chrisman in Sept. 1836 (Morgan Co. records) and died June 30, 1837 in childbirth. My father had always told me about "Aunt Nancy" bringing up her sister's son, Washington Perry Chrisman, "who was orphaned at an early age." Jacob died in the fall of 1839. (Washington Perry Chrisman was my father's grandfather.)

Nancy Thompson bought her farm on Coon Run in Sec. 20, T.16N R.12W, from a John Thompson (p. 122 for location). On the later map of 1894, p. 37, her farm appears under the name of Susan T. Nergenah. Susan T. Nergenah (Susan Frances) was Nancy's daughter named in her Morgan County will. (The marriage records show the name as Niergenau, obviously written by the man himself - a neat, educated writing.) No living descendants.

A John Thompson came to Morgan Co. from Macoupin, bought a lot of land and sold it to several people. He bought some of his land from Oswell Thompson and Oswell Jr., the first purchase being about 1831. John Thompson had left Morgan Co. for Ripley Co., Ind., per a deed, by 1847 when Nancy bought land from him, the transaction being handled by John N. Thompson, Atty-in-fact. The wife of the original John Thompson was a Hannah (per deed).

[Anybody having further information on these families could send it to us to share with those having family connections.]

* * * * *

Finding people who were orphaned and raised by relatives is something of a problem for genealogists, as above case indicates. Another letter from our new member, Mrs. Chester H. Gausman, presents a similar case: "Thank you for your help when we met at the Courthouse ... Sophie Baird, born Springfield, Il., or vicinity, 30 Apr 1855, orphaned, went to Nebr. with John & Elizabeth McClain family in the 1860's. A brother Ebenezer(?) migrated with another family to Nebr., and either returned to IL or went to CAL. She is my grandmother, and any clues to her family are needed."

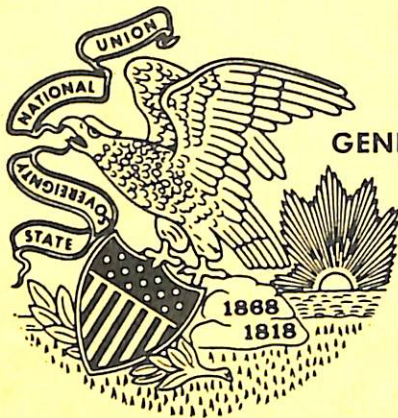
