

DAVID SCHOTZKO: CO-PRODUCER

As a soloist, chamber musician, and curator, percussionist David Schotzko is a passionate advocate for contemporary composers, having premiered over 300 works with percussion by composers from around the globe. He is currently the Artistic director of Arraymusic-one of Canada's oldest contemporary music organizations-and was a founding member and Program Director of the renowned International Contemporary Ensemble (ICE) in New York and Chicago from 2002 to 2008. Since moving to Toronto in 2010, David has served as Artistic Advisor for Ottawa Chamberfest and Music in the Barns, and has curated programs for Arraymusic, Intersection, the University of Toronto, and more.



BRENDA LOCHHEAD: SUPPORT CONTEXT MANAGER

Brenda is a support worker with Family Services of Greater Vancouver and has more than 25 years of experience in the anti-violence sector, where she supports victims in the Vancouver Police Department Counter Exploitation Unit. She provides services to victims of sexual exploitation and human trafficking. She was instrumental in the development and implementation of a coordination framework for supporting trafficked and exploited individuals, which has been recognized by other policing agencies. In 2018, she was the winner of the BC Ministry of Public Safety Services to Victims Award, which celebrates exemplary leadership in providing services and support to victims.



NAOMI WOO: MUSIC DIRECTOR

Naomi is a prominent young conductor, recognized by CBC (30 Under 30) and Flare Magazine (How I Made It) as a rising star on the Canadian classical music scene. As Assistant Conductor of the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, Naomi programmes and conducts educational concerts and is a leader in community engagement. Naomi is also the first Music Director of Sistema Winnipeg, a music programme for social change in the city's North End. As an opera conductor and music director, Naomi has conducted more than a dozen operas, and in 2018, she was one of only 12 conductors accepted onto the first training course for women conductors at the National Opera Studio, hosted by the Royal Philharmonic Society and the Royal Opera House.
