AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 6 RELATING TO THE  
DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF BOYNE FALLS

THE VILLAGE OF BOYNE FALLS ORDAINS:

**Section 1. Amendment of Section 3.**

Section 3 of Ordinance No. 6 enacted December 6, 1955 shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 3. Except as provided in this section, no person shall at anytime shoot or discharge or cause to be shot or discharged any firearm, rifle, pistol, or shotgun within the Village limits. A person who has a reasonable belief that his or her life or the life of a third person is in immediate danger may discharge or shoot a firearm, rifle, pistol, or shotgun within the Village limits to protect his or her life or the life of the third person.

**Section 2. Amendment of Section 4.**

Section 4 of Ordinance No. 6 enacted December 6, 1955 shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 4. A person who violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor which shall be punishable by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days or a fine of not more than Five Hundred and 00/100 (\$500.00) Dollars, or both, plus costs of prosecution.

**Section 3. Validity.**

If any section, provision or clause of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not effect any remaining portions or application of this Ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid portion or application.

**Section 4. Effective Date.**

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after being published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village.
