The Seven New Creation Bible Truths

1. A New Species – Born of God

When you accepted Jesus Christ as Lord, you didn't just receive a spiritual tune-up—you became something entirely new, a brand-new species that never existed before. The New Birth is a supernatural transformation where the very life and nature of God are imparted to your spirit. You're no longer merely human; you are born of God, filled with His Spirit, and empowered to live above the natural limitations of this world. As 2 Corinthians 5:17 declares, "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature..."—you have been re-created in Christ with divine DNA. This is not religion; this is regeneration.

2 Corinthians 5:17 – "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature..." **John 1:12-13** – "...born, not of blood... but of God."

- The New Creation is not simply someone who has been forgiven of sin, but rather a person who has been completely recreated, now possessing the very nature of God.
- Jesus did not come to establish another religion; instead, He came so that His life and character could be reproduced within us.
- The born-again believer becomes a completely new kind of being—something that has never existed before—created in Christ and filled with God's own life and nature.

Emphasize that the believer is not an improved sinner but a brand-new being, partaking of the divine nature.

2 Corinthians 5:17 Emphasizes the radical transformation that occurs at the new birth—not just a changed life, but a completely new kind of life.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for Step 1: A New Species - Born of God

- 1. According to 2 Corinthians 5:17 and John 1:12–13, what does it truly mean to be "born of God," and how does this differ from merely being forgiven or religiously reformed?
- 2. How does understanding yourself as a completely new creation—with God's own nature and life within—change the way you see your identity, your past, and your potential in Christ?
- 3. In what practical ways can believers live out this "divine nature" daily, demonstrating that they are not improved sinners but entirely new beings in Christ?

2. A New Nature - The Nature of Righteousness

When you were born again, you didn't just get forgiven—you were made righteous. Righteousness is not something you earn or grow into; it is a gift from God, a part of your new nature in Christ. You have been made the righteousness of God in Him (2 Corinthians 5:21). That means you can stand in God's presence without guilt, shame, or condemnation. Righteousness gives you the right to receive from God, the boldness to pray with authority, and the freedom to live above sin. It's who you are now—not based on what you've done, but on what Jesus has done for you.

2 Peter 1:4 – "...partakers of the divine nature..." **Romans 5:17** – "...those who receive... the gift of righteousness..."

- Righteousness is not something we gradually work our way into; it is a gift freely given to us at the moment of the New Birth.
- Righteousness is not defined by your actions; it is your identity in Christ.
- If you are born again, you are already as righteous today as you will ever be, even when you are in heaven.
- You are the righteousness of God, not because of anything you have done, but entirely because of what Jesus accomplished for you.
- Righteousness means having the ability to stand confidently before the Father without any sense of guilt, shame, or inferiority.
- Righteousness is not a goal that you strive to achieve; it is a gift that you receive by faith.

Teach that righteousness is not performance-based; it is a legal standing and nature received from God.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for **Step 2: A New Nature – The Nature of Righteousness**

- According to 2 Corinthians 5:21 and Romans 5:17, how does understanding righteousness as a gift—rather than something earned—transform the way we relate to God?
- 2. What does it mean to "stand before God without guilt, shame, or condemnation," and how can this truth reshape the way you pray, worship, and see yourself?
- **3.** If righteousness is part of your new nature in Christ, how should that reality influence the way you respond to temptation, failure, and your daily walk with God?

3. A New Identity - In Christ

Your identity is no longer defined by your past, your failures, or your circumstances—it's defined by who you are in Christ. When you made Jesus the Lord of your life, you were spiritually united with Him in His death, burial, and resurrection. Now, you are in Him, and everything He is, you have access to. Galatians 2:20 says, "I have been crucified with Christ... and Christ lives in me." That means your old identity died, and a new, victorious identity was born—one that carries His authority, His righteousness, and His purpose. In Christ, you are more than a conqueror.

Galatians 2:20 – "I have been crucified with Christ..."

Colossians 3:3 – "Your life is hidden with Christ in God."

- Everything Jesus did was not for His own sake but for ours; we were included with Him in His death, burial, and resurrection.
- The moment you were born again, you received a brand-new identity—you are no longer defined by your past but by who God says you are in Christ.
- What took place in Christ is far greater than anything that has ever happened to you in your life.
- Your identification with Christ is at the very core of your faith: you died with Him, were buried with Him, and were raised with Him into a completely new life.
- You look far better in Christ than you ever could apart from Him.
- The gospel acts like a mirror, reflecting back to you your true identity in Christ—showing you that you are righteous, redeemed, and victorious.

Emphasize identification with Christ. What happened to Him legally happened to us spiritually.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for Step 3: A New Identity - In Christ

- 1. According to Galatians 2:20 and Colossians 3:3, what does it mean to have your life "hidden with Christ," and how does this redefine your sense of self and purpose?
- 2. How does understanding your identification with Christ—being crucified, buried, and raised with Him—change the way you view your past and your present challenges?
- 3. If everything Jesus accomplished was credited to you, how can embracing your new identity in Christ empower you to live with greater confidence, authority, and victory each day?

4. A New Relationship - Sonship and Fellowship

Salvation didn't just bring you into a religion—it brought you into the family of God. Through the New Birth, you received the Spirit of adoption and became a child of God with full rights of sonship. Romans 8:15 says, "You have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father." This is an intimate, personal relationship where God is not just your Creator—He is your loving Father. You can walk with Him, talk with Him, and enjoy daily fellowship with Him. As His child, you're never alone, and you're always welcome in His presence.

Romans 8:15 – "You have received the Spirit of adoption..."

1 John 1:3 – "...that ye also may have fellowship with us..."

- The highest honor of redemption is that we have been made sons of God—not merely servants, but beloved children in His family.
- The ultimate purpose of redemption was never just forgiveness; it was to bring us into sonship.
- We are not servants who must beg for favor, but sons who freely enjoy the inheritance given to us by the Father.
- God imparted His very nature to us so that we could stand before Him just as Jesus does—fearless, righteous, and fully loved.
- Sonship means we belong to God's family, with all the rights, privileges, and responsibilities that come with being His children.
- Christianity is not merely a religion; it is a living relationship between a loving Father and His sons.
- Because we are born of God, we share in His very nature and are as near to the Father's heart as Jesus Himself is.
- Sonship gives us boldness in prayer, confidence to face life, and authority to operate in the spiritual realm.

The New Creation enters a relationship of love and intimacy with the Father, not fear or distance.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for **Step 4**: **A New Relationship – Sonship and Fellowship**

- 1. According to Romans 8:15 and 1 John 1:3, what does it mean to receive "the Spirit of adoption," and how does this truth transform the way you relate to God?
- 2. How does understanding yourself as a son or daughter of God—rather than merely a servant—affect your confidence in prayer, worship, and daily fellowship with the Father?
- 3. In what practical ways can you deepen your relationship with God as your loving Father, living daily in the awareness of His presence, favor, and love?

5. A New Authority – Seated with Christ

As a born-again believer, you have been raised up and seated with Christ in heavenly places, far above all principality and power (Ephesians 2:6, 1:21). This isn't a future promise—it's a present reality. You share in Jesus' victory and authority because you are in Him. This means you no longer live under the dominion of Satan, sin, or fear. You have authority to speak God's Word, resist the devil, and enforce the victory of the cross in every area of your life. You're not trying to get the victory—you're operating from it, because you're seated with Christ on the throne of triumph.

Ephesians 2:6 – "...made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus." **Luke 10:19** – "I give you power to tread on serpents..."

- We do not need to pray for authority, because as New Creations we were born into it.
- You are not struggling to reach victory—you are already seated in victory through Christ.
- God raised you up with Christ and seated you far above every power; now you can live as one who is already seated there.
- Your place of authority is in Christ, at the right hand of the Father—the very center of power in the universe—and that's where you already are.
- When Jesus sat down, it was not because He was weary but because the work was finished; now you share that seat with Him in His finished work.
- The same authority that raised Jesus from the dead is the authority that now resides within you.
- Your spiritual position determines your perspective—when you know you're seated with Christ, you stop begging and start reigning.

Teach the believer's position of authority over sin, Satan, and circumstances through union with Christ.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for Step 5: A New Authority – Seated with Christ

- 1. According to Ephesians 2:6 and Luke 10:19, what does it mean to be "seated with Christ," and how does this spiritual position affect the way you face challenges and opposition?
- 2. How does recognizing that you already share in Christ's victory and authority change the way you pray, speak, and respond to the works of the enemy?
- 3. In what ways can believers move from a mindset of striving for victory to one of reigning from victory, fully exercising their authority in Christ?

6. A New Mind - Renewed by the Word

Even though your spirit is made new at salvation, your mind must be transformed to align with God's truth. The renewal of your mind through God's Word is essential to living in victory. Romans 12:2 tells us, "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind..." This means replacing old thoughts shaped by the world with God's thoughts revealed in Scripture. As you meditate on the Word and act on it, your thinking changes, your faith grows, and your life begins to reflect the reality of who you are in Christ. A renewed mind is the gateway to a transformed life.

Romans 12:2 – "Be transformed by the renewing of your mind..."

1 Corinthians 2:16 – "...we have the mind of Christ."

- The recreated spirit can only take the lead over the mind when the mind itself is renewed by the Word of God.
- The true battlefield of life is in the mind, and victory begins when you start thinking the way God thinks.
- You will never rise above the level of your thoughts; right living is always the result of right thinking.
- God's Word is like a mirror that reveals who you are in Christ and renews your mind so you can live in line with that truth.
- Mental assent merely admires and agrees with the Word but fails to act on it, while a renewed mind puts the Word into practice.
- You cannot expect to live a victorious life if your mind remains in defeat.
- Renewing the mind is not something you do once—it is a daily discipline of feeding on the Word until it reshapes the way you think.
- You renew your mind by continually putting God's Word before your eyes, into your ears, and on your lips—until it transforms your heart and your lifestyle.

The New Creation must undergo mind renewal to reflect their new identity and authority.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for **Step 6: A New Mind – Renewed by the Word**

- 1. According to Romans 12:2 and 1 Corinthians 2:16, what does it mean to be "transformed by the renewing of your mind," and how does this process help you live out your new identity in Christ?
- 2. Why is it essential to replace old, worldly thought patterns with God's truth, and what practical steps can you take to make the Word the dominant influence in your thinking?
- 3. How does having "the mind of Christ" empower you to respond differently to life's challenges, temptations, and decisions compared to a natural, unrenewed mindset?

7. A New Mission - Ministry of Reconciliation

As a new creation in Christ, you've been given more than just a new life—you've been given a divine assignment. Every believer is called into the **ministry of reconciliation**, to bring others into the same relationship with God that you now enjoy. According to 2 Corinthians 5:18-20, God has made you His ambassador, His voice on the earth, to proclaim that the price for sin has been paid and fellowship with the Father is restored through Jesus. Your mission is clear: speak the truth in love, walk in the power of the Spirit, and lead others to the saving grace that changed your life.

2 Corinthians 5:18-20 – "...has given us the ministry of reconciliation." **Matthew 28:19** – "Go therefore and make disciples..."

- We are not saved merely to go to heaven; we are commissioned to bring the reality of heaven to others here on earth.
- The same Christ who once walked the shores of Galilee now walks the world through you.
- Because Christ lives in you, you have become His hands to the sick, His voice to the lost, and His heart to the broken.
- God did not save you just to sit in comfort—He saved you to be sent out. As a new creation, you carry the message and ministry of reconciliation, representing Jesus to a lost and broken world.
- The very moment you became a new creation, you also became God's ambassador—His voice, His hands, and His heart in a hurting world.
- God reconciled you to Himself so that, through you, He could bring reconciliation to others.
- You are not just saved from something; you are saved for something—to lead others to Christ.
- You are Heaven's representative, carrying a message powerful enough to set captives free.

Every New Creation is an ambassador of Christ, empowered to represent Him on earth.

Three Questions for Reflection and Discussion for **Step 7: A New Mission – Ministry of Reconciliation**

- 1. According to 2 Corinthians 5:18–20 and Matthew 28:19, what does it mean to be entrusted with the "ministry of reconciliation," and how does that shape your purpose as a believer?
- 2. How does seeing yourself as Christ's ambassador change the way you view your daily interactions—with family, coworkers, or strangers?
- 3. In what practical ways can you live out your mission of reconciliation, sharing God's love and truth with those who need to experience His forgiveness and new life?

21-Day New Creation Confessions

Confessing your identity in Christ is vital because faith must be expressed to be effective. Believing in your heart is only part of faith—confession is the voice of faith. Until you speak what you believe, it remains inactive.

Romans 10:10 ("...with the mouth confession is made unto salvation") and 2 Corinthians 4:13 ("...we believe, therefore we speak") reveal the power of confession. Just as we confessed Jesus as Lord to receive salvation, we continue confessing God's Word to walk in the reality of who we are in Christ.

Confession aligns our words with God's truth, not with feelings, failures, or lies of the enemy. It renews our minds, builds our faith, and sets spiritual laws in motion. Right confession strengthens faith—wrong confession weakens it. Continually speaking the truth of God's Word—even in the face of doubt or opposition—helps believers hold fast to what Jesus has already accomplished and silences the voice of condemnation.

Confession is not about convincing God—it's about agreeing with what He has already declared and finished through Christ.
