# Paul's Revelation

---

## 1. Paul's Revelation: The Foundation of Christianity

Paul's gospel did not come through the classroom of men but through the classroom of the Holy Ghost. His letters are the unveiling of the New Creation, the believer's identification with Christ, and the victory that flows from union with Him.

**Galatians 1:11–12** — Paul declares that he “*neither received it of man... but by the revelation of Jesus Christ.*”

This is not second-hand truth. This is Jesus revealing Jesus.

**Ephesians 3:3–4** — “*By revelation He made known unto me the mystery.*”

The New Covenant cannot be understood intellectually alone; it must be revealed. What God unveiled to Paul is the backbone of our redemption realities.

**2 Corinthians 12:1–4** — Paul speaks of “visions and revelations of the Lord.”

These encounters formed the substance of what we now call Paul's Revelation—God's own interpretation of the cross, the resurrection, and the believer's position in Christ.

---

Paul's revelation is God's blueprint for New Testament Christianity. Without it, the believer's life is reduced to imitation rather than participation. With it, we step into:

- **What God has done *for us*** in Christ (substitution).
- **What God has done *in us*** in Christ (identification).
- **What God is doing *through us*** by the Spirit (manifestation).

**“Paul's letters contain the thoughts of God, reduced to the vocabulary of man.”**

When you read Paul, you are reading God's mind concerning the New Creation.

**“Revelation knowledge is the key to success in the Christian life.”**

Natural knowledge informs, but revelation knowledge transforms.

**“The Holy Spirit turns doctrine into reality—truth experienced, not just studied.”**

This is the essence of walking in victory: the Holy Spirit taking what is true in Christ and making it real in you.

- We don't live by information; we live by revelation.
- We don't fight for victory; we fight from victory because of what Christ already accomplished.
- We don't see ourselves after the flesh; we see ourselves in Christ, the way God sees us.

Paul's revelation becomes the believer's identity lens. Once you see who you are in Christ, you can never go back to who you were in Adam.

---

## **Confession**

*“Father, open the eyes of my heart. Reveal to me the mystery of Christ in me. Let the Holy Spirit turn every scripture into living reality. I walk in the light of Paul’s revelation—my identification with Christ, my union with Him, and my victory through Him.”*

## 2. The In-Christ Realities — The Believers New Position

At the heart of Paul's revelation beats one central truth:  
What God did *in Christ*, He did *for us*, and He put *in us*.

The phrase "in Christ," "in Him," "in Whom" is the golden thread that runs through the Pauline letters. These words describe the believer's new position, new identity, and new authority. They are the divine mirror that reveals who you are now because of what Jesus has done.

**2 Corinthians 5:17** — *"If any man be in Christ, he is a new creation."*

This is not a changed person but a recreated person—a new species, born of God, carrying God's nature.

**1 Corinthians 1:30** — *"But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who has been made unto us wisdom, righteousness, sanctification, and redemption."*

Your standing before God is not based on your effort but on your position in Christ.

**Ephesians 2:4–6** — God has *"raised us up together and seated us together in Christ Jesus."* Where Christ is seated, the believer is seated. Your spiritual geography determines your spiritual victory.

---

**"The most important words in the Bible are *in Christ*."**

They define the believer's legal status and vital experience.

Paul's entire system of truth—redemption, righteousness, authority, inheritance—flows out of this one reality:

**Identification:** His death was our death.

**Regeneration:** His life is our life.

**Position:** His seat is our seat.

**Possession:** What He has, we share.

In Christ is not a doctrine you visit—it is a **place you live**.

**"There is a place God designed you to live—in Christ."**

**"Confession is the road to realization."**

What you boldly declare about who you are in Christ becomes the experience of your daily walk. You say it until you see it, and when you see it, you *walk* in it.

The believer's greatest battles are won or lost in the arena of identity.

**When you know who you are in Christ:**

- Defeat loses its voice.
- Condemnation loses its grip.
- Fear loses its authority.
- Satan loses his advantage.

**Union with Christ is the believer's eternal position.**

Your identity is not in your past, your performance, or your feelings—it is in Christ alone.

---

**Confession**

*"I am in Christ. I am a new creation. His life is my life, His righteousness my righteousness, His authority my authority. I live from my place in Him—seated, blessed, and victorious."*

### 3. Identification With Christ — Our Co-Crucifixion & Co-Resurrection

Identification is the master key that unlocks who you are, what you have, and what you can do in Christ. Paul's revelation is not merely that Christ died *for* us, but that Christ died *as* us. Redemption is not substitution alone—it is union.

Identification means:

Everything Jesus did in His death, burial, resurrection, and enthronement, God credits to the believer as if we did it with Him.

This is the backbone of victorious Christianity.

**Romans 6:6** — “*Our old man was crucified with Him.*”

God does not counsel the old man; He crucifies him. The cross is the end of your former identity.

**Galatians 2:20** — “*I am crucified with Christ; nevertheless I live...*”

The believer's life is no longer self-powered but Christ-empowered. The “I” that was defeated died; the “I” that lives cannot be defeated.

**Colossians 3:1–3** — “*You died... and your life is hidden with Christ in God.*”

Your past is buried, your present is hidden in Christ, and your future is secure in Him.

**The believer was:**

- **Crucified** with Christ
- **Died** with Christ
- **Buried** with Christ
- **Quickened** (made alive) with Christ
- **Raised** with Christ
- **Seated** with Christ

This is the spiritual history of every believer.

**“What happened to Christ, happened to you.”**

**“Your identification is your location.”**

Where you locate yourself determines how you see yourself, speak about yourself, and walk in authority.

If you locate yourself in your feelings, you'll live defeated.

If you locate yourself in your failures, you'll live condemned.

But if you locate yourself **in Christ**, you'll live in victory.

---

**“The Father sees you in Christ, not in your weakness.”**

He doesn't deal with you based on Adam—He deals with you based on Jesus.

Identification means:

- You are not trying to become righteous—you are the righteousness of God in Christ.
- You are not fighting to get free—you died to sin and were raised in liberty.
- You are not trying to get accepted—you were co-crucified, co-raised, and co-seated with Christ.

As some of the early faith fathers said:

**“Christ did not die only for us but as us.”**

His cross is your cross. His resurrection is your resurrection. His seat is your seat.

---

Victory begins with identity.

You cannot walk in what you do not see.

You cannot possess what you will not confess.

The revelation of identification shifts the believer from:

- Trying to earn victory → **Standing in accomplished victory**
- Fighting the old man → **Reckoning him dead**
- Hoping for acceptance → **Living from union**

This is why Paul's system of truth always circles back to identification:

**The old you died. The new you is Christ in you.**

## Confession

*“I was crucified with Christ. I died with Him. I was buried with Him. I was made alive with Him. I was raised with Him. I am seated with Him. As He is, so am I in this world.”*

## 4. The Blood of Jesus — The Legal & Vital Power of Redemption

At the core of Paul's message—beneath identification, righteousness, and the new creation—flows a crimson river: the blood of Jesus.

Everything God has done for us in Christ rests on the legal and eternal power of His blood. Without the blood, there is no redemption; with the blood, there is no condemnation.

Paul's revelation begins where God begins: with the blood that satisfied Heaven and silenced hell.

**Ephesians 1:7** — *“In whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins.”* Redemption is not a feeling—it is a blood-bought fact.

**Romans 3:24–25** — *“Through faith in His blood...”*

The blood must not only be shed—it must be applied by faith.

Believing in the blood is believing in the finished work of Christ.

**Hebrews 9:12–14** — *“By His own blood He obtained eternal redemption.”*

His blood cleanses our conscience, restores our fellowship, and gives us boldness before God.

---

The blood of Jesus carries a dual power:

### 1. Legal — Before God

Before the throne, the blood is the eternal evidence that sin has been judged and righteousness has been secured.

**“The blood makes you free legally; the Spirit makes you free vitally.”**

The blood satisfied the highest claims of divine justice.

When God sees the blood, He sees no guilt, no shame, no past.

### 2. Dynamic — In Us

The same blood that speaks in Heaven also works in the heart of the believer:

- Cleansing the conscience
- Breaking the power of sin
- Removing guilt and fear

- Producing boldness and fellowship
- Empowering faith and authority

The blood doesn't just speak to God—it speaks to you.  
It tells you who you are, what you have, and what has been removed forever.

---

**“Faith in the blood of Jesus is the master key.”**

There is no freedom, no victory, no joy, no revelation without applying faith in the blood.

**“The blood of Jesus is the living voice of God’s mercy.”**

The blood speaks—continuously, powerfully, eternally—declaring: *You are clean. You are free. You are redeemed.*

**“The power of the church lies in the power of the blood.”**

A bloodless gospel is a powerless gospel.

---

The blood of Jesus:

- **Gives confidence** — You stand before God without fear or inferiority.
- **Cleanses the conscience** — You live without guilt, shame, or condemnation.
- **Grants access** — You enter boldly into the presence of God.
- **Releases authority** — Satan fears the believer who knows how to speak and apply the blood.

The blood is Heaven's receipt that the price is paid.

The blood is the believer's weapon that enforces the victory of Christ.

The blood is the foundation of every blessing in the New Covenant.

---

## Confession

*"I have faith in the blood of Jesus. His blood cleanses me, redeems me, and gives me bold access to God. The blood speaks mercy over me. I walk in confidence, purity, and victory through the blood."*

## 5. The Spirit of Faith — Paul's Attitude of Victory

The Spirit of Faith is the attitude, posture, and voice of a believer who has seen something in the spirit that cannot be shaken by circumstances.

Paul didn't merely *teach* faith—he lived it in prisons, storms, persecutions, beatings, and impossible situations. He carried a confidence that no outward pressure could silence.

The Spirit of Faith says:

“I believe, therefore I speak.”

It holds fast when the natural mind collapses. It declares victory while standing in the fire. It sings in prison, shakes off snakes, and refuses to quit.

**2 Corinthians 4:13** — “*We also have the same spirit of faith... we believe and therefore speak.*”

Faith must be spoken. Believing in the heart and speaking with the mouth releases the supernatural.

**Romans 10:8–10** — The word of faith is near you—“*in your mouth and in your heart.*”

Faith is not passive or silent; it is vocal, bold, and creative.

**Galatians 3:5** — The Spirit moves and miracles happen “*by the hearing of faith.*”

The atmosphere of faith is the atmosphere where the Holy Spirit works.

Paul's Spirit of Faith is not positivity or optimism—it is a revelation-based boldness born out of who the believer is in Christ.

No matter the situation, Paul aligned his words with God's Word.

The Spirit of Faith gives you:

- Boldness under pressure
- Courage in adversity
- Strength in weakness
- Vision in darkness
- Victory in impossibility

“**Never run at your giant with your mouth shut.**”

David ran at Goliath speaking.  
 Jesus spoke to storms, sickness, trees, demons, and mountains.  
 Paul spoke in the midst of shipwreck, beatings, and imprisonment.

A silent believer is a defeated believer—faith must have a **voice**.

---

How Faith Works:

- **Believes** the Word
- **Speaks** the Word
- **Acts** on the Word
- **Rejoices** before the answer
- **Stands** until manifestation comes

**“Faith’s confession builds the reality of the Word into your spirit.”**

You say it **until** you see it, and when you see it, nothing can stop it.

Faith is not striving; it is receiving.

**“Faith is the open hand that receives all grace gives.”**

Grace is God’s supply.  
 Faith is your response.  
 The Spirit of Faith is your lifestyle.

---

The Spirit of Faith:

- Sees the invisible
- Believes the impossible
- Speaks the unshakable
- Acts with confidence
- Wins every time

This is how Paul faced adversity with triumph.  
This is how believers today overcome every attack.  
This is how the Gospel advances through you.

---

## Confession

*"I have the same Spirit of Faith. I believe God's Word. I speak God's Word. Mountains move, doors open, and victory manifests as I declare the truth. I refuse to fear, I refuse to quit, and I walk in triumph through Christ."*

## 6. Revelation Knowledge — Seeing What Paul Saw

Revelation knowledge is the heartbeat of Paul's ministry.

Paul knew that transformation comes not simply from hearing truth, but from seeing truth.

Revelation knowledge is when the Holy Spirit takes the Word off the page and writes it into your heart.

It is the difference between information and impartation.

Paul didn't pray for believers to get more blessed, more anointed, or more spiritual.

He prayed that they would see what they already have in Christ.

When the eyes of your heart open, everything changes.

---

**Ephesians 1:17–19** — Paul prays for the “*Spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him.*”

This is the master prayer of the New Testament.

Revelation brings:

- Enlightened eyes
- Inheritance understanding
- Resurrection power awareness

**Colossians 1:9–11** — “*Filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding.*”

Revelation produces:

- Supernatural clarity
- Strength
- Patience
- Fruitfulness

**1 Corinthians 2:9–12** — “*God has revealed them unto us by His Spirit... that we might know the things freely given to us by God.*”

What eye cannot see and what ear cannot hear is **revealed** by the Spirit.

---

Paul's revelation was not meant to remain exclusive; it was meant to be transmitted. This is why he prayed constantly for believers to see what he saw:

- Their identity in Christ
- Their authority in Christ
- Their inheritance in Christ
- Their position in Christ
- Their victory through Christ

Revelation is the unveiling of the unseen.

It is light entering the human spirit.

It frees you from spiritual blindness, religious tradition, and human limitations.

"The eyes of your heart must be flooded with light."

Light breaks ignorance.

Light brings confidence.

Light empowers faith.

"The Holy Spirit takes what God has done for you in Christ and makes it real to you."

Truth becomes transformational only when it becomes revelational.

---

Revelation:

- Changes identity
- Produces boldness
- Activates authority
- Strengthens faith
- Breaks fear
- Erases insecurity
- Builds a dominion mindset

You can't walk in what you cannot see.  
You can't take what you won't perceive.  
You can't access what you don't know exists.

This is why Paul prayed—not for power, but for perception.  
Not for blessing, but for sight.  
Not for something new, but for revelation of what already belongs to us.

“Truth must be illuminated by the Spirit to be transformative.”  
Information touches the mind—revelation transforms the spirit.

## Confession

*“The eyes of my heart are flooded with light. I have wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Christ. I see who I am, what I have, and what I can do in Christ. The Holy Spirit reveals the unseen to me, and I walk in boldness, clarity, and authority.”*

## 7. The New Creation — God's Masterpiece

The New Creation is the crowning truth of Paul's revelation.

It is God's finest work, His masterpiece, His highest expression of redemption.

The believer is not a forgiven sinner struggling to get better—he is a recreated spirit-being, born of God, carrying His nature, His righteousness, and His life.

Christianity is not behavior modification—it is spirit re-creation.

The New Creation is God's answer to man's condition, and His platform for demonstrating His glory on the earth.

**Ephesians 2:10** — *“For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus...”*

The word *workmanship* (poiēma) means “God's poem, His masterpiece.”

You are not mass-produced—you are divinely crafted.

**Galatians 6:15** — *“What counts is the new creation.”*

Circumcision, uncircumcision, background, and performance do not define you.

Only the New Creation matters.

**Ephesians 4:24** — *“Put on the new man... created in righteousness and true holiness.”*

This new nature is not achieved—it is received.

You were recreated righteous.

The New Creation is the miracle of **divine life imparted**.

It is not a repaired version of the old you, nor a cleaned-up version of Adam.

It is a brand-new species with God's own life and DNA.

**“God didn't just change you—He recreated you.”**

You are the product of God's own workmanship, designed to function in His realm, speak His Word, and carry His authority.

**“The New Creation is a new species with God's nature.”**

This is why you can reign over sin, sickness, fear, and the devil—because you share His nature.

Regeneration is not symbolic—it is supernatural.

**“Regeneration is the miracle of divine life imparted.”**

This life—zoe—is the foundation for:

### 1. Spiritual Authority

Authority does not come from trying harder; it comes from **who you are** in Christ.

## 2. Healing

God's nature in your spirit brings life to your body.

## 3. Boldness

The righteous are bold as a lion because righteousness is their nature.

## 4. Holiness

Holiness flows from nature, not struggle.

You live holy because you were created holy.

---

The New Creation is the believer's spiritual identity card:

- You are not "trying to get blessed"—you **are blessed**.
- You are not "trying to get victory"—you **are born of victory**.
- You are not "trying to access God"—you **are one spirit with Him** (1 Cor. 6:17).
- You are not "becoming righteous"—you **are righteous** by nature.

Your spirit is identical to Christ in life, righteousness, and nature.

The more you see the New Creation, the more dominion you walk in.

Transformation is not trying to improve the old; it is renewing your mind to the new.

---

## Confession

*"I am God's masterpiece—His workmanship, His new creation in Christ. I have His life, His righteousness, and His nature. I am bold, strong, healed, and victorious. I walk in authority because I am a new species in Christ Jesus."*

## 8. The Authority of the Believer — Seated With Christ

Authority is not a feeling, a personality type, or a special calling—it is the legal right and spiritual power given to every believer because of their union with the risen Christ.

Paul's revelation shows that the believer is not fighting *for* victory, but from a seat of victory—seated with Christ in heavenly places, far above every demonic force.

Your authority is based entirely on your identification with Christ: His triumph is your triumph, His seat is your seat, His dominion is your dominion.

**Ephesians 1:19–23** — Christ has been raised and exalted “*far above all principality and power... and every name that is named.*”

All things are under His feet—and if He is the Head and you are the Body, they are under your feet as well.

**Ephesians 2:6** — “*And has raised us up together and made us sit together in heavenly places in Christ Jesus.*”

This is the believer's spiritual position.

Authority flows from where you sit, not from how you feel.

**Colossians 2:9–10** — “*You are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power.*” If Christ is the Head over all powers, and you are in Him, then you stand in shared dominion.

---

Paul reveals that the same authority God gave to Christ has been delegated to His Body.

Authority is not partial—it is positional.

It is not emotional—it is legal.

It is not someday—it is now.

As one Word of Faith father said:

“You are not trying to win—you are enforcing victory.”

The believer doesn't petition the enemy; the believer commands because he speaks from Christ's seat.

Your authority is only as strong as your identification.

This is why Paul's revelation teaches:

“Your identification with Christ is the basis of your authority.”

When you know who you are in Christ, you speak differently, act differently, and confront the enemy differently.

**“When the believer knows his authority, Satan is defeated.”**

Ignorance is the enemy's advantage; revelation is the believer's advantage.

---

The power of your authority does not come from:

- Your background
- Your emotions
- Your experience
- Your personality
- Your spiritual maturity

Authority comes from the risen, enthroned Christ.

“The risen Christ is the believer’s source of dominion.”

When you speak His Word, you are releasing the power of His resurrection over:

- Circumstances
- Sickness
- Satanic oppression
- Fear
- Lack
- Darkness
- Atmospheres
- Nations

A believer seated with Christ is a believer who reigns.

---

Authority is expressed through:

- Faith-filled words
- Bold commands

- Knowing your position
- Standing your ground
- Refusing intimidation
- Recognizing what is under your feet

The enemy's strategy is to distract, deceive, and diminish your awareness of your seat in Christ. Your strategy is to enforce, bind, loose, declare, and dominate through the authority of Jesus' Name. The more you see your seat, the stronger your stance.

---

## Confession

*"I am seated with Christ in heavenly places. His authority is my authority. All things are under my feet. I enforce victory through the Name of Jesus. Satan is defeated, and I walk in dominion because I am in Christ."*

## 9. The Mind Renewal Process — Transformation Through Identification

Paul's revelation is not complete until it becomes your mindset. The New Creation is perfect in your spirit, but your mind must be retrained, re-educated, and reprogrammed to agree with what God has already done in Christ. Mind renewal is the bridge between your spiritual position and your daily experience.

You cannot live beyond the level of your mind renewal.  
Your spirit is recreated instantly; your mind is renewed progressively.

This is how the believer moves from information → revelation → transformation.

**Romans 12:1–2** — *“Be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”*

Transformation (metamorphosis) is the result of replacing old thought patterns with revelation knowledge.

**Ephesians 4:23** — *“Be renewed in the spirit of your mind.”*

The “spirit of the mind” refers to the attitude, posture, and inner logic of your thinking.

**Colossians 3:10** — *“Renewed in knowledge after the image of Him who created him.”*

Your new mind is patterned after Christ Himself.

Paul's entire system of truth requires **a new kind of thinking**—thinking that matches:

- Your identification with Christ
- Your new creation identity
- Your righteousness in Christ
- Your authority in Christ
- Your victory through the blood
- Your place in the Spirit

**“Your mind must be taught who you are in Christ.”**

Your spirit already knows the truth—your mind must catch up.  
The renewed mind aligns your thoughts with God's thoughts until:

- Fear is replaced with faith
- Condemnation is replaced with righteousness
- Defeat is replaced with victory
- Flesh-thinking is replaced with Christ-thinking

“The renewed mind aligns man with his recreated spirit.”  
Your spirit wants to dominate, but your mind must agree with it.

The Holy Spirit accomplishes this inner work of transformation by illuminating truth:  
“The Spirit sanctifies through illumination of truth.”

Sanctification begins when truth becomes revelation and produces new thought patterns.

---

Without mind renewal:

- Identity remains unclear
- Faith remains weak
- Authority remains unused
- Victory remains unrealized
- The old habits continue
- Feelings dominate
- Circumstances shape behavior

With mind renewal:

- Identity becomes established
- Faith becomes bold
- Authority becomes active
- Transformation becomes visible

- The Spirit leads
- The Word governs
- Victory is your lifestyle

Mind renewal is not willpower—it is Word-power.

The more you meditate, confess, and agree with Scripture, the more your mind takes on the mind of Christ.

---

How Mind Renewal Work:

1. Revelation comes to your spirit.
2. Meditation brings it into your mind.
3. Confession engraves it into your thinking.
4. Action manifests it in your life.

You don't renew your mind by effort—you renew it by exposure to the Word until the Word becomes your reasoning.

You begin to think like God, talk like God, expect like God, and walk like a son of God.

## Confession

*“My mind is being renewed day by day. I think in line with who I am in Christ. The Spirit of wisdom and revelation floods my understanding. I agree with God’s Word—therefore I am transformed, strengthened, and established in victory.”*

## 10. The Glory of Christ in the Believer — Paul's Ultimate Revelation

Paul's system reaches its highest peak in one breathtaking truth:  
Christ in you.

Not Christ beside you, not Christ cheering you on, not Christ occasionally helping—but Christ in you, living His life through you.

This is Paul's greatest revelation and the ultimate aim of redemption:  
That the believer becomes the visible expression, the earthly manifestation, and the living demonstration of Christ's glory.

The glory that once dwelled in temples now dwells in you.  
The glory that raised Christ from the dead now resides in your spirit.  
Christianity is not imitation—it is manifestation.

**Colossians 1:27** — “*Christ in you, the hope of glory.*”

This is the centerpiece of Paul's revelation.  
The indwelling Christ is both the source and expectation of glory in the believer.

**2 Corinthians 3:18** — “*We are being transformed from glory to glory.*”

As revelation increases, manifestation increases.  
Beholding produces becoming.

**Romans 8:29–30** — “*Conformed to the image of His Son.*”

The purpose of redemption is the reproduction of Christ in the believer—His character, His authority, His nature, His glory.

Paul's revelation begins with identification and ends with manifestation.  
Every step of his doctrinal system—blood, righteousness, new creation, authority, mind renewal—points toward one high mountain:  
the glory of Christ revealed in the believer.

“Christianity is Christ living in man today.”  
The Christian life is not self-effort but Christ-expression.

“The indwelling Christ is heaven begun in the soul.”  
Heaven is not simply where you are going—it is who lives inside you now.

The glory is not something you are waiting to receive in eternity;  
The glory is in you now, and increases through revelation and faith.

That is why you can say with confidence:  
“The glory in you is greater than any trouble around you.”

Light always outshines darkness.  
Life always overrides death.  
Glory always triumphs over adversity.

---

Paul's Ultimate Goal for the Church:

Paul wanted believers to:

- See Christ
- Know Christ
- Become like Christ
- Express Christ
- Manifest Christ

This is why he labored, preached, prayed, and wrote—to form Christ in believers (Gal. 4:19).

The glory of Christ is the believer's:

- Identity
- Destiny
- Nature
- Calling
- Power
- Purpose

Everything God planned for the believer is wrapped in this one revelation:  
**Christ in you.**

---

The glory in you:

- Gives you strength in weakness
- Produces boldness and confidence
- Empowers miracles and ministry
- Brings transformation from the inside out
- Enables you to reign in life
- Carries healing, authority, and victory

Christ in you means:

- You are never alone
- You are never without ability
- You are never without answers
- You are never without power
- You are never without glory

The Christian life is glory inside operating through faith on the outside.

---

## Confession

*“Christ lives in me. His glory is in me. I am being transformed from glory to glory. I carry His presence, His nature, His authority, and His power. The glory in me is greater than any trouble around me. I manifest Christ on the earth.”*
