**Tuesday, October 8<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, October 10<sup>th</sup>. Join us!**

**First day:** Leave by 7:00am to travel to [Ginny's Fine Fabrics](#) in Rochester. Because we are expecting to arrive midafternoon and her store closes at 4:00, Ginny has agreed to keep her store open a bit late for us. She will be joining us for supper.

There are two good hotel choices: one right across the street from Ginny's and the other right next door. Very convenient and lots of great restaurant options.

**Second day:** Wednesday morning we'll leave Rochester by 8:30am and travel about an hour and a half to [SR Harris Fabric](#) in Brooklyn Park. SR Harris is a huge warehouse style fabric store that will leave you dizzy with its vastness.

After SR Harris and lunch, we'll travel about a half hour to [Lakes Makerie](#) in Minneapolis. Lakes Makerie is a small independent store which specializes in independent patterns and fabrics with a European vibe.

The Mall of America is only 10 minutes away. We'll plan on a hotel close by. There are lots of restaurant options in *and* close to the Mall. And of course, it's always fun to stroll the Mall.

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



make for summer and fall.

How do you organize your sewing area? I tend to purge or put away anything that I will not be using in the immediate future. Deciding on the patterns I intend to make this summer/fall is a big step for me. That sets the tone for all that comes next. For each of those patterns, I select the fabric and notions so everything is together and ready go when I am ready to begin.

I use two pattern cabinets to store all my patterns. They are sorted by type (skirts, tops, dresses, pants, etc.) and size. This has saved me hours and hours of time searching for a specific pattern. I keep a small box of patterns near my cutting table that I want to work on in the near (or not so near) future so that they never become "out of site and out of mind."

Organizing my fabric has been a bit trickier. But that said, generally, I have wovens and knits separated and sorted by color within my fabric closet. About 10 years ago, I put my fabric on bolts. I realize that takes up slightly more room but it has simplified the process of finding a specific fabric and they stay nicer on a bolt. I do not regret storing my fabrics this way.

During the pandemic I replaced my design board with peg board that places all my go-to tools at my fingertips. You would think I would have a neat and tidy space ready for photos at any moment, but that is not the case. My sewing room is always disheveled and messes with my creativity no matter how diligently I try to keep things orderly. So again, how do you manage your sewing area? Any great hints you would like to share with us?

These promise to be great opportunities to be creative, to learn something new and to make new friends. I can't wait to see each of you again and to share about what you have been making!!!

We are always in need of supplies for our community service projects. If you have any of the following that you would like to donate, please contact me or any CAB member:

- Cotton or flannel fabrics for bibs, cot sheets, burp cloths
- Soft cotton or flannel fabrics for anti-ouch pouches
- ¾ inch Velcro for anti-ouch pouches
- ¼ inch elastic for cot sheets
- Black out fabric used for curtain lining. This will have a "rubberized" back. We use this for the bib backing.

As always if you have some spare time and are looking for a project to sew, check out our website under the Chapter Info tab for instructions on how to make our community service projects.

Once again, our Sewing Guild Chapter will be participating in Ignite Peoria. Ignite will be held Saturday, August 10, at the Peoria Civic Center. We will have a booth with sewing machines set up for kids to sew a simple project. We will need volunteers to help kids create their project and for set-up and take-down. 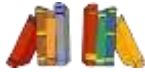

### ANTI-OUCH POUCH



Anti-Ouch Pouches (AOPs) were designed by chapter member Deon Maas. This underarm hanging pillow is intended to add a little comfort to people's lives during a stressful, painful time. The pillow hangs from the shoulder, fitting snugly under the arm to cushion and ease the pressure of the underarm and breast area after breast surgery, upper body surgeries or during radiation treatment.

Tens of thousands of anti-ouch pouches have been lovingly sewn and donated to breast centers across the United States. The American Sewing Guild featured the Anti-Ouch Pouch as the 2008 National Community Service Project. Read more at <https://www.asg.org/resources/giving-back>.

The Anti-Ouch Pouch is an ongoing project for our chapter. We donate hundreds every few months to the OSF Susan G Komen Center in Peoria. Digital mammography detects so many more cases of breast cancer thus increasing the need for AOP's.
