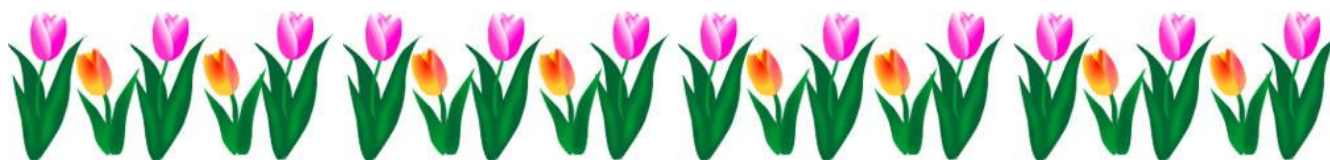

Later in life, as a fresh college graduate entering the world of corporate finance, sewing became an essential skill to provide her tall frame and limited budget with high-quality professional clothing.

She had a career change into youth development and education. That included teaching sewing and textile arts to 4-H youth, adults, and high school students.

From there she entered into corporate fashion, working in the apparel industry for Nordstrom Product Group and REI.

During her time at Nordstrom, she won the Adult division of the national Make it With Wool competition. With more life changes, she found herself able to pursue a career as a professional sewing educator. That was almost 20 years ago. She has had the incredible blessing of working with thousands of wonderful sewing enthusiasts worldwide every year.

As a sewing professional, she is known for her expertise in construction techniques, textiles, sergers (overlockers), machine embroidery and Modern American Pojagi piecework.

She recently published Serger 101: A Field Guide.

Katrina is a popular instructor at sewing shows and sewing guilds. and online. Online, she teaches for Sulky, Craftsy, Sew Daily TV, Taunton Workshops, Fabric Mart, Creative Spark, and STITCHES at Home. She is a national educator for Husqvarna Viking and PFAFF sewing machines, a PFAFF Brand Ambassador, and a Sulky Sewcialite.

When not sharing the love of sewing, she is raising natural colored wool for her [Spoiled Sheep](#) yarn and fiber business.

Please contact the Neighborhood Group leader to confirm monthly meeting times, programs and locations, especially if you are traveling a distance. Programs sometimes change.

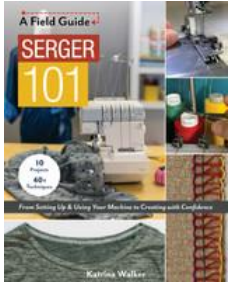

SEW WITH SUE

I hope all of you are taking advantage of the national ASG Neighborhood zoom meetings. Even if you don't think you like the topic, I am sure you will come away learning something. I almost always learn something from any class or meeting.

If you aren't attending one or more of our neighborhood meetings, you are missing a lot of fun, information and just getting together with someone who "speaks" sewing. If you are a snow bird, it would be so much fun to attend a meeting in your winter area.

If you are putting together a skirt with a lining, sew the two together at the hem. Put the hem on a pant hanger or two. Hang on the shower rod. Pin the waistline together. This will eliminate a bubble at the hem. This is especially important for knits.

According to Pantone, the new color for spring is Viva Magenta. It is powerful and empowering. It revels in pure joy, encouraging experimentation and self-expression without restraint. It is an electrifying and boundaryless shade that is manifesting as a stand-out statement.

Bring your machine and basic sewing supplies plus various colors of thread. I will have bibs ready to sew and if you have cotton or flannel fabrics you no longer need, bring them too! We will have a second Community Sew Day on Friday, September 8, 2023, same place and time.

We are always in need of supplies for our community service projects. If you have any of the following that you would like to donate, please contact me or any CAB member:

- Cotton or flannel fabrics for bibs, cot sheets, burp cloths
- Soft cotton or flannel fabrics for anti-ouch pouches
- ¾ inch Velcro for anti-ouch pouches
- ¼ inch elastic for cot sheets
- Black out fabric used for curtain lining. This will have a “rubberized” back. We use this for the bib backing.

As always if you have some spare time and are looking for a project to sew, check out our website under the Chapter Info tab for instructions on how to make our community service projects.

The Sewing Guild will be participating in Ignite Peoria which will be Saturday, August 12, 2023 at the Peoria Civic Center. We will have a booth with sewing machines set up for kids to sew a simple project. We will need volunteers to help kids create their project and for set-up and take-down. If you would like to help us spark creativity in kids, let me know.

ILLINOIS STATE MAKE IT WITH WOOL

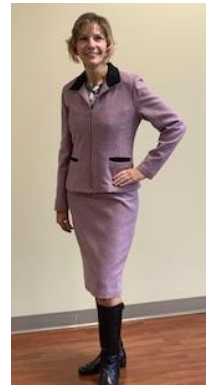

The MIWW contest offers the opportunity to focus attention on the beauty and versatility of wool; encourages the use of wool fabric or yarn in sewing, knitting, crocheting, spinning and weaving wool fabrics and yarns; offers the opportunity to compete for valuable prizes.

Start sewing your wool garment now for the state contest at our annual meeting! It would be nice to have more ASG members in the competition. ASG members receive a \$10 discount off the state entry fee. The Central Illinois Chapter ASG is a sponsor of the Illinois State Make It With Wool contest. ANTI-OUCH POUCH



Anti-Ouch Pouches (AOPs) were designed by chapter member Deon Maas. This underarm hanging pillow is intended to add a little comfort to people's lives during a stressful, painful time. The pillow hangs from the shoulder, fitting snugly under the arm to cushion and ease the pressure of the underarm and breast area after breast surgery, upper body surgeries or during radiation treatment.

Tens of thousands of anti-ouch pouches have been lovingly sewn and donated to breast centers across the United States. The American Sewing Guild featured the Anti-Ouch Pouch as the 2008 National Community Service Project. Read more at <https://www.asg.org/resources/giving-back>.

The Anti-Ouch Pouch is an ongoing project for our chapter We donate hundreds every few months to the OSF Susan G Komen Center and Methodist Diagnostic Center in Peoria.
