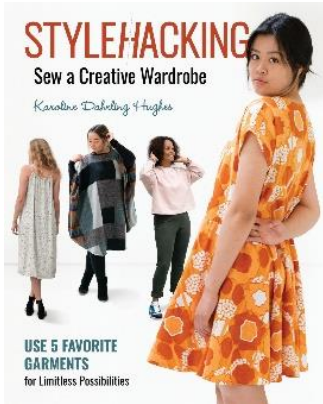

## SEW WITH SUE

Galesburg Sewing Center is under new ownership. It is now called Sewing Center by Ron in the same Galesburg Main Street location.

Did you know that your seam ripper can be even faster if you use it correctly? Pick out several stitches with the point of the ripper. Turn the ripper over so the safety ball is pointing down. Hold the seam so you can easily glide the ripper along the seam. The stitches come out in a few seconds rather than picking out each stitch.

If you are serging and need thread to match your fabric, use a sewing spool with a bobbin placed on top. Put the end of the thread tail up through the bobbin into the thread guides so it releases smoothly. An alternative, which is not as smooth but saves buying multiple spools of sewing thread, is to wind thread on bobbins and place them on the spool holder.

### ANTI-OUCH POUCH



Anti-Ouch Pouches (AOPs) were designed by chapter member Deon Maas. This underarm hanging pillow is intended to add a little comfort to people's lives during a stressful, painful time. The pillow hangs from the shoulder, fitting snugly under the arm to cushion and ease the pressure of the underarm and breast area after breast surgery, upper body surgeries or during radiation treatment.

Tens of thousands of anti-ouch pouches have been lovingly sewn and donated to breast centers across the United States. The Anti-Ouch Pouch is an ongoing project for our chapter. We donate hundreds every few months to the OSF Susan G Komen Center in Peoria.
