HANDS-ON PANTS WORKSHOP

Your ASG local board has heard you!!!! PANTS! PANTS! PANTS! The holy grail for garment sewers is to have a pants pattern that fits. For grins and giggles, the second definition of Holy Grail is “a thing that is eagerly pursued or sought after.” That definition describes us to a T!

As a follow-up to Sew Special, Suzy Baker Bachman will be presenting a 3-day workshop where you will trace your pattern; have the pattern fitted to you; make a muslin; and fine-tune fit to your body. Then you will make a pair of pants with fashion fabric that will fit and you will be proud to wear in public. The last session will be on how to change the design elements of your pattern to reflect different styles.

These classes will be held at the United Presbyterian Church, where many of our guild events are held. The board hopes you are as excited about this as they are. It will be a fun and creative time for all of us.

You will learn about the different types of wool, with colors shown. You will learn all of the tools which you will need. You will learn basic shapes using armature wire to build your design.

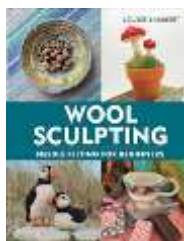
It explains how to needle felt with the wool and tools. You will find basic shapes well illustrated. It illustrates how to blend wool.

MEET MEMBER JENNIE HAWKEY



Jennie Hawkey is a weaver and weaving teacher. She started Hopewell Weaving in 2007, teaching weaving in her cottage, for guilds and at conferences. She has woven for over 30 years and specializes in accessories that incorporate intricate weaves, natural fibers and vivid colors. Although weaving has been a long-time craft, teaching is Jennie's passion.

Jenney's love of fiber arts started with sewing and, like many of us, with her mom. Her mom sewed and liked to make things, especially reupholstering old furniture.

At school she got to take a sewing class in 8th grade. She remembers going to the fabric store and picking out a pattern and fabric for a jumper with no sleeves because they were too difficult! Her parents also got her a Kenmore sewing machine that year. She used it for many years making clothes for herself and then for her daughter when she was young.

In college, she was introduced to weaving in an art class. In the 70's weaving was part of many art departments. When she graduated and went out on her own, she was able to get a loom and join a weaving guild in Peoria.

Teaching is the other important activity in her life. She was an educator in public schools for 35 years. She loves to teach and has been able to combine teaching and fiber arts. In 2007, she started a business called Hopewell Weaving and has developed classes in weaving both in person and online. She also teaches in locally at the Peoria Art Guild.

In July, she had a week-long fiber arts camp for kids called "Wool to Weaving" at the Peoria Art Guild. She took the kids to an alpaca farm to show them one of the sources of yarn, then had local artists teach them how to spin fiber, dye yarn, and of course weave!

Her teaching has also expanded to state and national weaving conferences. Jennie's workshop experience includes workshops at the Handweavers Guild of America Convergence 2024, Midwest Weaving Conference, Shake Rag Alley, and Yadkin Valley Fiber Center.

Jennie is an educator and teacher of children and adults and loves to pass on the skills of weaving. In 2020 she began teaching online courses, beginning with Warping 101, a free, 5 session class in which beginning weavers could warp their own looms at home. From 2020 to 2022, over 60 new weavers have received online individual live support in these courses. She then converted several other of her classes to an online format and continues to teach both in person and online.

One of her favorite projects is Picket Fence Weavers, a space for people with disabilities to learn to weave and sell their work. She finds weaving to be endlessly fascinating and a wonderful creative outlet.

Jennie has been fortunate to travel on several tours that specialize in weaving and textiles. Italy has such a rich history of fiber arts and she got to weave on old Jacquard looms in Florence. And she also got to see collections of intricate and precious woven fabrics in the textile centers of Venice.

Much of her sewing these days combines handwoven fabric and stitching. She also loves to embroider and make useful embellished objects like handbags or Christmas ornaments.

Can you believe that in March of 2026 our Central Illinois Chapter of the American Sewing Guild will be 40 years old? We thank those who had the foresight to start our guild. I hope you will continue to, or start to, attend all chapter activities. You will be so much richer for doing so. ANTI-OUCH POUCH

Anti-Ouch Pouches (AOPs) were designed by chapter member Deon Maas. This underarm hanging pillow is intended to add a little comfort to people's lives during a stressful, painful time. The pillow hangs from the shoulder, fitting snugly under the arm to cushion and ease the pressure of the underarm and breast area after breast surgery, upper body surgeries or during radiation treatment.



Tens of thousands of anti-ouch pouches have been lovingly sewn and donated to breast centers across the United States. The American Sewing Guild featured the Anti-Ouch Pouch as the 2008 National Community Service Project. Read more at www.asg.org/resources/giving-back.

The Anti-Ouch Pouch is an ongoing project for our chapter. We donate hundreds each year to OSF in Peoria, OSF and Carle Cancer Clinic in Bloomington-Normal, OSF in Galesburg, and Graham Hospital in Canton.

The MIWW contest offers the opportunity to focus attention on the beauty and versatility of wool; encourages the use of wool fabric or yarn in sewing, knitting, crocheting, spinning and weaving wool fabrics and yarns; and offers the opportunity to compete for valuable prizes. This year the contest includes a recycle and sweater contest.
