# **MEET OUR PRESIDENT, SUZY BAKER-BACHMAN**



My interest in textile arts began as a young child as I learned needle arts from my mother, grandmother and aunts. I am from Tennessee and becoming proficient in needle arts, hand and machine, was part of the Southern culture I grew up in. In my early twenties I had an opportunity to apprentice with a woman who made draperies, window coverings, bedspreads, and all home décor. That was an amazing experience and has saved me a lot of money over the years while also providing me a cottage industry when my children were little.

In the early 1970s I was sent to Eugene, Oregon and became a certified Stretch and Sew Instructor and taught classes in Memphis, Tennessee. I moved to Illinois in 1976 and in the early 1980s I opened a small boutique sewing shop that featured English Smocking, Heirloom sewing, and French hand and machine sewing. I also taught classes on designing and making children's clothing.

I earned an undergraduate degree from Bradley University in Family and Consumer Sciences, Teacher Education, and also a Master's degree in Human Services Administration (administration degree for those who want to work with not-for-profit organizations). I worked in higher education for 25 years at Bradley University and Illinois State University. The majority of that time I worked in Career Services where my primary focus was working with students individually and in the classroom.

Since retiring from ISU, I have become a certified Sulky Instructor; have taught classes through local quilt and sewing stores, and Illinois Central College. In 2023 I became a certified Palmer Pletsch Pants Instructor.

The bottom line for me is I love sewing. Any kind of sewing. For example, hand sewing, crochet, tatting, embroidery (by hand or machine), smocking, needle point, cross stitch, etc. But to be totally transparent, I never learned to knit. I lived in Tennessee and I didn't need a knitted sweater - - way too hot for that.

Sewing is my therapy, my creative outlet, and my happy place. The whole process from conceptualizing an idea, creating the design, to final construction is a joy for me. And the best payoff has been I have met the most wonderful people through sewing and their creativity is infectious.

I am a member of the Central Illinois Chapter of the American Sewing Guild and the Haute Couture Club of Chicago.

great times of creativity, education, and sharing.


This newsletter is full of information about the upcoming events. If you have questions about any event, please contact any member of the Board and we will be happy to help you.

On September 13, same place and time, we will be making Anti-Ouch Pouches for mastectomy patients. Both of these are worthwhile causes. We need your help in making these items to donate.

As always, we are in need of donations for our community service projects. If you have any of the following that you would like to donate, please contact me at <u>kwould62@gmail.com</u> or any CAB member:

- Cotton or flannel fabrics for bibs, cot sheets, burp cloths
- Soft cotton or flannel fabrics for anti-ouch pouches
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch Velcro for anti-ouch pouches
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch elastic for cot sheets
- Black out fabric used for curtain lining. This will have a "rubberized" back. We use this for the bib backing.

Mark your calendar for this year's Annual Sewing Retreat to be held August 26-28, 2024 at the East Peoria Holiday Inn. Once again, we will have the option for you to attend during the day and sleep at home. Or, if you want some time away from home, you can always spend the night at the hotel. 

## **SEW WITH SUE**

The Sewing Studio in Hudson is moving to a new larger location. During the move, they are having a sale you might want to take advantage of. They will be closed beginning March 10<sup>th</sup> to move to the new location. Their Grand Opening Celebration is March 22-March 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

If you need scissors sharpened, Jones Sewing on Prospect sharpens scissors on Friday for \$5 each. Periodically, Boline's in Bloomington and the Sewing Studio in Hudson sharpens them as well. Also check with your local sewing retailer.

Quilting in the Valley is still located in Peoria. They moved to a smaller store near Dicks and Planet Fitness.

Have you cleaned out your patterns lately? How do you store them? I put mine in pattern cabinets I was lucky enough to purchase when a store went out of business. Do you store them by size, pattern company, or in categories? I opted to store by category starting with the smallest size. It takes a while, depending on how many patterns you have. However, in the future, it is easier to find a pattern you want. I discarded a lot that I knew I wouldn't use or wouldn't fit anyone in my family. What to do with the discards? Some thrift shops take them. Many say they don't sell. Some libraries have a giveaway/exchange box. There are also some national companies that buy old patterns in bulk. You could set up a page and sell them yourself. That takes time and patience. Good luck in your quest.

## **ANTI-OUCH POUCH**



Anti-Ouch Pouches (AOPs) were designed by chapter member Deon Maas. This underarm hanging pillow is intended to add a little comfort to people's lives during a stressful, painful time. The pillow hangs from the shoulder, fitting snugly under the arm to cushion and ease the pressure of the underarm and breast area after breast surgery, upper body surgeries or during radiation treatment.

Tens of thousands of anti-ouch pouches have been lovingly sewn and donated to breast centers across the United States. The American Sewing Guild featured the Anti-Ouch Pouch as the 2008 National Community Service Project. Read more at https://www.asg.org/resources/giving-back.
