Emergency Medicine Department. "It's a big change from days-gone-by when patients in the ER were often seen by the youngest and least experienced physicians."

Erskine adds that not only can patients

rest assured the physicians who see them at St. Marys are specialists in emergency medicine. Several of the staff also have board certification in another specialty. For example, Dr. Erskine is also a board certified pediatrician.

"Double board certification reflects prior training and practice," he explained. "Being versed not only in emergency medicine gives us an extra breadth and depth in diagnosis and treatment.

"We have a much broader perspective in serving our patients and a firm base for interaction with other members of the medical staff."

The two-day board exams are conducted by the Board of Emergency Medicine.

Each physician on the ER staff also has a faculty appointment within the UW Department of Family Practice.

In June of 2023, the Sun Prairie Emergency Center (SPEC) closed. The St. Mary's ED absorbed some of the impact of the closure-with a bump in patient volume, shifting of nursing and tech staffing from SPEC to the St. Mary's ED, and redistribution of physician staff.



With both physician and AP staffing challenges, in 2023 our physicians and PAs were able to remain flexible, with some creative changes to the staffing models led by our staffing work group.

Our SMM sepsis metrics showed improvement in percentage of patients who receive antibiotics within 1 hour of ED arrival, percentage of patients with blood cultures before antibiotics, arrival to lactic acid order times and arrival to antibiotic order times. There was a 13-minute improvement in median arrival to antibiotic administration time.

Our stroke metrics continue to improve with a median door to needle times of 42 mins (goal < 45 mins) for TNKase for 2023, and improved evaluation times for "walk in strokes".




We frequently hear of patients driving from as much as an hour away to be seen in the PRH ED, where they know they will receive excéllent care.

Maintained our trauma certification thanks to the hard work of Dr. Tovar and Lybeck. We updated our leveling criteria to maintain consistency across SSM sites. Dr. Tovar assumed the role of site Trauma Medical Director.

Collaborated with hospital staff and our pre-hospital EMS partners in developing a stroke workflow to streamline our process, provide consistent care and improve our time to imaging, treatment and disposition, with the goal of improved patient outcomes.



St. Clare Hospital BARABOO

Implemented Hicuity, a tele-medicine critical care service, to provide eICU capabilities to several of our department rooms as well as a mobile cart. This added level of remote monitoring is a vailable for our critically ill patients if additional help with management is needed.

Installed a dispensing machine for Naloxone in the ED entrance, which can be accessed by the public without cost. This harm reducing initiative also Includes information regarding local resources for the management of substance use disorder.

Updated our ED supplies with the purchase of a Belmont Rapid Infuser, Glidescope and Slit lamp. The Infuser will allow for rapid transfusion of blood in trauma and medical patients with life threatening bleeding. Our Glidescope is a state-of-the-art device for performing videolaryngoscopy as well as fiberoptic airway management. Also included is a portable monitor for use when responding to emergent airways within the hospital. The slit lamp modernizes our ability to perform detailed eye examinations and procedures.


The Behavior Health program continues to grow and provide a much-needed resource for the community.

Volumes have continued to increase with almost 26k patients evaluated through the department this year.

To better align with patient presentation volumes and better serve our community, we added an hour of physician coverage.

We underwent a complete remodel of our 2 large trauma bays including new monitors and surgical lights.



We continue to play an integral part with our local EMS and provide dedicated training.

We received a 2023 Community Partner Award from the Lake Mills Fire Department for our dedication to training.

We continue to work closely with Jefferson County Health and Human Services to provide the most comprehensive behavioral and mental health care we can for our local community.

We provided specialized training to our ER nurses regarding pediatric and OB emergencies.

PREHOSPITAL

Since 2017, our EMS program has grown from a conceptual discussion between previous SSM Health Wisconsin president, Damond Boatwright, and MEP President, Dr. Michael Foley, in recognition of a gap within our healthcare system, into a comprehensive prehospital medicine program that has advanced the medical care provided to our communities and supports development of a true integrated health care system.

We are supported by MEP physicians and advanced providers who provide EMS medical direction, education and training, participate on numerous local and regional EMS committees, and medical coverage at mass gathering events throughout Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Fond du Lac, Iowa, Jefferson, Marquette, Rock, and Sauk Counties.

Through unification of evidence-based protocols, an EMS Physician staffed online medical control line from 0800-2200 daily and sharing of educational and training resources —this has helped create consistency in clinical care to our patients throughout much of the area our hospital partners cover as well as supports the regionalized trauma, stroke, and cardiovascular systems of care.
































Celebrating Madison Marathon Runner's Survival from OHCA

Pram Adriansjach doesn't even remember running the Madison Marathon on November 12th. Right as he crossed the finish line of the 26.2 mile course, he collapsed. Bob Barrix, paramedic and MEP Education Specialist, covering the finish line — witnessed Pram go down with apparent seizure like activity before calling for assistance. Dr. Kacey Kronenfeld, did an initial rapid assessment and made the decision to transport him rapidly to the medical tent away from the crowd and elements, where the rest of the team was waiting. Alongside SSM Health staff, Madison Fire Paramedics, Dr. Aurora Lybeck helped lead the resuscitation that resulted in ROSC after two shocks before he was stabilized for transport to his home hospital of UW downtown. Prior to sedation, the team was optimistic as Pram had started to breathe on his own and had some spontaneous movement. We would find out soon after that Pram went to the cath lab, had a stent placed, and was able to be discharged after a few short days in the hospital, completely neurologically intact.



In partnership with SSM Health, we support medical coverage for the multiple mass gathering events. Though everyone's teamwork, communication, and the expert clinical care the day of the event were critical to supporting this outcome – it takes months of preparation and a coordinated efforts by event planning team and our medical leadership to ensure we have the resources needed to respond in an event like this.















Highlights

Mission: Lifeline EMS recognition is a program designed to showcase Emergency Medical Service organizations across the nation for excellent care for patients with stroke and STEMI care. Every agency under the medical oversight of MEP Health that submitted data achieved the highest-level recognition (Silver if first year submitting data, or Gold if agency had submitted previous years). These agencies include: Cambridge Area EMS, Deer Grove EMS, DeForest Windsor Fire and EMS, Fond du Lac Rescue, Lodi Area EMS, McFarland Fire and Rescue, Monona Fire, Oregon Area Fire and EMS, Reedsburg Area Ambulance

Dr. Eric Snell, along with Fort Healthcare Emergency Response Liaison, Melissa Murray, received 2023 Community Partner Awards from the Lake Mills Fire Department at their annual awards banquet on Saturday, January 27th. At the event, the EMS Captain Kevin Waddell said some very nice things about their assistance getting their EMTs ready to go with the launch of their EMS service and new ambulance in 2023. He thanked us for our consistent help, the high-quality training we provide, and for being available whenever needed.

MEP Online Medical Control Line Every day from 0800-2200, one of Drs. Kronenfeld, Lybeck, Wleklinski, Grahl, Bahr, Grover, and Stahmer are available to provide an EMS physician who knows the protocols and field management capabilities of our agencies to discuss difficult cases or situations, augment protocols, and to support critical incident debriefing if needed. In 2023, they supported almost 200 calls from the field!

Dr. Jake Zadra, EMS Medical Director for SSM Health St. Mary's Janesville supported Blackhawk Tech College in development and implementation of their first paramedic class in 2023!

Dr. Chris Stahmer, medical director of Reedsburg Area Ambulance Service notes that 2023 was the busiest year to date for the service with over 2400 combined 911 and interfacility calls and a massage expansion to the station.

Partnership with SSM Health: Our medical direction in Dane, Fond du Lac, Rock, and Sauk Counties is successful because of our partner, SSM Health. Together, we continue to expand prehospital integration – increasing collaboration amongst the SSM Health Wisconsin ministries and service lines, EMS education, increased service line collaboration, community outreach, and mass gathering medicine.

Dr. Kacey Kronenfeld had two presentations at the Cardiac Arrest Survival Summit in San Diego, CA in early December of 2023. The first talk was on development of a High School EMS Club - an innovative approach to create a zero-response time and improve survival from cardiac arrest. The second talk highlighted the process we have built in Dane County, from 911 call review to end of year survivor celebration – that supported a 65% Utstein survival rate for 2022, more than double the national average.
