





First Friday, November 4th at 8:45 followed by Divine Mercy Chaplet

Looking to start the First Friday Devotion? Here's what you need to know:

1. The devotion must take place on nine consecutive Fridays.

2. Go to Confession within 8 days before or after the Friday

Our Lord requires Communion to be received
 Those that make the nine Fridays must do so in honor of Christ's Sacred Heart

5. Remember – just like First Saturday, this devotion is NOT a substitution for your life as a Catholic! While Our Lord implies there are abundant graces for those who partake in this devotion, it does not save us from temptation or give us an excuse to stop leading a life of virtue
6. All Catholics should seek to make the First Friday devotion as it is pleasing to Our Lord

All Saints Nov 1st Holy Day of Obligation

What is All Saints Day?

All Saints' Day is a Christian solemnity, or dignified remembrance, that celebrates the honor of all church saints, whether known or unknown. This holiday is also known as All Hallows' Day, the Feast of All Saints, the Solemnity of All Saints, and Hallowmas.

Who is a saint? <u>You are</u>. That is, if you're a follower of Jesus. God calls a "saint" those who trust in Christ alone for salvation.

Live like a saint today.

This is St. Paul's message in the fifth chapter of his letter to the Ephesians. Imitate God, he said. Live as children of light.

Being a saint doesn't require spending long hours in prayer, but rather living life open to God in good times and in bad, Pope Francis said. Christians should live with the **"hope of becoming saints"** and with the desire that "work, even in sickness and suffering, even in difficulties, is open to God."

Why do Catholics celebrate All Souls Day?

The Church is composed of the faithful living upon the earth and those who have gone before us. The latter includes the Saints in Heaven and the faithful Souls being purified in Purgatory. Just as on November 1st we honor those who are with God, on November 2nd Catholics celebrate a Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed. Also known as All Souls Day, on this day we honor them for their fidelity in life, as well as pray for them, since they are being purified before entering the All Holy Presence of God. As Revelation 21:27 says of the Heavenly Jerusalem, "... nothing unclean shall enter in."
