



The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ Corpus Christi



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is historically known by its Latin name, Corpus Christi. This day is a celebration of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Traditionally celebrated on the Thursday following the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, the feast dates to 1263 AD with a visionary nun and a Eucharistic miracle.

"Besides physical hunger, people have another hunger, one that cannot be satisfied with ordinary food. It is the hunger for life, hunger for love (and) hunger for eternity. The body and blood of Christ can give people eternal life because the substance of this bread is love. Living the Catholic faith, means allowing yourself to be nourished by the Lord and building your life not on material goods, but on the reality that does not perish: the gifts of God, His Word, and His Body." *Pope Francis*

What is Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament?

Exposition is the placement of the sacred host outside the tabernacle for public adoration. The Church permits a "full" exposition, when the sacred host is clearly visible in a vessel called a "monstrance".

Who are the adorers?

While all are welcomed and encouraged to attend Adoration, individuals are needed to commit to spend an hour or two once or twice a month before the Blessed Sacrament. That is why typically, two or more people take turns, to spend an hour, in prayer and silence, before the Blessed Sacrament. This is crucial since Christ exposed in the monstrance must never be left unattended.
