"The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want...Even though I walk in the dark valley I fear no evil; for you are at my side with your rod and your staff that give me courage." (Ps 23).

God gives us the grace to celebrate the 4th Sunday of Easter. In the Gospel according to John for the 4th Sunday of Easter Jesus identified himself as the shepherd. Jesus comes to offer us riches which we will never have to give up. He promises that they will last beyond death into and throughout eternity. "I came" He said, "that they might have life and have it more

abundantly". Abundant life! That is what we all want. We want a life so full in joy and happiness that there be no fear of it ever ending. That is what the psalmist sings about. That is what Jesus promises. Jesus wants to be your shepherd, your security, your protector. "I am the gate," He says, "Whoever enters through me will be sayed."

We all know that spiritual riches are a gift from God. We cannot earn them. But we do have to sometimes work hard to prepare and open ourselves for the reception of Jesus' gifts. Now with the church still closed for public liturgy it can be difficult to prepare yourself and the family for Sunday's celebration, to create a Family Church, a liturgy of Domestic Church Life. There can be many attractions which can draw us away from God. But if we open our home to the Lord our reward will be great. It is by being like a sheep which hear the voice of the Shepherd and follow wherever He goes. Jesus is the gate wishing to lead us through himself into never ending happiness.

Let us not forget Mary during this blessed time of Easter. Indeed, she is our Mother. Before Jesus died on the cross, he gave his mother to us. She was with Jesus on the way to Calvary. She experienced what does it mean to be in pain and suffering, what does it mean to be lonely and helpless. But she never left her Son. She became our Mother not in Bethlehem but in Golgotha. And now Mary is with us. She is with her suffering children. She knows our prayers and she would like to help us. She would like to let us know that for those who trust God, everything is possible. "Through Mary to Jesus".

Let us conclude this reflection with the closing prayer after the Litany of the Blessed Virgin: "Lord God, give to your people the joy of continual health in mind and body. With the prayers of Virgin Mary to help us, guide us through the sorrows of this life to eternal happiness in the life to come. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen."
