Pentecost Sunday

Today is one of the most holy days in the year - Pentecost Sunday!

As the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 1, illustrates, there were 120 people praying for the Holy Ghost. And iust as the Heavens opened and a dove descended in the Baptism of Jesus, the Holy Ghost descended on the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary at Pentecost. How truly remarkable and breathtaking it would have been if we were



there to see tongues of fire falling from the sky.

But alas, that is what happens to each of us, though invisibly, at our own Confirmation. The same Spirit is within those that have been Confirmed in the Catholic Church. We have the Holy Spirit and we have the responsibility to go out and be beacons of the light of Christ, just like the Apostles did.

The word "Pentecost" means "fifty days" because today's celebration is fifty days after the celebration of the Lord's triumphant Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

The account of the Descent of the Holy Spirit holds an important lesson- **prayer is necessary**. After praying fervently for nine days did Mary and the apostles receive the gift from on high. And it was when Jesus was praying after His baptism that the Heavens opened. And it was during prayer when Jesus was transfigured on Mt. Tabor. And we can also assume it was during prayer that the Archangel Gabriel revealed to Mary that she was to be the Mother of God. Today we recall that the Holy Spirit descended during prayer. Let us keep the importance of prayer in mind.
