# **First Sunday In Advent**

The word "*Advent*" comes from the Latin word "*adventus*," which means "*a coming*, *approach*, *arrival*." When we expect guests to arrive at our homes, we turn the lights on; we anticipate their arrival and welcome them with joy.

Advent wreaths ~ The Advent wreath is a centuries-old Christian tradition. Potentially overlooked by the candles it holds to light the way for the birth of Jesus, the Advent wreath itself symbolizes many themes and beliefs central to the Christian faith.

**History of the Advent wreath** ~ The origin of the Advent wreath has been traced back to Germany, though the exact dates are unknown. Historians have suggested that pre-Christian Germanic peoples would light candles around wreaths in the dark winter months in anticipation of the warmer, lighter months in springtime. This tradition likely evolved into an "Advent wreath" at some point during the Middle Ages, transforming the pagan tradition into a Christian one.

Advent wreath meaning ~ The circular shape of the Advent wreath symbolizes God's infinite love for us – it is never-ending, just like the true Light of the World, Jesus, who leads us into eternal life with Him. The materials of the Advent wreath similarly lead us to reflect on the everlasting nature of God.
